NOTICE is hereby given that the Officer Administering the Government, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 34 of the Cemeteries and Burial Grounds Ordinance, No. 9 of 1899, and on the recommendation of the proper authority, to wit, the Chairman of the Local Board of Negombo, made under the said section 34, has approved of the allotment of land set out in the schedule hereto annexed being provided and used as an addition to the existing burial ground for the burial of the Roman Catholics of Sea street, Negombo, in Alutkuru Korale North, from the date hereof.

SCHEDULE.

Name of land: Palamarattaditottam and Panamarattaditottam.
Situation: Sea street, in Alutkuru Korale North.
Boundaries: North by the land called Palamarattaditottam belonging to W. Fransiscu Fernando and others; east by Sea street; south by land called Koolamarattaditottam belonging to W. Domingo Fernando and a part of the same land belonging to W. Susey Fernando; west by Panamarattaditottam land belonging to W. M. Rodrigo and another, a part of the same land belonging to W. Bastian Fernando and another.
Extent of the land: 65,465 square feet.
The present burial ground is 22,065 square feet in extent, and this is being now extended by 43,400 square feet.

THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE, No. 13 OF 1896.

THE following rules and orders made by the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, under Ordinance No. 13 of 1896, entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages," for the conduct of the Kataragama pilgrimage and festival, where special precautions have been and are necessary, are published for general information, in lieu of the rules promulgated annually for several years.

Rules.

1. For sanitary reasons the duration of the Kataragama festival and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama shall be and it is hereby limited to 15 days, namely, from July 4 to 18, 1913; inclusive. Pilgrims arriving before the day first named or staying beyond the period here prescribed shall be guilty of an offence.

2. It shall be lawful for the Police authorities or any Police Magistrate at any place on the line of march to prohibit from proceeding all persons who, by reason of disease, infirmity, weakness, advanced age, youth, want of supplies, or other sufficient cause, are considered unfit to undertake the journey, or who appear likely to fall ill and endanger the health of others; and to require such persons to find security to ensure their obedience to the orders so given. In default of such security being found, it shall be lawful for the said Police authorities or Police Magistrate to detain such persons in custody for a period not exceeding three days.

3. In the event of an epidemic-breaking out at Kataragama during the festival, it shall be lawful for the officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders to declare the festival at an end, and to direct pilgrims at once to leave the village and proceed to their homes, and to prescribe the roads they have to travel.

4. The officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama and at Kataragama—

- (a) To appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water and drinking, and for natural offices.
- (b) To appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims.
- (c) To prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims.
- (d) To regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims.
- (e) To fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them, and to detain them if unfit to travel.

Any person disobeying an order given by the appointed officers shall be guilty of an offence.

5. The Police are empowered and required to seize and destroy all food condemned as unwholesome on the march or in camp by the Medical Officer, or, if there be none, by the Chief Officer of Police; and any person resisting or obstructing the Police in the discharge of this or of any other duty prescribed by these rules shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

6. Any person bringing any cattle or cart bulls within three miles of the camp shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

7. Any person selling meat in camp in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the officer in charge of the camp, and any other person selling food condemned as unwholesome by the Medical Officer, or in his absence by the Chief Officer of Police, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

8. Any person who shall, during the occupation of the camp, use any other place for offices of nature than that provided for the purpose by Government, or failing to cover the deposit with earth or sand, and any person who shall during the same period bathe in or enter the river above the spot appointed by the officer in charge of the camp, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

9. Any person suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and not reporting the same to the Medical Officer, or in his absence to the Chief Officer of Police, and any person abetting or assisting in the concealment of such disease, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

10. All persons shall take up the quarters assigned to them by the Chief Officer of Police at the halting places and in the camp, and any person declining or neglecting to do so shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

11. The number of pilgrims for the pilgrimage of the year 1913 is restricted to 3,500.

12. No person shall proceed on the pilgrimage in the year 1913 without having first obtained ticket from the Government Agent of the Western Province for the Colombo band, or from the Government Agent of the North-Central Province for the Anuradhapura band, or from the Government Agent of the Southern Province for the Galle band, or from the Government Agent of the North-Western Province for the Kurunegala band, or from the Government Agent of the Eastern Province for the Batticaloa band, or from the Government Agent of the Northern Province for the Jaffna band, or from the Government Agent of the Province of Uva for the Badulla band, or from the Government Agent of the Province of Sabaragamuwa for the Ratnapura band, or from the Government Agent of the Central Province for the Kandy band.

13. Every person proceeding on the pilgrimage shall show his ticket when required to do so by any officer of Police, or by any officer appointed to enforce the observance of orders under the Ordinance aforesaid.

14. The transfer of a ticket by the person named in it and the use of it by any other person are forbidden.

His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf vested in Him by the Colonial Prisoners' Removal Act, 1884, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to make the following Order as to the removal of prisoners and criminal lunatics to Ireland under the said Act:

The Colonial Prisoners' Removal Order in Council, 1907, shall, if the prisoner or criminal lunatic to be removed under the said Act is to be detained in Ireland, be amended as follows, that is to say:—

I.—A Secretary of State shall transmit one copy of the Order of Removal and one copy of the Notification of Concurrence to the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland for record in Dublin Castle, instead of transmitting them to the Home Office.

II.—For the forms numbered III., IV., IX., and X. in the Schedule to the Order of the 9th day of September, 1907, there shall be substituted the forms similarly numbered in the Schedule to this Order, or forms to the like effect varied as circumstances may require.

III.—This Order shall commence and come into operation on the First day of May, 1913.

IV.—Nothing lawfully done as regards Ireland under the Colonial Prisoners' Removal Order in Council, 1907, shall be prejudiced by this Order.

V.—This Order may be cited as "The Colonial Prisoners' Removal Order in Council, 1913."

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 7, 1913.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 86 (1 European, 8 Burghers, 53 Sinhalese, 10 Tamils, 10 Moors, 3 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1913, viz., 229,776) was 19·5, as against 25·0 in the preceding week, 21·5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23·0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 110 (3 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 55 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 12 Moors, 7 Malays, and 7 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 25·0, as against 28·4 in the previous week, 33·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·5 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 110 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 36 in the preceding week and in the corresponding week of the previous year and 30 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 14.

Selected Causes of Death.—Fourteen deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 9 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in New Bazaar, 4 in Kotahena, 2 each in Maradana hospitals and Kollupitiya; and 1 in Pettah. Four deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

2. Thirteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 14 in the previous week and the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 in Kotahena, 2 in Maradana hospitals, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Slave Island, and Wellawatta.

3. Four deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 8 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 were in Wellawatta and 1 each in Maradana hospitals and Slave Island. There were 15 cases reported during the week, against 9 in the previous week.

4. Nine deaths were registered from *Debility* (8 infants), 7 each from *Enteritis* (3 infants) and *Infantile Convulsions*, 5 from *Senility*, 4 from *Diarrhoea* (2 infants), 3 each from *Worms* and *Asthma*, 2 from *Accidents* (one was due to burns and the other was a case of tetanus caused by an injury to foot), 1 from *Tetanus* (infant), and 34 from *Other Causes*.

5. Ten cases of *Measles* were reported, against 28 in the previous week; and 9 of *Chickenpox*, against 4 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·5°, against 80·6° in the preceding week and 82·0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·717 in., against 29·763 in. in the preceding week and 29·820 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3·52 in., against 3·34 in. in the preceding week and 6·31 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
