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### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, February 8, 1913.

The Council met this day at 2 P.M., pursuant to notice dated February 3, 1913

*Present* :—The Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonawardena; Mr. H. M. Makan Markar; Mr. D. W. Subesingha; Dr. C. B. Lourensz; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. G. E. Abeywardena; and Mr. E. H. Vanderstraaten.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of the Council held on January 11, 1913, a copy of which was sent to each member, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on January 11, 1913, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice Mr. D. W. Subesingha asked—What supervision, if any, is exercised by the Council over the manufacture of aerated waters in the town?

The Chairman replied that the Council exercised the necessary sanitary supervision over the aerated water factories situated within the Municipal limits and read the report of the Medical Officer of Health on the subject.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. D. W. Subesingha moved :—

(1) For a return showing the amounts realized by the sale of the fish auction shed during the years 1909, 1910, 1911, 1912, and 1913.

(2) For a return of the amounts realized by the sale of the stalls in the fish market during the said years.

(3) For a return showing the commission the renter was entitled to charge on the quantity of fish he had to sell so that he may have obtained enough by way of commission to pay the purchase amount due to the Council during the said years.

(4) For a return showing the quantity of fish sold at the fish auction shed during February, March, and April, 1913.

(5) For a return showing the total commission obtained by the renter during the said months.

With the permission of Council motions (4) and (5) were amended to read as follows :—

(4) For a return showing the value of the fish sold at the fish auction shed during March, April, and May, 1913.

(5) That a special officer be appointed for three months, commencing from March 1, 1913, on a salary not exceeding Rs. 35 per mensem, who will attend the sales of fish in order to ascertain the total commission obtained by the renter during the said months.

Mr. G. E. Abeywardena seconded.—Carried.

4. Report of the Special Committee appointed on January 11, 1913, to report on the proposal to keep separate gangs of labourers for continuous work in each ward.—Laid on the table.

#### Report of the Medical Officer of Health for the Month of February, 1913.

*Scavenging.*—There has been very little improvement in the new scheme, due mainly to the contractor for the supply of draught cattle not sending his bulls and drivers at the proper time to the cart shed. Besides, several of his bulls have very frequently been seized by the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals and the scavenging has thereby been neglected in several parts of the town.

*Drainage.*—Not satisfactory.

*Water supply* from Hiyare not satisfactory; samples have been sent for bacteriological examination.

*Dairies and laundries.*—I have taken steps to revise the registers and to cause the requirements to be more strictly complied with.

*Alleys.*—Clean.

*Bakeries.*—Clean.

*Markets.*—Clean.

*Cattle and goats.*—180 cattle and 122 goats were passed for slaughter.

*Infectious diseases.*—Chickenpox, 9 cases; mumps, 8 cases; measles, 18 cases; enteric, 2 cases; dysentery, 1 case.

The cases of chickenpox were almost entirely confined to Bope. Six cases of measles were confined to one house in Kaluwella, the rest were in Maitipe. All the cases of mumps occurred in Richmond College.

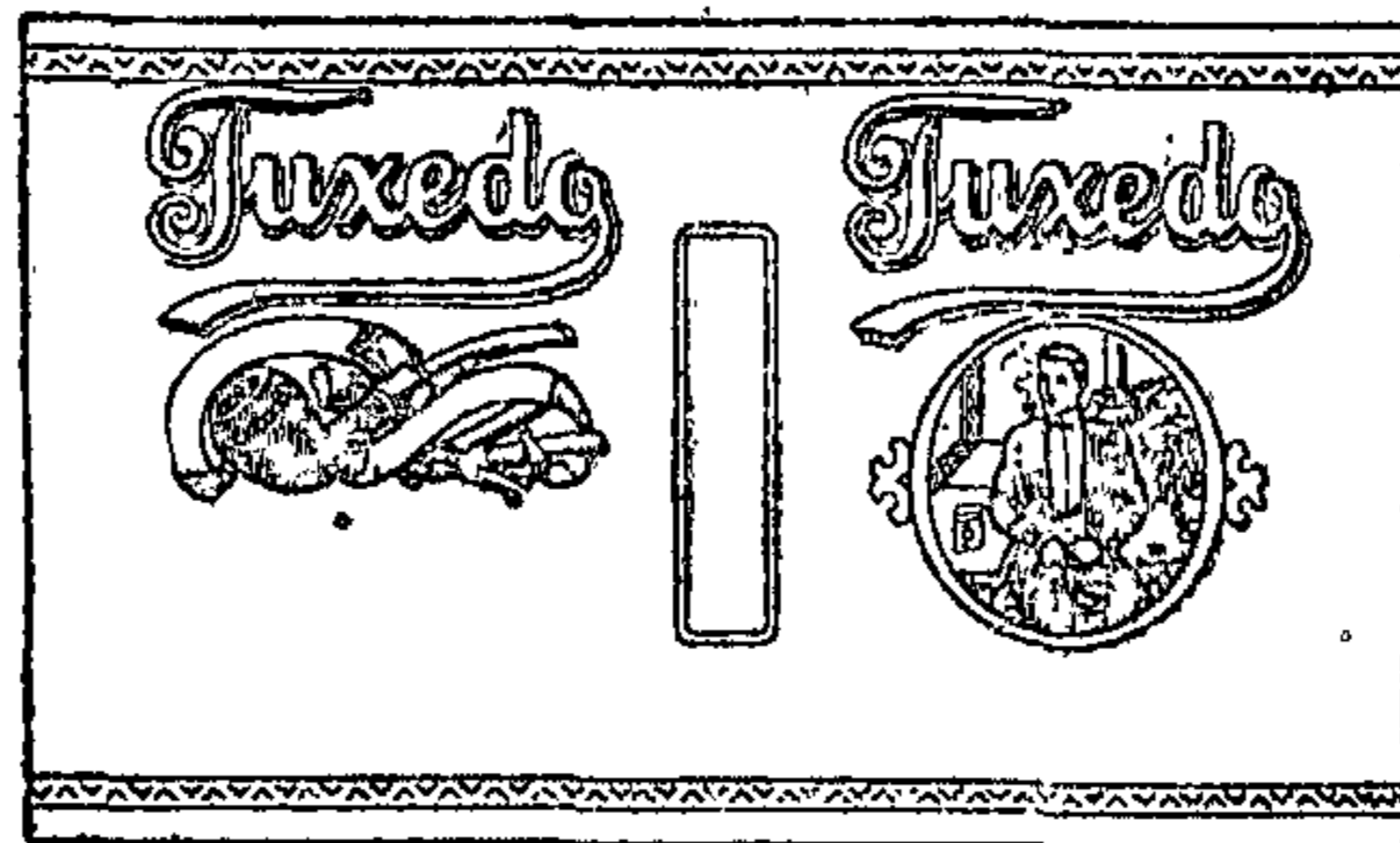
