

NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specification has been accepted:-

No. 1,317 of December 17, 1912.

Norah Edith Hughes-Mahone.—" Improvements in, and relating to, Ladies' Headgear."

Abstract.—This invention relates to ladies' head-coverings of the collapsible type, that is to say of the kind which can be folded-up or closed when out of use and unfolded or opened for use, without disturbing the drapery, such head-coverings being, therefore, particularly adapted for theatres and other public places or for travelling, where the ordinary head-covering is inconvenient.

Such head-coverings comprise, essentially, a frame or "shape" composed of a series of arched or semi-circular members (assimilating ribs) which are hinged or pivoted together at the two sides of the head-covering so that they can be collapsed or distended without prejudicially affecting the drapery arranged on them in such manner as to accommodate itself to the movements thereof.

The claims are:-

- 1. A collapsible ladies' head-covering comprising a frame or "shape" composed of a series of members pivoted or hinged so that they can be collapsed or distended, in combination with locking means consisting of devices forming indirectly or directly parts of some of the said members and situated at or in close proximity to the pivotal points or hinges thereof, substantially as described.
- 2. In a collapsible head-covering for ladies; in combination, a frame or "shape" composed of members hinged indirectly or directly upon a common pivot at each side of the covering, flexible media attaching such members at intervals, and locking means constituted indirectly or directly by parts of some of the members at or about the hinges or pivots thereof, substantially as described.
- 3. In ladies' headgear, the combination of parts constituting a frame or "shape" and a locking device therefor, all arranged, constructed and adapted for use, substantially as described with reference to, and as illustrated in, figures 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5; or figures 6, 7, and 8; or figures 9 and 10; or figures 11, 12, 13, and 14; or figure 15 of the accompanying drawings.

Giffard Wells Bruce Foote.—" A Rubber Mill Roll Washer."

Abstract.—This invention is in connection with Rubber machinery; more particularly in connection with scrap washing and creping and is an arrangement of pipes nozzles and cocks which can be attached to any rubber rolling machine. The object of this invention is to make the washing and creping of scrap rubber a less expensive process by decreasing the amount of manipulation and increasing the life of rubber rolling machinery and making the scrap crepe a more marketable article, cleaner and more resilient.

The inventor states:—One of the present methods of dealing with scrap is to manipulate it in an ordinary Rubber crepe washing mill. The mill consists of two fluted rollers running in opposite directions at different speeds, thus giving a tearing, squeezing action. The scrap is fed from a hopper between the rollers with water running on to the scrap, above and between the rollers. The water is supposed to wash the sand, dirt and bark out of the scrap; but the danger is, that in squeezing the scrap, the sand is more firmly incorporated with the rubber, and the more the rubber is rolled the harder the sand is fixed, and the less resilient the rubber becomes. To clean the rubber effectively, water must be applied freely. At present it is only applied above and between the rollers, so that much sand and dirt adheres to the under side of the rollers, and as no water is applied to the under sides of the rollers the sand dirt and bark are re-rolled into the rubber, instead of being washed out of it. My in ention consists of an arrangement of pipes nozzles and cocks to apply additional water to the opposite sides of the rollers from the sides to which water is at present applied. Water is applied with the scrap above the rollers. By my invention additional water is applied to clean the surface of the rollers where not in contact with the scrap rubber, and so the life of the washing mill is prolonged considerably, because the manipulation is completed in less time and consequently with less wear and tear of the machinery.

The claims are :--

- 1. A system of pipes having perforations and or nozzles substantially as described and illustrated for the purpose of flushing the rollers of a rubber mill.
 - 2. In combination with such system guards having outlets substantially as described and illustrated.
 - 3. In combination wit such system and guards, planes substantially as described and illustrated. Three sheets of drawings.
