WHEREAS by "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the purposes of the administration of justice, for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence, or alleged crime or offence:

For the Western Circuit, four times at least in each year at Colombo, and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Colombo on January 10, on March 20, on July 10, and on October 10, in every year:

And whereas it appears to Us to be expedient to hold a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court at Negombo, a place included within the said Western Circuit:

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, do hereby order and appoint as follows :

That a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall commence to be holden at Negombo on or about Monday, the 30th day of May, 1892.

WHEREAS by "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the purposes of the administration of justice, for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence, or alleged crime or offence :

For the Southern Circuit, twice at least at Galle, and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Galle on April 25 and September 15 in every year :

And whereas it is further provided by the said Ordinance that it shall be competent for the Governor, for sufficient reasons to him appearing, to order, after previous consultation with the Judges, other Sessions to be holden at the places therein mentioned or at any other place in any of the said Circuits, or to alter the dates therein mentioned, and to fix any other date for the commencement of the Sessions at any place :

And whereas it appears to Us to be expedient to hold a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court at Mátara, a place included in the said Southern Circuit, and to alter the date fixed by the said Ordinance for holding the first Criminal Sessions at Galle :

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint as follows :

That the first Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court for the Southern Circuit for this year shall commence to be holden at Galle on or about Monday, the 2nd day of May, instead of Monday, the 25th April; and

That a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall commence to be holden at Mátara, a place within the said Southern Circuit, on or about Monday, the 16th day of May.

**DRAFT ORDINANCES.**

**MINUTE.**

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

**An Ordinance to re-adjust the Customs Duties leviable on Kerosine Oil, Spirits, and Tobacco.**

Preamble.

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to re-adjust the Customs Duties leviable under the Ordinances Nos. 17 of 1869, 14 of 1871, and 39 of 1884, respectively; on certain articles imported into this Colony: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

To be read with Ordinances Nos. 17 of 1869, 14 of 1871, and 39 of 1884.

**1** This Ordinance and the schedule hereto annexed, so far as they are consistent therewith, shall be construed and read as one with the Ordinances Nos. 17 of 1869, 14 of 1871, and 39 of 1884.

Definition clause.

**2** For the purposes of this Ordinance “kerosine oil” shall include the liquids commonly known by the names of rock oil, Rangoon oil, Burma oil, kerosine, petroleum, paraffine oil, mineral oil, petroline, gasoline, benzol, benzoline, benzine, and any inflammable liquid that is made from petroleum, coal, schist, shale, peat, or any other bituminous substance, or from any products of petroleum.

Duties imposed on tobacco, kerosine oil, and spirits.

**3** From and after the time when this Ordinance shall come into operation, the several duties of customs, as the same are respectively inserted, described, and set forth in figures in the schedule hereto annexed, shall be levied and paid upon the several articles in the said schedule mentioned when imported into this Colony, anything in the aforesaid Ordinances Nos. 17 of 1869, 14 of 1871, and 39 of 1884 to the contrary notwithstanding.

Operation.

**4** This Ordinance shall come into operation at such time as the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, appoint.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

## An Ordinance to abolish the Paddy Tax.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to abolish the tax, duty, or share due to the Crown in respect of paddy grown in this Colony : Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

Tax on paddy abolished.

1 From and after the passing of this Ordinance there shall cease to be levied by and payable to the Crown such tax, duty, or share as by law, custom, or usage (whether general or local) has heretofore been so levied and payable in respect of paddy grown in this Colony.

Repeal.

2 The Ordinances set forth in the schedule hereto, and so much of any other Ordinance as is inconsistent with this Ordinance, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

## MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, February 12, 1892.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated February 6, 1892.

*Present* :—Mr. H. H. Cameron, Mayor and Chairman; Captain F. Bayley; Mr. E. Walker; Mr. C. S. Hay; Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne; Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa; Mr. C. Perera; Mr. H. van Cuylenberg; and Mr. C. P. Dias.

The Minutes of January 19 and 23, 1892, having been printed and a copy sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of January 19 and 23, 1892, be confirmed.

Mr. C. P. Dias presented a letter dated February 8, 1892, from Mr. James de Kretser, Honorary Secretary, Colombo Colts Cricket Club, complaining of their cricket pitch at the Racquet court having been damaged by the Agri-Horticultural Show, and requesting that the ground be restored to its former condition.

The Chairman stated that the Secretary, Agri-Horticultural Society Committee, had already been written to on the subject, and that his attention would be invited to the matter.

The Chairman presented a petition dated January 9, 1892, from Mr. Thomas Pieris Gunasekere, complaining of a drain running alongside the foundation of house No. 51, St. Sebastian Hill.

The Chairman stated that the Superintendent of Works, to whom the letter was referred, had undertaken to submit an estimate.

Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne presented a petition dated February 10, 1892, from E. Ismail Maricar, praying for renewal of special licenses to sell meat at No. 1, Layard's Broadway, and No. 10, Van Rooyan street.

The Chairman stated that the matter was under consideration, and that a report on the petition would be laid before Council at the next Meeting.

1/2. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Dias asked "what suggestions the Sanitary Officer has made for removing the long standing nuisances in Kehelwatta, and for improving its present insanitary condition," and moved "that the same be considered."

In reply, the Chairman read a letter No. 197 dated February 11, 1892, from the Sanitary Officer, stating that, in order to improve the sanitary condition of Kehelwatta, a proper system of drainage should be adopted after the demolition of the existing rookeries and the erection of buildings in accordance with sanitary rules; and suggesting, further, that this locality be scavenged twice daily, and also the construction of a side drain to prevent stagnation of water from the standpipes.

The Chairman undertook to request the Superintendent of Works to furnish an estimate for a side drain in Cramer's lane to carry off the waste water from the standpipes.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Dias moved "that immediate steps be taken to prevent the misuse of the green opposite the Holy Trinity Church, St. Sebastian, by vagrants."

Mr. H. van Cuylenberg.—Seconded.

Resolved,—That the attention of the Police be invited to the matter, and that the employment of special constables be authorised, if necessary.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved "with reference to the resolution of Council of July 11, 1890, regarding letter No. 87 dated July 3, 1890, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating to the Council that the Government would consider any application from the Council for assistance towards the introduction of a more perfect system of drainage, to wit, that the letter be acknowledged with thanks, and that Government be informed that the Council trust to be able at an early date to submit some scheme of drainage for the consideration of Government, and, with further reference to a letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary dated November 7 last, offering the Municipal Council any reasonable assistance which the Executive Government could afford for the sewerage of the Fort, that the said resolution of Council of July 11, 1890, be given effect to by submitting for the consideration of Government the two schemes for the drainage of the Fort prepared by Messrs. Ormsby and Skelton, respectively, and that Government be at the same time asked for the assistance promised."

This motion was, by leave of Council, amended by the substitution of the words "the scheme for the drainage of the Fort prepared by Mr. Skelton, together with the report thereon by Mr. Ormsby," for "the two schemes for the drainage of the Fort prepared by Messrs. Ormsby and Skelton, respectively."

The motion so amended was seconded by Captain Bayley, and carried.

Mr. C. S. Hay "moved that the Chairman be authorised to order out 1,000 ft. of 6-in. Doulton pipes at once, and that Messrs. Ormsby's and Skelton's plans for the drainage of Chatham street be submitted to Government, with a request that one or other of the schemes may be selected for adoption."

Captain Bayley seconded.—Carried.

10. A letter dated February 1, 1892, from Mr. R. D. Ormsby, was read, intimating, with reference to the application made to him for plans and estimates in connection with the sewerage of the Fort, that by a recent circular from Government he is precluded from undertaking any work outside his own duties. The Chairman then stated that he had received a subsequent letter from Mr. Ormsby of February 8, stating that, if the Chatham street verandahs could be reclaimed continuously for the whole length of the street, he would concur with Mr. Skelton in placing the steps back within this space and so giving increased width to the carriage way, and that if this were so there could be no necessity for two separate estimates, though he would be glad to give an opinion on Mr. Skelton's estimate without fee, if desired by the Council.

11. A letter No. 31 dated January 14, 1892, from the Superintendent of Works, with reference to the deepening, cleansing, and improvement of the lake, was submitted.

Mr. C. Perera moved "that the lake be restored to its former level, that is, to the level of the spill."

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

This motion was, by leave of Council, withdrawn.

Mr. C. Perera then moved "that pending the receipt of surveys from the Surveyor-General in connection with the proposed embankment at Captain's Garden, an estimate be submitted for the piling and other work necessary to be carried out at the Suduwella swamp.

The Chairman seconded.—Carried.

12/14. Dr. Trimen's letter No. 177 of December 22, 1891, and connected correspondence on the subject of the removal of the weeds growing in the lake, the reports of the Superintendent of Works (received with letter No. 293 of November 13, 1891), the Consulting Engineer (received with letter No. 67 of November 7, 1891), and the Sanitary Officer's report of December 8, 1891, with reference to the lake, and Hon. L. B. Clarence's letter of November 6, 1891, inviting attention to the condition of the lake, were submitted, after having been previously printed and circulated.

Mr. C. Perera moved the appointment of a Special Committee consisting of Hon. J. J. Grinlinton, Captain F. Bayley, Mr. C. S. Hay, Mr. D. F. Browne, Mr. E. Walker, and Mr. C. Perera—three Members to form a quorum—to report on the foregoing letters and reports, including the letter No. 31 of January 14, 1892, from the Superintendent of Works.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

15. The letter from Mr. Vincent Loos, with reference to the new road from the Maradana Junction and connected papers, were submitted.

Resolved,—That the consideration of the above be deferred.

16. A letter No. 156/014530, dated December 24, 1891, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary (which had been previously circulated), with reference to the subject of Vaccine Stations, was submitted, intimating that the Governor desired to impress on the Council the general principle that charges on account of sanitation should be met from the funds of the Municipalities or other local bodies empowered to levy rates, and should no longer be provided from the public revenue, and that in the present instance the cost of vaccine stations would be a proper charge on the funds of the Municipality; and, further, that if the funds referred to should be insufficient the Governor was prepared to consider the propriety of empowering the Municipal Council to impose a special sanitary rate or to increase the present consolidated rate in order to meet this purpose.

A Minute by Dr. Kynsey on the subject was also read, recognising the courtesy of the Council in postponing the consideration of the papers on the above subject at the last Meeting owing to his absence, and hoping that the matter would be considered without further loss of time. The houses for vaccine stations having been selected, the furniture was now required to open the stations; and Dr. Kynsey was strongly of opinion that a special rate should be levied for sanitary purposes.

A letter No. 196 of February 10, 1892, was also read, submitting an estimate of Rs. 57-93 for the requisite furniture for each vaccine station.

The Chairman moved "that he be authorised to incur an expenditure of Rs. 521-37 for furniture for nine vaccine stations."

Captain Bayley seconded.

Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne moved as an amendment the previous question.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.

**Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, February 27, 1892, at 8 o'clock a.m.**

*Present*:—Hon. P. A. Templer, Chairman; F. Vine, Esq.; J. B. Siebel, Esq.; J. N. d'Esterre, Esq.; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; F. van Langenberg, Esq.; Barnes de Alwis, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on January 21 were read and confirmed.

2. The Chairman called on the Secretary to read copy of letter No. 7, dated February 11, to the Colonial Secretary, on the subject of the preservation of the lake, written in accordance with the resolution of the Council (No. 8) adopted at the last Meeting. On the letter being read, the Chairman stated that he thought it possible that some assistance might be given by Government, if it could be shown that the dredger and barge referred to in the Secretary's memorandum attached to letter No. 38 to the Colonial Secretary of July 1, 1890, and dated June 16, 1890, could be procured for the sum stated therein.

3. The following documents were laid on the table:—General Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from close of 1890 to December 31, 1891, and from close of 1891 to January 31, 1892; separate Statements of Receipts and Disbursements in respect of the General Revenue; Police Assessment and Water-rate accounts for the same periods; Progress Reports of Work done brought up to the same dates; Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the months of December and January; also reports by the Health Officer for the same months.

Mr. Van Langenberg asked why no explanatory notes had been attached to the statements, and referred to the resolution of March 21, 1891. A form in which these notes should be prepared was submitted and approved of, and the Secretary was instructed to see that notes in this form do accompany the separate monthly statements of receipts and disbursements.

## Report on the Sanitary Condition of the Town of Kandy for the Month of December, 1891.

**General Health.**—The month of December was characterised by heavy falls of rain, and in consequence of excessive atmospheric moisture, affections of the lungs and of the bowels prevailed to a great extent. Influenza, varying in symptoms from severe headache, increased temperature of the body, and slight colds in the head and chest, to graver chest affections attended with considerable prostration, prevailed to some extent in the town, and in many houses several inmates suffered at the same time. An unusual number of cases of diarrhoea and dysentery were treated in the Kandy hospital and in the Government outdoor dispensary.

**Contagious Diseases.**—A mild case of chickenpox occurred in Colombo road on the 5th instant, and two cases in Market street on the 10th instant. The patients were isolated and the houses whitewashed and disinfected. On December 14 two cases of infectious cholera, reported from Mulgampola near Getambe, were removed to the hospital, and proved fatal. These patients (an immigrant labourer and her child) caught the infection at Matale, where cholera was prevailing at the time. On their arrival at Getambe the symptoms of the disease developed themselves. The infected ambalam at Mulgampola was whitewashed and disinfected.

**Vaccination.**—Sixty-seven people were vaccinated in town during the month, of which 49 were successful and 18 absent. Of those re-vaccinated (13 in number) 2 were successful and 11 failed to present themselves for examination.

**Slaughter House.**—Only a small number of black cattle was daily produced for examination and slaughtered. Owing to the scarcity of beef the price went up during the month. The cattle were in fairly good condition. The Municipal Inspectors drew my attention to the practice of beef from inferior animals not examined, being purchased from unlicensed vendors at Katugastota and offered for sale at the Kandy market. As there is great danger of diseased meat being introduced for sale, this practice should be put a stop to; and I would suggest, with a view to this, that the Police authorities be requested to instruct the constables stationed at Katugastota to prevent beef being conveyed to Kandy for sale.

Report on the Sanitary Condition of the Town of Kandy for the Month of January, 1892.

**Health.**—The general health of the town during the last month was more satisfactory than during the month of December. The spread of influenza has somewhat subsided. Coughs and colds of a mild nature prevailed to some extent.

**Contagious Diseases.**—Only one case of chickenpox occurred in a house No. 103 in Castle street. This was a very mild case, and the patient recovered in a few days.

**Slaughter House.**—During the month of January 188 black cattle and 104 buffaloes were slaughtered, giving an average of 6 of the former and 3 of the latter slaughtered per diem. The reason for this small number is stated to be the prevalence of murrain and the consequent scarcity of cattle. The cattle produced for examination were of the ordinary description. I would here invite attention to the objectionable way in which beef is carted to the market. The carts have no protection before and behind, and the exposed carcasses are thus conveyed through the public streets from the slaughter-house to the market. To prevent this unsightly exhibition, and to protect the beef from the clouds of dust that settle on it, I would suggest that the butchers be instructed to supply side blinds to the cart. Two butchers from Kandy were prosecuted and fined Rs. 2.50 each for conveying to Kandy beef purchased from unlicensed vendors at Katugastota. I would suggest that offences of this nature be met by more severe punishment, and that the licenses of such offenders be cancelled for a week.

**Market.**—The market was as a rule clean. The usual monthly whitewashing was completed at the end of the month.

**Latrines.**—The Municipal latrines were in a cleanly state. I am glad to report that the suggestion in my last report, to supply seats for children using the De Soya latrine, has been carried out.

**Drainage.**—The drain opposite the Maligawa is in the same state as reported before.

**Contaminating Water Supply.**—The jail latrine contents are still buried in the vicinity of the reservoir.
