PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir EDWARD NOEL WALKER, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by section 8 of "The Road Ordinance, 1861," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to declare that any road, canal, or river shall be deemed to be a principal thoroughfare for the purposes of the said Ordinance, and such road, canal, or river shall, from the time specified in such Proclamation, be deemed to be a principal thoroughfare accordingly:

And whereas it is expedient to declare the road mentioned in the schedule hereto a principal thoroughfare for the purposes of the said Ordinance :

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the road mentioned in the schedule hereto shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, be deemed to be a principal thoroughfare as from and after the First day of January, One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-four.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Nineteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-three.

WHEREAS by section 85 of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, intituled "An Ordinance for the General Regulation of Customs in the Island of Ceylon," it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation appoint any place to be a haven, creek, port, or warehousing port in this Colony, and declare the limits thereof, or annul the limits of any port, haven, or creek already appointed, or to be hereafter appointed, and declare the same to be no longer a port, warehousing port, haven, or creek; and that all ports, warehousing ports, havens, and creeks, and the respective limits thereof, appointed and existing as such at the time of the passing of the said Ordinance, should continue to be such ports, havens, and creeks until annulled or altered as aforesaid :

And whereas the town of Balapitimodera, in the Southern Province, is a port duly appointed within certain specified limits, and was existing as such at the time of the passing of the said Ordinance:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to annul the limits of the said port and declare the same to be no longer a port for the purposes of the said Ordinance :

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, do by this Our Proclamation annul the limits of the said port of Balapitimodera aforesaid, and declare the same, as from and after the First day of August next, to be no longer a port for the purposes of the said Ordinance.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, May 27, 1893, at 8.30 o'clock a.m.

Present.-Hon. P. A. Templer, Chairman : R. D. Ormsby, Esq.; J. B. Siebel, Esq. ; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; J. N. d'Esterre, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; F. van Langenberg, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on April 22 were read and confirmed.

2. The following documents were laid on the table :-General Statements of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund, also separate Statements of Receipts and Disbursements in respect of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate accounts from close of 1892 to April 30; Progress Report of Work done brought up to the same date; Statement of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during April, and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the same period; also report by the Health Officer.

Resolved,-That the General Statements of Receipts and Disbursements and Progress Report of Work done, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, be forwarded to Government, as required by section 90 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, and also the Health Officer's report.

3. Mr. Ormsby put the following question, of which notice had been given :--What steps, if any, are being taken to provide funds for the extension of the water supply to the houses at the upper end of the lake ?

Reply :- The Chairman stated that the matter had been under the consideration of the Standing Committee, and that at a meeting held this day the following resolution had been adopted, which he now brought forward for the information of the Council, though it had not been possible to enter it on the Order of the Day for the present meeting :---

"That the Secretary be instructed to lay out on the ground the line to be followed by the main pipes, and to prepare an accurate estimate of cost of purchasing the mains and fittings, and of laying the same, and to submit the same at the next meeting, with a view to tenders for the execution of the work being called for."

It was proposed by Mr. J. H. Sproule, seconded by Mr. E. Beven, "that effect at once be given to the recommendation of the Standing Committee."

On being put to the meeting the resolution was adopted, Mr. d'Esterre desiring to record his objection, as he considered it irregular to bring forward the motion at this meeting.

4. Read application by the Honorary Secretary of the A B C D Club, dated March 16, for permission to erect a pavilion inside the recreation ground, with recommendation of the Standing Committee that the necessary permission be granted.

Proposed by Mr. J. H. Sproule, seconded by Mr. F. van Langenberg, "that the recommendation of the Stand-ing Committee be adopted, and that the A B C D Club be granted permission to erect a pavilion on the site indicated and shown on the plan sketch attached to the application, subject to the payment of a ground rent of Rs. 5 per mensem to the Municipal Council, payable quarterly in advance; that the building be removed when required by the Council on six months' notice; that the cost of removal be borne by the Club, and the materials be considered the property of the Club; that the Municipal Council be held in no way liable for any claim to compensation for such removal.

Rules relating to Pensions to Officers of the Galle Municipality.

1. The Pension Minutes regarding the Civil Service of Ceylon shall be generally applicable to those officers of the Municipality of Galle who receive a salary of Rs. 250 a year and upwards.

2. No pension will be granted to any officer of the Municipal Council without the authority of the Governor, in order to obtain which certificates of service, age, good conduct, and of the ground of retirement must be submitted to the Colonial Secretary.

3. Subject to the provisions of rule 2, all officers of the Municipal Council of Galle on the Fixed. Establishment drawing a salary of Rs. 250 per annum and upwards shall be entitled to pension as follows :-----

Any officer who shall have served ten years and upwards, and under eleven years, shall receive an annual allowance of fifteen-sixtieths of the annual salary of his office; eleven years, and under twelve years, an annual allowance of sixteen-sixtieths of such salary; and in like manner a further addition to the annual allowance of one-sixtieth in respect of each additional year of such service, until the completion of a period of service of thirty-five years, when the annual allowance of forty-sixtieths may be granted; and no addition shall be made in respect of any service beyond thirty-five years.

4. No officer of the Municipal Council will be held to have an absolute right to compensation for past services or to any pension under these rules; and the Municipal Council will retain power and authority to dismiss any such officer without compensation.

5. No pension shall be granted to any officer of the Municipal Council who shall be under fifty-five years of age, unless upon certificate from the Chairman of the Municipal Council and from two medical practitioners that he is incapable, from infirmity of mind or body, to discharge the duties of his situation, nor unless he shall have discharged those dutes with diligence and fidelity to the satisfaction of the Chairman.

6. It will be competent to the Municipal Council, with the authority of the Governor, in cases of peculiar and extraordinary merit in respect of duties outside of those for which the officer has received a salary, to grant special and higher rates of pension than those laid down in these rules.

7. The above-mentioned rates are only to be granted in cases of decidedly faithful and meritorious service, but when the testimony as to fidelity, diligence, and merit is in any respect defective, a deduction will be made from the apportioned rates. Where there has been obvious negligence, irregularity, or misconduct, the grant of allowance will be altogether withheld.

8. The claim of an officer of the Municipal Council to pension will be considered to have commenced from the date of his first permanent appointment to the Fixed Establishment of the Municipal Council.

9. Every officer on the Provisional and Temporary Establishment will, in the event of transfer to the Fixed Establishment, be entitled to reckon his provisional and temporary service, when it has been continuous, with his subsequent permanent service.

10. The services in respect of which superannuation allowances are granted ought in all cases to have been continuous, unless interrupted by reduction of office or other temporary suspension of employment not arising from misconduct or voluntary resignation of the party.

11. The pension shall be computed upon the salary of the permanent office held by an officer of the Municipal Council at the time of his retirement, provided he shall have held such appointment for at least three years, otherwise the pension shall be calculated upon the average of the salaries attached to the permanent offices held by such person during the three years next preceding the commencement of such pension.

12. In case of suspension or reduction or abolition of office, temporary allowances may be assigned, agreeably to the specified rates, on condition, however, that the parties receiving the same will be liable to be recalled into service, and with the understanding that they are to be re-employed, as opportunity may offer, in preference to new applicants for office.

13. In the case of officers to whom temporary allowance may be assigned in accordance with rule 12 on the abolition or re-organisation of their offices, and who may be afterwards re-employed, one-half of the period during which they have been in the receipt of such allowance will be allowed to count towards pension on their final retirement.

14. In case of abolition of office, to persons who shall have served twenty years and upwards a period of ten years shall be added to their actual service in completing their retiring allowance.

To persons who shall have served under twenty years and not less than fifteen years, a period of seven years shall be added.

To persons who shall have served under fifteen years and not less than ten years, a period of five years shall be added.

To persons who shall have served under ten years and not less than five years, a gratuity shall be granted calculated at the rate of one month's pay for each year's service, with an additional allowance of three months' pay.

To persons who shall have served less than five years, a gratuity shall be awarded calculated at the rate of one month's pay for each year's service, with one month's pay added.

The number of years to be added to actual service on abolition of office should not be more than that which, if added to the age of the retiring officer, would make that age up to sixty, except that one year would be added in the case of an officer of sixty or more, unless the officer was quite disqualified for further service.

15. In the case of persons who, if they served the time granted by rule 14 for compensation, would be over fifty-five years, and who may retire through abolition of office, the provisions in rule 14 will not be binding on the Municipal Council, but each particular case will be decided according to the view that may be taken after a full consideration of all the circumstances attending it.

16. The period of service upon which the superannuation allowance of all officers of the Municipal Council taking leave of absence in the regular manner with abatement of salary will be calculated, will be at the rate of one month for every two months of such leave. Absences in excess of the period for which half salary may be allowed will not count as service.
17. Should the term of service not warrant the assignment of an annual allowance, a gratuity may be

17. Should the term of service not warrant the assignment of an annual allowance, a gratuity may be granted after the rate of one month's salary for each year of service. For a fractional part of a year's service exceeding six months half a month's salary will be added to the gratuity.

18. If any person, being in the receipt of any pension or superannuation allowance from the Municipal Council, shall be convicted of any offence in any court of justice in this Island, for which he shall be sentenced to death or to any term of imprisonment with hard labour exceeding twelve months, such pension or superannuation allowance shall forthwith determine and cease to be payable, unless such person shall, within three months after his conviction, receive a free pardon, or unless the Municipal Council shall otherwise order.

19. Every person hereafter appointed to any office under the Municipal Council in which a pension is granted on retirement may be required to retire from the service of the Municipal Council on or after attaining the age of fifty-five, upon the receipt of twelve months' notice to that effect; and all present officeholders 60 years of age or over, may similarly be required to retire from the service of the Municipal Council, upon the receipt of twelve months' notice to that effect.

THE following regulations made by the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under the provisions of section 36 of "The Forest Ordinance, 1885," for the management of the portions of forest specified in the schedule annexed to the Proclamation dated the 8th May, 1893, constituting such portions of forest a village forest for the benefit of the Village Community of Pannila, in the Pannil pattu of Atakalan kóralé, in the Ratnapura District of the Province of Sabaragamuwa, are published for general information.

Regulations referred to.

I. Rights of felling timber or collecting forest produce, or of pasturing cattle in a village forest, may be exercised only by the permanent residents of the village named in the Proclamation constituting such forest a village forest.

2. The under-mentioned trees may not be cut without the permission of a forest officer empowered to grant such permission, as provided in the Ordinance :-Buruta (satinwood), del, dun, hal, halmilla, hora, kalumediriya (calamander), kaluwara (ebony), kina (hill country), kos (jak), kumbuk, lunumidella, milla, na (ironwood), nedun, sapu (hill country), suriamara, tekka (teak).

3. No trees of any kind over one cubit in girth at four feet from the ground may be cut without a permit from the Ratémahatmayá.

4. Dead or fallen timber for firewood, sticks for fences and tool handles, and canes and creepers may be cut without a perwit.

5. No person may sell, barter, or give away any timber or forest produce taken from a village forest to persons outside of the village community.

6. No person may cut any timber or collect any forest produce in excess of his actual personal requirements at any one time, except to sell, barter, or give away to other members of the village community.

7. No person shall depasture cattle in the village forest in excess of the number required for his own use or that of his household.

IT is hereby notified for general information that HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN has, by Order in Council dated the 17th instant, been pleased to rescind from and after the 19th instant so much of the Order in Council of February 6, 1892—published in the Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary of the 25th June, 1892—as constituted the rupee of Portuguese India legal tender in Ceylon, and that the said rupee is accordingly demonetised, and is no longer legal tender in Ceylon from and after the 19th instant. Such coins may, however, be exchanged for rupees of British India at any Government Treasury or Kachchéri in the Colony until the 24th instant inclusive.
