#### MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Tuesday, June 11, 1912.

THE Council met this day at 4 P.M., pursuant to notice dated June 11, 1912.

*Present* :—The Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonawardena; Mr. D. W. Subasingha; Mr. S. H. Titley; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. G. E. Abeywardena; and Mr. E. H. Vanderstraaten.

The Minutes of the General Meeting held on May 11, 1912, copies of which were sent to each Member, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on May 11, 1912, be confirmed.

1. Papers *re* improvements to Galle Railway Station.—Laid on the table.

2. Interim report of Special Committee dated May 27, 1912, reappointed on January 13, 1912, to inquire into and report as regards an improved system of lighting the town.

Mr. D. W. Subasingha moved—That the report be adopted, and the Chairman be authorized to carry out the suggestions contained therein. Mr. G. E. Abeywardena seconded.—Carried unanimously.

3. Papers *re* drinking trough for cattle erected by the C. S. P. C. A. in the triangle in the bazaars.—Laid on the table.

## NOTIFICATION UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specification has been accepted :—

No. 1,225 of December 6, 1911.

Stephen Brown.—"Improved appliances for cutting rubber whether in sheet or crepe or otherwise and other substances."

*Abstract.*—This invention has for its object the manufacture of a suitable instrument or tool to cut rubber (in sheet or crepe or other shape) and similar substances more evenly and regularly, more quickly with less expenditure of labour, and less liability to bruises and injuries to the operators' hands; and generally in a cheaper and more efficient manner than by the use of ordinary scissors and knives which, it is stated, are now generally employed for the purpose.

The Appliance consists :—(1) Of a long knife hinged at one end to a table and capable of moving about that hinge in a vertical plane, being guided in that plane by providing large vertical surfaces of contact at the hinge as well as, when necessary, by providing a vertical spring guide or guard at the end of the knife farther away from the hinge and against which the knife bears in its descent; (2) of a blade fixed in a vertical plane to the table and against which the side of the movable knife bears and so provides the shearing action required; (3) of a table made so that it is extensible on one side, and so that it can be drawn out by a telescopic arrangement, to any suitable breadth. The Appliance can be worked by hand or by power. The drawings show arrangements for both cases.

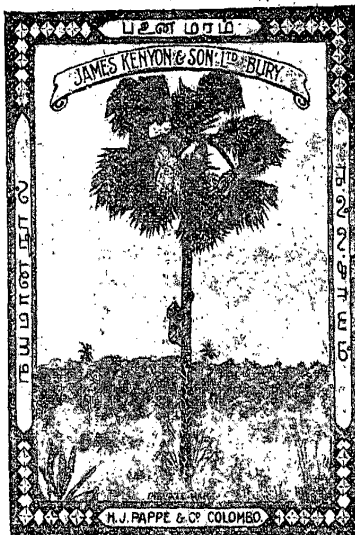
