RULE REFERRED TO.

39. (b) All dogs brought for conveyance in the dog locker must be muzzled with a leather or wire muzzle in such a way that the dog cannot bite, and must be provided with chain and leather or metal collar in good order. No dog will be accepted for conveyance unless so muzzled. Dogs not provided with chain and scientable collar will only be accepted for conveyance, provided a letter of indemnity is furnished. Provided, however, that where a dog is confined in a box, crate, cage, basket, or hamper so constructed as to render it impossible for the dog while so confined to bite any person or animal, the Railway authorities may in their discretion accept the same for conveyance.

"THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE, 1889."

THE following rules made under the provisions of sections 6 and 16 of the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 24 of 1889, as amended by Ordinance No. 9 of 1894, by the Village Councils of Wanni, Dewamedi, Katugampola, Dambadeni, Weudawili, and Hiriyala hatpattus, in the Kurunegala District of the North-Western Province, have been approved by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, and are published for general information under section 7 of the said Ordinance.

Rules made for the Village Committees of Wanni, Dewamedi, Katugampola, Dambadeni, Weudawili, and Hiriyala Hatpattus, in the Kurunegala District of the North-Western Province, under the provisions of Sections 6 and 16 of Ordinance No. 24 of 1889.

When an area of Crown land is set apart by Government as a chena reserve for the benefit of the inhabitants of a village, such inhabitants shall be bound to keep the boundaries of such area and of any subdivisions into which it may be divided open and defined at all times by permanent landmarks in accordance with the orders of the Ratemahatmaya

Whenever a chena reserve has been so set apart by Government, it shall be the duty of the Ratemahatmaya to divide it into twelve blocks defined as required These blocks shall be cultivated in rotation, one block in each year, and it shall not be lawful for any person to cultivate in a block other than that allotted for cultivation during the year. The Ratemahatmaya shall make a rough plan showing the blocks, numbered consecutively, and shall file it for reference in his office and supply the Arachchi of the village with a copy thereof.

3. In sufficient time before the commencement of the chena season the Arachchi of the village shall convene a meeting of the villagers, and shall decide what extent of the block allotted for cultivation in the year shall be assigned to the head of each family. The extent so allotted shall be in proportion to the number of the adults and children supported by the head of each family. It shall not be lawful for the head of a family to clear any portion other than the portion so assigned to him. When the subdivision of the area to be cultivated during the year has been arranged as above, the Arachchi shall forward the proceedings of the meeting to the Village Committee, together with a general application to the Government Agent for a permit to clear the block allotted to the year. The Village Committee shall forward such application at least one month before the clearing is to commence to the Government Agent, who will issue the permit in favour of the Arachchi on behalf of the villagers, unless good reasons (to be stated by him) exist to the contrary. Notification of the issue of such permit shall be given to the villagers by beat of tom-tom. It shall not be lawful for any person to clear any portion of any such chena reserve until the general permit above referred to has been issued by the

Cultivation by any one other than a *bona fide* villager is prohibited.

Should any dispute arise, the decision of the Chairman of the Village Committee shall be final.

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VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 28, 1913.

g Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 105 (2 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 63 Sinhalese, 12 Tamils, 16 Moors, 1 Malay, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1913, viz., 229,776) was 23·8, as against 27·9 in the preceding week, 21·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23·0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 110 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 52 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 18 Moors, 3 Malays, and 7 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 25.0, as against 26.5 in the previous week, 30.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 110 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 29 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

Selected Causes of Death.—Nineteen deaths were registered from Pneumonia (against 7 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in Kotahena, 4 in St. Paul's, 3 in Pettah, 2 each in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals) and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Slave Island. Six deaths were registered from Bronchitis.

- 2. Six deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 10 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year), of which 1 each was in Pettah, San Sebastian, St. Paul's, New, Bazaar, Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and Kollupitiya.
- 3. Three deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 2 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year), of which 1 each was in Kotahena, Maradana hospitals, and Kollupitiya. There were 5 cases reported during the week, against 7 in the previous week.
- 4. Ten deaths each were registered from Enteritis (1 infant) and Infantile Convulsions, 8 from Debility (5 infants), 6 from Senility, 4 from Dysentery, 3 from Diarrhaea, 1 each from Worms and Accident (gored by a bull), and 33 from Other Causes.
- 5. Five cases of Measles were reported, against 14 in the previous week; and 8 of Chickenpox, against 9 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.7°, against 82.9° in the preceding week and 81.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.845 in., against 29.821 in. in the preceding week and 29.816 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.32 in., against nil in the preceding week, and 1.92 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
