HENRY MCCALLUM.

WHEREAS by sub-section (4) of section 94 of Ordinance No. 10 of 1861, as amended by section 7 of Ordinance No. 23 of 1910, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare that the provisions of the said sub-section (4) of section 94 of the aforesaid Ordinance shall extend and be applicable to any road in this Colony, or to any section of such road, whenever it shall appear to the Governor and Council that a sufficient number of halting places has been constructed along the same:

And whereas it appears to Us, the Governor and Council, that a sufficient number of halting places has been constructed along the following roads:—

- (1) All roads of the town of Matale.
- (2) Such portions of the roads from Kandy to Trincomalee, Mirisgoniyoa to Anuradhapura, and Kurunegala to Dambulla as lie within the District of Matale.
- (3) The road from Matale to Udupihilla.

The roads from—

- (4) Matale to Rattota;
- (5) Kalawewa to Galewela;
- (6) Naula to Elaheera;
- (7) Palapatwela to Galewela;
- (8) Elwela to Ukuwela Station;
- (9) Kalalpitiya to Ukuwela Railway Station; and
- (10) The road from Galahenwatta to Yatawatta, within the limits of the Central Province:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, in exercise of the power in Us vested as aforesaid, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the provisions of sub-section (4) of section 94 of the said Ordinance shall extend and be applicable to the roads above-mentioned as from and after April 1, 1912.

WITH reference to the Notification dated December 11, 1909, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th idem, it is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to amend rule 8 of the rules regulating the pensions to be granted to Public Servants of this Colony, promulgated by Notification dated December 9, 1908, and to substitute therefor, with the sanction of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following rule:—

Mode of Calculation of Pension, &c.

8. The pension or gratuity awarded to a Public Servant shall be computed upon the salary drawn by him at the time of his retirement in respect of the permanent office or offices then held by him, provided that he shall have held such office or offices, or an office or offices to which the same fixed salary or incremental scale of salary is attached, for at least three years; otherwise the pension shall be calculated upon the average of the salaries attached to the permanent offices held by such person during the three years next preceding the commencement of such pension. Provided that where an officer retires within three years of his promotion to a higher class or grade, he shall have the option of claiming either a pension calculated in manner aforesaid, or a pension calculated on the salary which he would have been receiving had he not been promoted to the higher class or grade. In the case of Native Sergeants of the Police Force, pension will be calculated on the salary drawn at the time of retirement, even if such salary was not drawn throughout the preceding three years, if the officer has served in the class in which he is serving at the time of his retirement for such three years.

Separate tenders should be made for the several rents as shown above, both the name and number of the rent being inserted in the tender.

Tenders properly sealed may either be posted, addressed to the Hon. Sir Hugh Clifford, K.C.M.G., Colonial Secretary, marked "Arrack Rent Tender," or delivered personally by the tenderer to the Board.

The conditions of sale have been amended since the rents were last sold. Forms of amended conditions of sale with lists of taverns can be obtained at any Kachcheri in the Island. Attention is drawn to the fact that the privilege which will be sold under the conditions is the right to sell only arrack by retail, and does not include the right to sell toddy.

Tenderers who cannot speak English and wish to communicate with the Board must bring their own interpreters.

No tender will be considered unless the tenderer is present in person or by his authorized agent at the Council Chamber, and is prepared to deposit forthwith the amount of one month's rent as tendered by him.

In the event of two or more tenders being for an equal amount, the Board shall have the option of forthwith offering the rent for sale by public auction—the bidding to be restricted to the tenderers in question—or of calling for fresh tenders.

The Board do not bind themselves to accept the highest or any tender.

And notice is hereby further given that the purchasers of the Arrack Rents of the Four Gravets of Colombo (Fort excepted) and of the Four Gravets of Galle will be required to pay, in terms of the provision of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1892, a stamp duty of Rs. 500 for each and every license issued under Ordinance No. 13 of 1891 to sell arrack by retail at each and every tavern situated within the limits of the Municipalities of Colombo and Galle.

Forms of tender can be obtained free of charge on application personally or by letter to the Hon. the Controller of Revenue.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. Whenever it shall be determined to establish a public market, the Board shall give not less than ten days' notice of the time when the same will be opened, and such notice shall be published by beat of tom-tom.

2. No person shall without a license granted by the Board publicly expose for sale any meat, poultry, fresh fish, fresh fruit, or vegetables in any place within the limits of the Board other than the public market; and it shall be lawful for the Inspector of the Board to seize any such meat, poultry, fresh fish, fresh fruit, and vegetables exposed or hawked about for sale contrary to the provisions of this by-law, and to remove the same to the office of the Board to be disposed of as may be ordered by the Chairman or Police Magistrate or the President of a Village Tribunal.

3. A table of rents and fees leviable at each market shall be printed in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil and placed in a conspicuous place at each market. It shall be unlawful for any person to demand or receive higher sums than those authorized by such notice.

4. The several rents and fees payable in respect of a public market shall be paid in advance from time to time on demand to the Board, or its lessee, or other persons authorized by the Board, or their lessees to receive the same.

5. If any person liable to the payment of any rent or fees authorized as aforesaid does not pay the same when demanded, the Board, or any person authorized by the Board to collect the same, may levy the same by seizure and sale of all or any of the articles in the market belonging to or in the possession of the person liable to pay such rent or fee.

6. No person shall sell or expose for sale in any fish market or stall any provisions or things other than fresh fish.

7. No person shall sell or expose for sale in any vegetable or fruit market or stall any meat or fish, whether fresh or salted, or any cooked food, or any articles other than fresh fruit and vegetables.

8. Every occupant of a stall or seat in any market shall keep such stall or seat clean and free from filth or rubbish. No person affected with, or suffering from, cutaneous, contagious, or infectious disease shall occupy any stall, seat, or place in any public market, or expose for sale thereat any provisions whatsoever.

9. No person using or occupying any public market shall—

- (a) Behave in a disorderly manner or commit any nuisance in or about such market.
- (b) Carry on any cooking in any such market.
- (c) Remain in or loiter about such market after the place is closed for business at 9 P.M. without being able to give a satisfactory account of himself.
- (d) Damage or in any way deface any portion of the buildings, stalls, lamps, or any property of the Board in or about such market, or defile or pollute in any way the water provided for use in such market.

10. It shall be lawful for the Inspector of the Board upon the seizure by him as unwholesome or unfit for human food of any meat, poultry, fish, game, vegetable, fruit, or other article of food introduced into or exposed for sale within the limit of the Sanitary Board, to convey the same to the Medical Officer of the station, or in his absence, or if there be no such officer, to the Magistrate, or in cases where there is no Police Court, to the President of a Village Tribunal; and if it appear to such Medical Officer, Magistrate, or President that such meat, poultry, fish, game, vegetable, fruit, or other provisions are unfit for human food, he shall order the same to be destroyed, or to be disposed of so as to prevent it being exposed for sale or used for such food.

11. All public markets shall be open daily from 6 A.M. to 9 P.M., and it shall be the duty of the Board to make provision for the proper lighting of the market.

12. It shall be the duty of the market-keeper or of the lessee of the market to maintain order within the limits of the market. Every person who shall obstruct or resist any person appointed by the Board to superintend any public market or to collect the rents or fees or to enforce order or cleanliness therein whilst in the execution of his duty shall be guilty of an offence.

13. Whenever it shall appear to the Board that the use or consumption by the public of any particular kind of fish is injurious, or that during the prevalence of any epidemic the use or consumption of any particular kind of fruit or vegetable is hurtful, it shall be lawful for the Board, on the recommendation of the Medical Officer, by beat of tom-tom or other sufficient notice, to prohibit for such time as to the Board shall appear necessary the sale of any such fish, fruit, or vegetable in any market or other place within the limits of the Board; and after such notice to cause the same, whether exposed for sale or not, to be seized and destroyed in such manner as the Board or Chairman may direct.

14. No person shall throw any rubbish, refuse, bones, skins of animals, or other such thing in or upon any public market or its premises, except into a receptacle provided for such purpose.

Examination for the Local Division of the Civil Service of Ceylon.

1. An Examination for admission to the Local Division of the Civil Service will be held in Colombo in or about December next. The prospects and conditions of the Service are set out in the Minutes governing the Local Division of the Civil Service published in the *Government Gazette* of February 17, 1911. The number of persons to be selected at this Examination will be two.

2. No person will be admitted to compete who has not received a nomination from His Excellency the Governor.

3. Applications for nominations should be sent to the Principal Assistant Colonial Secretary—the envelope to be marked “Local Division, Civil Service”—on or before April 30. No question as to the delay or loss in the post of any such application can be entertained.

4. Nominations will be limited to candidates who have passed the Senior Standard of the Cambridge Local Examination, the London Matriculation, or any other public examination which may be deemed to be of an equally high standard.

5. Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof—

(a) That he is a natural born British subject born in Ceylon of parents permanently resident in the Island.

(b) That at least 19 years and not more than 23 years have elapsed since the date of his birth on January 1, 1912.

(c) That he is of good moral character.

6. Applicants should attach to their applications—

(1) Birth certificate.

(2) A certificate of character from the head of the school at which the applicant was educated.

(3) A statement showing where he was educated, examinations passed, degrees taken, &c., present occupation, and how he has spent the time since he left school.

(4) A medical certificate that the applicant is of sound constitution, possessed of good sight, and otherwise physically qualified for the Service.

(5) Particulars of property possessed by the applicant, showing the situation and nature of the land or property. It should also be stated in the case of landed property whether it is ancestral or recently acquired.

(6) Any athletic distinctions obtained by the applicant should be stated, also whether the applicant is a Volunteer, and whether he is able to ride.

7. All candidates after nomination will be required to undergo a medical examination by a Board before the examination by the Civil Service Commissioners. The fee for the medical examination will be Rs. 10.50. The fee for the examination will be Rs. 50.

8. The examinations will be conducted by the Civil Service Commissioners, and the following is a list of the subjects in which candidates will be examined:—

Candidates may take up two, and not more than two, of the voluntary subjects, and not more than one from each of the groups (a), (b), and (c).

Syllabus of Subjects.

Note.—No text books will be prescribed for any subject.

ENGLISH.

English Language and Composition.—The subject will include—

(a) A subject for an essay to be chosen by each candidate from several subjects set. Those proposed may include some having reference to Geography and History, and some involving an acquaintance with English authors, as well as more abstract subjects, the main object being to test power of expression, thought and arrangement, general reading, and knowledge. (All candidates will be expected to attempt the essay, to which special importance is attached.)

(b) Questions testing knowledge and command of English. These may include questions on précis writing, paraphrase, and analysis of sentences.

(c) Questions testing general reading and knowledge of English books.

MATHEMATICS, CLASS I.

Arithmetic.—The ordinary rules, with applications more specially to the mensuration of plane figures and solids. The metric system, and the use of decimals in approximate calculation; contracted methods. The use and theory of recurring decimals are not required, and candidates are at liberty to use algebraic symbols and formulas and tables of logarithms.

Geometry.—Plane geometry, theoretical and practical, not excluding simple problems in three dimensions. Proportion may be treated arithmetically; the special treatment of incommensurables is not required.

Algebra.—Including graphs of the simpler algebraic functions; quadratic equations; use of graphs in solving equations, and in illustrating and solving practical questions; rate of variation of a function and gradient or slope of a graph; graphic interpolation; indices and the simpler properties of surds.

Trigonometry.—Up to and including solution of plane triangles; graphs of trigonometrical functions.

Grasp of elementary principles and readiness in practical application will be looked for, but no great analytical skill will be demanded. Numerical results should be given to a few significant figures, and rough checks on the accuracy of the results should be applied. Neatness and accuracy of working are expected, and sufficient indication of the method of solution to make the work immediately intelligible. The examination will include laboratory work. Acquaintance is expected with the balance and steel-yard, and with the method of finding volume by weighing in air and in water. An idea of the range of the questions which will be set at the laboratory examination may be obtained from the laboratory questions set under Mathematics, Class I., at recent examinations for junior appointments in the Home Civil Service, and shown in reprints of the examination papers published by Messrs. Wyman & Sons, Fetter Lane, London, E.C.

LATIN.

The paper will include (1) questions on grammar; (2) unprepared passages for translation into English, with questions; (3) one or more easy unprepared passages for translation into English, a vocabulary of unfamiliar words being given; (4) one or more unprepared passages of ordinary difficulty for translation into English; (5) easy sentences for translation into Latin; (6) one or more continuous passages for translation into Latin.

BOOKKEEPING AND ACCOUNTING.

Knowledge of the general principles of Bookkeeping and Accounting. Bookkeeping by double entry.

MATHEMATICS, CLASS II.

Includes Mathematics, Class I., together with Mechanics. The principles of the lever, the inclined plane, the composition of forces and virtual work, their experimental investigation and application to machines and other simple cases of equilibrium. Centre of gravity, couple or torque, velocity ratio, mechanical advantage or force—ratio, work, efficiency.

Application to liquids and gases. Density. Boyle's Law. Pump, siphon, barometer, manometer. Velocity, acceleration, momentum, force, impulse of a force, energy, power or rate of work. The examination in Mathematics, Class II., will include laboratory work. An idea of the range of the questions which will be set at the laboratory examination may be obtained from the laboratory questions set under Mathematics, Class II., at recent examinations for junior appointments in the Home Civil Service, and shown in reprints of the examination papers published by Messrs. Wyman & Sons, Fetter Lane, London, E.C.

CHEMISTRY.

The following outline indicates the range of the examination:—

I.—*Written.*

The methods which lead to the discovery of the composition of common materials occurring in nature.

The determination of molecular weights, equivalents, and of atomic weights. Valency and structural formulæ.

Classification of the elements, including the Periodic Scheme.

General characters of the chief types of compounds, including acids, bases, and salts and a few prominent carbon compounds, especially as illustrating the relations of properties to composition and structure. No distinction will be admitted between Organic and Inorganic Chemistry.

History, production and properties of the more important and typical elements and their most familiar compounds.

The character of chemical changes, including combustion, thermal dissociation, and electrolysis; the conditions which determine and influence them, and the attendant phenomena.

The whole to be treated in an elementary manner.

Candidates will be required to show that they have seen and practised a great variety of experiments, and are familiar with the appearance of common laboratory materials.

II.—*Practical Examination.*

Candidates will be required to show that they are familiar with easy quantitative operations, gravimetric and volumetric, with the rudiments of qualitative analysis, and that they have prepared a number of elements or compounds by processes involving the manipulation of gases and the purification of substances by crystallization, distillation, &c. Candidates must bring to the practical examination the notebooks which contain the record of the experimental work they have performed. Specimens made by the candidate, duly attested by the teacher, if any, may also be submitted to the examiners.

PHYSICS.

The following Syllabus indicates the general scope and character of the examination, without being exhaustive of all parts of the subject. Candidates are expected to show a general acquaintance with the apparatus by which the elementary principles of Physics are illustrated and applied :—

General Properties of Solids, Liquids, and Gases.—Relation between Volume and Pressure in Gases.

Heat.—Definition of Temperature. Construction and use of Instruments for the measurement of Temperature.

Dew-point. Formation of Cloud, Fog, and Dew.

Conduction. Definition of Thermal Conductivity.

Radiation : its Emission, Propagation, Reflection, Refraction, and Absorption ; its Relation to Light.

The Mechanical Equivalent of Heat and Modes of Determination. The Conservation of Energy.

Sound.—The Production and Propagation of Sound.

Nature of Wave-motion. Amplitudes. Wave-length. Frequency.

Experimental determination of the Velocity of Sound in Air. Echoes. Effect of change of Temperature on the Velocity.

Determination of Frequency by simple methods.

Experimental investigation of the modes of Vibration of Strings by means of the Sonometer.

Experimental investigation of the Vibrations of Air in Pipes by Resonance to Tuning Forks.

Organ Pipes. Position of Nodes and Antinodes.

Optics.—Propagation of Light. Measurement of Velocity. Laws of Reflection and Refraction. Photometry

Reflection at Plane and Spherical Surfaces, and the formation of Images.

Refraction at Plane Surfaces and by Prisms. Minimum deviation. Chromatic dispersion.

The formation of Images by single Lenses. Long and Short Sight and their correction by Lenses.

The Combination of Two Lenses to form a simple Telescope or Microscope.

Magnetism and Electricity.—Properties of Magnets. Simple Phenomena of Magnetism and of Magnetic Induction (Influence).

The Magnetic Field. Lines of Force. The Law of Magnetic Force.

The Earth as a Magnet.

The Simpler Phenomena of Electrified Bodies. Conduction and Insulation. Electrification by Friction and by Induction (Influence).

Distribution of Electrification on Conductors.

Electric Field. Strength of Field.

The Law of Electric Force.

Potential. Capacity. Energy of Charge.

Electric Discharge and Electric Current.

Primary and Secondary Batteries.

GEOGRAPHY AND HISTORY. (*Two Papers.*)

Geography.—Questions on descriptive and general geography.

History.—The general course of English History and the development of the British Empire, from the accession of Henry VII. to the present time, with a more detailed knowledge of the reign of Queen Victoria.

SINHALESE.

Translation of passages from Sinhalese into English and from English into Sinhalese. Questions on Grammar. A fair knowledge of Sinhalese literature will be expected. An oral examination will also be held locally, in which candidates will be tested as to their ability to interpret from Sinhalese into English and *vice versa*.

TAMIL.

Translation of passages from Tamil into English and from English into Tamil. Questions of Grammar. A fair knowledge of Tamil literature will be expected. An oral examination will also be held locally, in which candidates will be tested as to their ability to interpret from Tamil into English and *vice versa*.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 23, 1912.

Births.—The total births registered in the City of Colombo in the week were 108 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 65 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 16 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1912, viz., 223,353) was 25·3, as against 23·9 in the preceding week, 22·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26·0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 126 (0 Europeans, 3 Burghers, 61 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 26 Moors, 6 Malays, and 1 Other). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29·5, as against 31·1 in the previous week, 30·1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 35·2 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 126 total deaths, 27 were of infants under one year of age, as against 34 in the preceding week, 40 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Selected Causes of Death.—Twenty deaths were registered from *Pneumonia*, as against 31 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year, of which 6 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 4 in Kotahena, 3 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, and 2 each in Pettah and San Sebastian. Three deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

2. Eighteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis*, as in the previous week and against 14 the weekly average for last year, of which 4 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 in Kollupitiya, 2 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Slave Island, and Wellawatta, and 1 each in Kotahena, New Bazaar, and Maradana hospitals.

3. Six deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever*, as against 4 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year, of which 3 were in Kotahena and 1 each in Maradana hospitals, Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and San Sebastian. There were 17 cases reported during the week, against 22 in the previous week.

4. Thirteen deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 10 from *Debility* (5 infants), 8 from *Senility*, 7 from *Tetanus* (3 infants), 6 from *Diarrhœa* (1 infant), 3 each from *Prematurity* (all infants) and *Anchylostomiasis*, 2 each from *Enteritis* (1 infant), *Apoplexy*, *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and *Malaria*, and 20 from *Other Causes*.

5. Twenty-four cases of *Measles* were reported, against 3 in the previous week; and twenty of *Chickenpox*, against 30 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82·9°, against 83·1° in the preceding week and 82·3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·856 in., against 29·820 in. in the preceding week and 29·994 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·81 in., against 0·48 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
