## REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

· 1. From September 1, 1912, no coconuts in husk shall be imported into Ceylon, except at the port of Colombo.

2. All coconuts in husk imported into Ceylon shall be subjected to furnigation

at the Government fumigatorium in Colombo before delivery to the consignee

3. The procedure defined by regulations Nos. 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8, and published in Gazette No. 5,936 of August 14, 1903, are to apply in the case of the said coconuts.

These regulations do not affect husked nuts, which are exempt from treatment.

THE REGISTRARS' PROCEEDINGS VALIDATION ORDINANCE, No. 3 of 1912.

An Order for the purpose of giving validity to certain Birth and Death Registrations in the Ratnapura, Anuradhapura, and Nuwara Eliya Districts.

HEREAS by section 3 of the above-named Ordinance it is enacted that "where, whether before or after the passing of this Ordinance-

(a) Any registration of a birth, death, marriage, document, or any other matter which is by law required or authorized to be registered; or

(b) Any proceeding taken or purporting to be taken by or before a Registrar by virtue of his officeis invalidated by reason of any informality, mistake, or accidental omission, whether relating to the appointment of the Registrar, or the limits of his jurisdiction, or the manner in which the registration or proceeding was made or taken, or any other incidental circumstance, and no other means are by law provided by which the registration or proceeding may be validated, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Executive Council, by order in Council notified in the Government Gazette, to give directions for the correction of the mistake, informality, or omission, and to make any other order that may be necessary for the purpose of giving validity to the registration or proceeding":

And whereas the registrations, specified in the schedule hereto, of births and deaths are invalidated by reason of the informalities and mistakes set forth in the said schedule, and no other means are by law provided for the validation of the said registrations:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the power vested in Us as aforesaid, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order and direct as follows:—

(a) The said registrations of births and deaths in the Ratnapura District are hereby declared to be as valid and effectual for all purposes as if the Registrar making the same had been duly appointed at the date when they were made.

(b) The said registrations of births and deaths in the Anuradhapura District are hereby declared to be as valid and effectual for all purposes as if the said births and deaths had occurred within the divisions of the Registrars

making the registrations.

(c) The said registrations of births and deaths in the Nuwara Eliya District are hereby declared to be as valid and effectual for all purposes as if they had been actually made within three months of the occurrence.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 10, 1912.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 83 (0 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 51 Sinhalese, 8 Tamils, 15 Moors, 1 Malay, and 2 Others. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1912, viz., 226,553) was 19.2, as against 18.0 in the preceding week, 19.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 110 (O Europeans, 6 Burghers, 50 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 21 Moors, 4 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 25.4, as against 25.6 in the previous week, 35.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 35.2 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 110 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as against 22 in the preceding

week, 34 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average of last year. Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 5.

Selected Causes of Death.—Eighteen deaths were registered from Phthisis (against 8 in the previous week and 14

the weekly average for last year), of which 6 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 4 in New Bazaar, 3 in St. Paul's, 2 each in Maradana hospitals and Slave Island, and 1 in Kollupitiya. 2. Sixteen deaths were registered from Pneumonia (against 19 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in St. Paul's, 3 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 2 each in Kotahena, New Bazaar,

Maradana hospitals, and Wellawatta. Five deaths were registered from Bronchitis. 3. Three deaths were registered from Enteric Fever (as in the previous week, against 8 the weekly average for last year), of which 1 each was in Maradana hospitals, Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and Slave Island. There were 8 cases reported during the week, as in the previous week.

Eleven deaths were registered from Enteritis (4-infants), 9 from Debility (6 infants), 6 from Diarrhæa (5 infants), 5 from Infantile Convulsions, 4 each from Dysentery and Senility, 2 from Worms, 1 from Tetanus, and 26 from Other Causes.

5. Eighteen cases of Measles were reported, against 10 in the previous week; and 2 of Chickenpox, as in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.6°, against 81.7° in the preceding week and 82.4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.825 in., against 29.828 in. in the preceding week and the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.54 in., against 0.71 in. in the preceding week and 0.08 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
