MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on June 21, 1913, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated June 17, 1913.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. G. S. Saxton, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. R. W. Jonklaas; Mr. D. E. Weerasooria; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; Dr. Allan de Saram; Mr. H. F. Tomalin.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on May 17 having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and about to be confirmed by the. Chairman when Mr. Beven objected to the inclusion of item 7 (1), and proposed that it be deleted on the ground that was irregular for Mr. Pieris, a member of the Finance Committee, to move an amendment to a recommendation of that committee agreed to by him, and that too without due notice of motion as required both by the Municipal Council Ordinance and the by-laws of the Council.

There being no seconder, the motion was declared lost. The Chairman pointed out that both the by-laws and the Ordinance provide for the transacting of business other than that specified in the notices of the meetings with the permission of the Council. The motion in question having been unanimously passed by the Council, the Chairman held that it was obvious the Council had no objection to the matter being brought up without notice. Mr. Jonklaas moved—"That the Minutes be confirmed." This was carried. Mr. Beven being the only dissentient.

- 2. The following documents were submitted:-
 - (a) Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1912 to May 31, 1913, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water Rate Accounts.
 - (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
 - (c) Health Officer's Report for May.
 - (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors, and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, during the month of May.
 - (e) The Reservoir Readings for May.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Council Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's Report be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on Laundries, Bakeries, Dairies, Standpipes, and House Service Taps inspected during May.

- 4. Correspondence :-
 - Letter of May 20, 1913, from Mr. W. C. Price, resigning his office as a Nominated Member of the Kandy Municipal Council.—Read.
 - (2) Letter of May 30, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to Mr. H. F. Tomalin, nominating him to be a Member of the Municipal Council of Kandy vice Mr. W. C. Price, resigned.—Read.
 - (3) Letter No. 114 of May 30, from the Hon, the Government Agent, Central Province, intimating that there is no stamp duty in respect of licenses for toddy taverns within the Municipality.—Read.
- 5. Recommendations of Standing Committees:

Law and General Subjects.

(1) That Mr. Vanderwall, the Council's Lawyer, be paid his annual fee of Rs. 31. 50 for the years 1910, 1911, and 1912.

Finance.

(2) That the wages of the two office coolies be raised from Rs. 11 to Rs. 12 50 a month.

Works

- (3) That the following estimates be sanctioned:-
 - (a) Two double canoes for Halloluwa ferry, Rs. 330.; (b) Four culverts on the Halloluwa road, Rs. 550.
- (4) That house service pipes be allowed on usual terms to-
 - (a) No. 3A, Ward struct, Weerappah Brothers; (b) No. 45, Brownrigg street, A. M. Meeya Lebbe.
- (5) That a public latrine be erected on premises No. 322, Peradeniya road, near the $10\frac{1}{2}$ mile stone, probable cost Rs. 1,000.
 - Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted.
 - 6. The election of a member to serve on the following Standing Committees:-
 - (i.) Market, and Sanitation; (ii.) Municipal Works.
 - Mr. H. F. Tomalin was elected for both the Committees.
- 7. At the close of the Proceedings, Mr. Beven said he wished to bring to the notice of the Council the death of Mr. Louis Pieris, who had served this Council as an Elected Member for a number of years. He thought it was only fitting that the Council should express their sympathy with the members of the family in the loss they had sustained. This was seconded by Mr. LaBrooy and carried unanimously.
