

The examination in the Criminal Procedure Code prescribed under the Minute of March 26, 1900, for officers in the Fourth Class of the Civil Service, will also be held on July 29, 1913, as well as at the Kandy Kachcheri.

" THE PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO ANIMALS ORDINANCE, 1907."

'HEREAS by the proviso to section 10 of "The Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Ordinance, 1907," as amended by Ordinance No. 19 of 1912, it is enacted that where in any area the whole or any part of the fines recovered in respect of offences under the said Ordinance which shall have been prosecuted by any officer of any society established in Ceylon for the prevention of cruelty to animals is by law or practice already appropriated to any public authority established in the area, an order made by the Governor in Executive Council, under section 10 of the said Ordinance, shall only take effect in such area, subject to the consent of such public authority signified by resolution notified in the *Government Gazette* and to the extent authorized by such resolution :

And whereas the Local Board of Matale has, under and in pursuance of the proviso to section 10 of the said Ordinance, passed the following resolution on April 2, 1913 :---

"It was unanimously resolved that the Local Board share of all fines recovered under 'The Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Ordinances, 1907 and 1912,' be granted to the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals ":

It is hereby notified that the Officer Administering the Government in Executive Council has, under the provisions of section 10 of the said Ordinance, directed that from and after April 2, 1913, the whole of the fines recovered in respect of offences punishable under the said Ordinance which shall have been prosecuted within the limits of the Local Board of Matale by any officer of the Society established in Ceylon for the prevention of cruelty to animals shall be paid to such Society.

THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE, NO. 13 OF 1896.

THE following rules and orders made by the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, under Ordinance No. 13 of 1896, entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages," for the conduct of the Kataragama pilgrimage and festival, where special precautions have been and are necessary, are published for general information, in lieu of the rules promulgated annually for several years.

Rules.

1. For sanitary reasons the duration of the Kataragama festival and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama shall be and it is hereby limited to 15 days, namely, from July 4 to 18, 1913, inclusive. Pilgrims arriving before the day first named • or staying beyond the period here prescribed shall be guilty of an offence.

2. It shall be lawful for the Police authorities or any Police Magistrate at any place on the line of march to prohibit from proceeding all persons who, by reason of discase, infirmity, weakness, advanced age, youth, want of supplies, or other sufficient cause, are considered unfit to undertake the journey, or who appear likely to fall ill and endanger the health of others; and to require such persons to find security to ensure their obedience to the orders so given. In default of such security being found, it shall be lawful for the said Police authorities or Police Magistrate to detain such persons in custody for a period not exceeding three days. 3. In the event of an epidemic breaking out at Kataragama during the festival, it shall be lawful for the officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders to declare the festival at an end, and to direct pilgrims at once to leave the village and proceed to their homes, and to prescribe the roads they have to travel.

4. The officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama and at Kataragama—

- (a) To appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water and drinking, and for natural offices.
- (b) To appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims.
- (c) To prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims.
- (d) To regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims.
- (e) To fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them, and to detain them if unfit to travel.

Any person disobeying an order given by the appointed officers shall be guilty of an offence.

5. The Police are empowered and required to seize and destroy all food condemned as unwholesome on the march or in camp by the Medical Officer, or, if there be none, by the Chief Officer of Police; and any person resisting or obstructing the Police in the discharge of this or of any other duty prescribed by these rules shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

6. Any person bringing any cattle or cart bulls within three miles of the camp shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

7. Any person selling meat in camp in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the officer in charge of the camp, and any other person selling food condemned as unwholesome by the Medical Officer, or in his absence by the Chief Officer of Police, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

8. Any person who shall, during the occupation of the camp, use any other place for offices of nature than that provided for the purpose by Government, or failing to cover the deposit with earth or sand, and any person who shall during the same period bathe in or enter the river above the spot appointed by the officer in charge of the camp, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

9. Any person suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and not reporting the same to the Medical Officer, or in his absence to the Chief Officer of Police, and any person abetting or assisting in the concealment of such disease, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

10. All persons shall take up the quarters assigned to them by the Chief Officer of Police at the halting places and in the camp, and any person declining or neglecting to do so shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

11. The number of pilgrims for the pilgrimage of the year 1913 is restricted to 3,500.

12. No person shall proceed on the pilgrimage in the year 1913 without having first obtained ticket from the Government Agent of the Western Province for the Colombo band, or from the Government Agent of the North-Central Province for the Anuradhapura band, or from the Government Agent of the Southern Province for the Galle band, or from the Government Agent of the North-Western Province for the Kurunegala band, or from the Government Agent of the Eastern Province for the Batticaloa band, or from the Government Agent of the Northern Province for the Jaffna band, or from the Government Agent of the Province of Uva for the Badulla band, or from the Government Agent of the Province of Sabaragamuwa for the Ratnapura band, or from the Government Agent of the Central Province for the Kandy band. 13. Every person proceeding on the pilgrimage shall show his ticket when required to do so by any officer of Police, or by any officer appointed to enforce the observance of orders under the Ordinance aforesaid. 14. The transfer of a ticket by the person named in it and the use of it by any other person are forbidden

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 14, 1913.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 113 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 63 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 23 Moors, 3 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1913, viz., 229,776) was 25.6, as against 19.5 in the preceding week, 19.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and $23 \cdot 0$ the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 123 (3 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 66 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 15 Moors, 3 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27.9, as against 25.0 in the previous week, $28 \cdot 1$ in the corresponding week of last year, and $29 \cdot 5$ the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 123 total deaths, 35 were of infants under one year of age, as against 31 in the preceding week, 40 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Selected Causes of Death.—Fourteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 13 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 in Maradana hospitals, 2 in Kotahena, and 1 each in Fort and Galle Face, St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya.

2. Ten deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 14 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Kotahena, 2 each in New Bazaar and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in San Sebastian and Slave Island. Seven deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

3. Two deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 4 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year), of which 1 was in Kotabena and the other in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals). There were 8 cases reported during the week, against 15 in the previous week.

4. Thirteen deaths each were registered from *Enteritis* (6 infants) and *Infantile Convulsions*, 5 from *Prematurity*, 4 from Senility, 3 each from Debility (1 infant), Marasmus (all infants), and Bright's Disease, 2 each from Worms (1 infant) and Accidents (one due to being run over by a motor car and the other to a fracture), 1 each from Diarrhæa and Tetanus (infant), and 40 from Other Causes.

5. Nine cases of *Measles* were reported, against 10 in the previous week; and 3 of *Chickenpox*, against 9 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was $81 \cdot 7^{\circ}$, against $80 \cdot 5^{\circ}$ in the preceding week and $80 \cdot 0^{\circ}$ in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was $29 \cdot 802$ in., against $29 \cdot 717$ in. in the preceding week and $29 \cdot 829$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was $1 \cdot 38$ in., against $3 \cdot 52$ in. in the preceding week and $8 \cdot 06$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
