By His Excellency Sir ARTHUR ELIBANK HAVELOCK, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by section 2 of "The Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, 1892," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be for that purpose published in the *Government Gazette*, to bring any town or village mentioned in the schedule thereto under the operation of the said Ordinance, and to define the limits of such town or village for the purposes of the said Ordinance:

And whereas it is expedient to bring the towns of Haputalé and Bandarawela, in the Province of Uva, mentioned in the said schedule, under the operation of the said Ordinance:

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the powers in Us vested by the said section of the said Ordinance,

do hereby, as from and after the First day of January, 1894, bring the towns of Haputalé and Bandárawela aforesaid under the operation of the said Ordinance, and define the limits of the said towns, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, to be those set out in the schedule hereto.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Thirty-first day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-three.

GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

WITH reference to the notification of the 13th October, 1893, in the *Gazette* of that date, the following notification issued by the Government of Bombay is published for general information.

Notification.—General Department.

No. 3,718.—IN exercise of the power conferred by Act I. of 1870, the following rules for quarantine against cholera have been made by the Government of Bombay, with the previous sanction of the Governor-General in Council. They have effect from the 10th instant in the Ports of Aden, Perim, and the Somali Coast as a temporary measure:—

- I.—The Commander of every vessel, including buggalows or other native craft, arriving from all ports on the Arabian Coast of the Red Sea shall, before entering the harbour, indicate by signal the port from which such vessel has come.
- II.—Such Commander shall not, except as hereinafter provided, allow any communication, either with the pilot boat, except orally, or with the shore, or with any other vessel or boat in the harbour.
- III.—Immediately on arrival the Commander shall cause the letter "R" of the Commercial Signal Code to be hoisted, and shall keep the said flag flying during his stay in port or until authorised by the Health Officer to haul it down. If communication with the shore is not desired, the vessel shall anchor at such place as may be pointed out by the Port authorities, having regard to the season of the year. If communication with the shore is desired, the Health Officer shall go alongside the vessel, and, after all necessary inquiries, shall direct the Commander to take the vessel to the quarantine anchorage duly appointed and notified in that behalf by the Resident, there to remain for a period of seven days from the date of arrival, or for the shorter period prescribed in rule IV., and undergo disinfection, which should apply as well to crew, passengers, effects, and susceptible goods.
- IV.—If the Health Officer of the Port has sufficient evidence that no cases of a suspicious nature have taken place on board during the voyage, and if the vessel is besides in good hygienic condition, the duration of the quarantine will be diminished according to the following scale:—

After eight days of voyage	six days of quarantine
Do. nine do.	five do.
Do. ten do.	four do.
Do. eleven do.	three do.
Do. twelve do.	two do.
Do. thirteen do.	and upwards	...	twenty-four hours of quarantine.

- V.—If during the period a vessel is at the quarantine anchorage aforesaid any case or cases of cholera should occur on board, the said vessel shall remain in quarantine for a period of seven days from the date of the last case occurring, and be subject to all the prohibitions provided for in rule III.
- VI.—When any vessel has been placed in quarantine as aforesaid, the Health Officer may direct the removal of so many of the passengers and crew as may not be suffering from illness, and whose services may not be required on board the vessel, to such particular spots as may from time to time be selected by the Resident as places of quarantine, there to remain for a period of seven days. If a case of cholera occurs among such passengers and crew during any such period, they shall remain in a place of quarantine for a period of fifteen days from the date of the occurrence of the last case of such illness.
- VII.—Any mails or cargo which may be brought by any vessel so arriving shall be landed under such precautions as the Health Officer may deem necessary to prevent the spread of the disease.
- VIII.—It will be the duty of the Port Officer to facilitate the conveyance to all vessels in quarantine of such supplies of provisions, stores, and other articles as may be required by those on board. Such supplies will be placed on the boats of the vessels in quarantine to be subsequently removed by members of their crews.
- IX.—All vessels arriving at Aden, Perim, and the Somali Coast which may have communicated with vessels coming from all ports on the Arabian Coast of the Red Sea shall be subjected to the same quarantine as vessels arriving at Aden, Perim, and the Somali Coast from such ports.
- X.—All vessels which have undergone quarantine in the manner above prescribed should have the fact clearly stated on their Bills of Health.

WHEREAS by section 3 of Ordinance No. 12 of 1885, intituled "An Ordinance authorising the Legislative Council, by resolution, to establish Tolls, and the Governor in Executive Council by resolution, to abolish Tolls, and to alter the places where Tolls shall be collected," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, by resolution to be notified in the *Government Gazette*, to determine at what places tolls should be collected, and to alter such places and other places to appoint:

And whereas a toll was established under the provisions of "The Toll Ordinance, 1867," on the Ampitiya road, in the Central Province:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 1st day of November, 1872, it was determined that the toll on the said road be collected at a point on the Kandy side of the junction of the said road with the Uduwela minor road, and about one mile from the head of the lake:

And whereas it is expedient to alter the same, and instead thereof to collect the said toll at the place specified and described in the schedule hereto:

It is therefore hereby notified that the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, by resolution dated the 29th day of September, 1893, has appointed the place specified and described in the schedule hereto for the collection of the toll on the Ampitiya road aforesaid, as from and after the 1st day of January, 1894, instead of the place determined for that purpose by the Proclamation of the 1st day of November, 1872, aforesaid.

Amendments sanctioned for 1894.

12. Excepting in towns with special claims, no application will, as a general rule, be entertained for aid to a new school when there already exists a school of the same class within two miles of the new school, without some intervening obstacle, unless the average daily attendance in the new school for one year prior to the date of application for aid exceeds 60 in a boys' or mixed school and 40 in a girls' school. But in any case, however large the attendance, no new school will be aided within a quarter of a mile of an existing school A excepting in towns with special claims as aforesaid.

Insert "of the same class,"

An Anglo-vernacular school will be considered as of the same class as a vernacular school.

20. Before any school is registered or placed on the list of aided schools the Department must be satisfied that—

(a) Scholars are being instructed in at least two standards set forth in schedules A B, D, E.

(b) (iii) In Villages.† A

Insert the following foot-note:—

† NOTE.—In villages in neglected districts where satisfactory reasons are adduced, the Director may be empowered to accept the following average attendance:—In a boys' school 25, in a girls' school 15, in a mixed school 25.

Clause 20—*contd.*

(c) The girls in a girls' school or a mixed school are taught plain needlework as part of the ordinary course of instruction, and that the head teacher, in a girls' school, is a female.

(f) Before any grant is made to a school, the Department must be satisfied that the requirements appearing in clauses 20 (c), (d), (e), and in schedule O in respect of children presented for examination, are fulfilled, and that the average attendance for twelve months preceding the examination is not less than the numbers given in clause 20 (b).

30. Managers of schools may claim after the annual examination—

(a) For every scholar presented in standards I. to VIII. a sum calculated on passes achieved according to schedules F, G.

(h) False personation or falsification of the register will involve forfeiture of half the grant for the year, and in the case of certificated teachers the certificate will be suspended.

35. In girls' vernacular and Anglo-vernacular boarding schools the value of a "pass" will be twice the value of a corresponding "pass" in day schools. [(Schedule H, Note.)]

45. A certificate of the second class will be issued to all students of a training school inspected by the Department who have completed two years' residence and passed the [final examination] to the satisfaction of the examiners appointed by the Department.

67. At the end of one year after admission to a training school as a Queen's scholar, an examination will be held in the subjects prescribed in schedule N, and the managers will be entitled to a grant of 100 rupees for every Queen's scholar who passes such examination satisfactorily. [Queen's scholars who fail to obtain one-third of the marks in reading, or in writing, or in arithmetic, or in school management, will forfeit their scholarships.]

[No student in a training school shall be considered to have passed any examination of the school unless such student shall have obtained one-third of the marks in reading, or in writing, or in arithmetic, or in school management.]

68. At the close of the second year there will be a final examination, and for each successful Queen's scholar the manager will receive the final sum of 150 rupees, making up the total value of the scholarship.

"Violation of the rules for keeping registers referred to in clause 20 (d) will entail a forfeiture of either one-fourth or one-tenth of the grant according to the nature of the irregularity to be dealt with, in the judgment of the Director.

"NOTE.—Reading, writing, arithmetic, and school management, theoretical and practical, are compulsory subjects. Failure to obtain one-third of the marks in any one of these subjects involves failure in the whole examination, and in the case of Queen's scholars forfeiture of the scholarship. In the other subjects of examination no credit will be given for any marks falling below 25 per cent. of the maximum in each subject. Fifty per cent. of the total number of marks must be obtained to secure a pass."

Add "(d) A list of the specific subjects in which it is intended to present scholars at the annual examination of the school should be sent to the Inspector of the district not later than the first week of the month immediately preceding the month fixed by the Department for the annual examination of such school."

REGULATIONS FOR THE OPEN COMPETITION OF AUGUST, 1894.

N.B.—The regulations are liable to be altered in future years.

1. On August 1, 1894, and following days, an Examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.* Not fewer than persons will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified, viz., for the Lower Provinces of Bengal (including Assam); for the Upper Provinces of Bengal (including the Punjab, Oudh, and the Central Provinces); for Burma; for Madras, and for Bombay†.

2. No person will be deemed qualified who shall not satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners:—

(i.) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.

(ii.) That his age will be above twenty-one years and under twenty-three years on April 1, 1894.

[N.B.—In the case of Natives of India it will be necessary for a Candidate to obtain a certificate of age and nationality signed, should he be a resident in British India by the Secretary to Government of the Province, or the Commissioner of the Division within which his family resides, or should he reside in a Native State by the highest Political Officer accredited to the State in which his family resides.]

(iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.

(iv.) That he is of good moral character.

3. Should the evidence upon the above points be *primâ facie* satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, the Candidate, on payment of the prescribed fee‡ will be admitted to the Examination. The Commissioners may, however, in their

discretion, at any time prior to the grant of the Certificate of Qualification hereinafter referred to, institute such further inquiries as they may deem necessary; and if the result of such inquiries, in the case of any Candidate, should be unsatisfactory to them in any of the above respects, he will be ineligible for admission to the Civil Service of India, and if already selected, will be removed from the position of a Probationer.

Candidates are at liberty to name any or all of these branches of knowledge.* No subjects are obligatory.

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks; and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. The marks assigned to Candidates in each branch will be subject to such deduction as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary† in order to secure that "a Candidate be allowed no credit at all for taking up a subject in which he is a mere smatterer."

7. The examination will be conducted on paper and *vivâ voce*, as may be deemed necessary.

8. The marks obtained by each Candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the several Candidates who shall have obtained, after the deduction above-mentioned, a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining Candidates, will be set forth in order of merit, and such Candidates shall be deemed to be Selected Candidates for the Civil Service of India, provided they appear to be in other respects duly qualified. Should any of the selected Candidates become disqualified, the Secretary of State for India will determine whether the vacancy thus created shall be filled up or not. In the former case, the candidate next in order of merit, and in other respects duly qualified, shall be deemed to be a selected Candidate. A Candidate entitled to be deemed a selected Candidate, but declining to accept the nomination as such, which may be offered to him, will be disqualified for any subsequent competition.

9. Selected Candidates before proceeding to India will be on probation for one year, at the end of which time they will be examined, with a view of testing their progress in the following subjects:—†

In this Examination, as in the open competition, the merit of the Candidates examined will be estimated by marks (which will be subject to deductions in the same way as the marks assigned at the open competition), and the number set opposite to each subject denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it. The Examination will be conducted on paper and *vivâ voce*, as may be deemed necessary. This examination will be held at the close of the year of probation, and will be called the *Final Examination*.

* A syllabus, defining in general terms the character of the examination in the various subjects, may be obtained on application to the Secretary, Civil Service Commission.

† Marks assigned in English Composition and Mathematics will be subject to no deduction. Each science will, for the purpose of deduction, be treated as a separate subject.

10. The selected Candidates will be tested during their probation as to their proficiency in Riding.

The examinations in riding will be held as follows:—

(1) Shortly after the result of the Open Competitive Examination has been declared, or at such time or times as the Commissioners may appoint during the course of the probationary year.

(2) Again, at the time of the Final Examination, Candidates who may fully satisfy the Commissioners of their ability to ride well and to perform journeys on horseback, shall receive a Certificate which shall entitle them to be credited with 200 marks to be added to their marks in the Final Examination.

(3) Candidates who fail to obtain this Certificate, but who gain a Certificate of minimum proficiency in riding, will be allowed to proceed to India, but will be subjected on their arrival to such further tests in riding as may be prescribed by their Government, and shall receive no increase to their initial salary until they have passed such tests to the satisfaction of that Government. A Candidate who fails at the end of the year of probation to gain at least the Certificate of minimum proficiency in riding will be liable to have his name removed from the list of Selected Candidates.

11. The Selected Candidates who, at the Final Examination, shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in Regulation 9, and who shall have satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of nationality, age, health, character, and ability to ride, shall be certified by the said Commissioners to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India, provided they shall comply with the regulations in force at the time for that Service.

12. Persons desirous to be admitted as Candidates must apply on forms, which may be obtained from "The Secretary, Civil Service Commission, London, S. W.," at any time after the 1st December, 1893. The forms must be returned so as to be received at the office of the Civil Service Commissioners on or before 31st May, 1894.*

The Civil Service Commissioners are authorised by the Secretary of State for India in Council to make the following announcements:—

(1) Selected Candidates will be allotted to the various provinces upon a consideration of all the circumstances, including their own wishes; but the requirements of the Public Service will rank before every other consideration.

(2) An allowance amounting to £100 will be given to all Candidates who pass their probation at one of the Universities or Colleges which have been approved by the Secretary of State, viz., the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, Dublin, Glasgow, Edinburgh, St. Andrew's, and Aberdeen; University College, London; and King's College, London; provided such Candidates shall have passed the Final Examination to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners, and shall have complied with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of Selected Candidates.

(3) The allowance of £100 will not be paid to any Selected Candidate until he has been certified by the Civil Service Commissioners to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India; and every Certificated Candidate must, before receiving his allowance, attend at the India Office and give a written undertaking to refund the amount in the event of his failing to proceed to India.

* These forms should be accompanied by evidence on the points mentioned in Regulation 2, and by a list of the subjects in which the Candidate desires to be examined. Evidence of health and character must bear date not earlier than 1st May, 1894.

(4) All Candidates obtaining Certificates will be also required to enter into covenants, by which, amongst other things, they will bind themselves to agree to such Regulations for the provision of pensions for their families as may be approved by the Secretary of State for India in Council. The stamps payable on these covenants amount to £1.

(5) The seniority in the Civil Service of India of the selected Candidates will be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from the combined marks of the Open Competitive and Final Examinations.

(6) Selected Candidates will be required to report their arrival in India within such period after the grant of their Certificate of Qualification as the Secretary of State may in each case direct.

(7) Candidates rejected at the Final Examination of 1895 will in no case be allowed to present themselves for re-examination.

SYLLABUS, SHOWING THE EXTENT OF THE EXAMINATION IN CERTAIN SUBJECTS AT THE OPEN COMPETITION FOR ADMISSION INTO THE INDIAN CIVIL SERVICE IN 1894.

English Composition.—An Essay to be written on one of several subjects specified by the Civil Service Commissioners on their Examination Paper.

English Language and Literature.—The Examination will be in two parts. In the one the Candidates will be expected to show a general acquaintance with the course of English Literature, as represented (mainly) by the following writers in verse and prose, between the reign of Edward III. and the accession of Queen Victoria :—

Verse—Chaucer, Langland, Spenser, Shakespeare, Milton, Dryden, Pope, Gray, Collins, Johnson, Goldsmith, Crabbe, Cowper, Campbell, Wordsworth, Scott, Byron, Coleridge, Shelly, Keats.

Prose—Bacon, Sir Thomas Browne, Milton, Cowley, Bunyan, Dryden, Swift, Defoe, Addison, Johnson, Burke, Scott, Macaulay (Essays and Biographies).

A minute knowledge of the works of these authors will not be looked for in this part of the Examination, which will, however, test how far the Candidates have studied the chief productions of the greatest English writers *in themselves*, and are acquainted with the leading characteristics of their thought and style, and with the place which each of them occupies in the history of English literature. Candidates will also be expected to show that they have studied in these authors history of the English language in respect of its vocabulary, syntax, and prosody.

The other part of the Examination will relate to one of the periods named below, which will follow each other year by year in the order indicated :—

1. 1700 A.D. to 1800 A.D.
(1894) [Pope to Cowper]
2. 1800 A.D. to 1832 A.D.
(1895) [Nineteenth Century writers to the death of Scott]
3. 1360 A.D. to 1600 A.D.
(1896) [Chaucer to Spenser]
4. 1600 A.D. to 1700 A.D.
(1897) [Shakespeare to Dryden]

The Examination in this part will require from Candidates a more minute acquaintance with the

English language and literature, as illustrated in the chief works produced in each period, and will be based to a considerable extent, but by no means exclusively, on certain books specified each year by the Commissioners.* The names placed under the dates are intended to suggest the general character of the literary development of the period, and, consequently, the natural limits of the Examination. All the works of Shakespeare, for example, will be regarded as falling within the period 1600 to 1700; all the works of Swift within the period 1700 to 1800; all the works of Scott and Wordsworth within the period 1800 to 1832.

French Language and Literature.—Translation from French into English and from English into French; Critical questions on the French Language and Literature.

German Language and Literature.—As in French.

Latin Language and Literature.—Translation from Latin into English, Composition in prose and verse (in the place of the latter may be taken, by those who prefer it, a paper of questions on *Latin Philology*). Critical questions on the Latin language and literature.

Greek Language and Literature.—Translation from Greek into English. Composition in prose and verse (in the place of the latter may be taken, by those who prefer it, a paper of questions on *Greek Philology*). Critical questions on the Greek language and literature.

Sanskrit Language and Literature.—Translation from Sanskrit into English and from English into Sanskrit. History of Sanskrit Literature (including knowledge of such Indian history as bears upon the subject); Sanskrit Grammar; Vedic Philology.

Arabic Language and Literature.—Translations as in Sanskrit; History of Arabic Literature; Arabic Grammar; Arabic Prosody.

English History.—General questions on English History from 800 A.D. to 1848 A.D.; questions on the Constitutional History of England from 800 A.D. to 1848 A.D.

Questions covering the whole period named will be set, but Candidates will be allowed to attempt only a limited number of them.

General Modern History.—Candidates may, at their choice, be examined in any one of the following periods :—

1. From the accession of Charlemagne to the Third Crusade. [800 A.D. to 1193 A.D.]
2. From the Third Crusade to the Diet of Worms. [1193 A.D. to 1521 A.D.]
3. From the Diet of Worms to the death of Louis XIV. [1521 A.D. to 1715 A.D.]
4. From the accession of Louis XV. to the French Revolution of 1848. [1715 A.D. to 1848 A.D.]

Periods 3 and 4 will include Indian History.

Greek History.—Questions on the General History of Greece to the death of Alexander; questions on the Constitutional History of Greece during the same period.

* The books for 1894 are :—

Pope : Moral Essays, Epistles, and Satires.

Thomson : Seasons.

Gray : Poems.

Cowper : Task.

Crabbe : Borough.

The "Spectator."

Berkeley : Minute Philosopher.

Burke : On the French Revolution; Thoughts on

the Present Discontents.

Johnson : Lives of the Poets.

Sir Joshua Reynolds : Discourses.

Roman History.—Questions on the General History of Rome to the death of Vespasian; questions on the Constitutional History of Rome during the same period.

In Greek and Roman History Candidates will be expected to show a knowledge of the original authorities. Questions covering the whole period named will be set, but Candidates will be allowed to attempt only a limited number of them.

Mathematics.—Pure Mathematics: Algebra, Geometry (Euclid and Geometrical Conic Sections), Plane Trigonometry, Plain Analytical Geometry (less advanced portions), Differential Calculus (Elementary), Integral Calculus (Elementary).

Applied Mathematics: Statics, Dynamics of a Particle, Hydrostatics, Geometrical Optics; all treated without the aid of the Differential or Integral Calculus.

Advanced Mathematics.—Pure Mathematics: Higher Algebra, including Theory of Equations,

Plane and Spherical Trigonometry, Differential Calculus, Integral Calculus, Differential Equations, Analytical Geometry, Plane and Solid.

Applied Mathematics: Statics, including Attractions, Dynamics of a Particle, Rigid Dynamics, Hydromechanics, Geometrical and Physical Optics, and Geometrical Astronomy.

Political Economy and Economic History.—Candidates will be expected to possess a knowledge of economic theory as treated in the larger text books; also a knowledge of the existing economic conditions, and of statistical methods as applied to economic inquiries; together with a general knowledge of the history of industry, land tenure, and economic legislation in the United Kingdom.

Logic and Mental Philosophy (Ancient and Modern).—Logic will include both Deductive and Inductive Logic.

Mental Philosophy will include Psychology and Metaphysics.

DRAFT ORDINANCES.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance for making provision for the Contingent Services for the Year 1894.

Preamble.

WHEREAS the Contingent Expenditure required for the service of the Government of this Island for the year One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-four, and not otherwise provided for, has been estimated at the sum of Thirteen million, Three hundred and thirty-nine thousand, Seven hundred and thirty-seven rupees: It is enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Rs. 13,339,737 to be charged upon the revenue of this Island for the Contingent Services for the year 1894.

1 A sum not exceeding Thirteen million, Three hundred and thirty-nine thousand, Seven hundred and thirty-seven rupees shall be and the same is hereby charged upon the revenue of this Island for the Contingent Services for the year One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-four, and the said expenditure shall be in conformity with the details of the Estimates specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed, whereof the following is an abstract:—

Expenditure of a sum not exceeding Rs. 374,417 unexpended in 1893.

Amount of labour to be supplied under the Ordinance No. 31 of 1884.

Treasurer to pay the above at such time as the Governor by warrant shall order.

And to receive credit in his accounts for the payments made in pursuance thereof.

2 And whereas from the sums voted for Public Works in the Supply Ordinances for the years 1892 and 1893 a sum not exceeding Three hundred and seventy-four thousand Four hundred and seventeen rupees will remain unexpended at the end of 1893, and the same has been brought forward for expenditure during the year 1894: It is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to authorise the expenditure of the said amount during the year 1894 for the completion of the works for which the same was voted.

3 And whereas by the 31st section of the Ordinance No. 31 of the year 1884, intituled "An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 10 of 1861, entitled 'An Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to Public Thoroughfares in this Colony,'" it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to propose the estimates prepared in pursuance thereof, or such of them as to him may appear expedient, in the Ordinance for making provision for the contingent expenditure of the Colony for the ensuing year, to be dealt with in like manner as any other estimate to be so proposed: And it is thereby also provided that the amount of labour to be supplied under the provisions of the said Ordinance No. 31 of 1884, for the performance of any work or works for which an estimate or estimates may have been so proposed by the Governor, and approved of by the Legislative Council, shall be distinctly stated in the Ordinance enacted for the same, and that the same shall not exceed two-thirds of the whole amount of labour due from the district or districts within which it may be required to be performed: It is enacted that the amount of labour to be supplied under the provisions of the said Ordinance shall be in conformity with the estimates specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

4 The Treasurer of the said Island shall issue and pay the said several sums to such persons, for the purposes hereinbefore-mentioned, upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor for the time being, by any warrant or order in writing to be signed by him, shall from time to time order and direct; and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the revenues of the said Island.

5 The said Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid; and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned; and he shall and may receive credit for the same accordingly.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance to amend "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1887."

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend in the particulars hereinafter mentioned the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance, and to establish sanitary regulations in respect of the production and distribution of milk within Municipalities: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Municipal Councils Amendment Ordinance, 1892," and this Ordinance and the principal Ordinance and "The Municipal Councils Amendment Ordinance, 1890," shall be read as one, and may be cited collectively as "The Municipal Councils Ordinances, 1887, 1890, and 1892."

CHAPTER I.

AMENDMENT OF "THE MUNICIPAL COUNCILS ORDINANCE, 1887."

Repealing clause.

2 Section 13 of "The Municipal Councils Amendment Ordinance, 1890," shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 47, as to appointment of chairman.

3 In the proviso to section 47 of the principal Ordinance the words "shall be an officer in the Civil Service of the Ceylon Government who" shall be omitted.

Amendment of section 55, as to jurisdiction of municipal magistrate.

4 In section 55 of the principal Ordinance, for the words "and 14 of 1878" shall be substituted the words "14 of 1878, 17 of 1889, and 12 of 1891, and any offence committed within the municipality in breach of section 257, 258, or 259 of the Ceylon Penal Code."

Section 164, as to sales and leases of lands or buildings.

5 For section 164 of the principal Ordinance the following section shall be substituted, namely :—

"(1) The municipal council, with the sanction of the Governor in Executive Council, may sell or lease any lands or buildings vested in them or acquired by them, either in block or in parcels as they may find most convenient and advantageous; and the proceeds of such sale and the rents arising from such lease shall be paid to the credit of the municipal funds.

Ordinance No. 7 of 1840 not to affect sales or leases to or by the municipal council.

"(2) None of the provisions in the Ordinance No. 7 of 1840 shall be taken as applying to sales, leases, or other conveyances of land or other immovable property from or to the municipal council."

Municipal magistrate may order the removal of obstruction, &c.

6 After section 183 of the principal Ordinance the following section shall be inserted, and numbered 183 a, namely :—

"It shall be lawful for the municipal magistrate in any proceedings under sections 175 and 183 of the principal Ordinance, to make an order requiring the person who has caused any obstruction, encroachment, or projection to remove, within a time to be fixed by the order, such obstruction, encroachment, or projection; and if the person against whom such order is made shall neglect to perform the act directed thereby, within the period specified in the order, he shall be liable to a penalty of twenty rupees for each day after the date fixed by the order for the performing of the act thereby directed, until the same is carried out. Such magistrate shall from time to time issue a warrant directing the amount due in respect of any such penalty to be levied in the manner by law provided for levying fines imposed by a magistrate in the police court."

Municipal magistrate may order alteration or demolition of houses built without notice or contrary to Ordinance No. 7 of 1887.

Chairman, with consent of standing committee, may provide houses of isolation.

Duties of municipal council to keep a register of all dairymen and milk vendors.

Powers of chairman of the municipal council to enter dairy premises or milk stores.

7 After section 201 of the principal Ordinance the following section shall be inserted, and numbered 201 *a*, namely :—

“Whenever a municipal magistrate considers, on receiving a report from the chairman, and on taking such evidence (if any) as he thinks fit, that any building begun or made without sending such notice and plan as is required by section 198 of the principal Ordinance, or at any levels different from those fixed by the chairman under section 199 of the principal Ordinance, or in any other respect contrary to the provisions of that Ordinance, such magistrate may make an order requiring the owner to alter or demolish such building within a time to be fixed in the order; and if the person against whom such order is made shall neglect to perform the act directed, thereby within the period specified in the order, he shall be liable to a penalty of twenty rupees for each day after the day fixed by the order for the performing of the act thereby directed, until the same is carried out. Such magistrate shall from time to time issue a warrant directing the amount due in respect of any such penalty to be levied in the manner by law provided for levying fines imposed by a magistrate in the police court.”

8 After section 250 of the principal Ordinance the following section shall be inserted, and numbered 250 *a*, namely :—

“It shall be lawful for the chairman, with the consent of the standing committee, to provide houses of isolation for the reception of persons suffering from any dangerous infectious disease, and to charge and levy fees for the use and occupation of such houses, and to make by-laws for the regulation of such houses, and for imposing, collecting, and recovering such fees.”

CHAPTER II.

SUPERVISION AND REGULATION OF DAIRIES.

9 It shall be the duty of the municipal council—

- (i.) To keep a register of the names and addresses of all dairymen and milk vendors selling or supplying milk to any person or persons resident within the municipality, and of all dairy premises and milk stores used from time to time by each of them for the production, deposit, or distribution of such milk.
- (ii.) To strike off such register the names and addresses of all persons who shall have ceased, or become disqualified as hereinafter provided, to carry on the business of dairymen or milk vendors.
- (iii.) To keep such register open at all reasonable times for inspection by the principal civil medical officer or any one of his officers, and to furnish any extracts from the same that he may require.
- (iv.) To cause to be inspected all such dairy premises and milk stores and the cattle, appliances, and utensils therein used for the production or distribution of milk, at the time prescribed in any regulations for the time being in force under this Ordinance, and to enter the date and result of every such inspection in the register.
- (v.) To furnish in the month of January of each year to the principal civil medical officer a report of the council's proceedings under this chapter in respect of the supervision and regulation of dairies during the preceding twelve months, in such form as may be prescribed by any regulation for the time being in force under this chapter.

10 The chairman of the municipal council shall have the following powers in addition to any other powers in this Ordinance conferred, viz. :—

- (i.) To enter or authorise the entry at all reasonable times into or upon any dairy premises or milk store; for the purpose of making any inspection

by this chapter authorised; to take away samples of the milk there found, and of the water of any well or other source of water supply therein or thereon, for the purpose of examination or analysis only.

- (ii.) To require any dairyman or milk vendor, by notice in writing, to cleanse and maintain in a sanitary condition his dairy premises or milk store and any utensils therein used as aforesaid.
- (iii.) To require any dairyman or milk vendor, by notice in writing, to close any well or other source of water supplied in or on his dairy premises or milk store, or used in connection therewith, which is so polluted or unwholesome as to be unfit for human consumption, and to wholly discontinue the use of the water thereof for any purpose whatsoever, for such period as the chairman shall direct, or to fill up the said well or source of water supply and keep the same so filled up.
- (iv.) To refuse or cancel the registration of any dairyman or milk vendor in respect of any dairy premises or milk store which is in an unsanitary condition, or in which the provisions for lighting, ventilation, drainage, lavatory, and privy accommodation or water supply are not such as are necessary for health, or for the cleanliness of the appliances and utensils used therein, or for the protection of any milk therein against infection or contamination.

For the purposes of this section the term "the chairman of the municipal council" shall include the sanitary officer of the municipality.

Dairymen and others to apply for registration.

11 Every dairyman and milk vendor engaged in the sale or supply of milk to any person or persons in any municipality at the time of this Ordinance coming into force, shall within three months of such time, and every dairyman and milk vendor thereafter commencing to engage in such sale or supply, shall, before so commencing, apply to the municipal council to cause to be entered on the register for that municipality his name and place of residence, and the locality of every dairy premises and milk store used or to be used by him, and thenceforward from time to time any change of such residence, or discontinuance by him to use any former, or commencement by him to use any other, dairy premises or milk store, and immediately upon such registration, and whilst the same continues in force, shall in some conspicuous place affix to and maintain upon every dairy premises or milk store in respect of which he is so registered, and to and upon every cart or other vehicle used by him for the distribution of milk in legible letters his name and the words "Registered Dairyman" or "Registered Milk Vendor," as the case may be.

Unregistered persons forbidden to sell or supply milk.

12 It shall not be lawful for any person to sell or supply milk to any person or persons in any municipality if his name and place of residence, and every dairy premises and milk store used for the purpose of the production, deposit, or distribution of any such milk are not entered upon the register for that municipality: Provided that persons engaged in the sale or supply of milk in any municipality, at the time of this Ordinance coming into force, shall not be affected by the provisions of this section until after the lapse of three months from such time.

Infectious disease in dairy premises, &c., to be reported immediately.

13 On the appearance of any case of infectious disease in man or beast in any dairy premises or milk store, the householder or occupier, or if there be no such householder or occupier, the owner of such premises or store, and also the medical practitioner attending the case, shall immediately report, in writing, such case to the municipal council.

Dairyman to supply names and addresses of customers.

14 Whenever it shall appear to the chairman of the municipal council, or be certified to such chairman by any legally qualified medical practitioners, that the spread of infectious disease is in their opinion attributable to the milk supplied by any dairyman or milk vendor, the chairman may require such dairyman or milk vendor to furnish forthwith, upon demand, a full and complete list of the names and addresses of all his customers, and to give such assistance to discover the residence of all or any of them as the chairman making the inquiry may deem necessary; and every such dairyman or milk vendor shall, for the purposes of such inquiry only, be deemed to be within the municipality of the chairman making the inquiry, whether he is actually resident within the municipality or outside its limits.

Persons suffering from infectious diseases or having been recently exposed to infection not to take part in dairy operations.

15 No person following the trade of a dairy farmer, cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or being the occupier of a milk store or milk shop, shall knowingly allow any person suffering from any infectious disease, or having recently been exposed to infection from a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk, or in any way to take part or to assist in the conduct of the trade or business of the dairy farmer, cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk or occupier of any milk store or milk shop, as far as regards the production, distribution, or storage of milk, until he shall have shown to the satisfaction of the chairman of the municipal council that all danger of communication of infection to the milk, or of its contamination, has ceased.

Sale or supply of unwholesome milk forbidden.

16 It shall not be lawful for any person selling or supplying milk to any person or persons resident in any municipality to store, keep, or deposit any milk in any room used for sleeping or dwelling in, or in any other place or way calculated to render such milk unwholesome or injurious to health, or to sell or supply any milk which shall have been produced from any diseased animal, or which shall have been in any place or way exposed to infection from any person suffering from any infectious disease, or which shall have been upon or in any dairy premises or milk store from which the sale of milk has been directed to be discontinued on account of infectious disease as provided in section 10 of this Ordinance.

Penalties, &c.

17 Every person who shall wilfully disobey, or act in violation of, any of the provisions contained in either of the last six preceding sections, or shall resist or wilfully obstruct any person in the lawful exercise of any of the powers conferred under section 10 of this Ordinance, or shall without lawful excuse neglect or disobey any requirement made under the provisions of section 10 hereof, or shall neglect or refuse to obey any order or direction of the chairman of the municipal council or the sanitary officer of the municipality made under the said section within the time limited in that behalf by such order or direction, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding two hundred rupees.

Governor to declare what are infectious diseases.

18 The Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the recommendation of the principal civil medical officer, shall, as soon as practicable, after the passing of this Ordinance, declare what are infectious diseases for the purposes of this Ordinance, and may thereafter from time to time add to, alter, or amend such declaration as may seem necessary or advisable. And the Colonial Secretary shall forthwith furnish a copy of each such declaration, and of each such addition, alteration, or amendment to the municipal council.

Summary jurisdiction and appeal.

19 All information for offences against this chapter may be heard and determined, and all penalties under section 17 may be imposed by the municipal magistrate in a summary way on the complaint of any officer of the municipal council, provided that where the chairman is the municipal magistrate, the police magistrate, but not such municipal magistrate, shall have jurisdiction to adjudicate upon the hearing of such complaint. Provided always that any person aggrieved by any adjudication of such

municipal, or police, magistrate may appeal therefrom to the Supreme Court. And such appeal shall be governed by the provisions regulating appeals contained in "The Criminal Procedure Code, 1883." Provided further that in all cases under the last preceding sections the fine shall be paid to the municipality wherein the offence is committed.

The Governor to have certain powers in all municipalities.

20 The Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall have power to require the municipal council to proceed with the execution of any power conferred, or the performance of any duty imposed, by the last preceding sections, within the said municipality, and within the time limited by the Governor, with the like advice in that behalf, and in case such requirement shall, without lawful excuse, be neglected or disobeyed, it shall be lawful for the Government to execute the said power or perform the said duty, and to recover in an action in any court of competent jurisdiction as a debt due to Her Majesty the expenses thereby incurred, together with the cost of such action against the municipal council so neglecting or disobeying.

Power to issue regulations.

21 It shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, upon the recommendation of the principal civil medical officer, to issue, from time to time, regulations subject to the provisions of this chapter, for the purpose of carrying the same into effect.

Interpretation.

22 The following expressions in inverted commas, when occurring in this chapter or any regulations thereunder, shall, for the purposes thereof, bear the meanings hereinafter respectively assigned to them, unless inconsistent with the context, viz. :—

"Dairy premises."—Any building, shed, land, or place used for the stalling, grazing, feeding, or milking of cattle for the purpose of producing milk to be sold or supplied, or any building or place used for the purpose of depositing or storing milk when so produced.

"Milk store."—Any building, shed, or stall used for the purpose of depositing, storing, or exposing milk for the purpose of selling or disposing thereof.

"Dairyman."—The occupier of any dairy premises as hereinbefore defined, or any person engaged in the production of milk for sale, or supply for profit, to other persons.

"Milk vendor."—The occupier of any milk store as hereinbefore defined, or any person engaged in the storage or distribution of milk for sale or supply to other persons.

"Register."—The register of dairymen and milk vendors, of dairy premises and milk stores kept under the authority of this chapter.

Provisions of chapter II. to extend to dairies situated outside municipal limits.

23 The provisions of this chapter shall apply to dairymen, milk vendors, dairy farmers, cow-keepers, and purveyors of milk, whether resident within or without the limits of the municipality, who may sell or supply milk to any person or persons resident within the municipality, and to dairy premises, milk stores, and milk shops, whether situated within or without the limits of the municipality, from which milk is sold or supplied to any person or persons resident within the limits of the municipality, and to the occupiers of such premises, stores, or shops.

The Chairman stated that, as resolved at the last meeting, the copy of by-laws adopted some time back by the Council, together with certain suggestions made by the Health Officer, had been forwarded to the Colonial Secretary as ordered.

He submitted letter dated September 13 from Surgeon-Captain Perry (Health Officer) on the subject.

It was ordered that these further suggestions be also forwarded.

Resolved,—That the Government be informed that the Council generally approves of the provisions of the proposed Ordinance, if they can be enforced, and desires to invite attention to the recommendations of their Health Officer, which have been already forwarded.

7. Read letter No. 32, dated September 15, from the Colonial Secretary, with reference to the drains in Trincomalee street, which have formed the subject of recent correspondence with Government.

On the motion of the Chairman it was resolved that the letter, with all connected papers, be circulated.

Health Officer's Report for August, 1893.

The general health of the community has been good.

No cases of infectious disease have been reported to me during the past month.

A special report on the insanitary condition of a stable yard in Peradeniya road has been sent to Mr. Inspector Brittain for use in the case of prosecution of the proprietor.

The drainage of the town is in a fairly satisfactory condition. The small catch-pit which receives the military hospital drain is not working satisfactorily. I think the drain would work better if the catch-pit were removed altogether.

The public latrines, market, and slaughter-house and cattle sheds have been kept in good order.

The quality of cattle is about the same.

I would draw the attention of the Municipal Council to the want of protection against contamination of the water in the reservoir.

Instead of this place being made one of the “sights” of Kandy (by its natural beauty) and a rendezvous for tea picnics, I would urgently suggest that no person whatever be allowed to go near this source of the water supply of the town without special permission; or if this cannot be carried out, that a fence be put up, which would effectually prevent any person being able to get near the water.

It may be said in answer to the above that people have been accustomed to visit the reservoir for a good many years, and no harm has resulted. To this I would say the prevention of a serious epidemic of infectious disease heretofore has been the result of good fortune. It only needs the deposit of one typhoid or choleraic stool into the reservoir to decimate the whole town, for if one of the stools of either of these diseases found its way into the reservoir, it would be conducted to the standpipes, and the inhabitants would have the poison laid on at their doors. This is no hysterical or fancy picture, for such catastrophes are of by no means rare occurrence, as witness the recent serious outbreak of typhoid fever at Worthing in England.
