## MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo, held in the Town Hall on Friday, February 28, 1913.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated February 22, 1913.

*Present*:—Mr. E. B. Alexander, Chairman ; Mr. C. P. Dias ; Mr. L. B. Fernando ; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader ; Mr. Arthur Alvis ; Mr. H. L. de Mel ; Mr. A. J. Martin ; Dr. D. P. Banajee ; Dr. E. V. Ratnam ; and Dr. W. P. Rodrigo.

The Chairman, by leave of Council, announced to the members the death of Mr. R. R. Dunuwille, Secretary, Municipal Council, which occurred on February 26, 1913, and moved—That this Council do place on record its appreciation of the valuable services rendered by the late Secretary, Mr. R. R. Dunuwille, both to the Municipal Council and to the Public of Colombo, and its deep sense of regret at his loss. Also that he should be commissioned, as its Chairman, to convey to his sorrowing widow and family the condolences of this Council. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried unanimously.

1. Minutes of General Meeting of January 10, 1913, and of Special Meeting of January 31, 1913, having been printed, and copies thereof having been sent to each member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the minutes of General Meeting of January 10, 1913, and Special Meeting of January 31, 1913, be confirmed.

2, 3, and 4. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works of February 14, 1913, on Finance of February 21, 1913, and on Municipal Works of February 21, 1913, having been previously printed and circulated, were laid before Council :—

*Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Municipal Works of February 14, 1913.*

- (3) Materials on orders Nos. 1,117 and 1,118, City Sanitation Engineer's Department—Payment of increased rate of 10 per cent. on 1911 contract rate on pipes and other materials supplied by Messrs. Walker, Sons, and Company, Limited, to the City Sanitation Engineer's Department.—Recommended to Council. There is no annual contract, and though the prices had increased to them by 30 per cent., Messrs. Walkers are only charging us 10 per cent.
- (4) Remuneration for work done while on leave—Waterworks Engineer's letter No. 18 of January 8, 1913.—Supplemental vote of Rs. 87·49 to meet payment of full pay to Mr. Thyne for three months.—Recommended.
- (7) To sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 400 to vote F 56, Watching Municipal Council lands.—Recommended.
- (8) Additional clerks for the Waterworks Engineer—Application from Waterworks Engineer for one clerk on Rs. 504 per annum and 2 clerks on Rs. 300 each per annum.—The Committee is of opinion that one permanent clerk is sufficient for the present on a salary of Rs. 504 to be charged to the waterworks vote.
- (9) Duplication of line at Ingham street—Letter from the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, No. 194 of January 21, 1913, asking for the surrender of a strip of land about 5 feet in extent.—Recommended that the deviation asked for by the General Manager be allowed.
- (10) Tenders for the supply of pig lead for the Waterworks Department—Recommendation of the Waterworks Engineer for the acceptance of tender of the Colombo Commercial Company, Limited, at Rs. 14 per cwt. nett.—Recommended.

The Committee are of opinion that the Council should not undertake the cost of improving and maintaining the piece of land in question.
- (8) Materials on orders Nos. 1,117 and 1,118, City Sanitation Engineer's Department—Payment of increased rate of 10 per cent. on 1911 contract rate on pipes and other materials supplied by Messrs. Walker, Sons, & Co., Limited, to the City Sanitation Engineer's Department.—Recommended, as though the prices have increased by 30 per cent ; Messrs. Walker, Sons, and Company ask for payment of the increased rate of 10 per cent.
- (9) Remuneration for work done while on leave—Waterworks Engineer's letter No. 18 of January 8, 1913—Supplemental vote of Rs. 87·49, to meet payment of full pay to Mr. Thyne for three months.—Recommended.
- (10) To sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 400 to vote F 56, Watching Municipal Council lands.—Recommended.
- (11) Additional clerks for the Waterworks Engineer—Application from the Waterworks Engineer for 1 clerk on Rs. 504 per annum, and 2 clerks on Rs. 300 each per annum.—Committee think that one permanent clerk on a salary of Rs. 504 per annum is sufficient for the present.
- (12) Duplication of line at Ingham street—Letter from the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, No. 194 of January 21, 1913, asking for the surrender of a strip of land about 5 feet in extent.—Recommended that the deviation asked for by the General Manager be allowed.
- (13) Supplemental vote of Rs. 900 to vote D 7, Library.—Committee regret that they are unable to recommend this expenditure.
- (15) Increase of pay to coolies of the Cattle Quarantine Station—Letter No. 1 of January 3, 1913, from the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon, forwarding petition from coolies for increase of wages and recommending that their wages be raised to Rs. 15 per month.—Recommended.
- (16) Cost of cablegram—Supplemental vote of Rs. 51·15, vote K 15, Miscellaneous, to meet cost of cablegram sent to Mr. Watson on his appointment, on November 4, 1911.—Recommended.
- (17) Supplemental votes, Secretariat—To sanction the following Supplemental votes :—C 2, Legal expenses, Rs. 1,000 ; C 3, Advertisements, Rs. 1,000 ; C 7, Telephones, Rs. 2,500 ; and C 14, Miscellaneous, Rs. 500.—Recommended.

Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that the Council do resume, and that the recommendations of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works of February 14, 1913, on Finance of February 21, 1913, and on Municipal Works of February 21, 1913, be adopted as amended. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

5. Interceptor traps on house drains—City Sanitation Engineer's letter No. 273 of December 14, 1912, forwarding draft amendments to by-laws with respect to drainage, having been previously printed and circulated, was brought before the Council.

It was resolved that the report of the Local Government Board and connected papers be circulated to Council and the matter be brought up again at the next Meeting of Council.

6. To sanction excess leave over 30 days granted to the following officers of the Works Department:—T. Joseph 4 days; P. O. Connell 5 days; J. V. Lieversz 9 days; V. Selvathurai 2 days; H. F. Silva 1 day; and H. V. Fernando 2 days.

Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that the leave granted by the Chairman be confirmed. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

7. To sanction excess leave of 16 days over 30 days granted to Mr. W. E. Sithampalam, Sub-Inspector, absent owing to ill-health.

Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that the leave granted by the Chairman be confirmed. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.



8. To sanction excess leave of 6 days over 30 days granted to Mr. A. C. Solomonsz, Head Clerk of the Municipal Assessor's Department, owing to ill-health.

Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that the leave granted by the Chairman be confirmed. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried

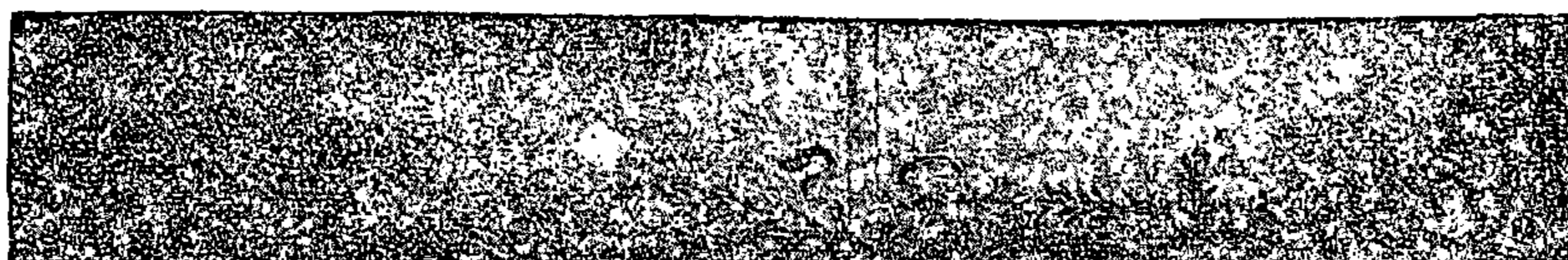
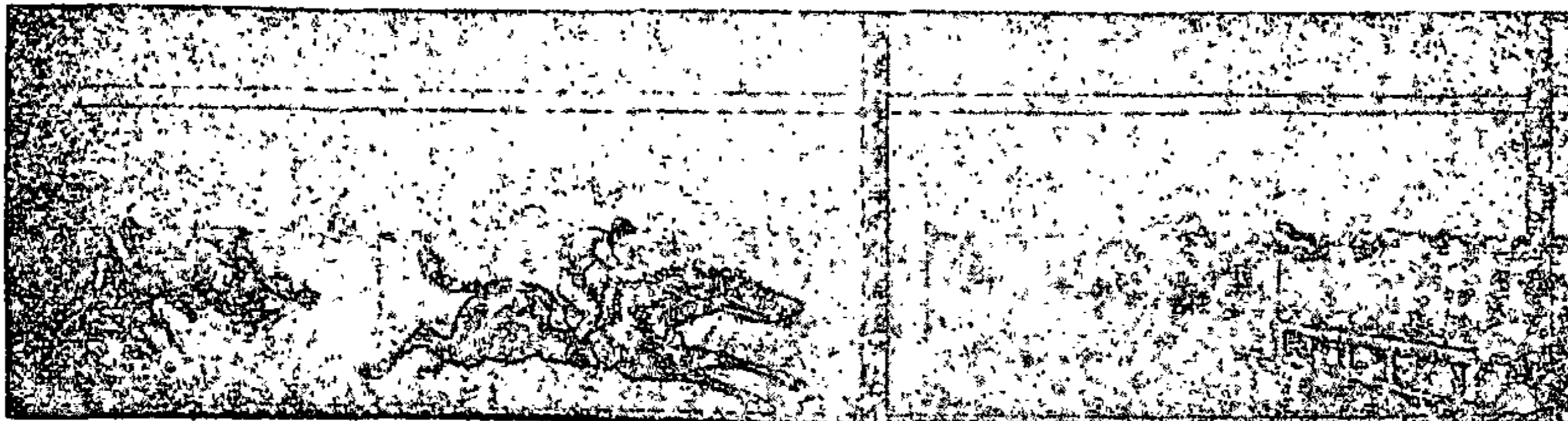

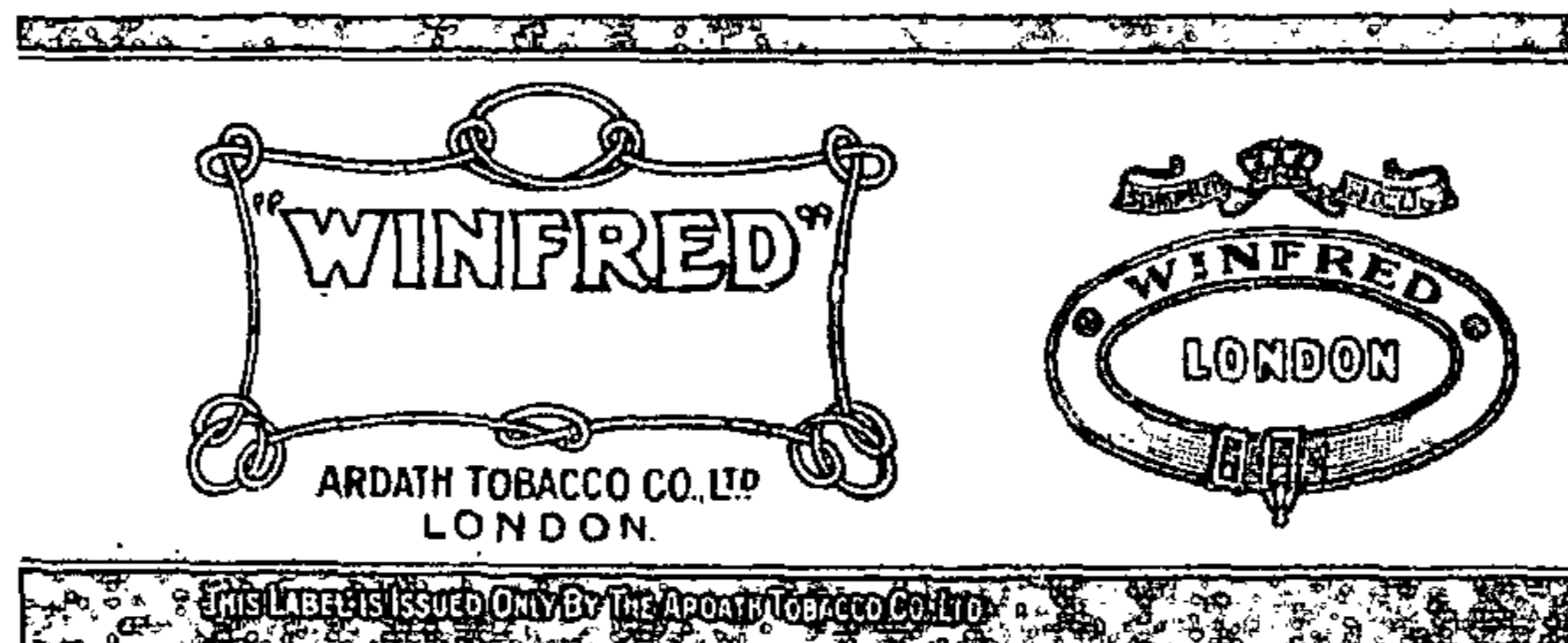
