SEASON REPORTS FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1912.

WESTERN PROVINCE.

COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Maha : the crop has now been reaped. Yala : the fields are now being ploughed.

Dry grain : nil. Other products : oranges, pineapples, breadfruits are scarce. Vegetables can be had at a moderate price. The price of coconuts varies between Rs. 60 and Rs. 75 per 1,000. Owing to the drought the flowering is very slow. Price of staple products : imported rice is sold from Rs. 4.50 to Rs. 6.50 per bushel according to the quality.

Remarks on harvest prospects generally : the drought has caused some damage.

Rainfall : There have been a few showers of rain during the month.

Health of the inhabitants : generally good. There were a few cases of chickenpox in the villages.

Cattle disease : rinderpest prevailed in Siyane Korale East, Hewagam, and Alutkuru Korale South. The disease is on the decrease.

KALUTARA DISTRICT.

CENTRAL PROVINCE. KANDY DISTRICT.

Paddy, maha : paddy in crop. Yala : nil.

Dry grain, maha : hill paddy in crop. Yala : nil.

Rainfall : insufficient for cultivation.

Food supply : rice, Rs. 4 to Rs. 6 per bushel ; paddy, Rs. 2 to Rs. 2 25 per bushel ; fine grain, Re. 1 to Rs. 2 50 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 4.50 to Rs. 12 per 100.

AGREEMENT OF LEASE.

An agreement entered into the ------ day of -----, between -----, Government Agent of the Western An agreement entered into the <u>day of</u> <u>day of</u>, between <u>sources</u>, Government Agent of the Western Province, for and on behalf of Our Sovereign Lord the King (hereinafter called the lessor, which expression shall include his successors in office for the time being), of the one part, and <u>sourcession</u>, of <u>(hereinafter called the lessee</u>, which expression shall include his heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns), of the other part, by which the parties hereto agree as follows :---

1. The lessor on behalf of the Crown agrees to let and demise and the lessee to take all that allotment of Crown land, -, particularized in the schedule hereto, and containing in the whole --. together situated at ---------- in -----with all ways, waters, easements, and appurtenances thereto belonging or usually occupied or enjoyed therewith, for the term of ______ years from the ______ day of ______ for the gross sum of Rupees ______, of which one-tenth portion, to wit, Rupees ______, was paid by the lessee to the lessor on the ______ day of ______ last, the receipt of which the lessor doth hereby acknowledge, and the remaining nine-tenths (hereinafter called the rent) shall be paid by the lessee to the lessor by equal quarterly payments on the ---- day of -------, the ----— day of – . the day of _____ next, and the last to be made in advance one calendar month before - in every year of the said term, the first of such quarterly - day of -------, and the -– day of – payments to be made on the . the expiration of the said term.

FFERS, marked on the envelopes "Purchase of Timber," will be received by the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Batticaloa Division, Batticaloa, up to midday on Monday, March 4, 1912, for the purchase of all unmarked and unnumbered trees, poles, warichchies, &c., standing within the 209 acre block in the Kanthalai Forest Reserve, to the north of and between the 7th and 8th mileposts, Kandy road, Trincomalee District, which will be pointed out by the Subdivisional Forest Officer, Trincomalee. Purchasers proposing to make an offer are requested to inspect the block preparatory to making the offer.

Any intending purchaser must make an offer for all 2 the unmarked and unnumbered trees, poles, &c., standing within the 209 acre block.

3. Offers must be made on forms obtained from the Office of the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Batticaloa, on a deposit of Rs. 20 being made in the Trincomalee or Batticaloa Kachcheti, and no offer will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the offers may be treated as informal and rejected.

Should the person tendering decline or fail to pay the 4. required deposit and sign the agreement within 10 days of receiving notice in writing from the Head of the Department, or his duly authorized representative, that his offer has been accepted, the deposit mentioned in clause 3 shall be for-feited to the Crown.

The felling and removal of numbered or marked trees standing within the 209 acre block will constitute an offence punishable under the Forest Ordinance or Penal Code, and a termination of the monopoly and forfeiture of all sums paid.

Should the purchaser fail to pay the sums due on 11. due date, or decline to carry out the work within 10 days of receiving notice in writing from the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Batticaloa Division, Batticaloa, the sum deposited will be forfeited to the Crown, and the timber and firewood will be sold at the risk of the purchaser.
