WHEREAS His Excellency Sir HENRY EDWARD McCALLUM, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof, has quitted this Colony: It is hereby proclaimed that, by virtue of the Commission of His late Majesty KING EDWARD VII., bearing date January 21, 1907, REGINALD EDWARD STUBBS, Esquire, has this day assumed the Administration of the Government of this Island, of which all persons concerned are required to take notice.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-fourth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Thirteen.
