MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on November 16, 1912, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated November 12, 1912.

Present: The Hon. Mr. G. S. Saxton, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Mr. R. W. Jonlaas; Mr. D. E. Weerasooria; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; and Mr. W. C. Price.

1. The Minutes of proceedings of the Meeting held on October 15 having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.
2. The following documents were submitted:—
 - (a) Statement of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1911 to October 31, 1912, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water-rate Accounts.
 - (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
 - (c) Health Officer's Report for October.
 - (d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors, and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, during the month of October.
 - (e) The Reservoir Readings for October.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes or Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's report be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on Laundries, Bakeries, Dairies, Standpipes, and House Service Taps inspected during October.

4. Correspondence:—

- (1) Letter No. 15 of November 1 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve of the lease of the land at Bogambra for the erection of a theatre hall.
- (2) Letter No. 16 of November 7, 1912, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that official publications are not supplied free of charge to Municipalities.—Read.

(3) Letter No. 17 of November 11, 1912, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, *re* disinfection of cattle "galas."—Read.

(4) Letter No. 18 of November 11, 1912, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to sanction the proposed payment of Rs. 240 per annum out of Municipal funds as a subsidy in aid of the Kandy Friend-in-Need Society.

(5) Letter No. 14,120 of November 9 from the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, *re* motor speed-limit.—Read.

(6) Letter of November 12 from Mr. B. D. Masters inquiring whether the Council would rent out on a reduced rate the Town Hall from November 25 till the end of January for a bioscope show.

Resolved—That the Hall be rented out for the required period at Rs. 7·50 a day, the Council reserving to itself the right to have the use of it whenever necessary for any other purpose.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Beven moved—That steps be taken to acquire alley No. 12, Castle Hill street, with the object of demolishing the existing buildings and erecting in their place model dwellings. Mr. Weerasooria seconded.

The motion was put to the meeting and lost by 5 to 2.—*Ayes* : Mr. Beven, Mr. Weerasooria. *Noes* : The Chairman, Mr. Jonklaas, Mr. LaBrooy, Mr. Price, Mr. Pieris. For Mr. Beven's dissent see Appendix.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. LaBrooy was to have moved—That in view of the present congested state of the market steps may be taken to enlarge it.

With the leave of the Council he amended his motion as follows :—

That the Superintendent of Works be directed to report on the state of the market as to whether it requires additional accommodation. Mr. Pieris seconded. Carried.

7. The following motion stood in Mr. LaBrooy's name :—

That the Assistant Superintendent of Works may be authorized to supervise the work of the Inspectors under the directions of the Sanitary Officer.

This was withdrawn, with the leave of the Council, on its being explained that directions had already been issued by the Chairman for the better supervision of the work of the Inspectors.

8. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

Municipal Works.

(1) That the following estimates be sanctioned :—Improvements to Bahirawakanda road, Rs. 468·03.

(2) That house service pipes be allowed on usual conditions to (a) 836, Peradeniya road, J. Piachaud; (b) 8, Cross street, J. Ratnayake; (c) 136, Colombo street, A. M. K. Meedin; (d) 1,357, Peradeniya road, M. D. Haramanis Appuhamy.

Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted.

Dissent on the Question of Alleys.

I desire to record my dissent from the conclusion arrived at by a majority of the Council on my motion, which ran as follows :—That steps be taken to acquire alley No. 12, Castle Hill street, with the object of demolishing the existing buildings and erecting in their place model dwellings.

2. In February, 1911, the Council adopted the following resolution proposed by me :—“ That steps be taken by the Council to acquire, gradually and as funds permit, the alleys within Municipal limits, and to pull down the existing buildings and to erect in their place more commodious and better ventilated buildings.”

3. With the consent of the Chairman, the Inspectors of the Wards were directed to report on the various alleys within Municipal limits and to supply information as to the number of rooms in each, the number of occupants, the rent paid by each, and the sanitary arrangements provided for them.

4. There was some delay in supplying the information required, and when the reports eventually reached the Municipal Office, I desired the Standing Committee on Works to select an alley so as to start the scheme proposed by me in February.

5. Mr. Vaughan, the then Chairman, selected an alley in Temple street, and on the matter coming before the Council I proposed at the meeting held in December, 1911, that that alley be acquired. This was carried. It was proposed also that Government be asked to acquire it for the Council.

6. Mr. Vaughan was succeeded by Mr. Saxton, the present Chairman, and he decided that the alley in Temple street did not permit, owing to its size, of model dwelling be erected on it. He subsequently desired the Superintendent of Works to select another alley.

7. This officer selected No. 12, Castle Hill street, and prepared plans and estimates. According to him the cost of acquiring the alley and erecting model dwellings would amount to Rs. 15,500, and he thought that the rent recoverable would pay 4 per cent. nett on the outlay.

8. In my opinion on this report the work should have been commenced at once, as we have in fixed deposit Rs. 40,800, and as the cost of acquiring the alley and erecting new buildings on it would not exceed Rs. 15,500, it could not be said that the requirement in the resolution that it should be given effect to when funds permitted was not satisfied. The Chairman, however, sent a memorandum that no action was to be taken on the report of the Superintendent of Works, but that it was open to members to submit a resolution. Hence the resolution that I placed before the Council, which was defeated.

9. So far back as 1898 I brought to the notice of Council the insanitary state of alleys consequent on the report of Captain Hallaran, R.A.M.C., the then Health Officer, and of a committee appointed by Sir West Ridgeway, consisting of Mr. Cooper, the Head of the Public Works Departments, Major Hale, R.A.M.C., and Mr. Sproule to report on the sanitary state of Kandy.

Both reports dwell very strongly on the absence in the alleys of every requirements that would ensure health and freedom from sickness and urged the Council to acquire the alleys, as in their then state they were a menace to the public health. The resolution that I then proposed was that Government should be asked to acquire the alleys, or that money should be advanced to Council for the purpose without interest. This resolution was passed and sent to Government who, in a sympathetic reply, suggested that the worst alleys should be selected, the cost of acquiring them and erecting model dwellings be ascertained, and that an application for a loan on easy terms should then be made, which would be considered favourably. The necessity for improving the alleys by the erections of new buildings was here recognized by Government.

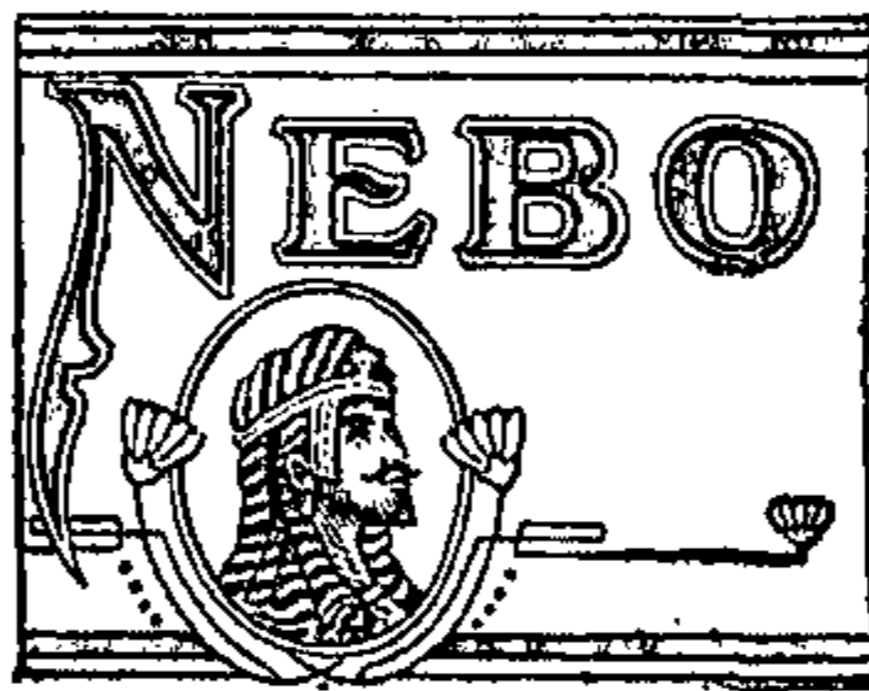

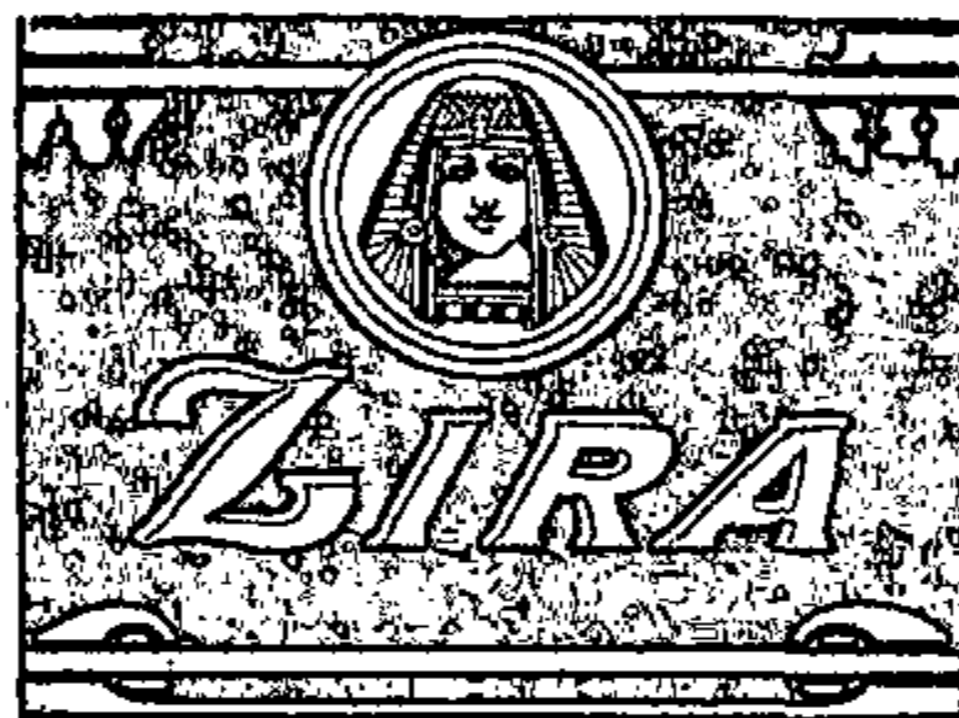

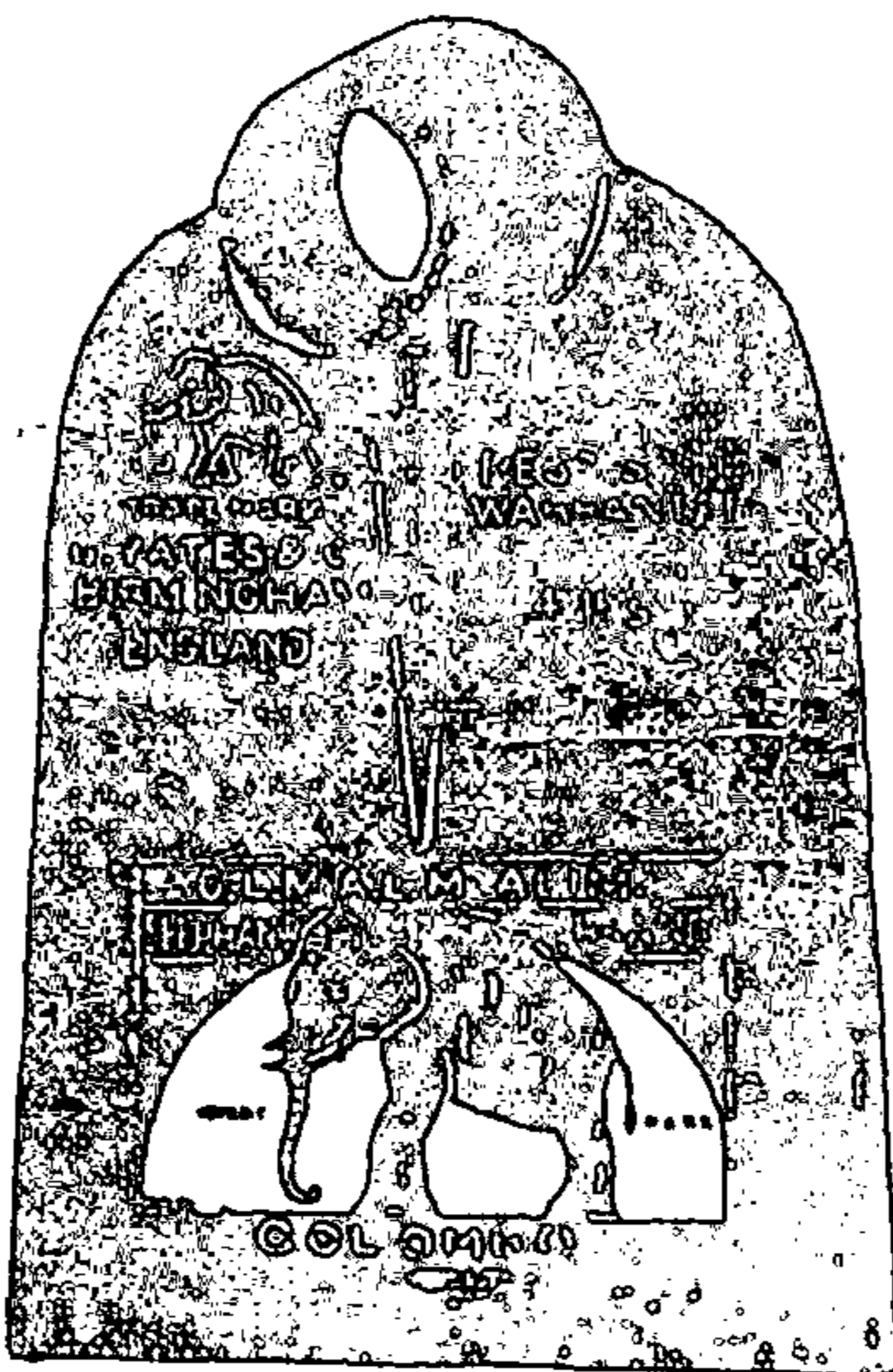
