No. 1,269 of June 26, 1912.

George Alexander Craib.—"An improved rubber tapping knife and bark collector."

Abstract.—The improved tapping knife is made out of a piece of cylindrical steel measuring approximately 3½ inches long and 7/16 inches outside diameter and hollow for its entire length. It is sharpened to form a cutting edge at one end, the other end being inserted in a wooden handle approximately 7½ inches long which is also hollow throughout its length, with the inside diameter increasing towards the end farthest from the cutting edge.

The bark, when cut with the knife, is forced along the hollow part of the knife and handle where it collects and is prevented from falling on the ground and so becoming mixed with earth, sand, and mud, and other extraneous matter thus ensuring, it is stated that clean bark and scrap will be sent to the rolls.

Jacob Da Costa Gadelha.—"An implement for tapping trees."

Abstract.—Implements for tapping trees for latex of the type in which incisions are made by striking the implement against the tree after the manner of a hatchet or after the manner of a chisel and mallet suffer from the draw-back, it is stated, that the incision or cut is carried too deep. This invention is intended to overcome that draw-back.

The implement consists of two cutting blades attached or pivoted to a long handle and being in effect similar to a hatchet with two blades side by side and curved so as to make their edges approach one another. Their edges are held apart by a spring; but when in use, and when the blades are forced into the bark of a tree, the curvature of the blades causes them to be forced towards one another until their edges meet. Accordingly a wedge-shaped piece of bark is seized by those blades by that action, whose depth is regulated by the curvature of the blades.

As a modification, means are provided for forcing together the blades of the implement otherwise than by striking the tree with them and depending alone on the curvature of the blades. A bridle or yoke with converging inside surfaces surrounds the two blades and, by means of a chain pulled by the operator, the converging surfaces squeeze the blades together; and, because of the curvature of the blades, they penetrate the bark as before.

Martin Max Forkert.—"Means for keeping clean the meshes of flour sifters."

Abstract.—This invention relates to means for keeping clean the meshes of flour sifters and it consists in an arrangement whereby the sifting net receives automatic and strong shaking sufficient, it is stated, to loosen any adhering flour.

For this purpose the inventor arranges below the sifting net loose cylindrical bars carried across the sifting net and resting in brackets attached to the frame of the net. When the sifting net is reciprocated with an endwise motion those bars roll in those brackets and strike the ends of those brackets and so transmit a shock to the frame of the net and to the net itself.

The vibrating sieve provided with those shaking appliances is claimed as the invention.
