NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specifications have been accepted :—

No. 1,262 of May 24, 1912. (Date applied for under Section 50 of the Ordinance, March 18, 1912.)

John Gott.—"Improvements in the working of submarine cables."

Abstract.—This invention relates to a system intended to apply the International Morse Code to the transmission of messages over long submarine cables, in place of the code now used whereby uniformity of working with land lines and other connections is established.

The invention primarily involves a method of transmission of the Morse Code which enables it to be applied in the most economical manner as regards time. It is well known that reversed currents sent rapidly through a long submarine cable are the most effective in definition as received at the distant end of the cable—each following current having the effect of neutralizing the preceding one.

In this invention every unit of each letter is formed by a reversed current so that in no case during transmission does a current of the same polarity follow. At the receiving end of the cable these reversed units of letters are transformed in a simple manner so that the alphabet comes out in Morse characters as if received through a short land line and are therefore easy to read and transcribe.

To obtain the reversal of polarity for each unit of a letter with absolute uniformity and certainty I make use of the discharge of current from the cable itself, which, having considerable energy, is able to act upon a polarized relay and cause the desired change of direction for the following signal. The direction of the discharge, as is well known is a factor of the polarity of the charge and changes in accordance therewith, so that the reversals produced by this action on the polarized relay follow in sequence with infallible regularity. Another method of effecting the reversal of the polarized

relay, when from any cause, the first method is not preferred, will also be described. It consists of a transformer provided with primary and secondary coils, the primary being placed in the earth circuit of the split, or double battery. Currents are induced in the secondary which is connected to and actuates the polarized relay. The induced currents in the secondary coil are reversed according to the polarity of the last current sent into the cable and these reversals take place in regular sequence assuring that no two successive currents are sent of the same polarity. One advantage of this last method is that on making contact with the key to charge the cable the battery contact in the relay is reinforced at the moment the key is depressed thus assuring perfect transmission. This is brought about by the action of the secondary coil. The sending of messages through the cable is effected by the working of a single Morse key of the usual type so that the operator's mode of manipulation is exactly the same as if he were sending into any ordinary line.

William Arthur Gilbert and John Aflek-Robertson.—"An improved tea plucker and gatherer."

Abstract.—This invention relates to a hand machine or apparatus specially adapted for gathering or plucking tea, trimming hedges, borders and the like purposes and its object is to facilitate and expedite such labour and to obviate the damage caused to the axils of the tea plants by careless pluckers in plucking by hand in the usual manner.

The invention consists of a modification and adaptation, for the purpose set forth, of the well known horse clipping machine. The modification and adaptation for the purpose set forth consists in providing for making the lower of the two plates of a horse clipper with wider boundaries on the sides and back and adding to it raised edges so as to form a tray to collect the cuttings from a tea bush.

Nils Testrup and Olof Soderlund.—"Improvements in and relating to Evaporation Distillation and similar operations."

Abstract.—The present invention relates to evaporation on a system already proposed, according to which the vapour given off by the liquid which is being evaporated in an evaporator, is withdrawn, is compressed, and is returned after compression to the evaporator for effecting further evaporation of the liquid by virtue of the increase of temperature which it has undergone owing to compression.

This invention is described by the inventor as consisting broadly of a method of evaporation and of apparatus constructed to carry out the method.

In the apparatus chosen by the inventor to illustrate his method of evaporation, the procedure is as follows:—The liquid to be distilled, or the solution to be concentrated, is pumped over and over again from the bottom to the top of a chamber containing a heating coil, the liquid being caused to trickle down the external surface of that coil in a thin film. The vapour that is given off as that liquid becomes heated to boiling temperature, is drawn off from the top of the chamber, is compressed by a compressor to a pressure corresponding to some 3° or 5° C higher than the boiling temperature and is passed through the inside of that coil, and so becomes the heating agent for evaporating more of the liquid. As it issues from the coil it passes through a regenerator to warm up fresh liquid entering the chamber and is condensed thereby and is then the distillate required.

A continual small supply of steam from some external source to make up leakage of heat and to expel air or other uncondensable gases (and to warm up the apparatus at the start) is required. Power to drive the circulating pump and the compressor is also required. But it is stated that an experimental apparatus worked by that method evaporated more than 50 lb. wt. of water per lb. wt. of fuel used to supply all steam and power to the apparatus.

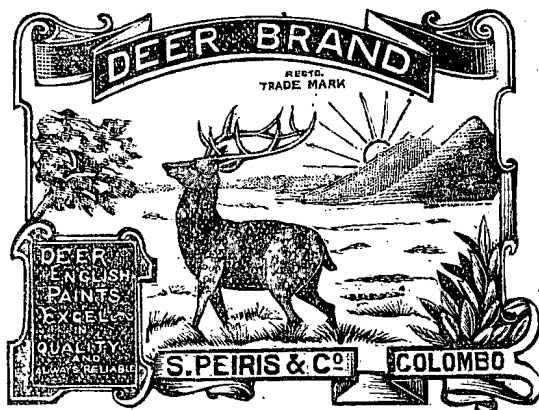

7. That Article 48 be deleted and the following Article inserted in lieu thereof, and numbered 48:—

48. Modification of rights and consent thereto.—If at any time by the issue of preference shares or otherwise the capital is divided into shares of different classes:—

- (1) The holders of any class of shares by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders may consent, on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class, to the issue or creation of any shares ranking equally therewith, or having any priority thereto, or to the abandonment of any preference or priority, or of any accrued dividend, or the reduction for any time or permanently of the dividends payable thereon, or to any scheme for the reduction of the Company's capital affecting the class of shares;
- (2) All or any of the rights, privileges, and conditions attached to each class may be commuted, abrogated, abandoned, added to, or otherwise modified by a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, provided the holders of any class of shares, affected by any such commutation, abrogation, abandonment, addition or other modification of such rights, privileges, and conditions, consent thereto, on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class, by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders.

Any extraordinary resolution passed under the provisions of this Article shall be binding upon all the holders of shares of the class, provided that this Article shall not be read as implying the necessity for such consent as aforesaid in any case in which but for this Article the object of the resolutions could have been effected without it.

8. That in Article 50, the words “which have not been taken or agreed to be taken by any person” be deleted.

9. That Articles 51 and 52 be deleted and the following Articles substituted in lieu thereof, and numbered 51 and 52:—

51. Provided also that before the Directors execute any mortgage or issue any debentures, they shall obtain the sanction thereto of the Company in General Meeting whether Ordinary or Extraordinary. Any such securities may be issued either at par or at a premium or discount, and may from time to time be cancelled or discharged, varied or exchanged, as the Directors may think fit, and may contain any special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares, or otherwise.
10. That Article 61 be deleted and the following Article be substituted in lieu thereof, and numbered 61:—
61. *Seven days' notice of Meeting to be given.*—Seven days' notice at least of every General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, and by whomsoever convened, specifying the place, date, hour of meeting, and the objects and the business of meeting, shall be given either by advertisement in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, or by notice sent by post, or otherwise served as hereinafter provided; but an accidental omission to give such notice to any shareholder shall not invalidate the proceedings at any General Meeting.
11. That Article 66 be deleted and the following Article be substituted in lieu thereof, and numbered 66:—
66. *Resolution involving sale of Company's property or winding up.*—No resolution involving the sale of the Company's estates or any of them or the winding up of the Company shall be deemed to be carried unless passed by three-fourths in number and value of such Shareholders of the Company for the time being entitled to vote as may be present in person or by proxy or by attorney at any meeting, of which notice specifying the intention to propose such resolution has been duly given.
12. That in line 2 of Article 79 the words and figures "Rupees Two thousand Five hundred (Rs. 2,500)" be deleted and the words and figures "Rupees One thousand Five hundred (Rs. 1,500)" be substituted in lieu thereof.
13. That sub-section 14 of Article 110 be deleted and the following sub-section be substituted in lieu thereof, and numbered (14):—
- (14) Subject to the approval of the Company in General Meeting to arrange terms for the amalgamation of the Company with any other Company or Companies, or individual or individuals, or for the sale or disposal of the business, estates, and effects of the Company, or any part or parts, share or shares thereof, respectively, to any company or companies, or person or persons, upon such terms and in such manner as the Directors shall think fit. And the Directors shall have power to do all such things as may be necessary for carrying such amalgamation, sale, or other disposition into effect so far as a resolution or a special resolution of the Company is not by law necessary for such purpose; and in case any terms so arranged by the Directors include or make necessary the dissolution of the Company, the Company shall be dissolved to that end.

14. That Article 113 be deleted and the following Article be substituted in lieu thereof, and numbered 113:—

113.—*The use of the Seal.*—The seal of the Company shall not be used or affixed to any deed, certificate of shares, or other instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors, or of one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries of the Company, who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the Secretaries, in the event of a firm being the Secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, attorney, or agent of the said firm signing for and on behalf of the said firm as such Secretaries.

Should the above resolution be passed by the requisite majority, it will be submitted for confirmation as a special resolution to a Second Extraordinary General Meeting which will be subsequently convened.
