T is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance of section 24 of "The Village Communities Ordinance, 1889," and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the imposition of a toll from January 1, 1914, by the inhabitants of the subdivision Beruwala-Alutgama, in the Chief Headman's division of Kalutara totamune, at the ferry of Badanagoda-ela, between Badanagoda and Heralatuduwa, on the Deenagoda-Badanagoda Village Committee road, and of the levy of the same rate of charges as those leviable under the provisions of "The Tolls Ordinances of 1896 and 1905."

"THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE, 1889."

T is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance of section 24 of "The Village Communities Ordinance, 1889," and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the imposition of a toll from January 1, 1914, by the inhabitants of the subdivisions of Munwattebage pattu and Wadduwa-Waskaduwa, in the Chief Headmen's divisions of Rayigam korale and Panadure totamune, respectively, at the ferry of Keppu-ela, between Paragastota and Gonaduwa, on the Paragastota-Gonaduwa Village Committee road, and of the levy of the same rate of charges as those leviable under the provisions of "The Tolls Ordinances of 1896 and 1905."

R. E. STUBBS, Colonial Secretary. IT is hereby notified for public information that six free courses of tuition of three months each will be given annually, at the expense of the Government of Ceylon, at the London School of Tropical Medicine.

- 2. These courses will be available (a) for officers already in the Medical Service of the Government of Ceylon, (b) for candidates nominated to appointments in the Medical Service of the Government of Ceylon, and (c) in default of sufficient applications from Government officers in any one year, for private medical practitioners residing in the Island.
- 3. The cost of board and lodging will be defrayed by Government in the case of an officer in class (a) or (b), provided that he either resides in the school or in quarters found for him by the school. The amount so paid will be limited to the rates charged by the school for board and lodging.
- 4. The officer must sign a bond with the Crown Agents to the effect that he will refund all charges for board and lodging, and also a sum of £16 in respect of his tuition, if he fails at the end of the three months' course to obtain the school certificate, or if on obtaining it he fails to assume or resume his post, or if he leaves the service of Government, except on the ground of ill-health, within three years of his assumption of or return to duty.
- 5. A doctor who obtains an appointment under the Government of Ceylon within three months of taking the course at the school may apply for a refund of his tuition fees, provided that one of the free courses for the year in which he attended the school was unused.
- 6. In the case of a doctor not in the employment of, or not nominated for employment under, the Government of Ceylon being granted a free course of tuition, he will defray the expenses of his board and lodging. He must, however, execute a bond with the Crown Agents undertaking to refund the sum of £16 in respect of his tuition if at the end of his three months' course he fails to obtain the school certificate, or if on obtaining it he fails to return to Ceylon within a period of three years from the last date on which he attended the course of free tuition.
- 7. There are three School Sessions yearly of three months each, viz., from January 15 to April 14, May 1 to July 31, and October 1 to December 31, inclusive.
- 8. The Notification dated January 29, 1906, published in Government Gazette No. 6,102 of February 2, 1906, is hereby cancelled.

By-laws referred to.

- 1. (a) The owner or occupier of any land suffering or permitting any opened coconuts or opened tins to lie exposed on it shall be guilty of an offence.
- (b) Any person who throws, lays down, or deposits any opened coconut or any opened tin on any public land shall be guilty of an offence.
- 2. Any person blocking or damming any stream, drain, or canal shall be guilty of an offence.

The timber must be felled and removed within four months of the acceptance of the tender, and any timber left unremoved within this period will revert to the Crown.

- 4. One-half of the purchase amount should be paid within ten days of the acceptance of the tender, and the balance before a removal permit is issued after the trees have been felled.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 1, 1913.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 117 (0 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 73 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 19 Moors, 1 Malay, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1913, viz., 235,829) was 25.9, as against 25.6 in the preceding week, 28.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23.0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 126 (0 Europeans, 4 Burghers, 58 Sinhalese, 34 Tamils, 21 Moors, 3 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27.9, as against 26.3 in the previous week, 25.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 126 total deaths, 35 were of infants under one year of age, as against 33 in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Selected Causes of Death.—Seventeen deaths were registered from Pneumonia (against 15 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 in Pettah, 2 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in San Sebastian and Wellawatta. Three deaths were registered from Bronchitis.

- 2. Eleven deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 9 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 each in New Bazaar and Maradana hospitals, and 1 each in Kotahena, Slave Island, and Wellawatta.
- 3. Two deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever*, against nil in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year, of which 1 was in New Bazaar and the other in Maradana hospitals.
- 4. Fourteen deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 14 from Debility, 9 from Sentity, 7 from Enterities. 3 from Dysentery, 3 from Worms, 3 from Marasmus, 3 from Nephritis, 2 from Cirrhosis of the Liver, 1 from Tetanus, 1 from an Accidental Kick at Football, and 22 from Other Causes.
- 5. Eleven deaths were registered from *Cholera*, against 4 in the previous week, of which 6 were in Kotahena, 4 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals). Four cases of *Cholera* were reported during the week against 5 in the previous week.
 - 6. Thirteen cases of Chickenpox were reported, against 6 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.7°, against 80.3° in the preceding week and 79.6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.821 in., against 29.896 in. in the preceding week and 29.858 in in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.24 in., against 1.33 in. in the preceding week and 1.90 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
