#### BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. The Board may order cesspools to be closed and dry-earth closets substituted.— The Chairman when especially empowered thereto by resolution of the Board may, by notice in writing, require the owner or occupier of any house or building or land having a cesspool on his premises to close such cesspool and substitute a dry-earth closet therefor.

2. Permission to bury in private premises.—Permission may be granted in writing by the Chairman to any householder to have night soil from his own premises buried or otherwise disposed of on his own premises.

3. Removal of night soil to the depôt.—Every person (unless specially exempted in writing thereto by the Chairman under by-law 2) on whose premises the dry-earth system is in operation is hereby required to cause the daily removal of night soil to a depôt appointed by the Board for the disposal of the night soil.

4. Name of person removing night soil to be registered at the Board Office.—Any householder not having received written permission under by-law 2 may employ any person for the purpose of the removal and disposal of night soil. Provided that in the case of such private arrangements being entered into, the name of such person so employed shall be registered at the office of the Board, and the place to which the night soil shall be removed and the method and time of removal and the disposal thereof shall be submitted to the Board for approval.

5. Fee for removal of night soil —Every person employing a Local Board officer for the removal of night soil shall pay to the Board in advance such sum as shall be approved by the Board for each bucket in which such night soil is deposited on his premises for removal by such officer.

Notary Public of Alutgama, in the District of Kalutara, has been lawfully convicted of an offence which, in the opinion of the Governor in Executive Council, renders him unfit to be entrusted with any responsible office. His Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in terms of clause 19 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1907, cancelled the warrant of the said Notary.

Only those members who are actually on the rolls of a school or college will be allowed to serve. #### Maritime Conventions Act, 1911.

CHAPTER 57.

An Act to amend the Law relating to Merchant Shipping with a view to enabling certain Conventions to be carried into effect.

[December 16, 1911.]

WHEREAS at the Conference held at Brussels in the year Nineteen hundred and Ten two Conventions, dealing respectively with collisions between vessels and with salvage, were signed on behalf of His Majesty, and it is desirable, that such amendments should be made in the law relating to merchant shipping as will enable effect to be given to the **Conventions** :

Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

## Provisions as to Collisions, &c.

(1) Where, by the fault of two or more vessels, damage or loss is caused to one or more of those vessels, to their cargoes or freight, or to any property on board, the liability to make good the damage or loss shall be in proportion to the degree in which each vessel was in fault.

Provided that-

- (a) If, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, it is not possible to establish different degrees of fault, the liability shall be apportioned equally; and
- (b) Nothing in this section shall operate so as to render any vessel liable for any loss or damage to which her fault has not contributed; and
- (c) Nothing in this section shall affect the liability of any person under a contract of carriage or any contract, or shall be construed as imposing any liability upon any person from which he is exempted by any contract or by any provision of law, or as affecting the right of any person to limit his liability in the manner provided by law.

(2) For the purposes of this Act, the expression "freight" includes passage money and hire, and references to damage or loss caused by the fault of a vessel shall be construed as including references to any salvage or other expenses, consequent upon that fault, recoverable at law by way of damages.

2. Where loss of life or personal injuries are suffered by any person on board a vessel owing to the fault of that vessel and of any other vessel or vessels, the liability of the owners of the vessel shall be joint and several.

Provided that nothing in this section shall be construed as depriving any person of any right of defence on which, independently of this section, he might have relied in an action brought against him by the person injured, or any person or persons entitled to sue in respect of such loss of life, or shall affect the right of any person to limit his liability in cases to which this section relates in the manner provided by law.

3. (1) Where loss of life or personal injuries are suffered by any person on board a vessel owing to the fault of that vessel and any other vessel or vessels, and a proportion of the damages is recovered against the owners of one of the vessels which exceeds the proportion in which she was in fault, they may recover by way of contribution the amount of the exceeds from the owners of the other vessels or vessels to the extent to which those vessels were respectively in fault.

Provided that no amount shall be so recovered which could not, by reason of any statutory or contractual limitation of, or exemption from, liability, or which could not for any other reason, have been recovered in the first instance as damages by the persons entitled to sue therefor.

(2) In addition to any other remedy provided by law, the persons entitled to any such contribution as aforesaid shall, for the purpose of recovering the same, have, subject to the provisions of this Act, the same rights and powers as the persons entitled to sue for damages in the first instance.

4. (1) Sub-section (4) of section 419 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (which provides that a ship shall be deemed in fault in a case of collision where any of the collision regulations have been infringed by that ship), is hereby repealed.

(2) The failure of the master or person in charge of a vessel to comply with the provisions of section 422 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (which imposes a duty upon masters and persons in charge of vessels after a collision to stand by and assist the other vessel), shall not raise any presumption of law that the collision was caused by his wrongful act, neglect, or default, and accordingly sub-section (2) of that section shall be repealed.

5. Any enactment which confers on any court Admiralty jurisdiction in respect of damage shall have effect as though references to such damage included references to damages for loss of life or personal injury, and accordingly proceedings in respect of such damages may be brought *in rem* or *in personam*.

#### Provisions as to Salvage.

6. (1) The master or person in charge of a vessel shall, so far as he can do so without serious danger to his own vessel, her crew and passengers (if any), render assistance to every person, even if such person be a subject of a foreign State at war with His Majesty, who is found at sea in danger of being lost, and, if he fails to do so, he shall be guilty of a misdemeanour.

(2) Compliance by the master or person in charge of a vessel with the provisions of this section shall not affect his right of any other person to salvage.

7. Where any dispute arises as to the apportionment of any amount of salvage among the owners, master, pilot, crew, and other persons in the service of any foreign vessel, the amount shall be apportioned by the court or person making the apportionment in accordance with the law of the country to which the vessel belongs.

#### General Provisions.

8. No action shall be maintainable to enforce any claim or lien against a vessel or her owners in respect of any damage or loss to another vessel, her cargo or freight, or any property on board her, or damages for loss of life or personal injuries suffered by any person on board her, caused by the fault of the former vessel, whether such vessel be wholly or partly in fault, or in respect of any salvage services, unless proceedings therein are commenced within two years from the date when the damage or loss or injury was caused or the salvage services were rendered, and an action shall not be maintainable under this Act to enforce any contribution in respect of an overpaid proportion of any damages for loss of life or personal injuries unless proceedings therein are commenced within one year from the date of payment.

Provided that any court having jurisdiction to deal with an action to which this section relates may, in accordance with the rules of court, extend any such period to such extent and on such conditions as it thinks fit, and shall, if satisfied that there has not during such period been any reasonable opportunity of arresting the defendant vessel within the jurisdiction of the court, or within the territorial waters of the country to which the plaintiff's ship belongs or in which the plaintiff resides or has his principal place of business, extend any such period to an extent sufficient to give such reasonable opportunity.

9. (1) This Act shall extend throughout His Majesty's dominions and to any territories under his protection, and to Cyprus.

Provided that it shall not extend to the Dominion of Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia, the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, and Newfoundland.

(2) This Act shall not apply in any case in which proceedings have been taken before the passing thereof, and all such cases shall be determined as though this Act had not been passed.

(3) The provisions of this Act shall be applied in all cases heard and determined in any court having jurisdiction to deal with the case and in whatever waters the damage or loss in question was caused or the salvage services in question were rendered, and sub-section (9) of section 25 of the Supreme Court of Judicature Act, 1873, shall cease to have effect.

(4) This Act shall apply to any persons other than the owners responsible for the fault of the vessel as though the expression "owners" included such persons, and in any case where, by virtue of any charter or demise, or for any other reason, the owners are not responsible for the navigation and management of the vessel, this Act shall be read as though for references to the owners there were substituted references to the charterers or other persons for the time being so responsible.

10. This Act may be cited as the Maritime Conventions Act, 1911, and shall be construed as one with the Merchant. Shipping Acts, 1894 to 1907.

### REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1911.

THE Eightieth Annual Report on the working of the Ceylon Savings Bank is herewith submitted, together with the Balance Sheet and Statements of Accounts, for the information of the Directors and Depositors.

It will be observed from the statements attached that the Bank continues to progress satisfactorily, and that its usefulness is still being appreciated by all classes of the community.

New Accounts and Accounts closed.—The number opened in 1911 was 2,725, which was only 101 less than in 1910, but this decrease is counterbalanced by the number of accounts closed (1,564), being 208 less than in the previous year.

Amount deposited and Amount withdrawn.—The amount deposited during 1911 was Rs. 1,952,926, a slight decrease compared with the previous year; while the withdrawals, which amounted to Rs. 1,657,328, were Rs. 139,051 less than in 1910.

Amount to Credit of Depositors was Rs. 5,132,981, being an increase of Rs. 295,598 over 1910.

Interest paid to Depositors amounted to Rs. 161,445, an increase of Rs. 9,227 over 1910, and was the largest amount paid by the Bank on this account.

Investments on House Property.—In 1911 Rs. 51,500 were repaid, and the Bank was able to lend Rs. 67,000 on fresh mortgages, the total investments on this account at the end of 1911 being Rs. 584,110.

Profits.—The profits of the Bank in 1911 amounted to Rs. 17,806, being the largest earnings since 1900.

Reserve Fund.—The Reserve Fund, which has been steadily augmented by the profits of the Bank, now stands at Rs. 616,439.

# VITAL STATISTICS.

'Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended April 27, 1912.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 107 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 57 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 19 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1912, viz., 223,353) was 25.0, as against 26.0 in the preceding week, 23.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 120 (0 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 69 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 12 Moors, 1 Malay, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 28.1, as against 27.6 in the previous week, 26.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 35.2 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Déaths.—Of the 120 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 24 in the preceding week, 24 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 2.

Selected Causes of Death.—Thirteen deaths were registered from Pneumonia (against 15 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 in Kotahena, 2 each in New Bazaar and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Pettah and Maradana hospitals. Four deaths were registered from Bronchitis.

2. Seventeen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 11' in the previous week and 14 the weekly average, 'for last year), of which 4 were in Kotahena, 3 each in St. Paul's and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 each in New Bazaar and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Maradana hospitals, and Slave Island.

3. Two deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 4 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year), both in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals). There were 7 cases reported during the week, against 13 in the previous week.

4. Seventeen deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 15, from Debility (7 infants), 10 from Enteritis, 3 from Anchylostomia sis, 3 from Nephritis, 3 from Diarrhea, 2 from Tetanus (1 infant), 1 each from Dysentery and Worms, and 29 from Other Causes.

5. Eleven cases of *Measles* were reported, against 25 in the previous week; and 13 of *Chickenpox*, against 11 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was  $83 \cdot 3^{\circ}$ , against  $82 \cdot 3^{\circ}$  in the preceding week and  $84 \cdot 0^{\circ}$  in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was  $29 \cdot 782$  in., against  $29 \cdot 802$  in. in the preceding week and  $29 \cdot 969$  in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was  $3 \cdot 22$  in., against  $2 \cdot 15$  in. in the preceding week and  $0 \cdot 04$  in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
