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### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, February 10, 1912.

The Council met this day at 2 P.M., pursuant to notice dated February 5, 1912.

*Present:* The Hon. Mr. C. M. Lushington, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonawardena; Mr. H. F. Tomalin; Mr. F. Perera; Mr. D. W. Subasingha; Mr. S. H. Titley; Mr. C. E. de Vos; and Mr. G. E. Abeywardena.

The Minutes of the General Meeting held on January 13, 1912, copies of which were sent to each member, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on January 13, 1912, be confirmed.

Before the proceedings for the day commenced, the Chairman addressed the Council with regard to certain questions and motions put at the last Meeting of Council and those to be put before them to-day.

As the Council considered that the questions should not remain unanswered, the business on the agenda was taken up in due course.

1. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. E. de Vos asked:—

(1) Whether, and if so how often, the drains and sewers of the Fort are cleaned out, flushed, and disinfected?

The Chairman replied that the drains are cleaned out, flushed, and disinfected once a day, and that the sewers are cleaned periodically once a year. Certain sewers were cleaned in December and January last.

(2) Whether scavenging is done daily in the alleys and lanes in the Fort, and if so at what hours?

The Chairman replied that the alleys and lanes in the Fort were scavenged daily between 1.30 and 3.30 P.M.

(3) Whether a more satisfactory method of removing night soil in the carts cannot be introduced?

The Chairman replied that the present method could not be improved upon without considerable expenditure. The work was reorganized a few years ago and placed under the direct control of the Medical Officer of Health, who says that the only means of improving it is by the adoption of the water-carriage system.

(4) How many prosecutions were entered in the year 1911 under the muzzling regulations?

The Chairman replied that ten prosecutions were entered under the dog muzzling regulations since it came into force in July, 1911, and that 927 dogs were destroyed during 1911.

(5) How many prosecutions were entered in the year 1911 with regard to carts and other vehicles not observing the rule of the road?

The Chairman replied that 194 prosecutions were entered.

(6) What, if any, steps are being taken to prevent the erosion of the sea in Victoria park?

The Chairman replied that a sum of Rs. 250 was spent in stone pitching in 1909, and that similar action will be taken during the current year.

2. Pursuant to notice Mr. D. W. Subasingha asked :—Has the one-tenth paid by the purchaser of the fish auction shed on October 5, 1911, been forfeited; if not that steps be taken by this Council to recover same—Mr. F. Perera seconded.

The Chairman replied that the one-tenth referred to was not forfeited as there was no loss to the Council by reason of the re-sale. The motion was put to the meeting and lost by 6 to 2, the mover and seconder only voting in favour of the motion.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. D. W. Subasingha moved—As the informations on my questions at the last meeting *re* the fish auction shed does not appear to be consistent with what has actually happened, that a Committee be appointed to inquire into and report on the sale of its lease.

There being no seconder the motion fell to the ground.

4. The first Supplemental Budget for 1912, as published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,486, dated January 26, 1912, and circulated among the Councillors in terms of section 100 of the Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, was approved.

5. Letter No. 348, dated February 2, 1912, from the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, *re* improvements to Galle Railway station.

Read and resolved that the Chairman do communicate with the Manager further on the subject.

Resolved—That that the fixing of a water meter to St. Aloysius' College be waived.

1. Papers *re* complaint of scavenging contractor *re* fines imposed on him and for payment of additional work done. Resolved—(1) That the sum of Rs. 176 paid for the rubbish for 1912 by Cunji Bawa Rahaman be refunded to him; (2) that the rubbish be given to the scavenging contractor to be deposited in an approved place and in accordance with the requirements during 1912 on payment of a sum of Rs. 81; (3) that the rubbish be the property of the scavenging contractor in future, to be deposited in an approved place in accordance with the requirements contained in the present lease; (4) that householders be informed of the requirements of Chapter X., rule 3, of the by-laws and directed to place their rubbish receptacles in suitable places for removal by the scavenging carts; (5) (i.) that householders should inform this Council whenever the removal of large quantities of rubbish (not containable in the ordinary receptacles referred to in (4)) is required to be removed, when on prepayment of a sum of Re. 1.25 for each double bullock cart load, orders will be issued to the contractor for the immediate removal of such rubbish; (5) (ii.) that whenever such large quantities of rubbish are required to be removed by the Council's officers, written orders should be issued to the contractor, who will be paid the above sum on production of such orders; (5) (iii.) that the sum of Re. 1.25 be paid to the scavenging contractor on the certificate of a responsible officer that such large quantities of rubbish as he has been required to remove has been promptly and efficiently done, otherwise the contractor will be liable to the full penalty under his contract; (5) (iv.) that the above be given a trial for six months; (6) that the terms of future contracts be amended so as to contain the requirements of (3) and (4); and (7) that the scavenging contractor be paid a sum of Rs. 300 as compensation for additional work done to end of February, 1912.

Resolved—That the sale be not approved, the Chairman dissenting.

## Report of the Medical Officer of Health for the Month of February, 1912.

Scavenging was not satisfactory.

Drainage.—Not satisfactory. Water from the stand posts stagnate in the unbuilt drains and afford facilities for the breeding of mosquitoes.

Water supply.—The analyst reported that the water supplied from Hiyare is fit for human consumption.

Alleys were kept clean.

Bakeries were kept clean.

Markets were well kept.

Cattle.—256 cattle and 123 goats were passed during the month.

Slaughter-house and cattle shed were well kept.

Latrines were well kept.

Mosquito Brigade.—Gardens in China Garden, along Dicken's road, Cripps road, Kandewatta road were cleaned.

General Health.—Three cases of dysentery, seven of enteric fever, and one of continued fever, and eleven of chickenpox were reported during the month.

Robert Derry.—"Improvements in or relating to the curing of India rubber."

*Abstract.*—This invention relates to apparatus for curing and coagulating latex, by the action of heat and smoke. The apparatus consists of a heating and smoking chamber or of separate heating and smoking chambers, through which the latex is conveyed by an endless flexible belt. The latex is contained in a vessel outside the heating and smoking chamber; and the flexible belt dips into that vessel and carries a thin film of the latex along with it.
