MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on January 28, 1913, at 8 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated January 14, 1913.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. G. S. Saxton, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Mr. D. E. Weerasooria; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; and Mr. W. C. Price.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on December 21 having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1911 to December 31, 1912, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water-rate Accounts.
- (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's Report for December.
- (d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors, and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, during the month of December.
- (e) The Reservoir Readings for December.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's Report be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on Laundries, Bakeries, Dairies, Standpipes, and House Service Taps inspected during December.

4. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter No. 2 of January 4, 1913, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Colonial Auditor, appointing him Auditor of the Kandy Municipality for the year 1913, for the information of the Chairman.—Read.

(2) Letter No. 15,844 of December 13, 1912, from the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, asking for authority to have one of the guns given for shooting stray dogs repaired at a cost of Rs. 25.

Resolved—That a new gun be purchased instead.

(3) Letter of December 17 from Miss Chapman, applying for permission to construct a tank 5½ ft. by 3½ ft. on the Gregory road reservation near "Mowbray."

Resolved—That permission be allowed on payment of an annual rent of one rupee in acknowledgement of trespass.

(4) Letter of January 14 from Mr. B. D. Masters, applying for the use of the Town Hall for his Bioscope Show until March 31 next at the reduced rate of Rs. 5 per night.

Resolved—That the application be allowed.

(5) Letter No. 1 of January 8, 1913, from the Superintendent of Municipal Works, applying for a re-vote of Rs. 5,899·28 on estimate for Gregsoning town streets and for sanction of the following excesses on estimates for 1912 :—Watering streets, Rs. 28·20 ; Wace Park upkeep, 43 cents ; laying house service pipes, Rs. 166·77.

Resolved—That papers *re* Gregsoning be circulated, and that the excesses be sanctioned.

(6) Application of January 6 from the Superintendent of Municipal Works for sanction to purchase a 2-inch meter to be affixed to the water service to the Queen's Hotel extensions.

Resolved—That permission be allowed.

5. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That the Halloluwa-Katugastota road, which will be handed over to the Council on completion, be called "The Lady McCallum Drive." Mr. LaBrooy seconded.—Carried.

A copy of the resolution to be forwarded to the Hon. the Colonial Secretary for the information of His Excellency the Governor.

6. In the absence of Mr. Jonklaas, who had given notice of the motion, Mr. LaBrooy, with the leave of the Council, moved—That the Council desires to place on record its appreciation of the valuable services rendered to the Council by Dr. G. P. Schokman, late Provincial Surgeon, Central Province, and to express to him its thanks for the same. Mr. Weerasooria seconded.—Carried.

7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. LaBrooy was to have moved—That in view of the report of the Superintendent of Works of September 14, 1911, to the effect that two of the streams flowing into the reservoir carry with them the drainage of 74 acres of cultivated land, and that unless the supply from those streams be cut off, or the drainage area acquired, the water in the reservoir is liable to serious contamination, the Council do take immediate steps for the acquisition of the land through which the Hal-oya flows and for the diversion of this stream into the reservoir and for cutting off the supply from the streams reported against by the Superintendent of Works.

In view of the fact that several members were absent, Mr. LaBrooy asked for leave to submit the above at the next Meeting of Council.—This was allowed.

8. To sanction leave in excess of 30 days granted during 1912 to the following officers :—Mr. V. Pereira, 32 days ; Mr. E. E. Mutukisna, 37 days.

Resolved—That the excess leave be sanctioned.

9. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

Laws and General Subjects.

(1) That Mr. Vanderwall's bill of Rs. 173·25 for professional services during the year 1912 be paid.

Finance and Assessment.

(2) That the bill of Rs. 20 be paid for the translation of the building by-laws into Sinhalese and Tamil.

(3) That the sum of Rs. 33·60 be voted to meet the cost of demarcating the boundary between Lewella-Alutgantota road and the land re-conveyed to Mr. E. S. Simpson.

Municipal Works.

(4) That the following estimates be sanctioned :—

(a) Laying cement concrete to floor around Police Court latrine, Rs. 161·70.

(b) New latrine at Palledeniya, Rs. 1,151·77.

Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted.

10. The election of Standing Committees for 1913 resulted as follows :—

A.—*Law and General Subjects* : Messrs. E. Beven, R. W. Jonklaas, and C. A. LaBrooy.

B.—*Market and Sanitation* : Messrs. W. C. Price, L. H. S. Pieris, and Dr. Allan de Saram.

D.—*Municipal Works* : Messrs. W. C. Price, R. W. Jonklaas, and C. A. LaBrooy.

11. The following Special Committee on the Town Drainage was re-appointed :—Messrs. Beven, Jonklaas, Pieris, Price, Dr. Allan de Saram, and the Chairman.

Scavenging.—Satisfactory.

Water Supply.—Good.

Drainage.—The drains were flushed and kept clean.

Alleys.—These were kept in as sanitary a state as possible.

Bakeries.—Fairly well kept.

Eating-houses.—Fairly well kept.

Public Market.—Clean and well kept.

Slaughter-house.—Clean and well kept.

Night Soil Depot.—Well kept.

Public Latrines.—Fairly well kept.

Food Supply.—Good. During the month 584 cattle, 115 buffaloes, 94 sheep, and 357 goats were passed. Eleven head of cattle, 3 buffaloes, 3 sheep, and 5 goats were rejected; 2 livers and 5 lungs of cattle, 4 livers and 1 lung of buffaloes, 4 livers and 2 lungs of sheep, and 9 livers, 43 lungs, and 1 spleen of goats were condemned and destroyed.

Public Health.—The health of the town during the month was good. Two cases of enteric fever, 12 cases of chickenpox, 4 cases of measles, and 1 case of continued fever were reported.
