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VITAL STATISTICS OF CEYLON.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR THE FIRST QUARTER OF 1893.

I.—Population.

The estimated population of the Island on the last day of the quarter was 3,119,037, as against 3,119,979 on December 31 last, a decrease of nearly a thousand.

Table I. in the appendix gives the estimated area, population, number of marriages, births (legitimate and illegitimate, male and female), deaths (male and female) of each Province and district of the Island in the quarter.

Arrivals and Departures of Indian Coolies.—The increase in the Indian cooly population of the Island continues to be steady each succeeding year, showing a larger excess of arrivals over departures than its predecessor. The total number of arrivals in the quarter was 21,479, which exceeded the arrivals in the corresponding period of the last two years, and was nearly two and a half times the annual average for the period in the ten years 1881–90 (8,708). The number of departures in the quarter was 20,829, an increase on the number in the corresponding period of 1891 (16,795) and of 1892 (20,287), and was 30 per cent. above the annual average of the quarter in 1881–90 (16,093).

II.—Marriages.

Marriages.—The number of general marriages—*i.e.*, marriages other than Kandyan or Mohammedan—registered in this quarter was 3,176, and of Kandyan marriages 795.

Table VII. in the appendix shows the marriages solemnised among the general community in every Province and district of the Island, the civil condition, nationality, the highest, lowest, and mean ages of the parties, the mode of solemnisation, the number of bridegrooms and brides who were unable to sign their names in the registers, &c.

Table VIII. gives similar information in respect of Kandyans.

First Marriages: Re-marriages.—Of the 3,176 general marriages, 2,742 (equal to 86 per cent.) were between bachelors and spinsters, 100 between bachelors and widows, 268 between widowers and spinsters, 63 between widowers and widows, 2 between divorced men and spinsters, and 1 between a divorced woman and a bachelor. Of the 795 Kandyan marriages, 663 (equal to 83 per cent.) were between bachelors and spinsters, 22 between bachelors and widows, 54 between widowers and spinsters, 16 between widowers and widows, 17 between divorced men and spinsters, 2 between divorced men and widows, 12 between divorced women and bachelors, 6 between divorced women and widowers, and 3 between divorced men and divorced women.

Age at Marriage.—The mean age at marriage for the general community was 28·2 for males and 20·7 for females; and for the Kandyans, 28 for males and 19 for females.

Minors.—In the general community 4·0 per cent. of the bridegrooms and 65·5 per cent. of the brides were under 21; and among the Kandyans 14·2 per cent. of the bridegrooms and 68·8 per cent. of the brides were under 21.

Mixed Marriages.—There were 10 mixed marriages in the quarter: 1 between a European and a Burgher, 2 between Burghers and Sighalese, 6 between Sighalese and Tamils, and 1 other mixed marriage.

Signatures in the Marriage Register.—Of the 6,352 persons married among the general community this quarter, 837 men and 2,572 women signed the register with marks; that is to say, 74 per cent. of the men and 19 per cent. of the women were able to write their names. Of the 1,590 persons married among the Kandyans, 280 men and 753 women signed the register with marks, or, in other words, 65 per cent. of the men and 5 per cent. of the women were able to write their names.

III.—Births and Deaths.

Births.—The births registered in the quarter numbered 24,345, and were in the proportion of 32·6 to 1,000 persons living, as against 29·9, the average of the corresponding period for the ten years 1883–92, and 29·7, the rate in the first quarter of last year.

Deaths.—The deaths registered in the quarter amounted to 25,737, including 30 Europeans, 105 Burghers, 18,470 Sighalese, 5,224 Tamils, 1,844 Moors, 51 Malays, and 13 others, and corresponded to an annual rate of 34·5 per 1,000.

The Births and Deaths and their Rates in this quarter are compared in the following statement with the results obtained in the previous quarter, the first quarter of the past year, and the average of the corresponding quarter in the ten years 1883–92:—

It will thus appear that the birth-rate of the Island in the present quarter, though slightly higher than the average of the corresponding quarter in the period 1883–92, is below the death-rate of the quarter, which was considerably in excess of the average.

Table II. in the appendix gives similar information to Table A in respect of each Province and district in the Island. Table I. gives the births and deaths according to sex, and births according to legitimacy; Table IX. the

births according to nationality and sex; and Table X. the deaths for each month of the quarter according to nationality for every Province and district. The causes of death for every Province and district are shown in Table XI., for the estates in the Central and Uva Provinces in Table XII., and for the town of Colombo (according to wards) in Table XIII. Table XIV. shows the period of life at which the deaths of the various races occurred in every district.

Age at Death.—The deaths of infants under one year of age numbered 5,435, and were in the proportion of 223. deaths to 1,000 births. The rate of infant mortality varied greatly in different districts, from 707 in Vavuniya, 579 in Kurunegala, and 341 in Trincomalee, to 63 in Kalutara, 97 in Colombo, and 119 in Negombo District. 46 deaths were reported to be of centenarians (23 of each sex).

Sex.—Of the total number of births (24,345), 12,692 were males and 11,653 were females, i.e., 109 males to 100 females. Of the total number of deaths (25,737), 13,121 were males and 12,616 were females. Out of equal numbers living of each sex there died 922 males to 1,000 females.

IV.—State of Public Health.

The general health of the population of the Island (34.5), though slightly better than in the corresponding quarter of last year (35.5), is worse than the average for the first quarter in the period 1883-92 (27.8), and shows an excess of 6.7 deaths to every 1,000 persons living in the population.

The Tables III., IV., V., and VI. in the appendix show the births and deaths and the death-rates for all ages and for infants in the several districts of the Island and in the subdivisions of those districts for this quarter and for the corresponding period of the last two years 1891-92. The rates shown are for the Singhalese only in the Singhalese districts and for the Tamils only in the Tamil districts. These separate rates furnish more trustworthy data for comparing the relative sanitary condition of those districts and divisions of the Island than if the rates included other nationalities temporarily resident in them. In the Puttalam District, where the Singhalese and Mohammedans are found in almost equal numbers, and in the Batticaloa District, where Tamils and Mohammedans are almost in equal numbers, the rates of the different sections of the population, as well as of all the races, are given.

I have included for the first time this quarter the infantile mortality for each division. This will furnish in time with a still more accurate measure of the comparative health of the divisions.

Western Province.—The health of the Singhalese population living in the Western Province, and estimated at 661,145 persons, was less satisfactory during the quarter than the corresponding period of 1891-92; the annual death-rate during the first quarter of 1892 being equal to 22.2 per 1,000, against 20.5 in the corresponding period of the last two years and 5.2 per 1,000 above the mean rate of the preceding eight quarters (17.0). The increase in the mortality is chiefly noticeable in the divisions of Siyane korale of the Colombo District and Hapitigam korale of the Negombo District. In Siyane korale (the second healthiest division in the Province) the death-rate rose in the quarter to 22.5, or 60 per cent. above the mean rate of the first quarter in 1891-92 (14.1), the excess being mainly attributable to fever and diarrhoeal diseases, which caused 390 deaths or more than half the total deaths recorded in the division. Hapitigam korale shows a similar rise in the death-rate from 24.7 (the mean rate for the quarter in 1891-92) to 33.3, fever accounting for 128 deaths out of a total of 226. In the Kalutara District the death-rate recorded in the quarter was about the average, and is equal to 19.9 per 1,000.

The weather during the period was generally unfavourable to health, the mean daily range in the temperature being in January 1.7°, in February 1.8°, and in March 2.3° in excess of the mean daily range in the corresponding months of the preceding two years.

Southern Province.—The mortality of the Singhalese population living in the Southern Province, and estimated at 446,539, was in the quarter at the rate of 30.3, which, though an increase of 8.1 deaths to every 1,000 living over the rate for the quarter in the Western Province (22.2), is 8.8 below the mean rate of the corresponding period in the previous two years (39.1), or, in other words, the deaths in the Province this quarter, allowing for increase of population, were 1,026 less than the average. It must be remembered that the Province was exceptionally unhealthy in the past two years and experienced an unusually heavy mortality from fever and diarrhoea which broke out in the Hambantota District during the first quarter of 1891, and which spread steadily into the Province, continuing to prevail until the end of the first quarter of the succeeding year. It was most fatal in the Hambantota District, and as it progressed through each district and division in the Province it declined in virulence. The extent to which the death-rate of the present quarter declined from the mean rate of the period in the last two years is therefore a measure of the greater unhealthiness of the corresponding quarter in 1891-92. Arranging the revenue subdivisions in the Province in the order of their geographical position, it will be noticed, as the following table shows, that there was in Magam pattu division a decline of 55.1 deaths, in Kandaboda pattuwa of 16.2, in Wellaboda pattuwa 14.2, in Gangaboda pattuwa (Matara District) 10.2, in Matara Four Gravets 6.0, in Gangaboda pattuwa (Galle District) 4.9, and in Wellaboda pattuwa 3.2 deaths to every 1,000 of the inhabitants.

The gradation was thus almost continuous from one end of the Province to the other until we reach Walallawiti kóralé and Hinidum pattywa (which are subject also to other influences owing to their proximity to the divisions of Pasdun and Kukulu kóralés, which were specially unhealthy in the first quarter of 1892), and was only broken in the divisions of Giruwa pattywa, Morawak kóralé, and Talpe pattywa, and the Galle Four Gravets. In Morawak kóralé the death-rate this quarter was the average, 45·7. The division is hilly and more elevated than any other in the Province, and this circumstance has probably been favourable to its immunity from the wave of epidemic fever and diarrhoea to which the other divisions were more or less subject. The Talpe division, instead of sharing in the general decline of mortality, showed an increase from 30·8 to 36·5, owing to an epidemic this quarter of dysentery and diarrhoea, which accounted for 189 out of 402 deaths in the quarter. The Galle Four Gravets division should be left out of consideration, being a town whose rate is subject to fluctuations owing to the presence of hospitals, jails, &c.

North-Western Province.—The mortality of the Singhalese population living in the North-Western Province, and estimated to contain 274,380 persons, was in the quarter at the annual rate of 70·8, which contrasts very unfavourably with the low rates of 45·3 and 40·0 recorded in the corresponding quarters of 1891 and 1892 respectively. The heavy increase in the mortality was chiefly confined to the Kurunégala District. Here the death-rate very nearly doubled itself, being at the rate of 82·3, as against 44·3 in the corresponding quarters of the two years 1891–92 (44·3). In some of the divisions the death-rate recorded was more than double: e.g., in Dambadeni hatpattywa the death-rate was 99·7, as against 42·7 in the corresponding period of 1891–92; and in Hiriyala hatpattywa 93·1, as against 45·5 in the corresponding period of 1891–92.

In Chilaw District the mortality this quarter was 3·8 above the mean rate of the corresponding period in 1891–92 (29·6), and in Puttalam District 5·4 below the mean rate, being 72·0, as against 77·4 in the corresponding period of 1891–92.

Central Province.—The mortality of the Singhalese population living in the Central Province, and estimated at 250,025, was in the quarter at the annual rate of 40·5, an increase of 6·1 deaths in every 1,000 living over the mean rate of the corresponding quarter in the last two years (34·4). In the Kandy District the rate of increase in the mortality to every 1,000 of the population was 4·7, from 31·1 to 35·8; in the Matalé District the increase was 18, from 45·5 to 63·5; while the Nuwara Eliya District was healthier during the period, and the death-rate fell to 28·2 from 32·6, with a decline of 4·3 to every 1,000 living.

Of the divisions in the Kandy District, Tumpane and Harispattu were particularly unhealthy during the period, the death-rates recorded having increased very considerably from the rates in the corresponding quarter of the last two years, and were in the ratio of 68·9 and 40·0 per 1,000 respectively.

Province of Sabaragamuwa.—The health of the Singhalese population living in the Sabaragamuwa Province, and estimated at 221,825 persons, was in the quarter at the annual rate of 38·6, as against a mean rate of 35·7 in the corresponding period of the previous two years. The improvement in the mortality is due to the healthiness of the Ratnapura District, which shows a decline in its death-rate from 50·0 to 38·1, while the other district of the Province (Kégalla District) was worse, and the death-rate recorded increased to 39·0 per 1,000, or 61 per cent. above the mean rate of the first quarter in 1891–92 (24·2).

The exceptionally high rate of mortality which prevailed in the Kégalla District during the quarter is due to a virulent outbreak of malarious fever, which assumed in every division an epidemic form. The outbreak commenced at the end of last year, and was at its worst in the first quarter of this year; but, with the advent of the usual rains at the end of the quarter, fever began to abate, and a decline of the death-rate may be expected in the succeeding quarter.

During the three months of this quarter fever was destructive, and raised the mortality considerably above the average. It was most fatal in Kinigoda, Galboda, and Atulugam kóralés, and in the division of Lower Bulatgama, as will be seen from the following table, where the death-rate in this quarter is compared with its mean rate in the past two years:—

In Kinigoda kóralé the death-rate was more than double, being at the rate of 58·7, as against a mean rate in the corresponding quarter of the preceding two years of 27·0; in Galboda kóralé the death-rate rose to 41·4 from 26·9; in Atulugam kóralé the death-rate rose to 38·4 from 22·9; and in Lower Bulatgama division to 30·0 from 17·8. The unhealthiness of these divisions is reported by the Assistant Provincial Registrar to have been aggravated by want of wholesome food caused by the failure of the maha harvest of August, 1892, and of the yala of January, 1893, and by a sharp rise in the market price of imported rice.

Province of Uva.—The health of the Singhalese population living in the Province of Uva, and estimated to contain at the beginning of this year 114,946 persons, was satisfactory during the quarter; the death-rate recorded being 39·5, or 20 per cent. lower than the mean rate in the corresponding quarter of the preceding two years (49·8). It must be remembered, however, that the last two years were among the unhealthiest years of the Province, cholera and epidemic diarrhoea raising the mortality much above the normal rate.

The improvement this quarter is noticeable in every subdivision of the Province, and is evidence of its immunity from epidemic fever, dysentery, or diarrhoea usual in the district, especially in the division of Welawaya. Here the death-rate, which in the corresponding quarter of 1891 and 1892 were as high as 84·5 and 99·6 respectively, fell to 57·6 this quarter.

North-Central Province.—The mortality among the Singhalese living in the North-Central Province, and estimated at 59,439, was in the quarter at the annual rate of 52·6 per 1,000, which, though an improvement on the corresponding quarter of last year (82·1), is worse than the rate in the period in 1891 (41·9). The Nuwaragampalata division in the district shows a better death-rate (46·6) than in the first quarter of 1891 (47·1), or 1892 (59·2), while the Tamankaduwa division was worse, the death-rate recorded being 57·2, as against 34·8 and 32·1 in the first quarter of 1891 and 1892 respectively. In Hurulipalata and Kelegampalata divisions the death-rates recorded (51·8 and 63·7 respectively) were below the rates in that period in 1892 but higher than in 1891.

Northern Province.—The mortality among the Tamils in the Northern Province, who are estimated at 308,401, was in the quarter at the annual rate of 23·3, a decline of 7·2 from the mean rate of the first quarter in the previous two years (39·3). Allowing for increase of population, the deaths in the quarter were 855 less than the average. In the Jaffna District, where more than nine-tenths of the Tamils are found, the death-rate fell from 24·6 to 21·4, in Mannar District from 67·6 to 36·9, in Mullaittivu District from 64·8 to 60·4, and in Vavuniya District from 55·9 to 38·9.

The general reduction in the death-rates does not mean an improved sanitary condition of the population, for the Province was below its normal state of health in the period with which the comparison is made. It will be seen from the annexed Table IV. in the appendix, in which the death-rates for first quarters in the years 1891, 1892, and 1893 are shown side by side, that the quarter was unhealthy in 1892, except in Mullaittivu District, which, however, suffered heavily in 1891, the mortality then attaining the enormous rate of 82·4. Confining the comparison to the first quarter of 1891, the first quarter of 1893 was as healthy as in that period, the only division showing abnormal rates being Valikamam East and Pachchilaippali. In Valikamam East the death-rate rose in the quarter to 20·1 from 16·3 and 18·1 in the corresponding quarters of 1891 and 1892 respectively, falling below Valikamam West (19·0), Vadamaradchi (17·3), and The Islands division of Jaffna (17·8) in point of health. Half the deaths in Valikamam East, i.e., 54 out of 109, resulted from fever. In Pachchilaippali, the other division of the Jaffna District, the death-rate was equal to 61·2. Of 85 deaths in this division 35 resulted from fever, 2 from dysentery and diarrhoea, and 11 from infantile convulsions.

Eastern Province.—The mortality of the Tamil population in the Eastern Province, consisting of 86,865 persons, was in the quarter at the annual rate of 33·7 per 1,000, as against 35·1 and 60·5 in the corresponding quarters of 1891 and 1892 respectively. The unhealthiness of the Province in the first quarter of last year was due to an epidemic of cholera, which prevailed in both the Batticaloa and Trincomalee Districts to an alarming extent.

In the Batticaloa District the Tamil death-rate this quarter fell to 32·4 from 51·9; it was 11·2 in the Local Board Division of Batticaloa, as against 86·2 in the corresponding quarter of 1892; 34·6 in Manmunai pattu (exclusive of the Local Board Division), as against 78·1; 20·4 in Eraur, Rukam, and Koralai, as against 45·5; 36·2 in Eruvil, Porativu, and Karavaku, as against 54·6; while in the other divisions of the district, which were unaffected by the cholera epidemic of 1892, the death-rate was equal to or less than in the first quarter of 1892.

The Mohammedan death-rate in the district was in the quarter 23·5, being 9·9 below the Tamil-rate (32·4), due probably to their being a well-to-do agricultural population.

The death-rate in the Trincomalee District during the quarter was 39·2 per 1,000. This rate, though lower than in the corresponding quarter of last year (54·5), when cholera was epidemic in the district and was fatal to 99 persons, is above the rate in the first quarter of 1891 (34·1). Of the divisions in this district Kotiyar pattu, as usual, shows the lowest death-rate (17·3), and was even better than in the corresponding quarter of 1891 (24·9) or of 1892 (22·2); Tampalakamam and Trincomalee town follow with death-rates of 25·4 and 37·7; and last comes the division of Kadukkulam pattu with a rate (83·4) nearly five times as high as in Kotiyar pattu (17·3), and showing 500 deaths of infants to every 1,000 children born alive.

V.—Causes of Death.

The causes of death registered in the Island during the quarter are given in detail in Table XI. in the appendix. They may be summarised as follows:—

Fever and Diarrhoeal Causes.—Of the 25,737 deaths registered in the quarter, 7,750 were reported due to various forms of fever and 5,881 to diarrhoeal diseases: i.e., fever contributed 30 per cent. and diarrhoeal diseases 23 per cent. of the total deaths from all causes. Under the head diarrhoeal diseases is included cholera, which caused 245 deaths, being nearly the same number as in the last quarter (243). It is not unlikely that many of these cases, though returned as cholera, were really cases of acute diarrhoea.

Smallpox accounts for 8 deaths in the quarter (Colombo 2, Kandy 5, and Badulla 1).

The other chief natural causes of death were infantile convulsions 1,676, worms 952, general dropsy 915, anaemia 674, phthisis 601, debility 587, puerperal convulsions 501, old age 341, pneumonia 314, thrush 253, rheumatism

177, ulcer and bedsores 154, childbirth 132, bronchitis 113, premature birth 107, measles 102, scrofula 97, parangi 92, (Kurunégal 45, Anurádhapura 12, Mátara 9, Mátalé 4, Galle, Batticaloa, and Ratnapura 3 in each, Kandy, Mullaittivu, Hambantota, and Badulla 2 in each, Negombo, Vavuniya, Trincomalee, Chilaw, and Kégalla 1 in each), asthma 87, starvation, want of breast milk 83 (Badulla 34, Kandy 14, Mátalé, Nuwara Eliya, and Mullaittivu 7 in each, Negombo 3, Mátara, Kurunégal, and Ratnapura 2 in each, Kalutara, Galle, Hambantota, Batticaloa, and Trincomalee 1 in each), paralysis 68, dochmias duodenalis 84, convulsions (adult) 63, malarial cachexia 61, puerperal fever 61, heart disease 61, rickets 55, tetanus 54, apoplexy 50, varicose veins 49, cancer 43, croup 42, ascites 24, whooping cough 22, leprosy 22 (Colombo 11, Jaffna and Galle 3 in each, Batticaloa and Badulla 2 in each, and Kalutara 1), and influenza 14.

Deaths by Violence.—Of the 453 deaths attributed to these causes, 122 are attributed to fall from trees, 86 to drowning, 32 to snake-bite, 31 to burns and scalds, 28 to gun-shot wounds, 21 to injury at birth, 7 to poison, 6 to fall of heavy substances, 5 to fall from height, 4 to injury from elephant, 3 to bulls, 3 to fall in pits, 3 to rat-bite, 3 to lightning, 2 to cheetah, 2 to crocodile, 2 to being run over by train, 2 to suffocation, 2 to sunstroke, 1 to a sheep, 1 to hornets, 1 to being run over by a cart; 22 deaths were due to suicide (11 by hanging, 3 by poison, 2 by gun-shot wounds, 2 by drowning, and the remaining 4 by other and undefined means).

Murders and Executions.—Twenty-two deaths registered in this quarter are attributed to murder and other forms of homicide (4 in Colombo, 3 in Kalutara, Kandy, Nuwara Eliya, Mátara, and Hambantota 2 in each, Negombo, Mátalé, Galle, Anurádhapura, Badulla, Ratnapura, and Kégalla 1 in each).

Four men were judicially executed: 2 in Colombo and 2 in Kandy.

VI.—Health of the Estate Population.

The total number of births reported for registration this quarter from the estates in the Central and Uva Provinces was 1,062 (of which 9 were Europeans, 21 Singhalese, 1,028 Tamils, and 4 Moormen), and the total number of deaths was 1,133 (of which 1 was a European, 15 were Singhalese, 1,114 Tamils, and 3 Moormen), corresponding respectively to an annual rate of 21·8 and 23·2 per 1,000. The causes of death are given in detail in Table XI., and may be summarised as follows:—

Kandy District.—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Kandy District was 660, of which 638 were Tamils, 15 Singhalese, 6 Europeans, and 1 Moorman; and the deaths numbered 593, of which 584 were Tamils, 7 Singhalese, 1 European, and 1 Moorman. The Tamil birth-rate in the quarter was equal to 28·2, as against a mean rate in the preceding eight quarters of 27·7; and the Tamil death-rate was equal to 25·8, as against a mean rate of 28·4 in the preceding eight quarters. As usual the most fatal cause was diarrhoeal diseases, which caused 197 deaths (81 from diarrhoea and 116 from dysentery), or nearly 33 per cent. of the total number of deaths (593). The other most fatal causes of death were debility 72 (including mostly deaths of infants from inability to suck milk), fever 47, general dropsy 42, pneumonia 24, infantile convulsion 23, bronchitis 17, old age 16, anaemia 14, want of breast milk 13.

Mátalé District.—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Mátalé District was 88 (all Tamils), and the deaths numbered 99 (all Tamils), and corresponded to an annual rate of 24·9 (against a mean rate in the preceding eight quarters of 21·1) and 28·0 (against a mean rate in the preceding eight quarters of 25·8) per 1,000 respectively. Dysentery and diarrhoea caused 26 deaths, i.e., 26 per cent. of the total number of deaths, fever caused 14 deaths, debility 10 (mostly of infants from inability to suck milk), general dropsy 9, pneumonia 5, infantile convulsion 5, old age 3, and 27 are attributed to other causes.

Nuwara Eliya District.—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Nuwara Eliya District was 291 (3 Europeans, 4 Singhalese, 3 Moormen, and 281 Tamils), and the deaths numbered 231 (8 Singhalese, 2 Moors, and 221 Tamils), and corresponded to an annual birth-rate of 18·4 (against a mean rate in the preceding eight quarters of 21·8), and a death-rate of 14·5 (against a mean rate in the preceding eight quarters of 20·2) per 1,000 respectively. Diarrhoea and dysentery were fatal in 53 cases, or nearly 23 per cent. of the total number of deaths (231), 67 are attributed to debility, 13 to pneumonia, 12 to general dropsy, 10 to childbirth, 9 to infantile convulsion, 8 to bronchitis, 8 to old age, and 51 to other causes.

Badulla District.—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Badulla District was 223 (2 Singhalese and 221 Tamils), and the deaths numbered 210 (all Tamils), and corresponded to an annual birth-rate of 30·2 (against a mean rate in the preceding eight quarters of 26·8), and a death rate of 28·4 (against a mean rate in the preceding eight quarters of 28·2) per 1,000 respectively. Diarrhoea and dysentery were fatal in 62 cases, or nearly 30 per cent. of the total number of deaths (210), dochmiasis duodenalis in 26 cases, pneumonia and bronchitis in 24, debility in 23, fever in 13, general dropsy in 7, old age in 6, and other causes in 49.

VII.—Health of the Town of Colombo.

On the 1st day of this quarter (January 1, 1893) the Ordinance No. 20 of 1891 came into operation, and at last a commencement was made of the measures so long in contemplation for the proper collection of the vital statistics of the metropolis and for the protection of its health.

The names of the registrars appointed and now holding office are as follows. The majority are medical officers with European qualifications, and the others were appointed after an examination held under the direction of the Principal Civil Medical Officer :—

The town of Colombo has been unhealthier this quarter than in the corresponding quarter of any previous year since 1887, when the vital statistics of the town were first collected.

The total number of births registered in the town during the quarter was 613, representing an annual rate of 19·4 per thousand, an increase of 2·2 per thousand on the mean rate for the quarter during the six years 1887-92, during which the vital statistics of the town have been collected.

The total number of deaths registered during the quarter numbered 788, corresponding to an annual death-rate of 25·0 per thousand, as against a mean rate of 22·4 in the corresponding period of the preceding six years.

As usual the death-rate exceeds the birth-rate, which is due mainly to the preponderance of males over females in the town population, and to the presence of hospitals and jails, which add to the normal mortality of the town. This quarter the excess of the death-rate over the birth-rate is slightly higher than usual.

The number of births and deaths of the different races and the different wards in the town, their rates per thousand, the principal zymotic causes of death, &c., are shown in the following table :—

The town population of Colombo comprises different nationalities, who are found in every ward or division of the town in varying proportions as to sex and age. The composition of the population being thus varied, and the facts collected (which include only those of the present quarter) few in number, there are no means of ascertaining the death-rates of the principal nationalities according to wards. In the absence of this information, the death-rates given above should be corrected by the birth-rates. The Maradana Ward would then appear to be healthier than Kotahena, Kotahena than St. Paul's, and St. Paul's than St. Sebastian, Pettah, or Slave Island ward.

The rate of infant mortality in the town measured by the proportion of deaths under one year of age to a thousand registered births was equal to 26·4.

Table VIII. in the appendix gives a detailed statement of the causes of death.

There were no deaths registered from cholera or smallpox. The last death from cholera was a solitary case in the fourth quarter of 1891, and the last death from smallpox in the fourth quarter of 1892. Two deaths resulted from whooping cough and one from influenza.

Dysentery and diarrhoea were fatal to 141, infantile convulsions to 90, fever to 131 (of which 17 were enteric), malarial cachexia to 28, phthisis to 71, pneumonia to 20, bronchitis to 9, asthma to 9, puerperal convulsions to 4, child-birth to 12, tetanus to 17, old age to 17, and premature birth to 3.

Violence accounts for 27 deaths, including 21 from accident (of which 5 were attributed to drowning, 4 to injury at birth, 2 to suffocation, 2 to fall from height, 1 to fall from a tree, 2 to being run over by a cart, 1 to being tossed by a bull, 1 to burns and scalds, and 3 to other causes), 2 from homicide, 2 from suicide, and 2 from judicial execution.

The subjoined Table gives the births and deaths and their rates of each nationality living in the Colombo Municipality for the first quarter of this year and of 1892, and the average of the corresponding period in the previous seven years:—

The deaths recorded in the quarter increased among all the sections of the town population, except the Mohammedans. The death-rate among the Sinhalese increased from 18·6, the mean rate of the period in the years 1887-92, to 22·8 this quarter, among the Tamils from 18·0 to 33·8, and still more among the Burghers from 9·1 to 25·5. Among the Mohammedans alone there was a decline from 39·6, the mean rate, to 22·9—i.e., a sudden fall from the highest mortality in the town, which has characterised this community ever since the statistics of Colombo were tabulated, to almost the lowest mortality. The number of registered deaths this quarter was 157, one-fifth of the number for all races, though, hitherto, the Mohammedan deaths have numbered one-third of the deaths of all races.

The reduction is due most probably to the evasion of the new law, which imposes so many checks on those disposed to report false causes of death, that it is probably found more convenient not to report the deaths, such a course being facilitated by the existence of cemeteries (Mohammedan and other) which are not under any official control, and to which bodies may be removed without information being given to the Registrars of Deaths.

A scheme for the placing under official control of all cemeteries and cremation grounds used by the inhabitants of Colombo is now before Government. The Hindu and Buddhist cremation grounds should be placed under such control, not merely in the interests of the public health, but in the interests of the administration of justice, as when a body is burned all material evidence of foul play, if any, is at once destroyed. The Municipality of Colombo should, I think, have charge of all the cemeteries and cremation grounds, which should be placed under the direct supervision of their Sanitary Officer. Only then will the new law be properly administered, the public health protected, the vital statistics of the town effectively collected, and the great expense now incurred by the Government for the registration of deaths in the town justified.

The delay in the publication of this report is due to the delay in the receipt of the duplicate registers of births, marriages, and deaths from the Provincial Registrar, Colombo.
