GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

IT is hereby notified for general information that Her Majesty the Queen has, by Order in Council dated the 17th instant, been pleased to rescind from and after the 19th instant so much of the Order in Council of February 6, 1892—published in the Ceylon Government Gazette Fxtraordinary of the 25th June, 1892—as constituted the rupee of Portuguese India legal tender in Ceylon, and that the said rupee is accordingly demonetised, and is no longer legal tender in Ceylon from and after the 19th instant. Such coins may, however, be exchanged for rupees of British India at any Government Treasury or Kachchéri in the Colony until the 24th instant inclusive.
