### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency REGINALD EDWARD STUBBS, Esquire, Officer Administering the Government of the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated February 28, 1900, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, divided the Kandyan Provinces enumerated in Schedule B to the Ordinance No. 3 of 1870 into the districts set forth in the schedule thereto:

And whereas it is expedient to alter and amend the said districts as specified in the schedule hereto:

Now know Ye that We, the said Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this Our Proclamation, alter and amend, with effect from January 1, 1914, the districts specified in the first column of the annexed schedule in the manner specified in the second column thereof.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Sixteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Thirteen.

12. (g) Wherever "wagons" are mentioned in these rules, it is understood that four-wheeled wagons are referred to. An eight-wheeled wagon is reckoned as follows:—

Capacity less than 30 tons: as two four-wheeled wagons.

Capacity 30 tons and over: as three four-wheeled wagons.

23. *Demurrage on Wagons.*—(a) Consignors ordering wagons and not loading them will be liable to a demurrage charge of Rs. 4 per wagon for each day or portion of a day until notice is given that the wagon or wagons will not be required.

(b) In the event of consignors who have ordered and loaded wagons failing to furnish consignment notes on the day on which such wagons are loaded, they will be liable to a demurrage charge of Rs. 4 per wagon for every day or portion of a day they are detained beyond the day of loading.

(c) All wagons containing articles which the Railway does not undertake to unload, and which are not discharged within twenty-four hours after their arrival at the station of delivery, will be liable to a demurrage charge of Rs. 4 per wagon for each day or portion of a day (exclusive of Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday), and no concession will be made (as shown in clause 22) on account of distance. If the goods arrive at the station of delivery between 5 P.M. and 7 A.M., the latter hour will, for the calculation of the twenty-four hours, be considered the hour of arrival.

(d) The Government does not undertake to provide warehouse accommodation for goods of the sixth class, or bulky or heavy articles (as defined in clause 39), nor does it undertake to unload such goods, or permit them to be unloaded, until the consignee has supplied carts or other conveyances into which the goods can be at once transferred, and if delivery is not taken within twenty-four hours after their arrival at the station of delivery, a demurrage charge of Rs. 4 per wagon for each day or portion of a day (exclusive of Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday) will be made.

(e) The Government, however, reserve to themselves the right of unloading wagons containing sixth class goods or bulky or heavy articles at any time after arrival, and in such cases warehouse rent or wharfage (as the case may be) will be charged in accordance with the conditions of clauses 22 or 24.

(f) The conditions regarding demurrage on dangerous goods are shown in clause 46 (h).

(g) The demurrage charges for eight-wheeled wagons shall be as follows:—

## VITAL STATISTICS.

## Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 18, 1913.

*Births.*—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 103 (2 Europeans, 11 Burghers, 53 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 16 Moors, 4 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1913, viz., 235,829) was 22·8, as against 27·4 in the preceding week, 20·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23·0 the weekly average for last year.

*Deaths.*—The total deaths registered were 114 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 57 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 20 Moors, 3 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 25·2, as against 27·2 in the previous week, 25·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·5 the weekly average of last year.

*Infantile Deaths.*—Of the 114 total deaths, 25 were of infants under one year of age, as against 31 in the preceding week, 29 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average of last year.

*Stillbirths.*—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 3.

*Selected Causes of Death.*—Fourteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 6 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Maradana hospitals, 4 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 in San Sebastian, 1 in Pettah, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta.

2. Twelve deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 14 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in Kotahena, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in Maradana hospitals, 1 in Slave Island, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta. Five deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

3. Five deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (as in the previous week and the weekly average for last year), of which 2 were in Maradana hospitals, 2 in Wellawatta, and 1 in Kotahena. There were 4 cases reported during the week, as in the previous week.

4. Twelve deaths were registered from *Enteritis*, 8 from *Debility*, 6 from *Dysentery*, 6 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 6 from *Senility*, 2 from *Worms*, 2 from *Tetanus*, 2 from *Accidents*, 1 from *Diarrhæa*, and 25 from *Other Causes*.

5. Eight deaths were registered from *Cholera* (against 3 in the previous week), of which 6 were in New Bazaar and 2 in Kotahena. Twenty-seven cases of cholera were reported during the week, against 7 in the previous week.

6. One case of *Measles* was reported, against 2 in the previous week; and 5 of *Chickenpox*, against 3 in the previous week.

*State of the Weather.*—The mean temperature of air was 80·6°, against 79·2° in the preceding week. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·874 in., against 29·878 in. in the preceding week and 29·815 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·94 in., against 1·47 in. in the preceding week and 9·19 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
