HEREAS by section 11 of "The Road Ordinance, 1861," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to alter and vary any district or division into which this Colony has already been divided under the authority of the Ordinance No. 8 of 1848, or into whigh it may at any time hereafter be divided, for the purposes of the said Road Ordinance of 1861 aforesaid: Provided that any such alteration of a district shall take effect only from January 1 thence next ensuing:

And whereas it is expedient to alter and vary the District of Anuradhapura, the limits whereof are the limits of the North-Central Province:

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter and vary the District of Anuradhapura aforesaid as at present exeting, and declare that the said district, or the North-Central Province, shall from and after January 1, 1914, be, for the purposes of "The Road Ordinance, 1861," aforesaid, as in the schedule hereto set forth and defined.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Fourteenth day of October, in the Year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Thirteen.

"THE CEYLON RAILWAY ORDINANCE, No. 9 OF 1902."

T is hereby notified that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, in exercise of the power vested in him by section 5 of the above-mentioned Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to revoke clause 11 (d), sub-section (2), of the rules relating to the conveyance of traffic by passenger trains, published by Notification dated October 11, 1907, and to substitute therefor the following amended clause, with effect from October 20, 1913:—

11. (d) (2) Applications.—Applications for berths must be made not later than 6.30 r.m. at any station on the line, but payment will not be accepted nor the accommodation promised until it has been ascertained that the required berths are available.

Application for upper or lower berths or berths in any particular part of the car will be attended to as far as possible, but all allocations will be made in the order in which the applications are received. No berth will be booked for a station at which the train is not regularly timed to stop, except where the time tables show that it will "call when required." Only one sleeping car is run on each train, except on special occasions, but should there be a demand for six or more extra berths, a second car will be provided if possible.

Should a sleeping berth be allotted in response to an application, the fee (Rs. 2 50) must be paid whether the berth is occupied or not, unless notice is given, twelve hours before the departure time of the train, cancelling the booking.

"THE LOCAL BOARDS ORDINANCE, 1889."

T is hereby notified that the following by-laws made by the Local Board of Minuwangoda, under and in pursuance of section 56 (5) of Ordinance No. 13 of 1898, have been confirmed by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, and are hereby published.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. No person shall keep a bakery without a license from the Chairman of the Local Board.

Every room in a bakery used (a) for kneading of dough or preparation of bread and (b) for baking of bread, or for either of these purposes, shall be well ventilated and well lighted, and the walls thereof plastered with cement, and the floor cemented throughout, and proper drainage provided; a ceiling shall also be provided when so ordered by the Chairman.

No bakery or place used for the sale of bread shall be within 30 feet of any

cesspit, latrine, or open sewer.

No room in a bakery used (a) for kneading of dough or preparation of bread and (b) for baking of bread, or for either of these purposes, shall be used as a dwelling place or for any purpose other than the preparation and baking of bread.

5. All utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to a bakery or place used for the sale of bread shall be kept scrupulously clean, and the tops of all tables are to be made of closely fitting planks free from holes and crevices.

6. All refuse and dirt in or about the premises of a bakery or place used for the

sale of bread shall be removed without delay and the drains kept well flushed.

7. All bread, cakes, or sweetmeats kept or exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed glass cases free from flies. The glass cases shall be kept scrupulously clean.

8. No person suffering from any cutaneous, contagious, or infectious disease, or who has recently been in attendance on any such person, or who is otherwise unclean, shall be employed in or about any place used as a bakery or for selling bread.

9. All persons employed in the preparation and baking of bread shall wear clean white aprons covering the chest and the body.

10. It shall be lawful for the Local Board Inspectors, supervisiors, or other persons authorized in writing by the Chairman at any time to enter and inspect any bakery or place used for the sale of bread, provided that there is some one on the premises.

11. Copies of the above by-laws in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil must be hung

up in a conspicuous place in every bakery.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

No person shall keep a bakery without a license from the Chairman of the Local Board.

2. Every room in a bakery used (a) for kneeding of dough or preparation of bread and (b) for baking of bread, or for either of these purposes, shall be well ventilated and well lighted, and the walls thereof plastered with cement, and the floor cemented throughout, and the proper drainage provided; a ceiling shall also be provided when so ordered by the Chairman.

No bakery or place used for the sale of bread shall be within 30 feet of any

cesspit, latrine, or open sewer.

No room in a bakery used (a) for kneading of dough or preparation of bread and (b) for baking of bread, or for either of these purposes, shall be used as a dwelling place or for any purpose other than the preparation and baking of bread.

All utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to a bakery or place used for the sale of bread shall be kept scrupulously clean, and the tops of all tables are to be made of closely fitting planks free from holes and crevices

All refuse and dirt in or about the premises of a bakery or place used for the sale of bread shall be removed without delay and the drains kept well flushed.

7. All bread, cakes, or sweetmeats kept or exposed for sale shall be kept in operly constructed glass cases free from flies. The glass cases shall be kept properly constructed glass cases free from flies. scrupulously clean.

8. No person suffering from any cutaneous, contagious, or infectious disease, or who has recently been in attendance on any such person, or who is otherwise unclean, shall be employed in or about any place used as a bakery or for selling bread.

All persons employed in the preparation and baking of bread shall wear clean white aprons covering the chest and the body

10. It shall be lawful for the Local Board Inspectors, supervisiors, or other persons authorized in writing by the Chairman at any time to enter and inspect any bakery or place used for the sale of bread, provided that there is some one on the premises.

Copiés of the above by-laws in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil must be hung

up in a conspicuous place in every bakery.

"THE REGISTRARS' PROCEEDINGS VALIDATION ORDINANCE, No. 3 of 1912."

An Order for the purpose of giving validity to certain Marriages registered in the Eastern Province under Ordinance No. 8 of 1886.

THEREAS by section 3 of the above-named Ordinance, it is enacted that "where, whether before or after the passing of this Ordinance-

(a) Any registration of a birth, death, marriage, or document, or any other matter which is by law required or authorized to be registered; or

(b) Any proceeding taken or purporting to be taken by or before a Registrar by virtue of his officeis invalidated by reason of any informality, mistake, or accidental omission, whether relating to the appointment of the Registrar, or the limits of his jurisdiction, or the manner in which the registration or proceeding was made or taken, or any other incidental circumstance, and no other means are by law provided by which the registration or proceeding may be validated, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Executive Council, by order in Council notified in the Government Gazette, to give directions for the correction of the mistake, informality, or omission, and to make

any other order that may be necessary for the purpose of giving validity to the registration or proceeding": And whereas the registrations, specified in the schedule hereto, of Muhammadan marriages registered by Mukammatu Kasim Levvai, who was appointed by the Provincial Registrar of the Eastern Province in December, 1889, are invalidated by reason of the omission set forth in the said schedule, and no other means are by law provided for the validation of the said registrations:

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, in exercise of the power vested in Us as aforesaid, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order and direct as follows:—

That all registrations of Muhammadan marriages made by the said Levvai between 1890 and the date of this order are to be as valid and effectual for all purposes as if the license required by section 4 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1886 had actually issued when he was first appointed.

Translation.

Ordinance of the Governor-General of the Netherland East Indies of May 15, 1913, providing for the Control by an Expert of Tea Seeds imported into the Netherland East Indies.

In the Name of the Queen.

The Governor-General of the Netherland East Indies, &c., considering it necessary to subject the import of tea seeds into the Netherland East Indies to restrictive provisions, in order to prevent as far as possible the conveyance of plant diseases and injurious influences on existing tea plantations, &c.

Article 1.

(1) It is forbidden to import tea seeds into the Netherland East Indies without these having been previously approved by an expert to be designated by the Director of Agriculture, Industry, and Trade, and a permit to import them having been issued by that expert.

(2) The objects or the materials which are or have been used for packing the seeds shall also be subject to this prohibition.

(3) The examination shall take place exclusively at Tandjoengprick.

(4) For special reasons the Director of Agriculture, Industry, and Trade may permit the importation at other places without the examination and permit referred to in the first paragraph of this Article.

Article 2.

(1) The importer shall be bound to give immediate notice in writing of the arrival of a consignment of tea seeds to the Director of Agriculture, Industry, and Trade, who shall order an examination as to the condition and quality of the seeds to be instituted as soon as possible by the expert referred to in the first paragraph of Article 1.

(2) At that examination the expert shall take precautions to prevent the infection of tea seeds by other tea seeds. in the vicinity of the place where the examination is held.

ت

Article 3.

(1) The expert may refuse to issue a permit to import tea seeds-

(a) If a certificate issued in the country of origin proving that the seeds were in a good condition at the time of delivery in that country cannot be produced.

(b) If in the opinion of the said expert the importer cannot supply sufficient information respecting the gardens

from which the seeds have come.

(c) If the importer is unwilling to cede for the requisite examination at most one hundred seeds of every case or other package of seeds whether free of cost or against payment of the invoice value.

(d) If in his opinion the seeds are in such a condition or of such a quality as to be considered likely to cause injury

to existing tea plantations on being planted.

(2) The Director of Agriculture, Industry, and Trade shall determine by whom the certificates referred to in

sub-section (a) of the first paragraph of this Article must be issued.

(3) Seeds for which no permit to import them is issued shall, unless they are conveyed by first opportunity beyond the Netherland East Indies, be destroyed at the expense of the importer in the manner to be indicated by the expert without the importer being able to claim any compensation.

Article 4.

(1) The expert shall have the power to order that seeds which are suspected of being infected shall be disinfected before being imported.

(2) This disinfection shall take place by the State at the expense of the importer without the Netherland East Indies being responsible for the consequences.

Article 5.

(1) The permit prescribed in the first paragraph of Article 1 shall be produced by the persons interested when

lodging at Tandjoengprick declarations for importation for consumption.

(2) This permit shall likewise be produced when making declarations for the despatch (of tea seed) to a place within the Customs area, or for (its) conveyance in transit to a place outside the Customs area, but within the Netherland East Indies, unless, on the ground of the fourth paragraph of Article 1, the Director of Agriculture, Industry, and Trade shall have determined that the importation at other places may take place without an examination.

Article 6.

(1) The importation of tea seeds contrary to the provisions of Article 1 shall be punished with a fine not exceeding 1,000 florins

(2) The destruction of seeds and packing may be ordered in the sentence, even in the case of acquittal.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 11, 1913.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 124 (3 Europeans, 11 Burghers, 48 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 29 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1913, viz., 235,829) was 27.4, as against 29.4 in the preceding week, 23.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23.0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 123 (3 Europeans, 12 Burghers, 56 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 18 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Other). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27·2, as against 25·6 in the previous week, 28·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·5 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 123 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 23 in the preceding week, 22 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Selected Causes of Death.—Fourteen deaths were registered from Pneumonia (as in the previous week, against 17 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in New Bazaar, 3 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 in Pettah. Eight deaths were registered from Bronchitis.

- 2. Six deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 16 in the previous week, and 14 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, Kotahena, and Maradana hospitals.
- 3. Five deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 3 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 were in Wellawatta, and 1 each in Pettah, Kotahena, and New Bazaar. There were 4 cases reported during the week, against 7 in the previous week.
- 4. Eleven deaths were registered from Enteritis, 10 from Infantile Convulsions, 8 from Senility, 4 from Worms, 4 from Debility, 4 from Prematurity, 3 from Diarrhæa, 3 from Marasmus, 3 from Heart Disease, 3 from Puerperal Septicæmia, 2 from Accidental Drowning, 1 from Dysentery, and 31 from Other Causes.
- 5. Three deaths were registered from *Cholera*, against 2 in the previous week, of which 2 were in New Bazaar and 1 in Kotahena. Seven cases of cholera were reported during the week, against 1 in the previous week.
- 6. Two cases of *Measles* were reported, against 1 in the previous week; and 3 of *Chickenpox*, as in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79·2°, against 80·9° in the preceding week and 80·6 in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·878 in., against 29·867 in. in the preceding week and 29·855 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1·47 in., against 2·51 in. in the preceding week and 2·78 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
