## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on July 19, 1913, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated July 15, 1913.

*Present*: The Hon. Mr. G. S. Saxton, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Mr. R. W. Jonklaas; Mr. D. E. Weerasuriya; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; Dr. Allan de Saram; and Mr. W. C. Price.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on June 21, 1913, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

(a) Statements of receipts and expenditure from close of 1912 to June 30, 1913, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water-rate accounts.

(b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.

(c) Health Officer's report for June.

(d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of June.

(e) The Reservoir Readings for June.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on Laundries, Bakeries, Dairies, Standpipes, and House Service Taps inspected during June.

4. Correspondence:—

(1) Letter No. 8 of July 11 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that the Provincial Engineer, Central Province, will be instructed to hand over to the Council from September 1 next the building known as the Old Lock Hospital, on condition that if it is at any time required again by Government it shall be at once handed back.—Read.

(2) Letter of June 30 from Dr. Allan de Saram applying for permission to build a motor shed on the land between Malabar street and Lady McCarthy's road.

Resolved—That permission be allowed; rent to be Rs. 6 per annum and the shed to be removed on a month's notice without any claim for compensation.

(3) Letter of June 29 from Mrs. L. Pieris thanking the Council for their sympathy in her recent bereavement.—Read.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. Pieris moved—That this Council considers it desirable to ask the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, to remove the toddy tavern presently situated in Railway Approach road to its former site at Deiyannawela or to some other less objectionable site.—Mr. Weerasooriya seconded.

The Chairman said if the Council wished to send in any expression of opinion it would be perfectly legitimate to do so, and that he was prepared to consider any objections lodged before July 31. He would however add that the present site was sanctioned only temporarily, because no other was available. Directly a suitable site was forthcoming the tavern would be removed thither.

In these circumstances Mr. Pieris begged leave to withdraw his motion.—This was allowed.

6. Recommendations of Standing Committees:—

*Law and General Subjects.*

(1) That all vehicles kept and used by any Municipal Council Officer on a certificate from that officer that they are chiefly used on Municipal duty be exempted from the payment of the annual tax.

(2) That the following by-law be passed:—No person of the male sex, over the age of eight years, shall enter a latrine reserved for females, and no person of the female sex shall enter a latrine reserved for males.

*Finance and Assessment.*

(3) That the Council grant to the Kandy Industrial School a yearly sum of Rs. 240, the same as was voted for the Friend-in-Need Society.

(4) That a vote of Rs. 76.56 be obtained for the purchase of a  $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. meter.

(5) That a gratuity of Rs. 144 be awarded to Arja Umma, widow of late Overseer N. Ismail, by payments of Rs. 3 a month for four years.

*Municipal Works.*

(6) That the following estimates be sanctioned:—Improvements to Municipal Office, Rs. 700.

(7) That house service pipes be allowed on usual terms to—(i.) 867, Peradeniya road, B. D. Sarnelis; (ii.) 118, Trincomalee street, T. R. Asana Marikar; (iii.) 71, Trincomalee street, Mrs. A. Wendt; (iv.) 21, Hill street, W. Senaris.

Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted, but that in regard to (1) the words "not exceeding two" be inserted after the word "vehicles."

7. The Chairman's Administration Report for 1912.—Tabled.

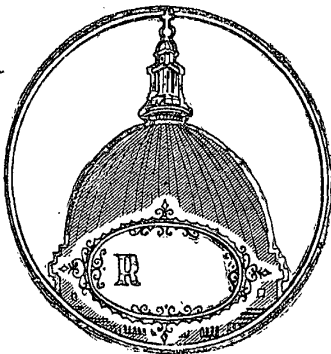

" A Rubber Tree Tapping Tool."

Abstract :—

The inventor states :—My invention is to be particularly used for extracting latex from the bark of trees and consists of a tool made in four simple pieces which can be easily taken to pieces for sharpening purposes and which can be adjusted to a nicety, so that any thickness of bark may be cut after the first incision has been made.

The object of my invention is to make the process of cutting the bark of a rubber tree a safe one by placing in the hands of a coolly a knife the blade of which can be easily removed for sharpening and can be readily adjusted after sharpening to give the desired depth of cut. The object also is to put into the hands of a coolly a tool which he can use with safety without danger of cutting into the cambium of the tree.

The claim is :—

(1) A rubber tree tapping tool consisting of a flat shank, with a handle at one end and widened at the other end, such flat widened end having its parallel and straight sides flanged upwards to form a guard to prevent damage to the cambium of the tree, substantially as described and illustrated, and having a transverse slot cut from and through each of these flanged sides towards the centre leaving uncut a centre piece about one fifth the width of that widened part, substantially as described and illustrated, and of a flat blade of the width of that before described widened part of the shank having its parallel and straight side edges flanged upwards to form a guard to prevent damage to the cambium of the tree and having its end sharpened, like a plane iron, and having a central slot cut from the cutting edge for about one third the length of the blade so as to pass the uncut part of the widened end of the shank before described when the blade is slipped into the before described transverse slots, substantially as described and illustrated, and of a set screw to hold the blade in these transverse slots of the widened part of the shank at an acute angle with the under flat surface of the before described widened part of the shank, and so that the cutting edge of the blade projects below that surface, like a plane iron in a plane, substantially as described and illustrated.

" Improvements in machines or apparatus for drying tea-leaf and other produce."

Abstract.—This invention relates to machines or apparatus for drying tea-leaf, or other produce (for brevity hereinafter referred as tea-leaf) in chambers into which heated air is forced, or drawn, and through which chambers the tea-leaf is conveyed on endless perforated, or reticulated, webs formed of tilting trays, so that the tea-leaf is presented in even layers to the action of the heated air, the said trays being caused to successively tilt for the purpose of discharging the tea-leaf on to another run of trays beneath them and then to resume their normal position to receive at a later stage, a further supply of tea-leaf. Owing to the green, sticky, or juicy condition of some of the tea-leaf it has been found that it adheres to the said trays when tilted resulting in an irregular drying of the tea-leaf and this invention has for its object to provide means whereby tea-leaf adhering to the trays can be removed therefrom and consists in providing a scraper or wiper, or scrapers, or wipers, which is, or are adapted to rake, scrape or otherwise remove any adhering or clinging tea-leaf from the tray after it has been tilted the removed tea-leaf subsequently falling on to the run of trays beneath.

The claims are :—

(1) In tea-leaf drying machines or apparatus, provided with travelling endless perforated, or reticulated, webs formed of tilting trays; scrapers or wipers, adapted to rake, scrape, loosen or remove from the said trays any tea-leaf or other produce adhering or clinging thereto after the said trays have been tilted, substantially as hereinbefore described.

(2) A tea-leaf drying machine, or apparatus, provided with a scraper, or wiper, constructed, arranged and adapted to operate substantially as and for the purpose hereinbefore described and illustrated in the accompanying drawing.
