**Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held
in the Town Hall on Friday, May 31, 1912.**

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated May 25, 1912.

Present.—Mr. C. R. Cumberland, Acting Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias, Major A. W. de Wilton; Mr. R. S. Templeton; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. D. P. Banajee; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; Mr. Sutherland Ross; and Mr. T. Leese.

1. The Minutes of General Meeting of April 26, 1912, and of a Special Meeting of May 17, 1912, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of General Meeting of April 26, 1912, and of the Special Meeting of May 17, 1912, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo presented a petition from some ratepayers of Colombo, and moved that a Special Committee be appointed to investigate into the complaint of the petitioners. The Committee to consist of Messrs. Arthur Alvis, H. L. de Mel, E. G. Jayewardene, A. J. Martin, Dr. E. V. Ratnam, and Dr. W. P. Rodrigo.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded, and, with permission of Council, moved to amend the motion so as to read as follows:—
“That the Council appoint a Special Committee consisting of the Chairman, Messrs. Arthur Alvis, H. L. de Mel, E. G. Jayewardene, A. J. Martin, Dr. E. V. Ratnam, and Dr. W. P. Rodrigo to investigate into all complaints on the part of the ratepayers of this city against any Inspector of the Municipal Council.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo, having agreed, withdrew his motion in favour of Mr. Dias's amendment, which was seconded by Mr. E. G. Jayewardene and carried unanimously.

3. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo asked the Chairman—

- (1) Whether the Council's Works Engineer has received an application dated February 17, 1912, from one O. L. Abdul Rahiman for permission to build a house at No. 16a, Wellawatta.
- (2) Whether a second letter was received by the same officer from the same applicant, calling attention to his first letter, on April 27 last.
- (3) Whether a third letter, addressed to the Chairman, was received on the 15th instant on the same subject.
- (4) Whether any reply to these letters was sent to the applicant, and moved for papers.

With regard to (1) and (2), the Chairman replied in the negative, and to (3) in the affirmative. With regard to (4), the Chairman said that a reply was sent on May 30, 1912.

Papers were laid on the table.

4. The Council then proceeded to elect one Member for the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets in place of the Hon. Sir Allan Perry, Kt., who has resigned from the Committee.

The Chairman declared the result of the ballot to be in favour of Mr. A. J. Martin, who was duly elected.

Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that this Council do place on record its appreciation of the invaluable services rendered by the Hon. Sir Allan Perry to the ratepayers of the city as a Member of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets, for a number of years.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried unanimously.

5. Interim Report of the Special Committee on Cheap Facilities of Transit in Colombo was brought before Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider the Interim Report of the Special Committee on Cheap Facilities of Transit in Colombo. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.—Carried.

(Council in Committee.)

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do resume. Mr. R. S. Templeton seconded.—Carried.

The Council having resumed, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved the adoption of the Interim Report of the Special Committee on Cheap Facilities of Transit in Colombo. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried unanimously.

Present :—The Hon. Mr. G. S. Saxton, Chairman; Dr. G. P. Schöckman; Mr. W. C. Price; Mr. C. H. LaBrooy; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. R. W. Jonklaas; Mr. D. E. Weerasuria; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on April 20 having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

(a) Statement of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1911 to April 30, 1912, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water Rate Account.

(d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of April.

Resolved—That further inquiry be made as regards the continuity of service of Cooly Rengen, and that Mr. L. P. Bulner, the town clock-keeper, be not recommended for an allowance in view of the opinion of the Colonial Auditor.

(3) Letter of April 26, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to Mr. C. A. LaBrooy, intimating that he has been nominated a Member of the Kandy Municipal Council, for the information of the Chairman.—Read.

(4) Letter No. 229 of May 7, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, *re* acquisition of an alley in Temple street, for the information of the Chairman.—Read.

(5) Letter No. 225 of May 7, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, *re* application for a block of Colonial Military land for a cricket field for Trinity College, Kandy, for the information of the Chairman.—Read.

(6) Letter No. 68 of May 13, from the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, *re* acquisition of land for a latrine at Buvelikada.

John Patrick Knelemn Wilkins.—"A process for extracting oil or vegetable fats from coconuts or other fruits or nuts by boiling in water."

Abstract.—This invention relates to a method for extracting oil or vegetable fats from coconuts or other fruits or nuts and for clarifying the oil or fat without the use of any of the chemical or mechanical processes for clarification hitherto employed.

The process is as follows:—The kernel of the ripe coconut or other nut after being separated from the shell in the usual way is crushed between rolls until it is reduced to a uniform pulp or meal. That meal is placed in an open boiler to an amount equal to one-third the capacity of the boiler; water is added to an amount equal to another one-third of the capacity of that boiler; and the remaining one-third of the capacity of the boiler is left as a space to allow for ebullition. The contents so arranged are boiled for about one hour and it is stated that the oil will then float on the surface of the water in a pure translucent condition. Cold water may then be added to bring the floating oil up to the rim of the boiler, so that it may be more easily removed, and to cool it.

The boiler with its contents is then removed to a cool chamber and allowed to remain until the oil coagulates. The coagulated oil is then broken up into lumps and lifted out of the water and is laid out in a second chamber in which the atmosphere is rarefied with the object of evaporating all moisture from the surfaces of the lumps.

Gogu Constantinescu.—“Improvements in an relating to the automatic Regulation of Feed of Liquids for supplying Carburetters and for like purposes.”

Abstract.—This invention relates to means for automatically regulating the flow of liquids under suction, and is particularly applicable to the regulation of the supply of liquid fuel to carburetters, vapourisers and the like for use with internal combustion engines ; but the invention is applicable also in all cases where a flow of liquid proportional to a pressure difference is required.

One of the principal objects of this invention is to provide for correct automatic regulation of the supply of liquid fuel to an internal combustion motor whether the load varies or is constant.

The invention consists in the means of regulating, and the apparatus for regulating the flow of the liquid under suction.

The apparatus consists of a vessel into which is led a supply of the liquid fuel, having an inlet, controlled by a float, or not, and an overflow ; so that a fairly constant level of the liquid surface is maintained in that vessel. A vertical tube projects upwards through the bottom of that vessel and projects slightly above the constant level of the liquid the lower end being coupled to the suction feed pipe of the motor the upper end of that tube having serrations at its edge. Surrounding that tube is another vertical tube projecting downwards from the closed top of that vessel and projecting well below the level of the surface of liquid surface in the vessel. In the closed top of that vessel a small hole is drilled making communication with the outside air and the inside of that downwardly projecting tube.

The action of the apparatus is as follows :—When the motor sucks through the feed supply pipe and through the upwardly projecting tube in the supply vessel, a diminution of pressure results—if the air hole through the top of the cover is properly adjusted in regard to size—and the liquid fuel rises in the downwardly projecting tube until it flows through the serrations at the top of the upwardly projecting tube and so into the suction feed supply pipe and to the motor. It is stated that the flow to the motor will be proportional to the suction demand of the motor.

A modification provides for the downwardly projecting tube to be a float operating a valve which controls the supply of liquid to the vessel and maintains it at a fairly constant level in the space outside the space in which is the upwardly projecting tube.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF "THE CEYLONESE UNION COMPANY, LIMITED."

It is agreed that the regulations contained in the Table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," subject to the hereinafter mentioned modifications, shall be deemed to be the regulations of the Company. The modifications are as follows:—

ISSUE AND TRANSFER OF SHARES.

The Directors may decline, without any reason being assigned by them, to issue or allot any share or shares to any applicant or to register the transfer of any share or shares held by a Shareholder which, in the interests of the Company, they deem it inexpedient to issue or allot or register.

Every instrument of transfer shall be left at the office of the Company for approval by the Directors, accompanied by such evidence as may be required by the Directors to prove the title of the transferor. If the transfer be approved, such approval shall be certified in writing under the hand of two of the Directors endorsed on such instrument of transfer, and the Company shall thereupon register the transferee as a Shareholder. If the transfer be not approved, the proposed transfer shall be absolutely void, and notice of non-approval shall be sent to the Shareholder intending to transfer such share. If no notice of non-approval shall be sent to the Shareholder within thirty days, the transfer shall be deemed to have been approved.

FORFEITURE OF SHARES.

Forfeited shares may be redeemed by the party whose shares have been declared forfeited at any time before they are disposed of on payment of the amount of calls due, interest, and all costs incurred, and on payment thereof such shares shall revert in the person entitled thereto before the forfeiture, and be held by him in the same manner as if the call in respect of which they were forfeited had been duly paid.

QUORUM AT GENERAL MEETING.

No business shall be transacted at any Meeting, except the declaration of a dividend, unless a quorum of Shareholders is present at the commencement of such business, and seven Shareholders shall form a quorum.

VOTE OF SHAREHOLDERS.

Each Shareholder shall be entitled to one vote for every share held by him. Shares may be registered in the joint names of two persons, but only one of them shall be entitled to vote in respect of such shares. Any representative, by power of attorney, of any absent Shareholder duly authorized and notified as hereinafter provided, shall be entitled not only to speak and vote at the Meetings of the Company, but shall also have power to appoint a proxy to represent his interests at such Meetings. Provided always that no person who is not a Shareholder in the Company can be appointed to act as proxy.

Powers of attorney or proxies to vote at Meetings of Shareholders need not be deposited at the registered office of the Company, but it shall be sufficient if they are produced to the Chairman at the Meeting by the parties holding the same.

DIRECTORS.

Until other or further provision is made at some General Meeting, the number of Directors shall be three, two of whom shall form a quorum, and the first Directors shall be those who have been provisionally appointed by the subscribers hereof.

Every Director shall hold not less than one share in the Company in his own name, and not jointly with another.

POWERS OF DIRECTORS.

Directors shall have the power to do the following things in the name and on behalf of the Company:—

From time to time to appoint and remove such Editors and Officers, Bankers and Proctors, or Solicitors, to the Company, as they may deem expedient; and to appoint an attorney or attorneys under the seal of the Company as they may deem necessary to act specially on behalf of the Company out of the Island; and to revoke such appointment and to appoint or remove one or more of their number as Managing Directors, and to fix the salaries of such persons.

To take on lease any land or other real or personal property that they think requisite or desirable for the purposes of the Company.

To erect any buildings for the purposes of the Company.

To execute all deeds, receipts, and other documents they may deem necessary, and for that purpose to use when required the seal of the Company.

To refer disputes to arbitration; to compromise any debt or claim due to or by the Company; to give time to any debtor for payment of his debt.

To make, accept, and endorse any bill of exchange or promissory note that may be considered necessary by a Meeting of the Board of Directors for the business of the Company.

To borrow on behalf of the Company any sum of money they may deem expedient either for the purpose of extending the business of the Company or for any other purpose connected with the business of the Company; to give security for money so borrowed or any part thereof, debentures or mortgage, or debentures secured by mortgages, such mortgages being on the whole or any part of the property of the Company, bonds, bills of exchange, promissory notes, or such other securities as they may think fit. Provided that the whole amount of the moneys due in respect of loans at any one time shall not exceed half of the nominal capital of the Company, unless by consent of the Company given at a General Meeting of the Shareholders after due notice of an intended resolution to increase the amount of loans, specifying the amount proposed to be borrowed and the amount of existing loans, debts, and liabilities.

To carry into effect all or any of the objects of the Company as expressed in the Memorandum of Association, and to exercise all or any of the powers thereby given to the Company.

To bring or defend or abandon any action, suit or prosecution, or other legal proceedings, civil or criminal.

To exercise, in the name and on behalf of the Company, all such powers of the Company as are not expressly required to be exercised by the Company in General Meetings.
