WHEREAS by section 26 of the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 24 of 1889, it is enacted that the Governor may, at his discretion, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, establish a Village Tribunal in any Chief Headman's division or part thereof brought under the operation of the said Ordinance:

#### VITAL STATISTICS.

#### Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended May 11, 1912.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 104 (0 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 59 Sinhalese, 11 Tamils, 17 Moors, 5 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1912, viz., 223,353) was 24·3, as against 19·2 in the preceding week, 23·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26·0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 133 (T European, 6 Burghers, 72 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 15 Moors, 4 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 31·1, as against 27·9 in the previous week, 28·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 35·2 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 133 total deaths, 40 were of infants under one year of age, as against 21 in the preceding week, 19 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 5.

Selected Causes of Death.—Twenty-one deaths were registered from Pneumonia (against 14 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 4 in Kotahena, 2 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals, Slave Island, and Wellawatta, and 1 each in Pettah and Kollupitiya. Seven deaths were registered from Bronchitis.

- 2. Ten deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 14 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 were in New Bazaar, 2 each in Maradana hospitals and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, and Kotahena.
- 3. One death was registered from *Enteric Fever* in Kotahena (against 4 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year). There were 20 cases reported during the week, against 10 in the previous week.
- 4. Seventeen deaths were registered from Enteritis (4 infants), 11 from Debility (7 infants), 9 from Infantile Convulsions, 4 each from Worms (2 infants) and Dysentery, 2 each from Tetanus (both infants) and Digarhaa, and 45 from Other Causes.
- 5. Ten cases of Measles were reported, against 14 in the previous week; and 6 of Chickenpox, against 8 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·1°, against 83·6° in the preceding week and 83·4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·811 in., against 29·812 in. in the preceding week and 29·917 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 4·89 in., against 1:24 in. in the preceding week and 0·69 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
