In the Name of His Majesty GEORGE THE FIFTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Henry Edward McCallum, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HENRY MCCALLUM.

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HEREAS by section 2 of "The Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, 1892," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be for that purpose published in the Government Gazette, to bring any town or village mentioned in the schedule thereto under the operation of the said Ordinance, and to define the limits of such town or village for the purposes of the said Ordinance:

And whereas it is expedient to bring the town hereinafter mentioned under the operation of the said Ordinance," and to define the limits of such town for the purposes of the said Ordinance;

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that from and after January 1, 1913, the town of Hanwella, in the Western Province, being one of the towns mentioned in the schedule to the said Ordinance, shall be brought under the operation of the said Ordinance.

And We do hereby define the limits of such town for the purposes of the said Ordinance to be those set out in the schedule hereto.

North.—The Kelani-ganga.

"THE CROWN LANDMARKS ORDINANCE, 1909."

III Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the power vested in him by section 3 of the above-named Ordinance, has been pleased to prescribe that the Crown landmarks referred to in the said section shall be of the following materials and sizes, namely:—

- 1. Cement concrete blocks, either 6 in. by 6 in. on top and 8 in. by 8 in. at the bottom and 2 ft. deep, or 4½ in. by 4½ in. on top and 6 in. by 6 in. at the bottom and 1 ft. 6 in. deep, or 3 in. by 3 in. on top and 6 in. by 6 in. at the bottom and 1 ft. 6 in. deep, bearing on top a broad arrow pointing to the centre mark.
- 2. Rough stone blocks with the upper 4 in. dressed, either 6 in. by 6 in. on top and 1 ft. 6 in. deep, or $4\frac{1}{2}$ in. by $4\frac{1}{2}$ in. on top and 1 ft. 6 in. deep, or measurements approximating thereto, bearing a broad arrow pointing to the centre mark.
- 3. On live rock a square figure measuring either 6 in. by 6 in. or $4\frac{1}{2}$ in. by $4\frac{1}{2}$ in., in which is cut a broad arrow pointing to the centre mark.
- 4. In remote districts, and in soils where the above marks would not be sufficiently permanent, with the written authority of the Surveyor-General first had and obtained, three cuts on large trees, or charcoal pits, 6 in. diameter and 18 in. deep, may be substituted for the masonry blocks described above, or such other marks as may be found suitable to the special circumstances of the case.
- N.B.—Specimens of the cement concrete blocks and of the stone blocks have been deposited at each Kachcheri for general information.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 5, 1912.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 101 (3 Europeans, 11 Burghers, 55 Sinhalese, 12 Tamils, 15 Moors, 4 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1912, viz., 226,969) was 23.3, as against 21.0 in the preceding week, 20.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 100 (2 Europeans, 4 Burghers, 51 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 15 Moors, 3 Malays, and I Other). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 23.0, as against 27.6 in the previous week, 32.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 35.2 the weekly average of last year. The death-rate is the lowest recorded this year in any week. Last year the lowest recorded was 27.2, but in 1910 it was 18.5.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 100 total deaths, 19 were of infants under one year of age, as against 31 in the preceding week, 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Selected Causes of Death.—Eighteen deaths were registered from Phthisis (against 13 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 each were in Maradana hospitals and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 in Kotahena, 2 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, and Wellawatta, and 1 in Kollupitiya.

- 2. Thirteen deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 18 in the previous week and the weekly average for last year), of which 4 each were in St. Paul's and Kotahena, 2 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in Pettah, New Bazaar, and Wellawatta. Three deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.
- 3. Four deaths were registered from Enteric Fever (against 5 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 were in Kotahena, and 1 each in San Sebastian and Kollupitiya. There were 20 cases reported during the week, against 6 in the previous week.
- 4. Nine deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 8 from Enteritis (1 infant), 7 from Debility (2 infants), 3 each from Worms and Senility, 2 each from Diarrhæa (1 infant) and Dysentery, and 28 from Other Causes.
- 5. Thirteen cases of Measles were reported, against 12 in the previous week; and 5 of Chickenpox, against 2 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·2°, against 81·2° in the preceding week and 80·8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29°859 in., against 29·852 in. in the preceding week and 29·855 in in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2·00 in., against 2·52 in. in the preceding week and 2·61 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
