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VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 6, 1913.

.Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 122 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 64 Sinhalese, 13 Tamils, 26 Moors, 8 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1913, viz., 235,829) was 27.0, as against 24.5 in the preceding week, 24.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23.0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 170 (0 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 86 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 33 Moors, 4 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 37 6, as against 30 9 in the previous week, 29 9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29 5 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths. Of the 170 total deaths, 53 were of infants under one year of age, as against 43 in the preceding week, 29 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 4.

Principal Causes of Death.—Twenty deaths were registered from Phthisis (against 9 in the previous week and 14. the weekly average for last year), of which 6 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 5 in Maradana hospitals, 2 each in Pettah, Sın Sebastian, and St. Paul's, and 1 each in Kotahena, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta.

2. Eighteen deaths were registered from Pneumonia (against 16 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 each were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals) and Wellawatta, 2 each in Kotahena, New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Pettah and St. Paul's. Twelve deaths were registered from Bronchitis.

3. Two deaths were registered from Enteric Fever, 1 in Kotahena and the other in Wellawatta (against nil in the

previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year).

4. Twenty-two deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 12 from Debility, 10 from Enteritis, 10 from Senility, 7 from Dysentery, 6 from Prematurity, 4 from Diarrhæa, 3 from Worms, 1 from Tetanus, 2 from Accidents due to a burn and nail prick respectively, and 35 from Other Causes.

5. Sixth deaths were registered from Cholera (against 3 in the previous week), of which 3 were in New Bazaar, 2 in Kotahena, and 1 in St. Paul's. Eleven cases of Cholera were reported during the week, against 5 in the previous week.

6. No cases of Measles were reported during the week. There were 3 in the previous week. Six cases of

Chickenpox were reported, as in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·2°, as in the preceding week, and 78·6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·858 in., against 29·826 in. in the preceding week and 29 908 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 4 17 in., against 7.50 in. in the preceding week and 2.59 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
