WHEREAS by section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof, or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided, for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Western Circuit, four times at least in each year at Colombo, and such other places in such Circuit, as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Colombo on January 10, March 20, July 10, and October 10 in each year:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that a Criminal Session of the Supreme Court shall be holden on the day hereinafter mentioned at Negombo, a place included within the said Western Circuit:

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that a Criminal Session of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Negombo, in the said Western Circuit, on or about Tuesday, August 19, 1913.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Sixteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Thirteen.

"THE FOREST ORDINANCE, 1907."

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, in exercise of the power vested in him by section 21 of the above-named Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following rules, in substitution for the rules numbered 1 to 13 in Chapter IV. of the Rules published by Notification dated April 21, 1909, as amended by Notification dated November 25, 1909, which are hereby cancelled.

CHAPTER IV.

RULES FRAMED FOR FORESTS OTHER THAN RESERVED OR VILLAGE FORESTS
UNDER SECTION 20.

Divisional Forest Officers are empowered to grant permission to fell, cut, girdle, tap, or injure by fire or otherwise scheduled or non-scheduled trees in forests other than village forests.

Section 21 (a) and (b).

1. No land at the disposal of the Crown shall be cleared for chena cultivation without a permit from the Government Agent of the Province, or the Assistant Government Agent of a district of the Province for his district.
2. No chena shall be cleared within 100 yards of any high road, principal or minor, or within 50 feet of any stream or ridge.
3. No forest containing full-grown trees shall on any account be cleared or burnt for chena while there is sufficient land described in the rule next following available.
4. Land formerly cleared for chena cultivation, which has been overgrown, and the second growth of timber on which is not more than ten years old, may be given for chena, irrespective of the kind of trees on it.
5. No person shall set fire to any grass, trees, or timber, or kindle any fire, or leave any fire burning, unless he shall have taken the following precautions:—
 - (a) He shall at least one week before kindling such fire have given notice of his intention so to do to the nearest Forest Officer.
 - (b) He shall have cleared of inflammable matter a belt of ground of not less than 20 yards in breadth around the place on which he purposes to kindle such fire.
 - (c) He shall have kindled such fire at a time when no high wind is blowing.
6. No trees described in Schedules II. and III. attached to Ordinance No. 16 of 1907 shall be felled or burnt on any pretence whatever, with the exception of saplings of such trees under five years old, on such chenas as are described in paragraph 4 hereof.
7. No person shall be granted a permit to clear land in excess of three acres.
8. The above-mentioned permit shall issue from the Kachechi of the district in which the chena is situated on a written application, to which shall be attached a report of the Revenue Headman of the applicant's village of the extent and description of land applied for, with a certificate that such land falls within the description given in rule 4. The applicant shall pay the Revenue Headman a personal fee of 50 cents on receiving his report from him.
9. The application mentioned in rule 8 shall be made on or before a date to be fixed by the Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent. The Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent may, however, in special cases, issue permits in respect of applications made after that date.
10. The permit to clear shall be recorded on the application, a register of which must be kept in the Kachechi.
11. No clearing permit shall be given to any one who has not been a resident of the village for two years, and whose name does not appear in the Division Officer's list.
12. Chenas must be cleared in squares, the sides of which shall be measured.
13. The Village Headman shall be held responsible for measuring and demarcating the chenas; his certificate under rule 8 shall contain a specific statement that he has done so, and his fee shall not be payable till he has so certified.
14. The above permit shall only be in force for a period not exceeding twelve months. If the cultivator of a chena wishes to cultivate it for a second year, he must again apply for and obtain a clearing permit as above provided for, which shall only be issued on the same conditions as for the first year of cultivation.
15. No person shall begin clearing until the permit referred to in rule 1 signed by the Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent has been issued to him.
16. Copies of all permits to clear chenas shall be sent immediately on their issue to the Forest Officer for his information, and shall be substantially in the Form A in the Appendix hereto.

Fire shall not be kindled under this permit during a high wind, nor until a space of 20 yards on all sides has been cleared of all inflammable matter, nor until at least one week's notice has been given to the nearest Forest Officer : on pain of forfeiture of the permit and confiscation of the crops, as well as any penalty provided by the Ordinance.

The assessed value of the tithe on paddy or fine grain shall be paid before removal of the crop.

The boundary trees marked by the Headman shall not be cut, nor any jungle cleared beyond the boundaries above given.

Land cleared under this permit shall be cleared in squares.

This permit shall be in force for twelve months.

“THE PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO ANIMALS ORDINANCE, 1907.”

WHEREAS by the proviso to section 10 of “The Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Ordinance, 1907,” as amended by Ordinance No. 19 of 1912, it is enacted that where in any area the whole or any part of the fines recovered in respect of offences under the said Ordinance which shall have been prosecuted by any officer of any society established in Ceylon for the prevention of cruelty to animals is by law or practice already appropriated to any public authority established in the area, an order made by the Governor in Executive Council, under section 10 of the said Ordinance, shall only take effect in such area, subject to the consent of such public authority signified by resolution notified in the *Government Gazette* and to the extent authorized by such resolution:

“That the whole of the fines recovered in respect of offences under the said Ordinance shall be paid to the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals in all cases which shall have been prosecuted by an officer of the Society”:

It is hereby notified that the Officer Administering the Government in Executive Council has, under the provisions of section 10 of the said Ordinance, directed that from and after the date hereof the whole of the fines recovered in respect of offences punishable under the said Ordinance which shall have been prosecuted within the limits of the Local Board of Chilaw by any officer of the Society established in Ceylon for the prevention of cruelty to animals shall be paid to such Society.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 12, 1913.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 100 (0 Europeans, 12 Burghers, 55 Sinhalese, 7 Tamils, 18 Moors, 7 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1913, viz., 235,829) was 22·1, as against 19·9 in the preceding week, 18·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23·0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 120 (0 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 59 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 21 Moors, 4 Malays, and 7 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 26·5, as against 23·2 in the previous week, 30·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·5 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 120 total deaths, 23 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the preceding week, 35 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 3.

Selected Causes of Death.—Fourteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 11 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in Maradana hospitals, 4 in Slave Island, 2 in Kotahena, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and Kollupitiya.

2. Ten deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 9 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 each were in St. Paul's and Kotahena, 2 in Wellawatta, and 1 each in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals) and Kollupitiya. Eight deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

3. Five deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 4 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 were in New Bazaar, and 1 each was in San Sebastian, Kotahena, and Slave Island. There were 18 cases reported during the week, against 9 in the previous week.

4. Seven deaths each were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, *Debility* (6 infants), and *Senility*, 5 from *Worms* (1 infant), 4 each from *Cirrhosis of Liver* and *Accidents* (due to a fall, being jammed between a fender and a crane girder, an injury by a nail, and fall off a swing respectively), 3 each from *Dysentery*, *Enteritis*, *Pyrexia*, and *Cellulitis*, 2 from *Tetanus* (both infants), 1 from *Diarrhoea*, and 34 from *Other Causes*.

5. Eleven cases of *Measles* were reported, against 4 in the previous week; and 7 of *Chickenpox*, as in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·1°, against 80·0° in the preceding week and 82·8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·826 in., against 29·855 in. in the preceding week and 29·813 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·16 in., against 3·36 in. in the preceding week and 0·08 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
