#### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, July 16, 1913.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated July 10, 1913.

*Present* :—Mr. E. B. Alexander, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; Major A. W. de Wilton; the Hon. Mr. R. S. Templeton; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. David Rockwood; Mr. A. J. Martin; Dr. D. P. Banajee; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; Mr. T. Lease; Dr. G. J. Rutherford; and Mr. T. H. Chapman.

The Minutes of the Special Meeting and General Meeting of June 27, 1913, and of the Adjourned General Meeting of June 30, 1913, having been printed, and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved, that the Minutes of the Special Meeting and General Meeting of June 27, 1913, and of the Adjourned General Meeting of June 30, 1913, be confirmed.

2 and 3. The following question and motion which stood in the name of Mr. E. G. Jayewardene was withdrawn with the consent of the Council:—

Mr. E. G. Jayewardene to ask the Chairman— (2) Whether he is aware of the fact that, when more land is acquired by the Council for the widening of any road or street than is actually required for such widening, the owner of the remaining portion of the land so acquired is deprived of access to the road over the portion of land found to be unnecessary for such widening by the erection of hoardings and fences; and, if so—

(3) To move that some relief be given to such owners by the re-sale to them of such superfluous land or by affording a right of way and access to the road over such land.

4, 5, and 6. Pursuant to notice Mr. H. L. de Mel moved—

For a return showing the number of meters in Colombo with the quantity of water supplied through them per mensem, and the charges made therefore under the following heads for 1912:—

- (a) Shipping purposes.
- (b) Trade purposes, other than above.
- (c) Private use other than domestic.
- (d) Government and Railway in excess of stipulated quantity.

- (5) For a return showing the value of pipes and other material imported by the Council for improvement of the Colombo Waterworks during the last three years, together with the amount paid on them as Customs Duty, Port Dues, &c.
- (6) For a return giving the public streets with their respective lengths where water mains have not been laid, more particularly in the eastward extension and Wellawatta. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.

The information was laid on the table. The Chairman agreed that it should be printed and circulated for the information of the members.

7, 8, and 9. The following Extracts from the Standing Committees on Sanitation and Markets of July 9, 1913, on Finance of July 11, 1913, and on Municipal Works of July 11, 1913, were brought before Council, having been previously printed and circulated:—

- (4) Pig nuisance: Proposed by-laws.—Recommended.

*Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Finance of July 11, 1913.*

- (3) To sanction the cancellation of the contract for the supply of grass to the conservancy depôt at Narahenpitiya.—Recommended.

- (4) Balance on Estimates: To sanction a re-vote of Rs. 10,000 on account of refuse destructor.—Recommended.

- (5) Papers in connection with water supply to Police Training School, Mount Lavinia, and Clerks' quarters, Angulana.

Recommended that the necessary water supply should be given to Government at the rate of Re. 1 per 1,000 gallons, in accordance with regulation 33 of the regulations under the Waterworks Ordinance, No. 18 of 1907, and on the further conditions recommended by the Waterworks Engineer. Mr. H. L. de Mel dissenting.

- (7) Application for bonus from Mr. K. V. Silva of the Public Health Department. Recommended a bonus of Rs. 50.

- (9) To sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 818.75 on account of caretaker's bungalow and cooly lines at Elie House reservoir.—Recommended.

- (10) Proposal to appoint Mr. P. H. Lanaway to the post of Superintendent, Fire Brigade, *vice* Mr. L. A. B. Peile, deceased, and to write to Superintendent, London Fire Brigade, to select a man for the post of Assistant Superintendent.

Recommended that Mr. P. H. Lanaway should be appointed on the initial salary of the Superintendent, and that the Chairman should write at once to the Superintendent of the London Fire Brigade.

*Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Municipal Works of July 11, 1913.*

- (2) Discontinuance of the services of Mr. P. J. Fernando, Draughtsman, Works Department. Recommended that he should be given one month's pay as a gratuity.

- (3) Supplementary estimate for additions to cemetery-keeper's quarters, Kanatta, Rs. 1,411.57.—Recommended.

- (4) Application for a tennis court in Campbell park from the Catholic Young Men's Christian Association. Recommended on condition—

(a) That the Catholic Young Men's Christian Association shall make the tennis court and maintain it in proper order.

(b) That no enclosure shall be erected other than fences at the backs of the court to stop the balls.

(c) That a rent of Re. 1 per mensem be paid to the Municipal Council.

(d) That the Council shall have power to resume possession at any time after giving one month's notice and without the payment of any compensation.

- (5) Application from the Director of the Roman Catholic Mission for a cricket pitch and tennis court on the Racquet Court grounds.

Recommended that the Chairman's suggestions should be adopted.

The Chairman moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items 7, 8, and 9 on the agenda. Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.—Carried.

(Council in Committee.)

7. Resolved, that item No. 4 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of July 9, 1913, be adopted, with the following amendments:—

By-law No. 2: That "50 feet" be substituted for "100 feet" in the second line, and that the following words after the word "nuisance" be deleted, *viz.*, "to any one residing in the locality or to any one passing along a street or road over which there is a public right of way."

By-law No. 3: That the words "of the Municipality" after the word "Officer" in the first line be deleted, and the following words substituted: "generally or specially authorized in that behalf by the Chairman or by the Medical Officer of Health."

8. With reference to item No. 5 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Finance, Mr. H. L. de Mel moved—That in the present circumstances the time is not opportune for this Council to commit themselves to any undertaking to supply water to others than the ratepayers. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

Mr. C. P. Dias suggested, as an amendment, that the question of water supply to Government be referred to a Special Committee consisting of the Finance and Works Committees and Mr. T. H. Chapman and Dr. G. J. Rutherford.

After some discussion Mr. H. L. de Mel, with the leave of the Council, withdrew his motion.

The Chairman moved—That the necessary water supply, not exceeding 30,000 gallons a day, be given to Government after the new main pipe line has been laid, at the rate of Re. 1 per 1,000 gallons, in accordance with regulation 33 of the regulations under the Waterworks Ordinance, No. 18 of 1907, and on the further conditions recommended by the Waterworks Engineer. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

On a show of hands being taken the motion was declared carried, 14 voting for and 3 against it, Mr. H. L. de Mel dissenting.

Item No. 10 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Finance of July 11, 1913, was adopted, with the following amendment:—

That Mr. P. H. Lanaway should be appointed to the post of Superintendent, Fire Brigade, on the initial salary and allowances on which Mr. L. A. B. Peile was appointed, and that the Chairman should write at once to the Superintendent of the London Fire Brigade to select a man for the post of Assistant Superintendent.

Resolved, that the remaining items of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Finance of July 11, 1913, be adopted.

9. With reference to item No. 4 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of July 11, 1913, it was resolved that the words "Catholic Young Men's Christian Association" be deleted in paragraph (a) and the words "Borella Catholic Young Men's Society" be substituted instead.

Resolved, that item No. 5 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of July 11, 1913, be deferred.

Resolved, that the remaining items of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of July 11, 1913, be adopted.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do resume, and that the resolutions of Council in Committee be adopted. The Hon. Mr. R. S. Templeton seconded.—Carried, Mr. H. L. de Mel dissenting as in Committee.

10. The proposed By-laws in connection with private markets having been previously printed and circulated, were laid before the Council.

Resolved, that the consideration of the by-laws in question be deferred.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the following items on the agenda, viz., 11 to 14, referring to excess leave granted by the Chairman, be sanctioned. The Hon. Mr. R. S. Templeton seconded.—Carried.

11. To sanction excess leave of 5 days over 30 days granted to Mr. D. M. Don Stephen, Clerk, Works Department.

12. To sanction excess leave of 7 days over 30 days granted to Mr. Stanley Mack, Superintendent, Madampitiya Treatment Works.

13. To sanction excess leave of 2 months and 24 days over 30 days granted to Mr. H. L. Amarasekere, Process Clerk, Municipal Court.

14. To sanction excess leave of 14 days over 30 days granted to Sub-Inspector W. E. Sittampalam of the Public Health Department.

15. The City Analyst's reports on town water for June, 1913, were laid on the table, and the Municipal Bacteriologist's report on town water for the month of May, 1913, having been previously printed and circulated, was also laid on the table.

16. The Progress Report No. 28 of the City Sanitation Engineer for June, 1913, having been previously printed and circulated, was laid on the table.

17. The report of the Chief Resident Engineer of the Colombo Drainage Works for the month of May, 1913, having been previously printed and circulated, was laid on the table.

18. Progress Reports of Works done for June, 1913, were laid on the table.

#### DISSENT.

At the General Meeting of Council on July 16, 1913 (Council in Committee), the following item came up for consideration:—

*Extract of Minutes:* No. "5. Recommended that the necessary water supply should be given to Government at the rate of Re. 1 per 1,000 gallons in accordance with regulation 33 of the regulations under the Waterworks Ordinance, No. 18 of 1907, and on the further conditions recommended by the Waterworks Engineer, Mr. H. L. de Mel dissenting."

The Member for Slave Island moved—"That in the present circumstances it is inopportune for this Council to commit themselves to any undertaking to supply water to others than the ratepayers." The Member for St. Paul's Ward seconded.

After discussion, the Chairman amended the recommendation by deleting the word "necessary" and adding a further condition that the supply be given after completion of the new main pipe line. Whereupon the motion was withdrawn and the recommendation as amended was carried by a majority of the Council.

We beg to dissent from the opinion of the majority for the following reasons.

1. Since taking over the Waterworks in 1908 from Government this Council has expended nearly Rs. 400,000 in laying a new main from Wellampitiya, scraping distribution mains, re-laying mains of greater capacity, &c. The investment having been made with the ratepayers' money, all resulting benefits must accrue to them. There is an annuity of Rs. 100,000 to be paid to Government till the end of year 1924. The consolidated rate was raised from 13½ to 16 in lieu of conservancy being overtaken by the drainage scheme. From January 1, 1913, a special water-rate of 2 per cent. is being levied (in spite of a dissent by 7 elected Members of Council, *vide* Minutes of Council of April 26, 1912, paragraphs 4 and 5 of dissent) with a view to securing to the inhabitants of this city a wholesome and adequate water supply in keeping with its rapid growth.

2. The improvements and extensions referred to above were designed to increase the supply from 4½ millions to 6 millions approximately per diem. A perusal of the monthly reports of the Waterworks Engineer will show that the average daily supply hardly exceeded 5½ millions, while the consumption, which in 1911 was 4½ and 4¼ millions, rose to

5 millions in 1912, and reached in 1913 as much as 5,648,927 daily in the month of June. In 1908 the cost of establishment for the Colombo Waterworks was only Rs. 22,752. The Budget for 1913-14 has provided Rs. 54,314 for establishment alone. Was not all this heavy expenditure sanctioned to improve and preserve an adequate water supply to the ratepayers? Or was it to traffic in water or commercialize the best asset of the ratepayers?

3. In addition to the several items of expenditure above indicated, the Council had to face the following problems, viz., the constant and great increase of population, the extension of limits, the introduction and working of the water-carriage system, the incrustation of pipes due to want of filtration, adequate pressure for protection against fire, increasing demand for trade purposes or metered supplies, &c. To meet these requirements the Council agreed to borrow Rs. 3,000,000 as being absolutely necessary to augment the supply by constructing a new 30-inch main from Labugama to Maligakanda and erecting jewel gravity filters to ensure a daily supply of 8 million gallons to the city; for this purpose Council imposed a special water-rate of 2 per cent., thus raising the consolidated rate to 18 per cent., *vide* Chairman's memorandum of February 19, 1912, and Waterworks Engineer's letter of March 24, 1912, and connected papers.

4. Mr. Macleod, late Chairman of this Council, in his Administration Report for 1910, declared that at least 90 gallons of water per head would be required, but expressed further opinion that with flushing and street watering the consumption would be little short of 35 gallons. This estimate included all requirements for shipping, trades, and purposes other than domestic, and also includes all Government establishments, hospitals, and railways in Colombo. In Madras it has been found that 35 gallons is required; in Bombay 40 gallons, and in Calcutta 48 gallons, the latter being 27 gallons filtered water and 21 gallons unfiltered.

5. But the said Chairman, in common with the Consulting Engineers, have made a serious error in his forecast of the probable population of Colombo, and it is this unexpected increase in population and greater use of water that has caused us anxiety to fear a shortage of supply soon. Mr. Macleod estimates the population of the city in the said Administration Report as follows:—

Let us compare this with the actual facts (Medical Officer of Health's quarterly health reports)—

1911 .. ..	211,204	6,336,120
1913 .. ..	229,953	6,898,590

Thus it would appear that the population already exceeds the number estimated as likely to be reached in 1920, and all the necessary water is now denied to the ratepayers. The supply recently has not only been intermittent, but some parts of the town denied water even in the daytime, while drain flushing and street washing was reduced.

6. The Waterworks Engineer says there will be no appreciable diminishing in the supply to Colombo by giving 30,000 gallons per diem to a point several miles away from Municipal limits—this, in spite of the fact that in June the average supply was 5,577,403 gallons and the average *daily* consumption 5,648,927 gallons, that the Elie House reservoir was empty from April 13 to 23, on May 18, again from June 16 to 30 (*vide* reports dated June 19 and July 10). The Municipal Engineer, however, is of opinion that the supply to Wellawatta will be affected, his chief reason being that the main pipe line through which water will be conducted for about *five miles* to Angulana have been only designed to supply the area *Wellawatta*.

This area is, besides, a large residential area, having several storeyed buildings, and the period of greatest draft is between 6 and 10 A.M., when all residents in South Colombo, as well as the clerks in Angulana and Mount Lavinia, will also require water.

7. The Municipal Engineer further states in his letter of June 18 that, taking the correct population of Colombo and excluding only 1 million gallons for trade and shipping, the increased supply of 8 million gallons after filtration will prove inadequate even at 30 gallons per head. We see no reason to reject the opinion of the Municipal Engineer based on facts and figures, who is not only an experienced officer but is the Chairman's chief technical adviser. We regret the whole matter was not referred to him for report and that report submitted to Council and the ratepaying public.

8. Whether we compute the rate per head even at 25 gallons and neglect flushing and street watering, adequate pressure for five hydrants, we have to face the following facts:—

- (a) On April 26, 1913, the quantity of water at the Maligakanda reservoir was at its lowest, 4,940,914 gallons, 9 feet 6 inches *below* overflow; and at its highest, on April 23, there were only 7,048,283 gallons, 2½ inches *below* overflow.
- (b) The metered supply that month was 34,103,870 gallons, indicating that ratepayers who actually pay cash wanted more water that month, while ratepayers in general were denied lawful use to some extent, and flushing and street watering diminished.
- (c) In April, 1912, water was at its lowest 1 foot 1½ inch *below* overflow (6,841,159 gallons), and at its highest 2½ inches *above* overflow with 7,147,172 gallons, while the metered supply for the month was 31,926,330 gallons.
- (d) In June, 1912, water was at its highest one inch *above* overflow, and lowest 10½ inches *below*, and even then there was 6,897,659, a quantity *above* the average daily consumption, viz., 5,548,878 (the figures for June, 1913, appear in paragraph 6 above).

The above facts clearly show that the demand is increasing, while the city's water supply is totally inadequate to face the emergency of an ordinary hot month, not to speak of "prolonged and severe drought." Should we not have at least three days' supply stored in reserve to meet dry weather or a serious accident on the main pipe line?

9. Granting even for the sake of argument that water mains are supplied throughout the entire habitable and inhabited areas of the city, and each unit consumes only 25 gallons, then the actual population of 229,953 will require 5,748,825 gallons per day. When the metered supply of 1 million is deducted, will not the supply for domestic use be compulsorily diminished by intermittent or insufficient supplies? Is this fair by the ratepayers? Is not the position of the ratepayers likely to be more prejudicially affected by this resolution?

10. We have not made allowances for the extra day population coming in daily to Colombo from the suburbs and other towns. We have not made allowances for the public latrines and baths yet to be built all over the city. (*Vide* City Sanitation Engineer's report dated July 14, 1913—73,000 use 18 public baths and latrines). Have we estimated for water required for Municipal wash houses or private laundries, Tuberculosis Dispensary, and Infectious Diseases Hospitals, Vagrants Home and House of Detention, Cattle Mart, Quarantine Stations, Slaughter House, and Public Markets? What about adequate fire pressure on mains and fixing suitable fire hydrants opposite factories, manufactories, and Bioscope

Shows? (*vide* section 37 of Ordinance No. 18 of 1907). Our street watering and drain flushing is niggardly done owing to insufficiency of water. Is it also not true that our public parks and cemeteries cannot have the necessary water during dry months?

11. This Council has postponed the following owing to the inadequate supply of water, and directly the new filtration and 30-inch main is over, these works must claim precedence over the sale of water to non-ratepayers. Are we to overlook these requirements?

- (a) Motor fire engine (pressure in water mains insufficient as well as hydrants).
- (b) Street watering vans (cannot be used as the filling capacity now of the street hydrants are far too small and pressure weak).
- (c) A third reservoir to the south of Colombo (to ensure rapid circulation and improve the head of water).
- (d) A pressure chamber (to improve a supply of water to the high buildings in the Fort, and to enable the water to reach remote parts of the town and upper floors of buildings).

12. Under the Infectious Diseases Ordinance and plague regulations Government compels ratepayers to close their wells, even when they are used for trade purposes, but the industries and factories are daily advancing, and are we to deprive a large number of our large ratepayers of their acquired rights to have as much water as they need on payment? (22 wells were closed in 1911, while 155 wells were condemned in 1910.)

13. We have reason to believe that there is now an insufficient provision for water in the eastward extension and Wellawatta, that the head of water cannot be restored without a reservoir in the residential areas of the city. The return called for by the Member for Slave Island and laid on the table at this Meeting shows that *eighteen* public streets *over four miles* in length are not served with water mains now. When the numerous people who occupy that area use the city supply instead of well water, will there not be an additional strain which we have failed to consider? We would here quote the Director of Public Works, Mr. Cooper, when the question of the southern outfall was mooted (*vide* his letter of August 18, 1911) in advising the Council to decide upon the adoption of the outfall and treatment works at Dehiwala, he made the following statements:—

- (2) "I presume there is little doubt that in all probability further districts to the south of the present Municipal limits will in time be absorbed within the city boundaries and provision for the adequate supply and distribution of water, and also for the collection and disposal of sewage within such district will demand the *serious consideration of the Council*."
- (3) "In the absence of a contour plan of the country, it is impossible to define even approximately the eastward boundaries that should be adopted in respect of these districts."
- (4) "I advise that Messrs. Mansergh & Sons be requested, in the preparation of such plans and estimates, to consider the probability of the Municipal limits being in the further extended as far as Mount Lavinia on the south and advise as to the eastern boundary that should be adopted in connection with such extension, having due regard to the efficient and economical collection and treatment of the sewage within the extended area."

Have we not completely overlooked such a question and its attendant responsibilities? Should we not expect Government to improve all those rural suburban areas under the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinances? Can we undertake to include such areas in their present condition in the absence of an improvement trust?

14. With grave questions such as readjustment of taxation, raising of rates before us, we must exercise the greatest care, diligence, and forethought in dealing with our Waterworks, which at present gives a *very good return*. Such savings must be earmarked for improvements for the city's need. (*Vide* letter No. 263 of September 12, 1912, from the Medical Officer of Health to the Chairman, where scraping of the other 20-inch main is foreshadowed by the Bacteriologist.)

15. When the filtration and 30-inch main augment the daily supply to 8 millions, the first duty of the Council and its executive officers is to ensure the fulfilment of the following essential requirements:—

- (1) The supply of all consumers with an adequate quantity of water continuously throughout the day.
- (2) The maintenance of a sufficient pressure throughout the distribution system.
- (3) Perfect and rapid circulation of water throughout the entire system.
- (4) Reasonable protection against fire.
- (5) Means of detecting and stopping waste in a systematic manner.

16. The expenditure of surplus revenue on current works is to secure immediate results, while the binding of posterity with the repayment of a Rs. 3,000,000 loan would insist that we hand over to our successors a thoroughly efficient and effective work capable of being reproductive; otherwise it is bad principle and bad finance.

17. The section No. 13 of the Waterworks Ordinance precludes the sale of water after filtration to any who are not ratepayers, save those specially provided in sections 8, 9, and 21 of the said Ordinance.

Where a loan is raised to defray the cost of work (in this instance to improve water supply) it is subject to repayment over a period of years (about 20 in this case). The object aimed at should be to procure at that cost an adequate supply to be sufficient for that period, viz., up to year 1933.

From facts above it is more likely that after 1916 the supply will prove inadequate. Should we bind our successors in this manner? We do not think so.

*The Conditions recommended by the Waterworks Engineer referred to in item No. 8 of the Minutes of the General Meeting of July 16, 1913.*

- (a) That the supply be registered by a meter, which shall be supplied and maintained by the Municipal Council, and for which Government will pay rent.
- (b) That the price of water shall be at the rate of Re. 1 per thousand gallons.
- (c) That all mains, fittings, &c., shall be in accordance with the Waterworks regulations.
- (d) That no service shall be granted to any premises other than those referred to in the Director of Public Works' letter No. 457 of April 21, 1913, without the sanction of the Municipal Council being obtained.
- (e) That the Municipal Council shall have the right to cut off the supply after reasonable notice in case the city's supply is endangered by continued drought or other unavoidable causes.
- (f) That the Municipal Council shall not be liable for any damages or penalty owing to failure on their part to supply water, if such failure is due to unusual drought or to any temporary interference to the supply caused by carrying out any work or to any other unavoidable cause or accident.

## MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, August 9, 1913.

THE Council met this day at 2 P.M., pursuant to notice dated August 4, 1913.

Present.—The Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, Chairman; Mr. D. W. Subesingha; Dr. C. B. Lourensz; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. G. E. Abeywardena; and Mr. A. H. F. Clarke.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on July 12, 1913, a copy of which was sent to each Member, were taken as read.

Resolved, that the Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on July 12, 1913, be confirmed.

2. Extract from Minutes of Meeting of Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of July 12, 1913, *re* rates of sale of beef and mutton in Municipal and private markets.—Deferred.3. Papers *re* revised by-laws.

Resolved, that the explanation of the Council's Lawyer, dated August 7, 1913, be circulated and brought up at the next Meeting.

4. Letter No. 9 dated July 24, 1913, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, with copy of report by Major S. P. James, I.M.S., on the Stegomyia Survey of Galle town.

Resolved, that the Medical Officer of Health be requested to report on the subject, especially as regards the passages marked by the Chairman, and that the matter be again brought up at the next meeting of Council.

5. The Council decided to accord a suitable welcome to Galle to His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, and voted a sum of Rs. 750 for the purpose. The drafting of the address and other details were left in the hands of the Chairman.

6. Second interim report of the Special Committee re-appointed on January 11, 1913, to ascertain and report on an improved system of lighting the town.

Mr. G. E. Abeywardena moved that the report be adopted. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.—Carried unanimously.

7. The Chairman with the permission of Council brought up the report of the Special Committee appointed on July 12, 1913, to consider the desirability of rescinding rules 30, 31, and 32, Chapter VI. of the by-laws, and to report on the steps to be taken to recoup the Municipality for the loss.

Mr. G. E. Abeywardena moved that the report be adopted. Dr. C. B. Lourensz seconded.—Carried unanimously.
