VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 30, 1913.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 112 (1 European, 13 Burghers, 65 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 11 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1913, viz., 235,829) was 24.8, as against 23.7 in the preceding week, 21.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23.0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 114 (1 European, 13 Burghers, 49 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 17 Moors, 2 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 25.2, as against 22.1 in the previous week, 24.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 114 total deaths, 21 were of infants under one year of age, as against 24 in the preceding week, 27 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 15.

Selected Causes of Death.—Fifteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 8 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 each in Kotahena and Maradana hospitals, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Pettah, New Bazaar, and Slave Island.

2. Nine deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* as in the previous week (against 17 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 each were in Kotahena and New Bazaar, and 1 each in San Sebastian, St. Paul's, Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), Slave Island, and Kollupitiya. Three deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

3. Nine deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 7 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 each were in Kollupitiya and Wellawatta, and 1 each in San Sebastian, St. Paul's, Kotahena, Maradana hospitals, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals).

4. Ten deaths were registered from *Senility*, 9 from *Enteritis* (3 infants), 6 each from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Debility* (3 infants), 4 from *Dysentery*, 2 from *Accidents* (due to a motor lorry passing over the leg and fall from the seat of a carriage respectively), and 41 from *Other Causes*.

5. There was 1 case of *Measles* reported during the week, against 3 in the previous week; and 5 of *Chickenpox*, against 4 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.3°, against 79.3° in the preceding week and 81.8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.893 in., against 29.850 in. in the preceding week and 29.812 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.03 in., against 0.40 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
