HEREAS the rules set forth in the schedule hereto, made by the Irrigation Committee of Wiyaluwa, in the Badulla District, Province of Uva, in pursuance of section 8 of "The Irrigation Ordinance, 1906," for the encouragement and extension of paddy cultivation, and the enforcement of ancient customs relating thereto, were duly transmitted by the Government Agent of the Province of Uva to His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, in pursuance of section 20 of the said Ordinance, for approval or disallowance thereof:

And whereas the said rules have been approved by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government. with the advice of the Executive Council:

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government, in exercise of the powers in Us vested by section 20 of the said Ordinance, do hereby give notice of Our approval of the said rules.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Eighteenth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Thirteen.

SCHEDULE.

- -1. All rules enacted previous to this in respect of Taldena-ela for the Province of Uva are hereby cancelled, provided that such cancellation shall not affect—
 - (a) The past operation of such rules.
 - (b) Any right, obligation, or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred thereunder.
 - (c) Any punishment or penalty incurred in respect of any breach of the said rules.
 - (d) Any investigation or legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such right, obligation, liability, penalty, or punishment, and every such investigation, legal proceeding, and remedy may be carried on as if the above rules had not been published.
- 2. The cultivation of fields under Taldena-ela irrigation work shall be confined to maha and yala harvest.
- 3. The cultivation for yala shall take place between August 1 and December 31, and cultivation for maha between February 1 and June 30.
- 4. The following intervals between cultivation seasons are required for general repairs and maintenance of the works, and no water will be issued through any sluice or canals for distribution to the fields during these periods:—

Maha from January 1 to January 30, 30 days. Yala from July 1 to July 30, 30 days.

- 5. The issue of water from the head sluice shall be regulated by the guardian on instructions from the officer in charge of the work, and from the ela by the velvidane. No person except the officer in charge of the work or some other person deputed by him shall interfere with the head sluice of the irrigation work or channels
- 6. .The manager of fields shall furnish the vel-vidane, within fifteen days before commencing cultivation, with a list of persons who have been employed as goiyas, showing the extent which each goiya cultivates. This list to be sent to the irrigation officer in charge of the work.
- 7. The distribution of water from the head sluice shall be regulated by the irrigation officer or guardian in charge of the work on written application from the vel-vidane giving the area requiring water, and he shall take action to prevent any water running to waste. The distribution of water from the sluices on the channel shall be regulated by the vel-vidane.
- 8. It shall be compulsory on all proprietors whose lands are irrigable from the Government channel to construct their shares of the subsidiary channels required to irrigate such lands. The course of such channels and the section and description to be constructed by each proprietor shall be determined by the officer in charge of the works according to the acreage of irrigable land held by each proprietor. The officer in charge will give notice to the Government Agent when and where any such channels are required.
- 9. All field channels shall be maintained in good order by the cultivators whose lands are irrigable thereby, and it shall be their duty to have their channels cleared before every cultivation, and to maintain and clear them during the cultivation. In the event of any cultivator failing to clear his share of the channels, the officer in charge of the works shall give notice that such repair or maintenance is required to the Government Agent, who shall cause the work to be done and recover the cost thereof from the defaulter.
- 10. No dam may be constructed on the main channel except on instructions from the officer in charge of the work.
- 11. Ploughing shall be commenced from agawata to the mulata fields and sowing in like manner, and no mulata proprietor shall plough his field before the agawata proprietor, provided the latter ploughs in time.
- 12. Fences must be put within six days of notice of apportionment being given by the vel-vidane. They must be sufficiently strong to keep out cattle, and each cultivator shall keep his portion of the fence in proper repair until the crop is reaped and gathered.
- 13. Each cultivator shall erect a proper watch hut adjoining the fence put up by him before sowing has commenced, and shall watch regularly until the crop is reaped and gathered, whether his own paddy is reaped or not.
- 14. In the event of any sudden and unforeseen accident occurring to any of the water-courses of such magnitude that it cannot be repaired in the ordinary manner, the vel-vidane shall, by beat of tom-tom, call on all the proprietors or cultivators of lands irrigated by the water-course to attend on the spot and assist in repairing it, and such proprietors or cultivators thus called upon shall attend and assist accordingly.
- 15. The cultivators of lands under cultivation shall be liable to pay to the velvidane four kurunies per amunam of sowing extent for yala and maha as huwandiran.
- 16. These dues shall be paid by each cultivator before any of his crop is removed from the threshing-floor, and the vel-vidane shall give receipts acknowledging the payment thereof.
- 17. The Government Agent shall have power to disallow the share or part of huwandiram due to a vel-vidane who has been guilty of any neglect of his duties.
- 18. Persons neglecting or refusing to give the shares of huwandiram from their fields shall be liable to prosecution and to a fine equal to double the value of huwandiram due, half the fine to be credited to the fine fund, and the other half to be paid in satisfaction of the huwandiram.

- 19. Any new channel that may be required by all the proprietors shall be made whenever the majority of the proprietors shall decide on making it, the work being executed by all in proportion to their respective shares. But if the minority of the proprietors do not concur in the decision of the majority, they shall be at liberty to appeal to the Village Council, and the decision of the Council either for or against the channel shall be final.
- 20. Should any new channel be required inside the field of some of the proprietors, and should the majority of the proprietors admit, or a Village Council decide, that it is necessary, it shall be made by all the proprietors through whose shares the channel has to pass, each opening the portion through his share.
- 21. Should any new channel be required outside the field of some of the proprietors, and should the majority of the proprietors or a Village Council decide that it is necessary, it shall be executed in the manner described in the 19th rule.

"THE EXPLOSIVES ORDINANCE, 1902."

T is hereby notified that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, in exercise of the power vested in him by section 7 of the above-named Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to repeal regulation 3 (l) of the regulations relating to the conveyance of explosives, promulgated by Notification dated June 13, 1902, and published in the Government Gazette No. 5,858 of June 20, 1902, and to substitute therefor the following regulation.

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Amended Regulation.

3. (l) For the conveyance of gunpowder exceeding 50 lb. weight, or its equivalent in other explosives as determined by the table in section 4 of the Explosives Ordinance, a license must be obtained from the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police for the district, or from a police officer specially authorized by the Inspector-General of Police for this purpose, or where there is no such officer from the Government Agent in charge of Police. The license substantially in form as below shall be issued subject to the conditions therein contained only after it has been ascertained that the powder or explosive is properly packed and secured according to the requirements of the Ordinance. The license shall specify the kind and quantity of explosive to be removed and the places from and to which it is to be removed; and in case it is to be removed to another district, a copy of the license shall be forwarded to the chief officer of police for that district.

ITH reference to the Notification dated February 28, 1913 (copy of which is reproduced below), in which an Examination for admission to the Local Division of the Civil Service—to be held in or about December next—was announced, it is hereby notified that the Examination has been postponed till April, 1914—the exact date will be announced later.

- 2. This postponement has been decided upon in order that effect may be given, at the forthcoming Examination, to the concession which has been granted by the Secretary of State, whereby members of the Government Service who desire to become candidates in the competition for entrance into the Local Division may be allowed to deduct from their actual age any time spent in Government service up to a maximum of seven years.
- 3. The list of applications for ordinary candidates has been closed, but applications for nominations from members of the Government Service who are eligible under the concession above specified will be received up to September 30.
- 4. Such applications must conform in all respects to the conditions laid down in the notice of February 28, 1913, except as regards paragraph 3 and paragraph 5 (b).
- 5. Applications for nomination should be sent to the Principal Assistant Colonial Secretary, through the Head of the Department in which the applicant is serving, on or before September 30, 1913. No question as to the delay or loss in the post of any such application can be entertained.
- 6. Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that on January 1, 1914, at least 19 years and not more than 30 years have elapsed since the date of his birth. He must also furnish proof that his service under Government is not less than the period by which his age on January 1, 1914, exceeds 23 years.

Notification referred to.

Examination for the Local Division of the Civil Service of Ceylon.

- 1. An Examination for admission to the Local Division of the Civil Service will be held in Colombo in or about December next. The prospects and conditions of the Service are set our in the Minutes governing the Local Division of the Civil Service published in the Government Gazette of February 17, 1911. The number of persons to be selected at this Examination will be two.
- 2. No person will be admitted to compete who has not received a nomination from His Excellency the Governor.
- 3. Applications for nominations should be sent to the Principal Assistant Colonial Secretary—the envelope to be marked "Local Division, Civil Service"—on or before April 30. No question as to the delay or loss in the post of any such application can be entertained.
- 4. Nominations will be limited to candidates who have passed the Senior Standard of the Cambridge Local Examination, the London Matriculation, or any other public examination which may be deemed to be of an equally high standard.
 - 5. Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof—
 - (a) That he is a natural born British subject born in Ceylon of parents permanently resident in the Island.
 - (b) That at least 19 years and not more than 23 years have elapsed since the date of his birth on January 1, 1913.
 - (c) That he is of good moral character.
 - 6. Applicants should attach to their applications—
 - (1) Birth certificate.
 - (2) A certificate of character from the head of the school at which the applicant was educated.
 - (3) A statement showing where he was educated, examinations passed, degrees taken, &c., present occupation, and how he has spent the time since he left school.
 - (4) A medical certificate that the applicant is of sound constitution, possessed of good sight, and otherwise physically qualified for the Service.
 - (5) Particulars of property possessed by the applicant, showing the situation and nature of the land or property. It should also be stated in the case of landed property whether it is ancestral or recently acquired.
 - (6) Any athletic distinctions obtained by the applicant should be stated, also whether the applicant is a Volunteer, and whether he is able to ride.
 - 7. All candidates after nomination will be required to undergo a medical examination by a Board before the examination by the Civil Service Commissioners. The fee for the medical examination will be Rs. 10 50. The fee for the examination will be Rs. 50.

8. The examinations will be conducted by the Civil Service Commissioners, and the following is a list of the subjects in which candidates will be examined:—

Candidates may take up two, and not more than two, of the voluntary subjects, and not more than one from each of the groups (a), (b), and (c).

Syllabus of Subjects.

Note.—No text books will be prescribed for any subject.

ENGLISH.

English Language and Composition.—The subject will include—

- (a) A subject for an essay to be chosen by each candidate from several subjects set. Those proposed may include some having reference to Geography and History, and some involving an acquaintance with English authors, as well as more abstract subjects, the main object being to test power of expression, thought and arrangement, general reading, and knowledge. (All candidates will be expected to attempt the essay, to which special importance is attached.)
- (b) Questions testing knowledge and command of English. These may include questions on préciswriting, paraphrase, and analysis of sentences.
- (c) Questions testing general reading and knowledge of English books.

MATHEMATICS, CLASS I.

Arithmetic.—The ordinary rules, with applications more specially to the mensuration of plane figures and solids. The metric system, and the use of decimals in approximate calculation; contracted methods. The use and theory of recurring decimals are not required, and candidates are at liberty to use algebraic symbols and formulas and tables of logarithms.

Geometry.—Plane geometry, theoretical and practical, not excluding simple problems in three dimensions. Proportion may be treated arithmetically; the special treatment of incommensurables is not required.

Algebra.—Including graphs of the simpler algebraic functions; quadratic equations; use of graphs in solving equations, and in illustrating and solving practical questions; rate of variation of a function and gradient or slope of a graph; graphic interpolation; indices and the simpler properties of surds.

Trigonometry.—Up to and including solution of plane triangles; graphs of trigonometrical functions.

Grasp of elementary principles and readiness in practical application will be looked for, but no great analytical skill will be demanded. Numerical results should be given to a few significant figures, and rough checks on the accuracy of the results should be applied. Neatness and accuracy of working are expected, and sufficient indication of the method of solution to make the work immediately intelligible. The examination will include laboratory work. Acquaintance is expected with the balance and steel-yard, and with the method of finding volume by weighing in air and in water. An idea of the range of the questions which will be set at the laboratory examination may be obtained from the laboratory questions set under Mathematics, Class I., at recent examinations for junior appointments in the Home Civil Service, and shown in reprints of the examination papers published by Messrs. Wyman & Sons, Fetter Lane, London, E.C.

LATIN.

The paper will include (1) questions on grammar; (2) unprepared passages for translation into English, with questions; (3) one or more easy unprepared passages for translation into English, a vocabulary of unfamiliar words being given; (4) one or more unprepared passages of ordinary difficulty for translation into English; (5) easy sentences for translation into Latin; (6) one or more continuous passages for translation into Latin

BOOKKEEPING AND ACCOUNTING.

Knowledge of the general principles of Bookkeeping and Accounting. Bookkeeping by double entry.

MATHEMATICS, CLASS II.

Includes Mathematics, Class I., together with Mechanics. The principles of the lever, the inclined plane, the composition of forces and virtual work, their experimental investigation and applications to machines and other simple cases of equilibrium. Centre of gravity, couple or torque, velocity ratio, mechanical advantage or forceratio, work, efficiency.

Application to liquids and gases. Density. Boyle's Law. Pump, siphon, barometer, manometer. Velocity, acceleration, momentum, force, impulse of a force, energy, power or rate of work. The examination in Mathematics, Class II., will include laboratory work. An idea of the range of the questions which will be set at the laboratory examination may be obtained from the laboratory questions set under Mathematics, Class II., at recent examinations for junior appointments in the Home Civil Service, and shown in reprints of the examination papers published by Messrs. Wyman & Sons, Fetter Lane, London, E.C.

CHEMISTRY.

The following outline indicates the range of the examination:—

I .- Written.

The methods which lead to the discovery of the composition of common materials occurring in nature.

The determination of molecular weights, equivalents, and of atomic weights. Valency and structural

Classification of the elements, including the Periodic Scheme.

General characters of the chief types of compounds, including acids, bases, and salts and a few prominent carbon compounds, especially as illustrating the relations of properties to composition and structure. No distinction will be admitted between Organic and Inorganic Chemistry.

History, production and properties of the more important and typical elements and their most familiar compounds.

The character of chemical changes, including combustion, thermal dissociation, and electrolysis; the conditions which determine and influence them, and the attendant phenomena.

The whole to be treated in an elementary manner.

Candidates will be required to show that they have seen and practised a great variety of experiments, and are familiar with the appearance of common laboratory materials.

II.—Practical Examination.

Candidates will be required to show that they are familiar with easy quantitative operations, gravimetric and volumetric, with the rudiments of qualitative analysis, and that they have prepared a number of elements or compounds by processes involving the manipulation of gases and the purification of substances by crystallization, distillation, &c. Candidates must bring to the practical examination the notebooks which contain the record of the experimental work they have performed. Specimens made by the candidate, duly attested by the teacher, if any, may also be submitted to the examiners.

PHYSICS.

The following Syllabus indicates the general scope and character of the examination, without being exhaustive of all parts of the subject. Candidates are expected to show a general acquaintance with the apparatus by which the elementary principles of Physics are illustrated and applied:

Sound.—The Production and Propagation of Sound.

Nature of Wave-motion. Amplitudes. Wave-length. Frequency.

Experimental determination of the Velocity of Sound in Air. Echoes. Effect of change of Temperature on the Velocity.

Determination of Frequency by simple methods.

Experimental investigation of the modes of Vibration of Strings by means of the Sonometer.

Experimental investigation of the Vibrations of Air in Pipes by Resonance to Tuning Forks.

Organ Pipes. Position of Nodes and Antinodes.

Optics.—Propagation of Light. Measurement of Velocity. Laws of Reflection and Refraction. Photometry. Reflection at Plane and Spherical Surfaces, and the formation of Images.

The formation of Images by single Lenses. Long and Short Sight and their correction by Lenses.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 16, 1913.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 85 (1 European, 8 Burghers, 42 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 10 Moors, 1 Malay, and 5 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1913, viz., 235,829) was 18.8, as against 18.1 in the preceding week, 22.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23.0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 137 (0 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 58 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 28 Moors, 5 Malays, and 8 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 30·3, as against 22·1 in the previous week, 26·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·5 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 137 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 26 in the preceding week, 29 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Selected Causes of Death.—Twenty deaths were registered from Pneumonia (against 10 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year), of which 6 were in Kotahena, 4 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 in St. Paul's, 2 in San Sebastian, and 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals, Slave Island, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta. Four deaths were registered from Bronchitis.

- 2. Thirteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 16 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year), of which 6 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 in St. Paul's, and 2 each in Pettah and New Bazaar.
- 3. Five deaths were registered from Enteric Fever (against 6 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 were in Maradana hospitals and 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and Slave Island.
- 4. Seventeen deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 12 from Enteritis (5 infants), 10 from Debility (1 infant), 5 from Diarrhæa (2 infants), 4 each from Worms and Tetanus (3 infants), 3 from Dysentery, and 40 from Other Causes.
- 5. Three cases of *Measles* were reported, against 6 in the previous week; and 5 of *Chickenpox*, against 4 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.4°, as in the preceding week and in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.800 in., against 29.870 in. in the preceding week and 29.844 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was '09 in., against nil in the preceding week and 0.23 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
