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PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of His Majesty GEORGE THE FIFTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir HENRY EDWARD McCALLUM, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HENRY McCALLUM.

WHEREAS by section 34 (1) of "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to declare by Proclamation any road or path which the railway may cross to be a "minor crossing," and whether such "minor crossing" shall be closed by gates or not:

And whereas it is expedient to declare a certain road which the railway crosses to be a "minor crossing" for the purposes of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, in exercise of the power in Us vested as aforesaid, do hereby declare the road which the Ceylon Government Railway crosses between the stations of Anuradhapura and Madawachchi, in the North-Central Province, set out below, to be a "minor crossing" for the purposes of the said Ordinance, as from and after June 24, 1912, and that such "minor crossing" be not closed by gates.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twentieth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Twelve.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir HENRY EDWARD McCALLUM, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HENRY McCALLUM.

WHEREAS by section 27 of "The Village Communities Ordinance, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to abolish any Village Tribunal, or to add to the jurisdiction of any Village Tribunal any other village or villages or group of villages in the same or any other division:

And whereas by the joint operation of section 53 of the said Ordinance and of Proclamations bearing date July 10, 1875, October 8, 1887, March 13, 1888, November 11, 1896, May 5, 1886, and May 5, 1886, the Chief Headmen's divisions called (1) Udukinda, (2) Yatikinda, (3) Wiyaluwa, (4) Wellawaya, (5) Wellassa-Buttala, (6) Bintenna, all situated in the Province of Uva, were brought within the operation of the said Ordinance; and whereas Village Tribunals have been established in the Chief Headmen's divisions of Yatikinda, Wellassa-Buttala, and Bintenna:

And whereas it is expedient to establish Village Tribunals for the Chief Headmen's divisions of Udukinda, Wiyaluwa, and Wellawaya, and to re-arrange the Village Tribunal areas of the said Chief Headmen's divisions as shown in the schedule annexed to this Proclamation:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers committed unto Us by sections 26 and 27 of the said Ordinance, do hereby—

- (1) Establish Village Tribunals for the Chief Headmen's divisions of Udukinda, Wiyaluwa, and Wellawaya.
- (2) Abolish the Village Tribunals of the Chief Headmen's divisions of Yatikinda and Wellassa-Buttala.
- (3) Add to the jurisdiction of the Village Tribunal of Udukinda the group of villages comprised in the Kumbalwela korale, part of the Chief Headman's division of Yatikinda.
- (4) Add to the jurisdiction of the Village Tribunal of Wiyaluwa the group of villages comprised in the rest of the Chief Headman's division of Yatikinda.
- (5) Add to the jurisdiction of the Village Tribunal of Wellawaya the group of villages comprised in the Chief Headman's division of Buttala.
- (6) Add to the jurisdiction of the Village Tribunal of Bintenna the group of villages comprised in the Chief Headman's division of Wellassa.

And We do further declare that this Proclamation shall take effect from July 1, 1912.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 22, 1912.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 95 (1 European, 8 Burghers, 60 Sinhalese, 7 Tamils, 12 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1912, viz., 223,353) was 22·2, as against 19·7 in the preceding week, 14·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26·0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 120 (2 Europeans, 3 Burghers, 63 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 14 Moors, 5 Malays; and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 28·1, as in the previous week, against 32·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 35·2 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 120 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 40 in the preceding week, 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 14.

Selected Causes of Death.—Twenty-two deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 25 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in New Bazaar, 3 each in Maradana hospitals and Slave Island, 2 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and Wellawatta, and 1 each in Fort and Galle Face, San Sebastian, and Kotahena. Six deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

2. Six deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 10 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana hospitals, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya.

3. Only 1 death was registered from *Enteric Fever* in Slave Island (against 1 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year). There were 7 cases reported during the week, against 10 in the previous week.

4. Eleven deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsion*, 11 from *Enteritis* (1 infant), 8 from *Dysentery* (1 infant), 6 from *Senility*, 5 from *Debility* (4 infants), 3 from *Heart Disease*, 2 each from *Diarrhœa*, *Worms* (1 infant), and *Tetanus* (both infants), and 35 from *Other Causes*.

5. Eighteen cases of *Measles* were reported, against 30 in the previous week; and 2 of *Chickenpox*, against 6 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·6°, against 80·0° in the preceding week and 83·8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·817 in., against 29·829 in. in the preceding week and 29·937 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2·61 in., against 8·06 in. in the preceding week and 0·14 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
