#### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, December 20, 1912.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated December 14, 1912.

*Present* :—Mr. W. E. Thorpe, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G.; the Hon. Sir Allan Perry, Kt.; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene; Mr. R. S. Templeton; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. David Rockwood; Dr. D. P. Banajee; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; Lieut.-Col. M. L. Hearn, R.A.M.C.; Mr. W. Sutherland Ross; and Mr. T. Leese.

Mr. C. P. Dias, with leave of Council, moved that this Council do place on record, and respectfully convey to Mr. Keith Macleod, Mayor and Chairman, its appreciation of the eminent and valuable services rendered to the Municipal Council of Colombo, and of his able and impartial administration of the affairs of the city, and express its profound regret at the circumstances which have necessitated his premature retirement from the field of his labours. Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.—Carried unanimously.

## NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specifications have been accepted :—

No. 1,293 of September 30, 1912.

*William Francis Barns.*—"A tool or instrument for tapping rubber trees."

*Abstract.*—The nature of the invention is completely described in the claims, which are as follows :—

1. A tool or instrument for tapping rubber trees made of steel or other suitable metal formed at one end of triangular section and serrated or grooved, like a file or rasp on two of these three surfaces the third surface being left smooth to act as a guard; the other end being made as a shank to fit in a handle substantially as described and illustrated.

3. The combination of the two serrated surfaces and the third smooth surface for the purposes set forth in a tool or instrument for tapping rubber trees substantially as described and illustrated.

*Alfred Yates.*—"An automatic counterweight wire shoot load arrester."

*Abstract.*—This invention relates to means for bringing to rest without shock loads travelling on a wire shoot at the end of the run.

Suspended on the wire shoot near the end of the run, and free to move on it, is a cage or buffer suitably framed together and having sail cloth or the like stretched across the frames. Wires or ropes are attached to that cage; the other ends of them being attached to counterweights in such a way that when the cage is caused to move by the load and its carriage coming in contact as it travels down the wire shoot, those counterweights are caused to rise, either vertically in hollow posts erected near by, or on an inclined path by being pulled up a slanting wire shoot erected near by. Arrangements are made for the counterweights to be moved in succession, so that the arresting influence may be relatively small at the beginning of the operation.

The claim is :—(1) An apparatus for arresting loads carried on wire shoots on their nearing the end of the wire by means of counterbalance weights which may be carried on an auxiliary wire shoot or otherwise, substantially as shown in sheets Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4.
