MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, October 27, 1911.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated October 21, 1911.

Present :—Mr. K. W. B. Macleod, Chairman ; Mr. C. P. Dias ; the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G. ; Sir Allan Perry, Kt. ; Mr. L. B. Fernando ; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader ; Mr. H. L. de Mel ; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene ; Dr. David Rockwood ; Mr. G. L. Cox ; Mr. Wm. Moir ; and Dr. D. P. Banajee.

The Minutes of General Meeting of September 22, 1911, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of General Meeting of September 22, 1911, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that the Municipal Engineer do furnish to this Council, within four months of date, a town planning scheme for laying out the area included in the Eastward Extension. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that this Council do request the Works Committee to inquire into and report upon the circumstances which led to the prosecution of Overseer Impett, an officer of this Council, who was tried before the Supreme Court and acquitted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene presented a petition from A. L. M. Hassin, regarding premises No. 3, Symond's road, Maradana, and moved that the same be referred to the Works Committee for inquiry and report. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

(3) Public Health Department Incremental Scheme: Medical Officer of Health's Report No. 39 of February 25, 1911—Recommended that the proposals D, E, F, H, I, L, and M in the Medical Officer of Health's Scheme be adopted.

The Committee considers that it would be unjust to deprive any denomination of the right to enter the cemetery by the main gate, as that is the entrance provided for the use of all denominations, and as the proposed waiting room will be erected at that entrance. It agrees to the other proposed by-laws, with the addition of the words "not exceeding quarter of an hour" after the words "any reasonable period of time" in by-law No. 3.

- (11) Provision by the Council of a culvert over drain in Maitland crescent on the road leading to the Nondescript Cricket Club ground, at a cost of Rs. 225, and conversion of sand track at a cost of Rs. 275, at the expense of the Nondescript Cricket Club.—Recommended.
- (13) Tenders for the extension to cattle mart for convalescent animals: Works Engineer's letter No. 1,009 of October 3, 1911, recommending acceptance of tender of I. L. M. Abdul Rahim for Rs. 14,500.—Recommended that I. L. M. Abdul Rahim's tender should be accepted.

6. With reference to the proposed by-laws annexed to item No. 2 of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of October 11, 1911, it was resolved that the proposed by-laws Nos. 1 and 4 be deleted altogether, and by-law No. 2 be amended, so as to read as follows : "No musical instrument shall be used in the cemetery, except on the written permission of the Chairman," and that by-law No. 3 be approved.

The Chairman moved that the by-laws, as amended, be adopted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried. (*Vide Annexure.*)

7. With reference to the proposed by-laws annexed to item No. 2 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of October 11, 1911, it was resolved that the proposed by-laws Nos. 1 and 4 be deleted altogether, and that by-law No. 2 be amended, so as to read as follows :—"No musical instruments shall be used in the cemetery, except on the written permission of the Chairman," and that by-law No. 3 be approved.

The Chairman moved that item No. 3 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of October 11, 1911, be adopted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

8. Resolved that the words "a first class architect" in item No. 15 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of October 13, 1911, be deleted, and that the words "an architect approved by the Chairman" be inserted therein and that the remaining items be adopted.

9. Resolved that the words "a first class architect" in item No. 15 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Finance of October 13, 1911, be deleted, and that the words "an architect approved by the Chairman" be inserted therein and that the remaining items be adopted, with the exception of item No. 34 which is to be cancelled.

The Chairman moved that the Council do resume and that the resolutions passed in Committee be adopted. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

10. Letter from Mr. E. C. Davies, forwarding recommendations for the post of Mechanical Engineer, was laid before Council, having been previously circulated.

Resolved that the matter be postponed for next meeting.

11. Re-transfer to the owner premises Nos. 70/70a, Second Cross street, Pettah, sold for arrears of consolidated rates and vested in the Council, as all taxes, costs, and compensation due to Council have been paid up.

Resolved that re-transfer of the premises to the late owner be approved.

12. Correspondence on the subject of the proposed lease of Municipal land at Short's road was brought before Council, having been previously circulated.

Resolved that the matter be postponed for next meeting.

13. To cancel sale of premises No. 42a, Ferry street.

Resolved that the sale be cancelled.

14. Colonial Auditor's Annual Report for 1910 was laid before Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

15. Excess leave of 2 days over 30 days granted to Mr. M. de Fonseka, Clerk of the Secretary's Department, absent from October 17, 1911.

Resolved that the leave granted by the Chairman be confirmed.

16. To sanction excess leave over 30 days granted to the Officers and Servants of the Finance Department, owing to ill-health, as follows :—Mr. K. C. Perera, 11 days ; Mr. A. W. Anderson, 4 days ; Manuel Appu, 14 days ; Lamina Fernando, 26 days.

Resolved that the leave granted by the Chairman be confirmed.

REGULATIONS AS AMENDED IN COUNCIL.

1. No musical instruments shall be used in the cemetery, except on the written permission of the Chairman.
2. In the event of more than one corpse being brought to the cemetery for burial at the same time, the Cemetery-keeper is empowered to delay the burial of one or more of the corpses for any reasonable period of time not exceeding $\frac{1}{4}$ of an hour, if in his opinion it is advisable so to do to maintain order and decency in the conduct of the funeral ceremonies to be observed at the burial of any of the corpses so brought for burial.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on October 21, 1911, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated October 17, 1911.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. J. H. de Saram, C.M.G.; Mr. W. C. Price; Mr. R. W. Jonklaas; and Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu.

The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on September 16, 1911, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1910 to September 30, 1911, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water Rate Accounts.
- Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- Health Officer's report for September.
- Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of September.
- The Reservoir Readings for September.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's Report be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during September.

Before commencing the proceedings for the day, the Chairman offered a few words of welcome to the new Member, Mr. J. H. de Saram, C.M.G., stating that the Council was fortunate in obtaining the services of a member of such wide experience and knowledge.

Mr. Beven said that he associated himself with all that fell from the Chairman and on behalf of the Unofficial Members was glad to welcome Mr. de Saram to the Council.

Mr. de Saram in reply said he would do everything to the best of his power in the interests of the Council.

Mr. Beven said that he noticed under the Waterworks Account an over expenditure of Rs. 8,000, and inquired how that amount came to be spent without being voted.

The Secretary explained that the expenditure was on account of Waterworks' materials ordered out by the Superintendent of Municipal Works and that it had never been the practice before to get a special vote for such indents.

The Chairman, however, thought that a vote should have been taken, and it was agreed that no expenditure be incurred in future on account of materials required for the Works Department without previously obtaining the sanction of Council for such expenditure.

4. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter of September 20, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, to Mr. J. H. de Saram, C.M.G. nominating him a Councillor of the Kandy Municipal Council *vice* Mr. W. D. Gibbon, resigned, for the information of the Council.—Read.

(2) Letter No. 662 of October 16, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, to the Hon. the Treasurer, authorizing him to remit to the Municipal Council the sum of Rs. 1,100 provided in the Estimates as a Government grant in respect of Lady Horton's Walk and connected paths for the current financial year, for the information of the Council.—Read.

(3) Endorsement No. 5 of October 13, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, *re* the dairy by-laws and regulations.—Resolved that the suggestions be adopted.

(4) Letter No. 22 of October 7, 1911, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, *re* the amendment to the Kandy Waterworks Ordinance.—Read.

(5) Letter No. 157 of September 28, 1911, from the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, *re* the erection of Perahera booths.—Read.

(6) Letter No. 752 of October 3, 1911, from the Provincial Engineer, *re* the advisability of appointing a fully qualified Engineer for the Kandy Municipality.

The Provincial Engineer moved—That the Council consider the advisability of appointing a fully qualified engineer for the Kandy Municipality to advise the Council on all matters relating to his profession and to superintend all works of engineering undertaken by the Council.

Mr. Beven seconded, and wished to add, with the leave of the proposer, "and assist the Chairman in supervising the office."
