MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, November 22, 1912.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated November 15, 1912.

Present :—Mr. C. R. Cumberland, Acting Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G.; the Hon. Sir Allan Perry, Kt.; Major A. W. de Wilton; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. David Rockwood; Mr. A. J. Martin; Dr. D. P. Banajee; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; and Dr. W. P. Rodrigo.

1. The Minutes of General Meeting of October 25, 1912, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of General Meeting of October 25, 1912, be confirmed.

With permission of Council item No. 9 in agenda was then taken up.

9. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved that this Council do decide that Mr. L. B. Fernando continue to be a Councillor, although he has failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings.

Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene presented a petition from the residents of Maligawatta and moved that the same may be considered and that some measure of relief may be granted to the petitioners. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved as an amendment that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Finance and Works for report. The Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G., seconded.

Whereupon Mr. E. G. Jayewardene withdrew his motion with leave of Council in favour of the amendment, which was carried.

2. (a) With permission of Council, Dr. E. V. Ratnam asked the Chairman with reference to the reply given by him on August 23 *re* house of detention for beggars what progress has been made so far.

The Chairman replied that the matter is in progress, and that he has submitted to Government suggestions for staff and an estimate of cost and is awaiting a reply.

3. With permission of Council Dr. W. P. Rodrigo withdrew the question standing in his name.

4. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo asked the Chairman how many motor cars are owned by this Council and what their original cost has been, what they cost the Council now per annum for maintenance, &c., for whose use they are provided and what other travelling allowances those officers are now drawing (the amount and nature.)

The Chairman replied that there are three cars, viz., the Chairman's car, the cost of which is Rs. 5,750, and the maintenance of it costing approximately Rs. 225 per mensem on the average, but only Rs. 145 for the last few months; the Waterworks Engineer's car, cost of which is Rs. 7,400, and maintenance Rs. 208 per mensem; and the Medical Officer of Health's car, costing Rs. 7,813.95 and maintenance of it amounting approximately to Rs. 203 per mensem. The Chairman said these cars are kept for the use of the Departments concerned, and the Chairman's car is occasionally used by Assistant Engineers, District Judges, and Council concerned in cases in which the Municipality is interested, &c.

As regards the travelling allowances the Chairman said they are as follows:—

Chairman, nil; Waterworks Engineer, Rs. 125 per month; Medical Officer of Health, Rs. 100 per month.

5. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo asked the Chairman whether it has been brought to his notice that the Council's motor cars have been used by its officers for private purposes and whether such use is not in contravention of any rule or order passed by the Chairman or this Council.

The Chairman replied that one such case was brought to his notice and the officer concerned has been dealt with. Use of a car for private purposes is not contrary to any rule or order of the Council or Chairman, but is contrary to the resolution of the Finance Committee.

6. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo asked the Chairman whether he can say why the nomenclature of the nature of travelling allowances in the case of certain officers of this Council has been altered in the Budget of 1912-1913 from what it used to be in the previous Budget.

The Chairman replied that he understood that the designation of the travelling allowances had been altered in the present Budget to comply with a resolution of the Council of February 17, 1911, that the allowances should in all cases be commuted, the officer making his own arrangement for his transport.

7. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo asked the Chairman whether he is aware that certain officers who have been expected to keep two horses did not do so, and that the Auditor required a certificate upon honour that these horses were actually kept, and whether the nomenclature of the nature of travelling allowances was not altered after and as a consequence of such requests.

The Chairman replied that the only officers who were expected to keep two horses were the Chairman and the Municipal Engineer. Both did so until the use of a car was substituted for the Chairman's allowance and the allowance to the Municipal Engineer was commuted. He said he was unable to trace any question of the Colonial Auditor on the subject, and the designation of the allowances was altered in accordance with the resolution of Council as already stated.

8. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo asked the Chairman whether he is aware of any officer who is now drawing Rs. 1,200 or 960 or 900 as travelling allowances per annum not keeping any other form of conveyance than one horse and one ricksha, and moved that sufficient steps be taken by the Chairman to prevent the misuse of the Council's cars and of the travelling allowances.

The Chairman replied to the first part of the question in the negative, and the other part was, by leave of Council, withdrawn by Dr. Rodrigo.

10 and 11. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene taking the two motions standing in his name together moved:—

- (1) That no extension of any water main in the city be made without the sanction of the Works and Finance Committees of this Council being first obtained therefor, and without an estimate of work being submitted to and passed by the said Committees.
- (2) That no application made for a private service of water by the owner or occupier of any house be refused without the previous sanction of this Council being obtained for such refusal. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

The Chairman moved as an amendment that (1) and (2) be referred to the Finance and Works Committee as to what further restrictions, if any, should be placed on the action of the Waterworks Engineer in (a) expending money or minor extensions out of open votes; (b) in refusing to grant water service.

Mr. E. G. Jayewardene withdrew his motion in favour of the amendment, which was carried.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the leave be granted. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

19. To sanction excess leave of 18 days over 30 days granted to Mr. W. B. A. Fernando, Clerk, Works Department, absent owing to ill-health.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the leave be granted. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.
