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MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Chairman of the Municipal Council of Kandy will receive sealed tenders for the purchase of the under-mentioned Toll Rents of the Central Province from January 1, 1913, to December 31, 1913. The tenders, which must be in sealed envelopes superscribed "Tender for Toll Rents," will be received at the Municipal Office until 8 A.M. on Saturday, September 21, 1912, when they will be opened, and all persons making tenders will be required to be present, and tender must be delivered in person.

2. The person whose tender is selected by the Chairman for submission to the Council will be required to deposit at once one-tenth of the purchase amount in cash; and should the tender be accepted by the Council, to furnish approved security for one-half of the whole purchase amount, or in cash for one-third of the whole purchase amount, within thirty days of the date of the receipt by him of the notification of the Council's acceptance of his offer. If deeds are tendered as security, the one-tenth cash deposit will be retained till the rent is closed.

3. He will also be required to deposit money to pay the fees of Counsel for examining and giving his opinion on the title deeds of properties tendered by him as security, and for examining and settling the security bond, and the fees charged by the Council's proctor for examining documents and drawing the security bond, and also the expenses of appraising the properties and of registering the security bond.

4. All title deeds tendered as security should be accompanied by a certificate obtained from the Registrar of Lands that the lands to which they relate are unencumbered. This certificate must be obtained at the cost of the party offering the security.

5. The renter shall be bound to provide and maintain, at his own expense, sufficient boats and boats' crew at the said ferry, the seaworthiness of the boats, and the number of the crew being subject to the approval of the Chairman, Municipal Council.

6. Further information regarding conditions of sale can be obtained on application to the Secretary, Municipal Council.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on June 15, 1912, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated June 11, 1912.

Present: The Hon. Mr. G. S. Saxton, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Mr. R. W. Jonklaas; Dr. G. P. Schokman; Mr. W. C. Price; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; and Mr. D. E. Weerasooriya.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on May 18 having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- (a) Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1911 to May 31, 1912, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water Rate Accounts.
- (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's Report for May.
- (d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of May.
- (e) The Reservoir Readings for May.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's Report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during May.

4. Correspondence:—

(1) Letter of May 2 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Acting Colonial Auditor nominating him to be an Auditor of the Kandy Municipality, for the information of the Council.—Read.

(2) Letter No. 7 of May 20 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that His Excellency the Governor has approved the lease to the Kandy Hotels Company of the piece of land at the corner of Ward and Castle Hill streets.—Read.

(3) Letter No. 8 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to sanction the grant to Mr. R. A. Ferdinands, Municipal Inspector, and to Recordkeeper B. Z. Zalim of pensions of Rs. 365-83 and Rs. 135 per annum respectively.—Read.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. Pieris asked—(1) How many toddy shops are to be opened within the Municipal limits of Kandy? (2) Whether Government contemplates giving even a portion of the revenue derived from these shops to the Municipality?

The Chairman replied that seven were to be opened, but as regards (2) he had no knowledge of any such intention on the part of Government.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. Beven asked—“How many officers were in the employment of Council at the time of the retirement of the late Secretary, and what the salary of each was, and the number of officers now in the employment of Council, and the salary of each?”

The Secretary furnished a statement giving the information called for, which it was agreed to circulate among the Members.

7. Papers *re* the grant of a site on Roseneath estate for the proposed institution for the deaf and the blind.

Mr. Beven proposed—“That the site be not granted.”—Mr. Jonklaas seconded. Mr. Price moved, as an amendment—“That the site should be granted.” This fell through for want of a seconder.

Mr. Beven's motion was then put to the Meeting and carried by 8 to 1, Mr. Price being the only dissident.

8. Report of Special Committee selected to consider the question of appointing a qualified engineer for the Kandy Municipality.

Mr. Beven pointed out that the Special Committee had failed to report specifically on the points referred to them by resolution No. 8 passed at the Meeting of January 20, 1912, and also that the vacancy caused by the retirement of Mr. de Saram, a Member of this Committee, had not been filled up.

Mr. C. A. LaBrooy was accordingly added to the Committee, and the report referred back to the Committee for information required of them by Council.

9. Papers *re* the acquisition of an alley in Temple street.

Resolved—That the papers be circulated.

10. Recommendations of Standing Committees:—

Finance and Assessment.

(1) That the lessee of the Municipal land at Bogambra be noticed to give up the land now rented to him at Rs. 45 a year; (2) that the pay of the night soil carters be increased from Re. 1 to Re. 1-12½ a day.

Municipal Works.

(3) That house service pipes be allowed to (i.) 67, 67A, Malabar street, A. M. Meeya Lebbe; (ii.) 67B, 67C, Malabar street, A. M. Meeya Lebbe; (iii.) 72, Peradeniya road, F. P. Mudunnayake; (iv.) 10, Victoria drive, C. S. Jayawardene; (v.) 19, Lady MacCarthy's drive, Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; (vi.) 815, Peradeniya road, Mrs. E. Schoorman; (vii.) 354-360, Trincomalee street, M. Mohideen Sirajadeen.

Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted, but that in the case of (2) the pay of the night soil carters be increased from Re. 1 to Re. 1-25 a day.

Scavenging.—Satisfactory.

Public Latrines.—Fairly well kept.

Food Supply.—Good. During the month 523 cattle, 108 buffaloes, 109 sheep, and 390 goats were passed. Sixteen head of cattle, 5 buffaloes, 3 sheep, and 11 goats were rejected; 3 livers and 9 lungs of cattle, 9 livers and 2 lungs of buffaloes, 4 livers and 2 lungs of sheep, and 7 livers and 20 lungs of goats were condemned and destroyed.

Public Health.—The health of the town during the month was good. Four cases of measles and 2 cases of chickenpox were reported.

Abstract.—A pair of legs hinged at the top, like compasses, and fitted with a spring that keeps the legs apart at a certain angle, are hinged to a clamp and are clamped thereby to the frame of the bicycle at the forward side of the pedal axle. Those legs are made of such a length that, when they hang vertically from that clamp, they rest on the ground when the front wheel of the bicycle is lifted clear of the ground; and in that position the bicycle is supported on the two legs and the rear wheel.
