Prevention of Malaria.

It shall be the duty of every householder to keep his compound clear of all weeds and brushwood within 20 yards of his own or of his neighbours' houses, and to remove and burn all refuse, rubbish, tins, coconut shells, and other matter or receptacles which are likely to form breeding places for mosquitoes.
 It shall also be the duty of every householder to fill in all hollows, holes, or other low places in his compound where water can collect and stagnate within 20 yards of his own or of his neighbours' houses on the receipt of a written notice from the Chairman of the Village Committee within fourteen days of the receipt of such notice. Provided that he shall have the right of appeal to the Government Agent against the order contained in such notice. In the event of any householder failing to comply with such notice or to lodge an appeal within the said fourteen days, it shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Village Committee to cause the work of filling to be done by labourers employed by the village headman, and to recover the cost of the work, together with reasonable cost of supervision, from such householder, im addition to such fine as may be lawfully imposed for the breach of this rule.

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
