The inventor states:—The object of my invention is to cure rubber latex in the same manner as done by hand in the Amazon, so that the rubber is similar to Fine Hand Para.

I am aware that there are at present several machines for coagulating and curing rubber latex that consist of a drum revolving in smoke, but these machines do not "churn" the latex as is done when curing "Find Hand Para."
