MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on
February 17, 1912, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated February 13, 1912.

Present: The Hon. Mr. G. S. Saxton, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. W. C. Price;
Mr. J. H. de Saram, C.M.G.; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Mr. D. E. Weerasooria.

The minutes of proceedings of the meeting held on January 20 having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1911 to January 31, 1912, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water-rate Accounts.
- Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- Health Officer's report for January.
- Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of January.
- The reservoir readings for January.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Council's Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's report be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during January.

4. Correspondence:—

(1) Circular No. 4 of January 31 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* Government Telephone Exchange and system of working official trunk calls.—Read.

(2) Letter No. 170 of February 1 from the Chairman, Provincial Road Committee, intimating that the Meda-ela bridge requires urgent repairs and asking the Council to contribute one-third (Rs. 45) of estimated cost of building a protecting wall.

Resolved—That the amount be voted for the purpose.

(3) Letter No. 151 of February 1, 1912, from the Director of Public Works, *re* Hantana roadside drains opposite new police quarters.—Read.

(4) Letter of February 1 and February 6 from the Hon. Mr. L. W. Booth and Mr. C. S. Vaughan, respectively, acknowledging with thanks receipt of letter forwarding copy of resolution *re* appreciation of services as Chairman.—Read.

(5) Letter of February 10 from Mr. D. Fairweather *re* aquatic birds for Kandy lake.

Resolved—That Mr. Fairweather be thanked and the birds accepted as a gift unconditionally.

(6) Letter of February 9 from Mr. K. J. Saunders applying for a site on Roseneath estate for the proposed institution for the deaf and the blind.

Resolved—That the lessee be written to and, if he consents, the matter be referred to a Special Committee consisting of Messrs. de Saram, Price, and the Chairman.

(7) Memorandum of February 10 from the Secretary, Municipal Council, Kandy, *re* recovery of dues for water consumed in excess of allowance.

Resolved—That all arrears prior to third quarter, 1911, be written off and the payment of all sums due as meter rent and for water consumed in excess of regulation allowance enforced in terms of the by-laws regulating the water supply.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Saram moved—For a statement in detail of the duties performed by the Chief Inspector both in that capacity and as a Ward Inspector. Mr. Beven—seconded.

Resolved—That the statement called for be furnished.

6. Report of the Special Committee appointed to revise the duties of the Municipal Clerical Staff.

Resolved—That the report be adopted subject to the following amendments:—

(1) Duties of the Secretary: Delete No. 24.

(2) Duties of the Superintendent of Works: (a) Delete No. 13; (b) in No. 14 omit "of night soil," and also "night soil" and.

(3) Duties of the Correspondence Clerk: Delete Nos. 19 and 20, and add them to the list of duties of the license clerk.

Health Officer's Report for the Month of February, 1912.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town was satisfactorily done during the month.

Water Supply.—Good.

Drainage.—The drains were flushed and kept clean.

Alleys.—These were kept in as sanitary a state as possible.

Bakeries.—Fairly well kept.

Eating-houses.—Fairly well kept.

Public Market.—Fairly well kept.

Slaughter-house.—Clean and well kept.

Night-soil Depot.—Well kept.

Public Latrines.—Fairly well kept.

Food Supply.—There is a scarcity of cattle at present. This is due, the butchers report, to the quarantine regulations in force with regard to the importation of cattle from India. Fewer cattle are imported from India, and Colombo butchers now compete with them in the purchase of cattle from Minneriya and Kurunegala, the two districts from which they mainly obtained their supply. During the month 550 cattle, 85 buffaloes, 110 sheep and 295 goats were passed; 11 head of cattle, 5 buffaloes, 3 sheep, and 6 goats were rejected. 2 livers and 6 lungs of cattle, 5 livers and 2 lungs of buffaloes, 5 livers and 2 lungs of sheep, and 5 livers 34 lungs of goats were condemned and destroyed.

Public Health.—The health of the town during the month was good. One case of continued fever over seven days' duration, 3 cases of chickenpox, and 15 cases of enteric fever were reported. Of the last, 13 out of the 15 cases reported were from the Girls' Industrial school, Katukele. A little girl was sent in from Madulkele suffering from fever, which was thought to be malaria; the case was one of enteric fever, and the other 12 contracted the disease from her.

Vaccination.—A male vaccinator was engaged during the month to vaccinate the residents at Lewella and those coming into the town, as smallpox was prevailing at Gunnapana. The vaccinator is at present working in the town. The total number vaccinated during the month is 300.

NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specifications have been accepted:—

No. 1,230 of December 22, 1911.

John Anderson.—"Improvements in feathering wind sails or propellers, applicable for wind mills, air ships and other purposes."

Abstract.—The type of propeller described in the Specification is that type which was formerly known as a paddle wheel with feathering paddles. The invention relates to mechanism for feathering the paddles in a manner which is claimed to be an improvement on known methods of doing that. Instead of feathering the paddles by a uniform speed of revolution about their own axes as the wheel revolves, the paddles are accelerated in their revolution at certain points and retarded at others with the object of keeping the paddles in a position normal to the driving (or driven) direction for a longer fraction of the time of one revolution of the wheel. The mechanism for doing that consists of a system of linkage driven by cranks and guided in frames; with epicyclic wheels transmitting motion to the cranks from gearing on the central shaft through chains and sprocket wheels.

No. 1,240 of March 14, 1912.

Arthur Reginald Angus.—"Improvements in or relating to railway safe running devices."

Abstract.—These improvements are specially devised to provide means for automatically locking or unlocking the points or switches on railway tracks either by the train or from a signal box or the like and ensuring that the same are safe for the train to run over. It being sought first to give an intimation or warning to the driver on the train as to whether the sections of track adjacent to and including the points or switches are safe or not safe to run over, and if unsafe to stop the train automatically. The intimations or warnings are visual or audible or both. And the train is automatically stopped by the steam being shut off and the brakes applied. The means for doing that are electrical and mechanical: the chief apparatus being contact shoes for the rails, which are bonded in sections so as to make part of an electric circuit; and an electric generator on the train. The various devices for locking and unlocking switches and for providing against failure of the circuit are described.

The invention is an adaptation to points and switches of the type of apparatus described in the same inventor's previous Patents Nos. 1,179, 1,180, 1,181, and 1,192 for preventing collision between trains.
