## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Henry Edward McCallum, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

### HENRY McCALLUM.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor dated December 14, 1906, a police force was established under section 7 of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," in the town of Wellawatta and Dehiwala, in the District of Colombo, Western Province, and in pursuance of section 13 of the said Ordinance the limits of the said town were defined by the said Proclamation:

And whereas by Proclamations dated respectively September 28, 1911, and November 9, 1911, issued under the provisions of section 5 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910," the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo were altered and extended on the south to the Kirillapane canal as far as the Dehiwala canal, as defined in the schedule thereto attached

And whereas owing to the alteration and extension of the Colombo Municipal limits as aforesaid it is expedient to alter the limits of the said town as defined in the schedule attached to the Proclamation dated December 14, 1906:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 13 of the said "Police Ordinance, 1865," do hereby alter the limits of the said town of Colombo, and declare that from and

after January 1, 1912, the limits of the said town shall for the purposes of the said Ordinance be as the same are set forth in the schedule hereto.

## Ceylon Government Agricultural Scholarships.

W ITH a view to securing trained teachers for Provincial Agricultural Schools which it is proposed to establish in Ceylon, it has been decided, with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, to grant Government Scholarships to promising young men desirous of embarking on an agricultural career in the Government service to enable them to receive a training in an Agricultural College in India.

2. As a first step it is proposed to grant four such scholarships tenable for a period of three years for a course of training at the Agricultural College at Poona. The scholarships will entitle the holders to the following allowances during the three years of their course of training:—A subsistence allowance of Rs. 50 per mensem, and an outfit and travelling allowance at the rate of Rs. 300 per annum paid half-yearly. The candidates will be provided with quarters, but they will have to provide their own boarding. Fees for tuition, cost of instruments, &c., and rent of quarters will be paid by Government.

The scholarships will be granted by nomination by the Governor in Executive Council to selected candidates who were over 19 and less than 24 years of age on January 1, 1912. Candidates for nomination must, however,

have passed one of the following examinations:-

(a) The Intermediate Examination in Arts or Science of the University of London.

(b) The F.A. or the B.A. Examination of the Calcutta University, provided this has been passed with a classical language and history.

(c) The F.A. or B.A. Examination of the Madras University, provided this has been passed with a classical language.

3. Candidates will also be required to pass a test in physical fitness before nomination.

- 4. The course of study is that laid down by the University of Bombay for the degree of Bachelor of Agriculture. The candidates will have to take the F. Ag., S. Ag., and B. Ag. Examinations in succession.
- 5. Applications for His Excellency the Governor's nomination must be submitted to the Hon. the Colonial Secretary not later than March 1, 1912. Each candidate must send in with his application two certificates of character, one of which must be from the Principal of the last school which he attended; also proof of age.
  - 6. Candidates nominated will be required to pay a medical fee of Rs. 10 50.
- 7. The next scholastic year of the Agricultural College at Poona will commence on June 1, 1912, and the students nominated for the scholarship will be admitted to the College on that date.

#### Ceylon Government Engineering Scholarships.

A N examination will be held by the Ceylon Government in May, 1912, for the award of scholarships to be held in the Upper Subordinate Class in Engineering at the Madras Engineering College.

If candidates of sufficient merit present themselves there will be awarded three scholarships, which will undercertain conditions lead to appointments in the Ceylon Irrigation Department.

The scholarships will entitle the holders to the following allowances for the three years of their course in the Upper Subordinate Class:—A subsistence allowance of Rs. 30 per mensem, and an outfit and travelling allowance at the rate of Rs. 200 per annum, paid half-yearly. Fees and deposits required for the classes will be paid by the Government. Those who pass the College final examination at the end of the three years' course will receive the same subsistence allowance for an additional year, during which they will be employed on works in India. They will also during this additional year receive the same travelling allowances as are drawn by Indian students under the same circumstances. All allowances will be contingent on the good conduct and satisfactory progress of the student.

2. The three scholars will, if they receive a certificate of good conduct and satisfactory progress during the year spent on works, be offered appointments as Irrigation Inspectors, Class II., of the Irrigation Department, with prospects of promotion to the higher grades of Irrigation Inspectors, Class I., and Chief Irrigation Inspectors.

The following is the sanctioned scale of salaries and strength for these appointments:

Twelve Inspectors, Class II., at Rs. 960 rising to Rs. 1,360 by annual increments of Rs. 40.

Ten Inspectors, Class I., at Rs. 1,400 rising to Rs. 2,300 by annual increments of Rs. 60.

Eight Chief Inspectors at Rs. 2,500 rising to Rs. 3,000 by annual increments of Rs. 100.

Promotion from class to class is by selection. Each of these scholars will be required to execute a bond of Rs. 1,000, pledging himself to enter Government service in the Irrigation Department, and remain in that service for at least ten years.

- 3. The examination will be confined to candidates whose age will be under 22 on June 30, 1912, and who are nominated by His Excellency the Governor. Before receiving such nomination, candidates must have passed one of the following examinations:—
  - (i.) The Matriculation Examination of the London University.
  - (ii.) The Cambridge University Senior Local Examination, including a pass in not less than five of the sections 2-16. Three of these sections must be—
    - (1) English.
    - (2) Mathematics.
    - (3) Latin, or Chemistry, or Physics, or two subjects in Biology and Physical Geography.
  - (iii.) The Intermediate Examination in Arts of the Madras University.
  - 4. The subjects of examination will be as follows:-

#### Compulsory

- (1) Arithmetic.
- (2) Drawing—Freehand and Geometrical.
- (3) English Language and Composition.
- (4) Pure Mathematics—Geometry, Algebra, and Trigonometry.

## Optional.

Not more than two of the following:-

- (5) Applied Mathematics—Elementary Mechanics and Hydrostatics.
- (6) Chemistry—Theoretical and Practical.
- (7) Physics—the elements of Sound, Light, Heat, Electricity, and Magnetism. Candidates will be examined practically in the use of the commoner physical apparatus.

Note.—The standard of the examination in subjects (4), (5), (6), and (7) is sufficiently indicated in the syllabus for the respective subjects prescribed for the Senior Cambridge Local and the London Matriculation Examinations.

- N.B.—In selecting the scholars a preference will be given to those who have passed in either Physics or Chemistry.
- 5. Applications for His Excellency the Governor's nomination must be submitted to the Director of Irrigation not later than April 15, 1912. Each candidate must send in with his application two certificates of character, one of which must be from the Principal of the last school which he attended.
- 6. Candidates nominated by His Excellency the Governor will be required to pay a medical fee of Rs. 10.50 and an examination fee of Rs. 25.

## Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 30, 1911.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Births.—The total births registered were 69 (I European, 8 Burghers, 41 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 2 Moors, 2 Malays, and 0 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1911, viz., 213,825) was 16.8, as against 24.6 in the preceding week, 28.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 159 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 78 Sinhalese, 46 Tamils, 20 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 38.8, as against 43.9 in the previous weak, 35.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 159 total deaths, 45 were of infants under one year of age, as against 49 in the preceding week, 37 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Selected Causes of Death.—As many as twenty-three deaths were registered from Pneumonia as in the previous week (against 12 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in Kotahena, 3 each in Maradana hospitals and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, St. Paul's, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, and 1 each in Kollupitiya North and Kollupitiya South. Three deaths were registered from Bronchitis.

- 2. Thirteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 14 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 were in Maradana hospitals, 2 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya North.
- 3. Three deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 5 in the previous week and the weekly average for last year), 1 each in San Sebastian, Maradana hospitals, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals). There were 18 cases reported during the week, against 22 in the previous week.
- 4. Sixteen deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 12 Debility (6 infants), 11 Senility, 10 Enterits (1 infant), 8 Dysentery (1 infant), 7 Premature Birth, 5 Tetanus (4 infants), 4 Diarrhæa (2 infants), 3 Syphilis (all infants), 3 each from Worms, Malarial Cachexia, and Nephritis, and 32 from Other Causes.
- 5. Nine cases of Measles were reported, against 4 in the previous week; and 14 of Chickenpox, against 5 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was  $80 \cdot 5^{\circ}$ , against  $80 \cdot 2^{\circ}$  in the preceding week and  $79 \cdot 0^{\circ}$  in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was  $29 \cdot 858$  in., against  $29 \cdot 871$  in. in the preceding week and  $30 \cdot 011$  in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was  $1 \cdot 57$  in., against  $1 \cdot 87$  in. in the preceding week and  $0 \cdot 53$  in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Births.—The total births registered were 100 (0 Europeans, 3 Burghers, 64 Sinhalese, 10 Tamils, 19 Moors, 4 Malays, and 0 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1912, viz., 223,353) was 23·4, as against 16·8 in the preceding week, 29·1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26·0 the weekly average for last year.

\* Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 190 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 98 Sinhalese, 44 Tamils, 35 Moors, 3 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 44.5, as against 38.8 in the previous week, 33.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 35.2 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 190 total deaths, 41 were of infants under one year of age, as against 45 in the preceding week, 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Selected Causes of Death.—As many as 24 deaths were registered from Pneumonia (against 23 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year), of which 7 were in Kotahena, 4 each in San Sebastian, St. Paul's, and New Bazaar, 2 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in Pettah, Maradana hospitals, and Kollupitiya North. Two deaths were registered from Bronchitis.

- 2. Sixteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 13 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 each were in New Bazaar and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 each in Pettah, Kotahena, and Maradana hospitals, and 1 each in San Sebastian, St. Paul's, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya North.
- 3. Twelve deaths were registered from Enteric Fever (against 3 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 each were in Maradana hospitals and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 in Kotahena, and 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Wellawatta. There were 26 cases reported during the week, against 18 in the previous week.
- 4. Eighteen deaths were registered from Enteritis (including 6 infants), 12 from Infantile Convulsions, 11 Senility, 9 Debility (4 infants), 8 Dysentery, 6 Tetanus (5 infants), 5 Malaria, 4 each from Rickets and Nephritis, 3 each from Worms, Cancer, Cerebral Hæmorrhage, and Peritonitis, and 47 from Other Causes.
- 5. Four cases of *Measles* were reported, against 9 in the previous week; and 2 of *Chickenpox*, against 14 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 77·1°, against 80·5° in the preceding week and 79·7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·893 in., against 29·858 in. in the preceding week and 30·006 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against 1·57 in. in the preceding week and 4·52 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
