GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

CEYLON GOVERNMENT 4 PER CENT. INSCRIBED STOCK.

Third Issue, Rs. 500,000.

Authorized by Ordinance No. 7 of 1892, "An Ordinance to empower the Ceylon Government to raise Four Million Rupees for the Construction of Railways and other Public Works."

THE Treasurer of Ceylon, on behalf of the Government, invites Tenders for the above amount of Stock, to be issued and inscribed under the provisions of "The Ceylon Inscribed Rupee Stock Ordinance, 1892."

The Loan is secured on the general revenue of the Colony, and the principal will be repayable at par on the 1st February, 1944, by a sinking fund of 1 per cent. per annum, to be formed under the management of the Auditor-General and Treasurer, who are appointed Trustees. The interest, at the rate of 4 per cent. per annum, will be payable half-yearly on the 4th February and 4th August in each year, for the half-year ended with the last day of the month next preceding, the first payment being due on the 4th August next, by dividend warrants, which, if desired, may be transmitted by post, either to the stockholders or other person, bank, or firm within the Colony. Principal and interest will be payable at the Treasury at Colombo.

If the price of the Stock be below par at the time when the contributions to the sinking fund are received, the Trustees are empowered to purchase therewith the Stock in the market, cancelling in the register the Stock so purchased.

The Stock will be transferable by agreement in writing, without charge, and free of stamp duty.

Tenders will be received at the Treasury at Colombo until 1 P.M. on Monday, the 15th January, 1894, and will be opened in the presence of such of the applicants as may attend.

Tenders must be for *even thousands* of Stock.

The purchase money will be required as follows:—

Five per cent. on application, and the balance on or before the 1st February, 1894.

The first payment must accompany the Tender, and the subsequent payment is to be made at the Treasury not later than the date above mentioned.

The allotments will be made to the highest bidders, provided the rates offered are not below Rs. 1,000 in money for every Rs. 1,000 of Stock. In the event of the receipt of Tenders in excess of the amount to be allotted at or above the minimum price, the Tenders at the lowest price accepted will be subjected to a *pro rata* diminution.

If no allotment be made, the amount forwarded with the Tender will be returned in full, and if a portion only of the amount applied for be allotted, the surplus will be appropriated towards the payment of the second instalment.

Bay of Bengal—Burma Coast—A Light-vessel off the South-East Corner of the Baragua Flats.

The Port Officer, Rangoon, has given notice that it is intended on or about April, 1894, to place a light-vessel off the south-east corner of the Baragua flats, in six fathoms water, in lat. $15^{\circ} 29' 15''$ N., long. $95^{\circ} 11' 30''$ E.

The vessel will be painted red with the word "Baragua" in white letters on her sides.

The light will be a revolving one of 10,000 candle power, showing a red and white flash alternately every 45 seconds, each flash being of five seconds' duration, and will be visible all round the horizon at a distance of about 10 miles.

India, West—Sindh Coast—"Entrance Channel and Southern Port Limit Buoy."

The Port Officer, Kurrachee, through the Director of the Royal Indian Marine, has given notice that the red conical buoy marking the Entrance Channel, starboard side of this port, has been moved a distance of about 1,900 ft. S. by E. (magnetic) of its former position, and now bears from the extreme end of Manora breakwater, east (magnetic), distance about 1,900 ft., in a depth of 21 ft., low water, ordinary spring tides.

This buoy will be known in future as "the Entrance Channel and Southern Port Limit buoy."

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 465 of 1893) that the 3-fathom bank in Otamatea channel, lying 2 miles S.-W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. (S. 62° W.) from Oewa mound, is shoaling, and extending both north and south. Middle bank is also extending; and an oval-shaped bank, with $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms on it at low water, is forming about 4 cables southward of the red buoy on the outer end of middle bank.

China Sea—Billiton Island—Cheruchup (Tierutiup) Bay—Shoal in Approach to Tanjong Pandan.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 468 of 1893) of the existence of a coral shoal, with 3 fathoms water on it, lying in the approach to Tanjong Pandan, with Kalmoa beacon bearing S. 59° E., distant $2\frac{1}{5}$ miles, and close eastward of the black buoy on the north side of the channel.

Bay of Bengal—Burma Coast—Regarding the Shifting of the Western Lump Buoy, Rangoon River.

The Deputy Conservator of the Port, Rangoon, has given notice that the Western Lump buoy has been removed and relaid about 600 ft. E.N.E. of its former position, in 21 ft. reduced. This covers all encroachments, and the Spit channel is now perfectly safe.

The least water between the Centre Spit and Western Lump buoys is 16 ft. reduced, and between the Western Lump and Upper Spit buoys is 18 ft. reduced, and is deepens immediately outside.

Australia—Burnett River Bar—Tidal Signals and Depth, South Channel.

The Port Master, Brisbane, has given notice (No. 26 of 1893) that on and after October 15 the Code of Tidal Signals in use at all other Queensland Ports (Brisbane excepted) will be that used at the Burnett Heads.

Notice is also given that the South channel across the Burnett bar has shoaled one foot, the depth at low water being now $5\frac{1}{2}$ instead of $6\frac{1}{2}$ ft. as notified in notice No. 23 of August 7 last. The tide signals give the depth of water on the old bar.

China Sea—Singapore Strait—Salat Sinki—Ajax Shoal Light-vessel—Intended Withdrawal.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 461 of 1893) that on December 1, 1893, Ajax shoal light-vessel will be withdrawn from her station from the north side of Salat Sinki, and will be replaced by a red bell buoy.

China Sea—Pescadores Islands—Extension of N. W. Outlier.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 462 of 1893) that H.M.S. Plover has reported N.W. Outlier to be of greater extent than heretofore charted, a patch of $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms existing about $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables N.E. from the 5 fathoms already shown on the charts, and a depth of $4\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms in the position of that 5 fathoms.

South Pacific Ocean—New Guinea—Reef North-west of Emerald Reef.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 483 of 1893) of the existence of a coral reef, about three cables in extent, with an estimated depth of about one fathom on it, lying north-west of Emerald reef, in approximately lat. $10^{\circ} 34' 45''$ S., long. $151^{\circ} 30' 30''$ E. A sounding of 14 fathoms was obtained about $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables south-west of the reef.

China—Yellow Sea—Pe Chili Strait—Kwan Tung Peninsula—Double Flashing Light on Liau Ti Shan Promontory.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 184, dated October 15, 1892, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 493 of 1893) that on August 7, 1893, the permanent light was exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the south-west slope of Liau ti Shan (Lao t'ieh Shan) promontory, south coast of Kwan Tung peninsula.

Liau ti Shan light is a double flashing white light, showing flashes at intervals of half a minute, and visible between the bearings (approximate) of S. 8° E., through east and north and N. 73° W., except where obscured by outlying islands. It is elevated 315 ft. above the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 25 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric of the first order.

The lighthouse, 52 ft. high, constructed of iron and cylindrical in shape, is, with the dwellings and boundary wall, coloured white.

Japan—Kiusiu—Amakusa Islands—Hachiman Seto—Sunken Rock North-west of Mato Sima.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 495 of 1893) of the existence of a sunken rock, locally known as Osone, with two fathoms on it at low water, lying on the east side of Hachiman Seto, with the north rock of Mato Sima bearing S. 42° E., distant about 3 cables.

Approximate position: lat. $32^{\circ} 17' 5''$ N., long. $130^{\circ} 10' 45''$ E.

NOTE.—The strong tides near this rock, which was plainly seen, prevented a detailed examination being made, but the depths close around were under 10 fathoms, increasing gradually.

China Sea—Tientsin District.

Notice is hereby given that Captain William P. Chard, of the Chinese ss. Peiping, reports that he has repeatedly, on different voyages, obtained soundings in from 7 to 9 fathoms, low water, hard mud, about 14 miles to the N. $87\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. (true) from Shaluitien island (Tsaofeitien), where the latest Admiralty charts show 15 fathoms, and that he estimates the extent of the bank to be about 3 miles in an E.N.E. and W.S.W. direction, with a breadth of from 1 to $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile. On a straight line from this bank to a point bearing south 3 miles from Tsaofeitien lighthouse, Captain Chard obtained no soundings of less depth than those indicated by the charts.

DRAFT ORDINANCES.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance relating to the wearing and carrying of Knives.

Preamble.

WHEREAS the practice of wearing and carrying knives upon the person affords facilities for the infliction of dangerous wounds upon any sudden quarrel or provocation, and it has been established that a large proportion of the homicidal crime which has occurred in the Island within recent years has been committed by the use of the knife : And whereas it is expedient, for the prevention of such crime, to restrict the practice aforesaid : Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

Commencement.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Prevention of Crime Ordinance, 189 "; and it shall come into operation in such provinces, districts, or places, and at such time as the Governor in Executive Council shall appoint by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*. Provided that at least one month's notice of such time shall be given in the province, district, or place described in such Proclamation, in such manner as the Governor shall in each case determine.

Definition.

2 In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Knife" shall mean any knife with which a stabbing wound can be inflicted, but shall not include a knife which is commonly known as a penknife.

Powers of the Governor in Executive Council.

3 (1) It shall be lawful for the Governor, in Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*—

(a) to revoke any Proclamation issued under section 1, and upon such revocation this Ordinance shall cease to have any effect in the province, district, or place described in such revoked Proclamation; or

(b) to exempt from the operation of this Ordinance any portion or portions (to be defined) of any province, district, or place to which this Ordinance applies; or

(c) to exempt, with or without conditions, any particular class or classes of persons residing in any province, district, or place to which this Ordinance applies; or

(d) to exempt, with or without conditions, any person or class of persons carrying on, engaged in, or employed in any profession, trade, business, manufacture, or occupation, whether agricultural or otherwise, from the provisions of this Ordinance.

(2) The Governor in Executive Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, reissue any Proclamation revoked under sub-section (a), or alter, modify, or revoke any exemptions made under sub-sections (b), (c), or (d).

Offence.

4 From and after the coming into operation of this Ordinance in any province, district, or place, it shall not be lawful for any person therein to wear or carry upon his person a knife elsewhere than in a dwelling-house or the curtilage thereof.

Provided always that this section shall not apply—

(a) to any public servant as defined in section 19 of the Ceylon Penal Code; or

(b) to any person in the naval, military, or volunteer service of Her Majesty.

- Penalty. 5 (1) Whoever, in contravention of the last preceding section, shall wear or carry upon his person a knife, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, upon a first conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding ten rupees, and upon every subsequent conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, or to simple or rigorous imprisonment not exceeding three months.
- Forfeiture. (2) The police magistrate who convicts the offender shall declare the knife in respect of which the offence has been committed to be forfeited, and shall cause such knife to be destroyed.
- Share of fine to informer. (3) A police magistrate imposing a fine under this Ordinance may award to an informer any portion, not exceeding a moiety thereof, which may be actually recovered.
- Arrest of offender and seizure of knife worn or carried. 6 It shall be lawful for every police officer or headman, and they are hereby required, to arrest, with or without a warrant, any person committing an offence under this Ordinance, and to seize any knife which such person, in contravention of this Ordinance, shall be wearing or carrying upon his person, and to produce such person and knife before the nearest police magistrate to be dealt with according to law.
- Security to keep the peace. 7 (1) If a person is convicted of a breach of section 4, the police magistrate may, in lieu of or in addition to any penalty which he may impose under this Ordinance, order the offender to execute a bond, with or without sureties, for a sum fixed with due regard to the circumstances of the case, and not being excessive, for keeping the peace during a period not exceeding six months.
- Proviso. Provided that where the offender is a minor, the bond shall be executed only by his sureties.
- Proviso. Provided also that if the conviction is set aside, on appeal or otherwise, the bond so executed shall become void.
- Certain provisions of the Criminal Procedure Code to apply. (2) The provisions of the Criminal Procedure Code, 1883, relating to proceedings subsequent to an order to furnish security to keep the peace, and to the procedure on forfeiture of bonds, shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to every order made and every bond executed under this section.
- Onus of proof. 8 In any prosecution for a breach of section 4, it shall lie upon the defendant to prove that he is a person not incurring a penalty for such breach by virtue of the proviso to the said section, or by virtue of any exemption proclaimed under sub-sections (c) or (d) of section 3.
- Village tribunals may try cases of first offence. 9 In the case of a first offence against the provisions of this Ordinance, it shall be lawful for any village tribunal, within the limits of whose jurisdiction such offence is committed, to try the offender, and to exercise each and every of the powers which a police magistrate may in the like case exercise, anything in "The Village Communities Ordinance, 1889," to the contrary notwithstanding.
- Proviso. Provided that in no case shall a village tribunal order any offender to execute a bond for keeping the peace.
- Repealing Ordinance No. 19 of 1890. 10 From and after the passing of this Ordinance the Ordinance No. 19 of 1890, intituled "An Ordinance relating to the wearing and carrying of Knives," shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance to amend "The Ceylon Court of Admiralty Ordinance, 1891."

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Ceylon Court of Admiralty Ordinance, 1891," hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

To be read with principal Ordinance No. 2 of 1891.
Short title.

1 This Ordinance shall be read as one with the principal Ordinance, and may be cited as "The Ceylon Court of Admiralty Ordinance, 1893," and this Ordinance and the principal Ordinance may be cited collectively as "The Ceylon Court of Admiralty Ordinances, 1891 and 1893."

Section 22 of Ordinance No. 2 of 1891 amended.
Rules of court.

2 For section 22 of the principal Ordinance the following section shall be substituted, namely :—

(1) Rules of court for regulating the procedure and practice (including fees and costs) in the colonial court of admiralty and district courts in the exercise of the jurisdiction conferred by this Ordinance, whether original or appellate, may be made by the judges of the Supreme Court or any two of them, of whom the chief justice shall be one, and in the same manner as general rules and orders may be made under the provisions of section 53 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889."

Provided that the rules under this section shall not extend to matters relating to the slave trade, and shall not (unless otherwise ordered by Her Majesty in Council) come into operation until they have been approved by Her Majesty in Council, but on coming into operation shall have full effect as if enacted in this Ordinance; and any enactment inconsistent therewith shall, so far as it is so inconsistent, be repealed.

(2) The rules made under this section may provide for the exercise of any jurisdiction conferred by this Ordinance on the colonial court of admiralty by the full court or by any judge or judges thereof, and subject to any rules any judge of the Supreme Court may exercise in all actions, causes, and matters which come before such court sitting as a court of first instance, and not as a court of appeal, all or any part of the jurisdiction by this Ordinance conferred or intended to be conferred on the Supreme Court.

3. The person whose tender for a toll is selected by the Government Agent for submission to the Governor will be required to deposit at once one-tenth of the purchase amount in cash; and should the tender be accepted by His Excellency the Governor, to furnish cash security to the amount of one-third for the whole purchase amount, within thirty days of the date of the receipt by him of the notification of the Governor's acceptance of his offer.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, October 13, 1893.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated October 7, 1893.

Present :—Mr. C. E. D. Pennycuik, Mayor and Chairman ; Dr. W. R. Kynsey, c.m.g. ; Mr. M. Finlay ; Mr. C. Perera ; Mr. H. van Cuylenburg ; Mr. C. P. Dias ; Mr. Walter Pereira ; Mr. R. H. Morgan ; and Mr. C. M. Fernando.

The Minutes of September 8, 1893, having been printed and a copy sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of September 8, 1893, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice Mr. Walter Pereira asked the Chairman for information as to the last step taken with reference to the question of the improvement of Hulftsdorp street.

The Chairman laid before the Council a letter No. 498 of September 19, 1893, from the Superintendent of Works and accompanying plan, and explained that the Council has already decided to acquire No. 39, St. Sebastian Hill, but the amount voted is insufficient. That provision will be made in the Budget for 1894 for this purpose and also for the acquisition of No. 1, Hulftsdorp, and so much of No. 2 as may be necessary.

2. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. M. Fernando moved "that the Superintendent of Works be requested to furnish an estimate of the cost of draining Union lane in Union place, Slave Island."

Mr. C. Perera seconded.

The Chairman informed Mr. Fernando that an estimate for this work was framed in 1891. That the Superintendent would be asked to revise it, and that the necessary sum would be included in the Budget for 1894.

3-5. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved "that by-law No. 2 under chapter XVIII. be amended, so that it may read as follows :—

(a) No licensed butcher shall slaughter any cattle unless he shall have previously exposed the same to public view in the exposing shed appointed by the Council, for a period of not less than twenty-four hours.

(b) No licensed butcher shall slaughter any cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs unless he shall have obtained from the slaughter-house keeper a printed permit in the form authorized by the Municipal Council. This permit shall be duly filled in by the slaughter-house keeper, and shall be signed by him and by the butcher who brings the animal for slaughter.

"That steps be taken under section 124 of the Ordinance 7 of 1887 to give effect to this amendment."

Mr. Walter Pereira seconded.—Carried.

6. A Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January to September, 1893, and a Progress Report of Work done during September, 1893, were laid on the table.

7. A further letter (No. 140 of September 19, 1893) from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, with reference to the Dairies Supervision Ordinance, was placed before the Council.

Resolved,—That the letter be referred to the Special Committee appointed on May 12, 1893, to report on the Draft Ordinance relating to dairies.

8. A letter No. 134, of September 9, 1893, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, with reference to the proposed employment of the Veterinary Surgeon in examining and passing meat at the slaughter-house, was placed before the Council.

Dr. Kynsey moved "that the Government be asked whether they would have any objection to the Council engaging Mr. Lye's services, whenever required, on payment of remuneration, provided his official duties are not interfered with."

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

9. A letter No. 93, of July 11, 1893, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, inquiring whether the Council will take charge of the new roads at Bambalapitiya and near the Havelock racecourse, was placed before the Council with connected papers.

The Chairman moved "that the roads referred to be taken over, provided the boundaries are defined and drains cut through the lots 8,854, 8,855, 8,888, and 8,889 in plan 9,462, and that the water-rights of the Council over the lots indicated be established."

Mr. Morgan seconded.—Carried.

10. The City Analyst's report dated September 22, 1893, on the town water for September, 1893, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

11. Reports of the Inspectors on licensed carriages, and kerosine oil, poison, and gunpowder shops for October 1893, were laid on the table.

12. Tenders for the lease of the Grandpass market were placed before the Council.

Mr. C. Perera moved "that the recommendation of the Standing Committee 'that the tender of the highest bidder No. 3 be accepted,' be adopted."

The Chairman seconded.

Mr. Morgan moved as an amendment "that the present lessee be allowed the lease if he is prepared to pay as much as the highest bidder ; if not, that the highest tender be accepted."

Mr. Walter Pereira seconded.

In pursuance of the said agreement the firm of Campbell, Rivers & Co. was reconstituted and a fresh deed of co-partnership, dated 14th and 16th February and 16th March, 1885, hereto annexed, marked B, was entered into between the said firm of Campbell, Rivers & Co., having for its members John Patrick Alston, Robert Findlay Alston, and James Brown Alston aforesaid, together with William Gibson (the 2nd respondent above-named) and William Hamilton Alston (the 3rd respondent above-named) of the one part, and the said Hector Cross Buchanan and Frederic William Bois of the other part, for the purpose of carrying on business in Ceylon under the name and style of Alstons, Scott & Co.

5. The said firms so reconstituted carried on business in Scotland and Ceylon respectively until their stoppage in 1891.

6. The said Robert Findlay Alston died on the 1st March, 1885, and Charles Dalrymple Gairdner, Chartered Accountant, Glasgow (6th respondent above-named), was appointed in Scotland judicial factor on his estate, acting under his trust disposition and settlement, dated 8th September, 1874, and relative codicil dated 3rd May, 1881, and both registered in the books of Council and Session, Scotland, 7th March, 1885, conform to act and decree by the Court of Session, Scotland, in his favour, dated 12th January, 1892. The said John Patrick Alston died on the 29th May, 1891, and James Muir, Chartered Accountant, Glasgow (the 5th respondent above-named), was appointed trustee on his sequestrated estate.
