# R. E. STUBBS.

WHEREAS by section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Southern Circuit, twice at least at Galle, and such other places in such Circuit, as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Galle on April 25 and September 15 in every year:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to appoint that a Criminal Session shall be holden on the day hereinafter mentioned at Matara, a place included within the said Southern Circuit:

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do hereby appoint that a Criminal Session of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Matara, in the said Southern Circuit, on or about Monday, May 5, 1913.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-eighth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Thirteen.

# TENDERS.

TENDERS are hereby invited for supplying provisions, &c., to the Ceylon Volunteers, to be delivered at the Camp of Exercise, Diyatalawa, to be held from July 17 to 26, 1913, also horse food, transport, cooly labour, cleaning of latrines, kerosine oil, scavenging of camp.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo. 3. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Controller of Revenue, or be sent through

4. Tenders should be marked "Tender for provisioning, &c., C. V. Camp, 1913," in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Controller of Revenue not later than midday on April 8, 1913.

5. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Volunteer Headquarters, Slave Island, Colombo, and no tender will be considered

unless it is on the recognized form.

6. A deposit of Rs. 150 will be required to be made either at the Treasury or Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. Should

any person decline to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered, or fail to furnish approved security, within. ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Head of the Department, or his duly authorized representative, that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. Upon a contract being entered into, the deposits of unsuccessful bona fide tenderers will be returned.

#### VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 22, 1913.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 109 (0 Europeans, 14 Burghers, 65 Sinhalese, 11 Tamils, 12 Moors, 6 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1913, viz., 229,776) was 24·7, as against 29·5 in the preceding week, 25·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23·0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 120 (0 Europeans, 4 Burghers, 68 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 17 Moors, 2 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27.2, as against 26.8 in the previous week, 29.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 120 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 21 in the preceding week, 27 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Selected Causes of Death.—Eighteen deaths were registered from Pneumonia (against 21 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in Kotahena, 4 in New Bazaar, 2 each in San Sebastian, Maradana hospitals, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, and Slave Island. Four deaths were registered from Bronchitis.

- 2. Eight deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 10 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 in Pettah, and I each in Slave Island and Kollupitiya.
- 3. Four deaths were registered from Enteric Fever (as in the previous week, against 5 the weekly average for last year), of which 1 each was in Pettah, St. Paul's, Kotahena, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals). There were 12 cases reported during the week, against 13 in the previous week.
- 4. Fourteen deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 7 each from Enteritis and Senility, 5 from Debility (all infants), 4 each from Worms, Anchylostomiasis, and Bright's Disease, 3 each from Puerperal Septicæmia and Accidents (1 each from mother over-lying on child, septic poisoning due to an injury in the throat, and prick of a nail in foot), 2 each from Dysentery and Tetanus (both infants), and 31 from Other Causes.
- 5. Seventeen cases of *Measles* were reported, against 15 in the previous week; and 20 of *Chickenpox*, as in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.7°, against 79.9° in the preceding week and 82.9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.824 in., against 29.813 in. in the preceding week and 29.856 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, as in the preceding week, against 0.81 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 120 total deaths, 26 were of infants under one year of age, as against 29 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

Selected Causes of Death.—Seventeen deaths were registered from Pneumonia (against 18 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 each were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals) and Slave Island, 3 in Kotahena, 2 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, and 1 each in San Sebastian and Maradana hospitals. Seven deaths were registered from Bronchitis..

- 2. Thirteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 8 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Kotahena, 3 in St. Paul's, 2 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in Pettah, New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya.
- 3. Six deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 4 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 each were in Kotahena and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in Maradana hospitals and Slave Island. There were 14 cases reported during the week, against 12 in the previous week.
- 4. Twelve deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 6 each from Enteritis (2 infants) and Bright's Disease, 4 each from Tetanus (3 infants) and Senility, 3 each from Dysentery, Debility (all infants), and Accidents (1 each from burns, fracture, and prick of a nail), and 36 from Other Causes.
- 5. Nineteen cases of *Measles* were reported, against 17 in the previous week; and 21 of *Chickenpox*, against 20 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·3°, against 81·7° in the preceding week and 83·4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·847 in., against 29·824 in. in the preceding week and 29·827 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3·39 in., against nil in the preceding week and 0·07 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
