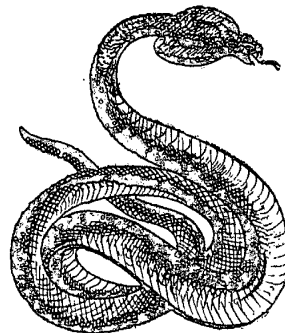

"A Machine for Coagulating and Curing Rubber Latex with smoke."

Abstract :—

The inventor states :—The object of my invention is to cure rubber latex in the same manner as done by hand in the Amazon, so that the rubber is similar to Fine Hand Para.

I am aware that there are at present several machines for coagulating and curing rubber latex that consist of a drum revolving in smoke, but these machines do not "churn" the latex as is done when curing "Fine Hand Para."

The claim is :—

A machine for coagulating and Curing Rubber latex with smoke consisting of a casing with a movable cover within which is mounted a rotatable cylindrical drum with grooved, perforated ridged, corrugated or plain surfaces substantially as described and illustrated which drum dips into a receptacle containing latex substantially as described and illustrated so that when the drum is rotated the latex is "churned" with smoke which is delivered into the casing from a furnace, by the action of the rotating drum substantially as described and illustrated.

"Improvements in or relating to the Locking Devices of Loose Leaf Ledgers and similar Volumes."

Abstract.—Relates to a loose-leaf binder of the class having a removable locking-post and, in close proximity thereto, a stud or button to release the rack gear, which controls the telescopic action of the posts. The head of the locking-post, which is put into place by a movement that depresses it and gives it a partial rotation, is provided with a wing piece which is brought under the button as the locking-post is rotated during locking, thus preventing the depression of the button until the locking post is unlocked and rotated.

The claim is :—

In a loose leaf ledger or similar volume having a removable locking post and a stud or button serving to release the rack gear, means on the head of the locking post for preventing the depression of the button or stud substantially as and for the purpose hereinabove described and as illustrated in the accompanying drawings.
