BY-LAW REFERRED TO.

XII.—Enclosing Private Lands with Walls or Fences.

48. Every owner or occupier of any house, garden, building, or land within the limits of the Local Board, Chilaw, shall keep such house, garden, building, or land surrounded with a wall or good fence: Provided always that each owner or occupier of adjoining lands which shall require to be fenced or walled under the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to make and keep in repair one-half of such fence or wall except where by any law or custom such liability shall be otherwise determined.

48. හලාවත නගරයතුළ නිවෙන්නාවූ කොසියම් ඇත්තෙක්වත්, පදිංචිකාරයෙක්වත්, ඔහුට අයිතිය නිවෙන්නාවූ ගෙයක්, වත්තක්, ගොඩනැගීමක්, එක්කෝ ඉඩත්කැබලිලකට, හරිආකාර වටවට තාප්ප තිබි නිවසක්, එසේනැත්නම් ගොදුට වැට අභුරවාතවත්වත් ඕනෑම. මෙපණක්නොව මෙම ඉඩම්වලට යාව නිවෙත ඉඩම්වල වැටකට බැන්දීම හෝ තාප්පතිබීම, ඉඩම අයිති එක ඇත්තා එක්කෝ පදිංචිකාරයා, සමග කරවීම සිරිත්ලෙසට පැවතී එනම්, එසේ එක්එක්කොට ඔහුඔහුන්ගේ හරි දෙකෙන් කොටසට වැට හෝ, තාප්පතිබීම තිස්සක් වන්නේය. මෙම අන්දමේ පනතක් හෝ සිරිතක් තැනුව නිවෙත්ව යෙදුනොත් පෙරකී නිසස වෙත අනුකූලව තීන්දුකරනු ලැබෙයි.

48. சலாபத்து சிர் திருத்தச்சகாக எல்கைக்குள்ளிருக்கும் காணியை, தோட்டத்தை, வீட்டை உடையவன் அல்லது அதில் குடியிருப்பவன் ஒவ்வொருவனும் தன் தன் காணியை, தோட்டத்தை, வீட்டை அல்லது நிலத்தை சுற்றிவர நல்ல ஒரு வேலியை அல்லது சுவரை போடவேண்டியது கடமை. ஆனால் இந்த உபசட்டத்தின்படி பளு துபார்க்கவேண்டிய பொதுவேலி யிருக்குமேயானால் அதை இருபக்கத்திலிருக்கும் காணி உடையவர்கள் அரைவாசி அரைவாசியாய் கட்டிமுடிக்க வேண்டும், இதற்கு எதிராக ஊர்வளமை அல்லது வேறுஏதும் கட்டினையிலாமல் இருக்குமேயானால்.

WHEREAS by section 25 of Ordinance No. 23 of 1889 it is enacted that "all rules framed under the provisions of section 13 or 16 shall be transmitted by the Government Agent to the Governor for the approval or disallowance thereof by the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in case such rules shall be approved, notice of such approval shall be given by Proclamation; and the said rules shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and in the district in such manner as to the Government Agent shall seem expedient, and shall thereupon become binding upon all proprietors within the said district, and shall be as legal, valid, and effectual as if the same had been inserted herein:

And whereas the following rules framed under the provisions of section 16 of "The Irrigation and Paddy Cultivation Ordinance, 1889," have been transmitted by the Government Agent of the Central Province to the Governor for the approval or disallowance thereof by the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council":

And whereas it is expedient to proclaim the approval of the said rules under the provisions of the said enactment:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the rules set forth in the Schedule hereto have been duly approved, and they are hereby published for general information.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-ninth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-two.

SCHEDULE.

RULES for the maintenance of the under-mentioned *Ēlas* in Páta Dumbara, in the District of Kandy, and to ensure the regular cultivation and irrigation of the fields thereunder.

- i.—The Udugođa Bandara-*Ēla*.
- ii.—The Teldeniya Wahala-*Ēla*.
- iii.—The Alutwela Wahala-*Ēla*.
- iv.—The Rambukwelle Gama-*Ēla*.

- v.—The Koholanwela-*Ēla*.
- vi.—The Werapitiya Maha-*Ēla*.
- vii.—The Narandande-*Ēla*.

1. The *vel-vidáné* appointed to take charge of each *Ēla* shall be responsible for its proper maintenance by the persons found to keep it in order, for the safe custody of the planks used in the headworks and distributing sluices, for the due cultivation by the owners thereof of the fields thereunder, and for the customary distribution of water thereto. It is also his duty to report forthwith to the *Rafémahatmayá* any injury occasioned to, or any defect noticed in, any of the masonry work along the course of, or connected with, the *Ēla*.

2. Where the *Ēla* passes through land leased by Government to the proprietor of any estate, such portion of the *Ēla* shall be kept in repair by the owner of the estate. The remainder of the *Ēla* shall be kept in repair by the joint labour of all owners of fields irrigated therefrom, in proportion to their respective shares. But whenever any such land ceases to be held on lease and reverts to Government, the portion of the *Ēla* passing through the same shall be maintained in like manner by the joint labour of all the owners of fields irrigated thereby.

3. No land shall be newly *asweddumised* or cleared within one chain of either side of the *Ēla*.

4. *Amunu* and *pota* shall be kept in repair by the joint labour of all owners of fields irrigated by means thereof, in proportion to their respective shares. But where water is used for estate purposes with the sanction of the Village Council, the quota of labour due by the owner of every such estate shall be commuted by the payment of such sum as shall be determined upon by agreement.

5. No new *Ēlawal* shall be made without the sanction of the Village Council.

6. Should water be at any time required to preserve a heap of germinated seed paddy, ready to be sown by any cultivator, the *vel-vidáné* shall allow such supply as may be necessary to be taken for the purpose, provided the turn of other cultivators to draw water from the *Ēla* is not interfered with thereby.

7. The *vel-vidáné* shall distribute water from the *Ēla* in accordance with the details in Schedule A hereto.

8. Should any cultivator neglect to perform any work allotted to him at the time appointed by the *vel-vidáné*, the *vel-vidáné* shall cause such work to be carried out by hired labour; and the expenses so incurred by him shall be advanced out of any fines levied by the Council.

9. All articles handed over to the vel-vidáné to be used in the maintenance of the éla, or for the distribution of water, shall be taken care of by him. And any neglect on his part to duly account for any such articles shall be treated as a breach of rules.

10. The vel-vidáné shall be entitled at each harvest at the threshing-floor, before any of the crop is removed, two lahas of paddy for each péla in extent sown. And no owner or cultivator shall remove any of the crop of any field from the threshing-floor until the vel-vidáné's share on account of such field has been paid.

SCHEDULE A. (SEE RULE No. 7.)

Udugoda Bandára-éla.

For the irrigation of fields in Udugoda, water shall be drawn from the éla night and day, with navat of bambu, as directed according to custom by the vel-vidáné, and as soon as a sufficient quantity of water shall have been drawn the navat shall be blocked up.

The Pallégamayaya shall be allowed to turn on water on the night of the 1st and 2nd days of the month.

The Viharé Muttettuwa shall draw water from a bambu of about three inches in diameter every day and night.

The Udugamayaya shall have water during the nights of the 3rd, 4th, and 5th of the month.

The Hurikaduwe Madige cultivators shall take water on the night of the 6th day of the month.

The Hentale Welyaya of Walala shall draw water on the night of the 7th day of the month.

The Gedarawela Welyaya and Dunukepotayaya shall be allowed to turn on water on the night of the 8th day of the month.

To the Welyayawal of Hurikaduwe Ratakorale water shall be turned on the nights of the 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th days of the month.

The Dambarawela shall have all the water from 6 A.M. to 6 P.M.

All cultivators who are allowed water during the night shall take care that the several navat are blocked up by 6 A.M.

The proprietors of the Ketawalagoda estate shall be allowed to draw water from a bambu three inches in diameter from 6 A.M. to 6 P.M. daily during the year.

Teldeniya Wahala-éla.

The water shall be distributed in the following manner, viz., from 5 A.M. to 4 P.M. to Wahalawela; from 5 P.M. to 7 P.M. to Ulpengewela; from 8 P.M. to 1 A.M. to Teldeniyawela; from 2 A.M. to 5 A.M. to Gankewela.

No water shall be taken to other tracts than those mentioned within the appointed hours. If, however, the owners of a tract, who have their seed paddy ready to be sown on a given day, find deficiency of water in their fields, they may, by consent of the owners of the tract which is by right entitled to the water, or by consent of the vel-vidáné, be allowed some water on application, provided that all the navat are blocked up as soon as a sufficient quantity of water has been drawn, or when the hours appointed for drawing have terminated.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance to amend "The Merchandise Marks Ordinance, 1888."

- Preamble.** **W**HEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Merchandise Marks Ordinance, 1888," hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows :—
- Amendment of Ordinance No. 13 of 1888.** After sub-section (2) of section 3 of the principal Ordinance and before sub-section (3) of the same section, the following sub-section should be inserted and numbered (2*a*), namely:—
- Section 3, as to offences as to trade marks and trade descriptions** "Every person who imports, sells, or exposes for, or has in his possession for sale or any purpose of trade any piece-goods manufactured beyond the limits of the Colony, such as are ordinarily sold by length or by the piece, which have not conspicuously stamped in English numerals on each piece the length thereof in standard yards, or in standard yards and a fraction of such a yard according to the real length of the piece, shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance."
- Section 15, as to prohibition in importation:** **2** In the twelfth line of sub-section (1) of section 15 of the principal Ordinance after the words "or produced" and before the words "are hereby prohibited" shall be inserted the words "and also all piece-goods, such as are ordinarily sold by the length or by the piece which have not conspicuously stamped in English numerals on each piece the length thereof in standard yards, or in standard yards and a fraction of such a yard according to the real length of the piece."
- Short title.** **3** This Ordinance may be cited as "The Merchandise Marks Ordinance, 189," and this Ordinance and the principal Ordinance may be cited collectively as "The Merchandise Marks Ordinances, 1888 and 189."

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE MOCHA TEA COMPANY OF CEYLON, LIMITED.

1. The regulations contained in Table C in the Schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," shall not apply to this Company, which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolutions. The Company may, by special resolution, alter or make provisions instead of, or in addition to, any of the regulations of the Company whether contained or comprised in these Articles or not.

2. The Company shall forthwith, after its incorporation, purchase all that estate called Mocha, situated in Maskeliya, and containing in extent five hundred and eighty-eight acres (588 A.) or thereabouts, for the sum of fourteen thousand pounds (£14,000) sterling, the vendor paying all expenditure on the estate and receiving all crops and produce gathered therefrom up to the thirty-first day of March, 1892.

SHARES.

3. Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing under his hand in such form as the Company from time to time directs.

4. The Directors may from time to time make such calls upon the Shareholders in respect of all moneys unpaid on their shares as the Directors may think fit, and each Shareholder shall be liable to pay the amount of calls so made to the persons and at the time and place appointed by the Directors. TRANSFER OF SHARES.

10. The Company may decline to register any transfer of shares made by a Shareholder who is indebted to them.

11. The fee payable to the Company for the registration of a transfer shall be rupees two and cents fifty.

12. The register of transfers shall be closed during the fourteen days immediately preceding every Ordinary General Meeting of the Company, and at such other times (if any) and for such period as the Directors may from time to time determine, provided always that it shall not be closed for more than thirty days in any year.

13. Subject to the restriction of these Articles any Shareholder may transfer all or any of his shares by instrument in writing. The Directors may decline to register any transfer whatever, and shall not be required to assign any reason for so declining. In the event of the Directors declining to register a transfer, the Shareholders desirous of executing the same or the Directors may convene an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company to resolve whether the said transfer shall be registered or not, and the resolution of such Extraordinary General Meeting shall be absolute.

TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

14. The executors or administrators or heirs of a deceased Shareholder shall be the only persons recognised by the Company as having any title to his share.

15. Any person becoming entitled to a share in consequence of the death, bankruptcy, or insolvency of any Shareholder, or in consequence of the marriage of any female Shareholder, or in any way other than by transfer, may be registered as a Shareholder upon such evidence being produced as may from time to time be required by the Directors.

16. Any person who has become entitled to a share in any way other than by transfer may, instead of being registered himself, elect to have some person to be named by him registered as a holder of such share.

17. The person so becoming entitled shall testify such election by executing to his nominee a transfer of such share.

18. The instrument of transfer shall be presented to the Company accompanied with such evidence as the Directors may require to prove the title of the transferor, and thereupon the Company shall register the transferee as a Shareholder. Provided always that the Directors shall have the right at all times to decline to register such person as aforesaid, and shall not be required to assign any reason for so declining. In the event of the Directors declining to register such person as a holder of such share, they shall, upon the request of such person, convene an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company to resolve whether such transfer shall be registered or not, and the resolution of such meeting shall be absolute.

FORFEITURE OF SHARES.

19. If any Shareholder fails to pay any call on the appointed day, the Company may at any time thereafter, during such time as the call remains unpaid, serve a notice on him requiring him to pay such call, together with any interest that may have accrued by reason of such non-payment.

20. The notice shall name a further day and a place or places, being a place or places at which calls of the Company are usually made payable, on and at which such call is to be paid. It shall also state that in the event of non-payment at the time and place appointed the shares in respect of which such call was made will be liable to be forfeited.

21. If the requisitions of any such notice as aforesaid are not complied with, any share in respect of which such notice has been given may be forfeited by a resolution of the Directors to that effect.

22. Any share so forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be disposed of in such manner as the Directors think fit.

23. Any Shareholder whose shares have been forfeited shall, notwithstanding, be liable to pay to the Company all calls owing upon such shares at the time of the forfeiture.

INCREASE OF CAPITAL.

24. The Directors may, with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, increase its capital by the creation of new shares, of such amounts per share, and in the aggregate as such resolution shall direct; and they shall have power to add to such new shares such an amount of premium as may be considered expedient.

25. Any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered as part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the same provisions in all respects, whether with reference to the payment of calls or the forfeiture of shares on non-payment of calls or otherwise, as if it had been part of the original capital.

BORROWING.

26. The Directors shall have power to borrow money for the purposes of the Company, and for this purpose to grant bonds, promissory notes, bills, debentures, interest warrants, bonds for cash credit, trust deeds, or other documents, to issue letters of credit, and to grant mortgages or other deeds of security over all or any of the Company's lands, property, estate, and assets. Provided that nothing herein contained shall be held to prevent the Directors procuring from time to time, in the usual course of business, such temporary advances on the produce in hand, or in the future to be obtained from the Company's estate or estates as they may find necessary or expedient for the purpose of defraying the expenses of working the said estate or estates, or of extending buildings, machinery, or plantations, or otherwise. GENERAL MEETING.

27. The first General Meeting shall be held at such time not being more than twelve months after the incorporation of the Company and at such place as the Directors may determine.

28. Subsequent General Meetings may be held at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if not so prescribed, then at such place and at such time as soon after the first day of February in each year as the Directors shall determine.

29. The above-named General Meetings shall be called Ordinary Meetings; all other General Meetings shall be called Extraordinary.

30. The Directors may, whenever they think fit—and they shall, upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one-fifth in number of the Shareholders of the Company for the time being, or by any Shareholder or Shareholders holding not less than one-fifth part of the shares of the Company for the time being subscribed for—convene an Extraordinary General Meeting.

31. Any requisition so made by the Shareholder or Shareholders shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, and shall be left at the registered office of the Company.

32. Upon the receipt of such requisition, the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such time and place as they shall think fit, not being more than twenty-one days after the leaving of the requisition; and if they do not proceed to convene the said meeting within twenty-one days after the leaving of the requisition, the requisitioner or requisitionists or any other Shareholder amounting to the required number may himself or themselves convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such time or place as he or they shall think fit.

33. Seven days' notice at least, specifying the place and the hour of meeting, and the purpose for which any meeting is to be held, shall be given by advertisement in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, or in such other manner (if any) as may be prescribed by the Company.

34. Any Shareholder may, on giving not less than ten days' previous notice of any resolution, submit the same to a meeting.

35. Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the registered office of the Company.

36. In order to constitute a meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, there shall be present, either personally or by proxy, three or more Shareholders, and no business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless the requisite quorum be present at the commencement of the business.

37. If within one hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of Shareholders is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of a Shareholder or Shareholders, shall be dissolved. In any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place; and if at such adjourned meeting the required number of Shareholders is not present, those members who are present shall be a quorum, and may transact the business for which the meeting was called.

38. The Chairman (if any) of the Board of Directors shall preside as Chairman at every meeting of the Company.

39. If there be no such Chairman, or if at any meeting he is not present at the time of holding the same, the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

40. The Chairman may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place ; but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place.

41. At any General Meeting, unless a poll is demanded by at least two Shareholders, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the book of proceedings of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the fact, without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution.

42. If a poll is demanded in manner aforesaid, the same shall be taken in such manner as the Chairman directs, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

43. In the event of a resolution being brought before a General Meeting involving the sale of the Company's estates or any portion thereof, or the winding up of the Company, a majority of three-fourths of the Shareholders present and (or) represented by proxy shall be necessary to carry such resolution.

44. Every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him.

45. If any Shareholder is a lunatic, or idiot, or prodigal, he may vote by his curator ; and if any Shareholder is a minor, he may vote by his guardian or any of his guardians if more than one.

46. If one or more persons are jointly entitled to a share or shares, the person whose name stands first in the register of Shareholders as one of the holders of such share or shares, and no other, shall be entitled to vote in respect of the same.

47. No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote at any meeting unless all calls due from him have been paid and no Shareholder other than the trustee or assignee of a bankrupt or representative of a deceased Shareholder, or person acquiring by marriage, shall be entitled to vote at any meeting held after the expiration of three months from the registration of the Company in respect of any share which he has acquired by transfer, unless he has been possessed of the share in respect of which he claims to vote at least three months previously to the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote.

48. Votes may be given either personally or by proxies. A proxy shall be appointed in writing under the hand of the appointor, or, if such appointor is a corporation, under their common seal.

49. No person shall be appointed a proxy who is not a Shareholder, and the instrument or mandate appointing him shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than forty-eight hours before the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote, but no instrument or mandate appointing a proxy, other than a power of attorney, shall be valid after the expiration of three months from the date of its execution.

DIRECTORS.

50. The qualification of a Director shall be holding not less than ten shares of the Company upon which all calls for the time being shall have been paid.

51. The number of Directors shall not be less than two or more than five ; but this clause shall be construed as being directory only, and the continuing Directors may act notwithstanding any number of vacancies.

52. The first Directors shall be Frederic William Bois, John Norman Campbell, and Edward Christian, and they shall hold office, except in the event of their becoming respectively disqualified, until the first Ordinary General Meeting of the Company to be held in the year 1893.

53. As a remuneration for their services, the Directors shall be entitled to appropriate annually a sum not exceeding rupees one thousand five hundred (Rs. 1,500), to be divided between them in such manner as they may determine, but the Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration for the future.

54. One of the Directors may be appointed by the Board to act as Managing Director and (or) Visiting Agent of the Company, for such time and on such terms as the Board may determine or fix by agreement with the person appointed to the office.

POWERS OF DIRECTORS.

55. The Directors shall have power to carry into effect the purchase of the said Mocha estate, and the lease (or) purchase of any other lands,

56. The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors either by themselves or with the assistance of a secretary or secretaries, agent or agents, to be appointed by them for such period and on such terms as the Directors shall think fit ; and the Directors shall pay out of the funds of the Company all costs and expenses, as well preliminary as otherwise, paid or incurred in and about the formation and registration of the Company, the purchase of the said lands and the cultivation thereof, and otherwise in or about the working and business of the Company.

57. The Directors shall have power to make, and may make rules or regulations for the management of the property of the Company, and for that purpose may appoint managers, agents, superintendents, officers, clerks, and servants, with such remuneration and at such salaries as they may consider advisable, and may pay the expenses occasioned thereby out of the funds of the Company, and may from time to time remove or suspend all or any of the managers, agents, superintendents, officers, clerks, or servants for such reasons as they may think proper and advisable, and without assigning any cause.

58. The Directors shall also have power to open from time to time, on behalf of the Company, any account or accounts with such bank or banks as they may select or appoint ; and also, by such signatures as they shall appoint, to draw, accept, make, endorse, sign, and enter into cheques, bill of exchange, promissory notes, bonds, mortgages, proxies, to any proctor or proctors, contracts or agreements on behalf and for the purpose of the Company.

59. The seal of the Company shall not be affixed to any instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors, who shall attest the sealing thereof.

60. The Directors shall exercise, in the name and on behalf of the Company, all such powers of the Company as are not expressly required to be exercised by the Company in General Meeting.

61. In furtherance, and not in limitation of, and without prejudice to the general powers conferred or implied in the last preceding clause, and of the other powers conferred by these presents, it is hereby expressly declared that the Directors shall have the powers following (that is to say) :—

(a) To institute, conduct, defend, compromise, settle or abandon any legal proceedings on behalf of the Company, and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due to or from the Company, and any claims or demands by or against the Company.

(b) To refer any claims or demands by or against the Company to arbitration, and observe and perform the awards.

(c) To make and give receipts, releases, and other discharges for money payable to the Company, and for claims and demands by the Company.

(d) To act on behalf of the Company in all matters relating to bankrupts and insolvents, with power to accept the office of trustee, assignee, liquidator, or inspector, or any similar office.

(e) To invest any of the moneys of the Company which the Directors may consider not to be immediately required for the purposes thereof, upon such securities and in such manner as they may think fit, and so that they shall not be restricted to such securities as are permissible to trustees without special powers, and from time to time to vary or release such investments.

(f) To delegate to any one or more of the Directors of the Company for the time being, or any other person or Company for the time being, residing or carrying on business in Ceylon or elsewhere, all or any of the powers or functions given to or exercisable by the Directors; and to confer such powers for such time and to be exercised for such objects and purposes, and upon such terms and conditions, and with such restrictions as the Directors may think expedient; and to confer such powers either collaterally with or to the exclusion of, and in substitution for all or any of the powers of the Directors in that behalf, and from time to time to revoke, withdraw, alter, or vary all or any of such powers. The Directors may allow to any person or Company to whom any powers may be so delegated such remuneration as they in their absolute discretion shall think fit.

62. A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted.

DISQUALIFICATION OF DIRECTORS.

63. The office of Director shall be vacated—

(1) If he ceases to hold the due qualification in shares.

(2) If he becomes of unsound mind or bankrupt, or take proceedings under the Bankruptcy Law for liquidation of his affairs by arrangement of, or composition with, his creditors.

64. No contract, arrangement, or transaction entered into by or on behalf of the Company with any Director, or with any Company or co-partnership of which a Director is a partner, or of which he is a Director, Managing Director, or Manager, shall be void or voidable; nor shall such Director be liable to account to the Company for any profit realised by such contract, arrangement, or transaction, by reason only of such Director holding that office or of the fiduciary relations thereby established, provided that the fact of his interest or connection therewith be fully disclosed to the Company or its Directors; but no Directors shall vote in respect of any contract, arrangement, or transaction in which he is directly or indirectly interested.

ROTATION OF DIRECTORS.

65. At the first Ordinary Meeting of the Company to be held in the year 1893, all the Directors shall retire, and at the first Ordinary Meeting in every subsequent year one-third of the Directors for the time being, or the number next below one-third, shall retire from office.

66. The Directors to retire in any year shall always be those who have been longest in office, and in case of Directors equal in length of office shall, unless such Directors agree among themselves, be determined by ballot.

67. A retiring Director, if qualified, shall be re-eligible. The Company at the Ordinary General Meeting shall fill up the offices vacated by the retiring Directors by electing a like number of persons.

68. If at any meeting at which an election of Directors ought to take place no such election is made, the meeting shall stand adjourned till the next day at the same time and place; and if at such adjourned meeting no election takes place, the former Directors shall continue to act until new Directors are appointed at the first ordinary meeting of the following year.

69. The Company may from time to time, by special resolution in General Meeting, increase or reduce the number of Directors, and may also determine in what rotation they are to go out of office.

70. Any casual vacancy in the Board of Directors may be filled up by the Directors, but any person so chosen shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

71. The Directors may meet together for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they think fit, and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes. In case of an equality of votes, the Chairman, in addition to his original vote, shall have a casting vote. A Director may at any time summon a meeting of the Directors.

72. The Directors may elect a Chairman of their meetings, and determine the period for which he is to hold office; but if no such Chairman is elected, or if at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the Directors present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

73. All acts done by any meeting of the Directors, or by any person acting as a Director, shall, notwithstanding that it be afterwards discovered that there was some defect in the appointment of any such Director or person acting as aforesaid on that day, or that they or any of them were disqualified, be as valid as if every such person had been duly appointed and was qualified to be a Director.

74. The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in a book or books provided for and used solely for that purpose:—

(1) Of all appointments of officers made by the Directors;

(2) Of the names of Directors present at each meeting of Directors;

(3) Of all orders made by the Directors; and

(4) Of all resolutions and proceedings of meetings of the Company and of the Directors.

75. And any such minute as aforesaid, if signed by any person purporting to be the Chairman of any meeting of Directors, shall be receivable in evidence without any further proof.

76. The Company in General Meeting may, by a special resolution, remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office, and appoint another qualified person in his stead. The person so appointed shall hold office during such time only as the Director in whose place he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

DIVIDENDS.

77. The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, declare a yearly dividend to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to their shares, and the amounts paid up thereon; and they may at their discretion, and without such sanction from time to time, pay to the members on account of the next forthcoming dividend such interim dividend as in their judgment the position of the Company justifies.

78. No dividends shall be payable except out of the profits arising from the business of the Company and with the sanction of the Directors.

79. The Directors may, before recommending any dividend, set aside out of the profits of the Company such sum as they think proper as a reserve fund to meet contingencies, or for equalising dividends, or for repairing, improving, or maintaining any of the property of the Company or any part thereof, or for such other purposes as the Directors shall, in their absolute discretion, think conducive to the interests of the Company; and the Directors may invest the sum or sums so set apart upon such securities or investments as they think fit.

80. When any Shareholder is indebted to the Company for calls, or otherwise, all dividends payable to him, or a sufficient part thereof, may be applied by the Board in or towards satisfaction of the debt.

81. Notice of any dividend that may have been declared shall be given to each Shareholder, or sent by post or otherwise to his registered place of abode; and all dividends unclaimed for three years after having been declared may be forfeited by the Directors for the credit of the Company's profit and loss account, but the Board may remit the forfeiture whenever they may think proper.

82. No dividend shall bear interest as against the Company.

ACCOUNTS.

83. Once at the least in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company in General Meeting a statement of the income and expenditure of the last year made up to a date not more than three months before such meeting.

84. The statement so made shall show, arranged under the most convenient heads, the amount of gross income and the amount of gross expenditure. Every item of expenditure fairly chargeable against the year's income shall be brought into account, so that a just balance of profit and loss may be laid before the meeting; and in cases where any item of expenditure which may in fairness be distributed over several years has been incurred in any one year, the whole amount of such item shall be stated, with the addition of the reasons why only a portion of such expenditure is charged against the income of the year.

85. A balance sheet shall be made out in every year and laid before the General Meeting of the Company, and such balance sheet shall contain a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company, arranged under the heads appearing in the form annexed to the table referred to in Schedule C to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," or as near thereto as circumstances admit.

86. A written or printed copy of such balance sheet shall be delivered at or sent by post to the registered address of every Shareholder.

AUDIT.

87. The first auditor or auditors of the Company shall be appointed by the Directors, and shall hold office until the second General Meeting, and afterwards the auditor or auditors shall be from time to time appointed by the Company in General Meeting.

88. The accounts of the Company for each year shall be examined, and the correctness of the balance sheet and profit and loss account ascertained by one or more auditors to be elected by the Company in General Meeting.

89. If not more than one auditor is appointed, all the provisions herein contained relating to auditors shall apply to him.

90. The auditors need not, but may be Shareholders in the Company. No person is eligible as an auditor who is interested otherwise than as a Shareholder in any transaction of the Company, and no Director or other officer of the Company is eligible during his continuance in office.

91. The remuneration of the auditor or auditors shall be fixed by the Company at the time of their election, save that in case of the first auditor or auditors it shall be fixed by the Directors.

92. Any auditor shall be re-eligible for election on his quitting office.

93. If any casual vacancy occurs in the office of auditor, the Directors may appoint another auditor, who shall hold office until the next Ordinary General Meeting.

94. If no election of auditor is made in manner aforesaid, the Directors may appoint an auditor or auditors for years then current, and fix the remuneration to be paid to him or them by the Company for his or their services.

95. Every auditor shall have access to all books of accounts kept by the Company, and shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto.

96. The auditors may make a report to the Shareholders upon the balance sheet and accounts, and in every such report they shall state whether in their opinion the balance sheet is a full and fair balance sheet, containing the particulars required by these regulations, and properly drawn up, so as to exhibit a true and correct view of the state of the Company's affairs; and such report shall be read, together with a report of the Directors, at the Ordinary Meeting.

NOTICES.

97. Notices by the Company may be authenticated by the signature (printed or written) of the Secretary or other person appointed by the Directors to do so.

98. Every Shareholder shall give an address in Ceylon which shall be deemed to be his place of abode, and shall be registered as such in the books of the Company.

99. Notices requiring to be served by the Company upon the Shareholders may be served either personally, or by leaving the same or sending them through the post in a letter addressed to the Shareholders at their registered places of abode, and any notices so served shall be deemed to be well served for all purposes, notwithstanding that the Shareholder to whom such notice is addressed may be dead, unless and until his executors or administrators shall have given notice to the Managing Director or Secretary of the Company of some address in Ceylon.

100. All notices directed to be given to the Shareholders shall, with respect to any share to which persons are jointly entitled, be given to whichever of the said persons is named first in the register of Shareholders, and notice so given shall be sufficient notice to all the holders of such share.

101. All notices required to be given by advertisement shall be published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*.

102. Every Shareholder residing out of Ceylon shall name an address in Ceylon at which all notices shall be served upon him; and all notices served at such address shall be deemed to be well served. If he shall not have named such an address he shall be not entitled to any notices.

MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION OF THE UPPER MASKELIYA ESTATES
COMPANY, LIMITED.

1. The name of the Company is "The Upper Maskeliya Estates Company, Limited."
2. The registered office of the Company is to be established in Colombo.
3. The objects for which the Company is established are—

(a) To purchase all those two estates called and known respectively as (1) Brunswick, situated in Maskeliya, Ceylon, and containing in extent two hundred and fifty-two acres or thereabouts; and (2) Bloomfield, also situated in Maskeliya aforesaid, and containing in extent two hundred and fifty-five acres or thereabouts, for the sum of two hundred and sixty-eight thousand one hundred and ninety-seven rupees (Rs. 268,197), upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon between the Company and the proprietor or proprietors of the said estates.

(b) To purchase, or lease, or otherwise acquire any other land or lands, machinery, implements, tools, live and dead stock, stores, effects, and other property, real or personal, movable or immovable, of any kind.

(c) To improve, plant, clear, cultivate, and develop the said estates, and any other lands that may be purchased, leased, or otherwise acquired, as tea estates, or with any other products, or in any other ways.

(d) To purchase or lease any other lands either adjacent to the said estates or either of them, or to any other lands that may be purchased, leased, or acquired, or elsewhere for the purposes of water supply, and (or) providing fuel or timber for the business of the Company, or for any other purpose necessary for the working of the Company.

(e) To purchase tea leaf and (or) other raw products for manufacture, manipulation, and (or) sale.

(f) To manufacture tea leaf and (or) other products.

(g) To carry on the business of planters of tea and other products in all its branches.

(h) To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects or any of them.

4. The liability of the Shareholders is limited.

5. The nominal capital of the Company is two hundred and seventy thousand rupees (Rs. 270,000), divided into 540 shares of five hundred rupees each. In case the Company shall increase its capital by the issue of new shares, such shares may be issued upon the terms specified in the Articles of Association for the time being of the Company.

We, the several persons whose names and addresses are subscribed, are desirous of being formed into a Company in pursuance of this Memorandum of Association, and we respectively agree to take the number of shares in the capital of the Company set opposite our respective names:—

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE UPPER MASKELIYA ESTATES COMPANY, LIMITED.

1. THE regulations contained in Table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," shall not apply to this Company; which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolutions. The Company may by special resolution alter or make provisions instead of or in addition to any of the regulations of the Company whether contained or comprised in these Articles or not.

2. The Company shall forthwith, after its incorporation, purchase all those two estates called and known respectively as (1) Brunswick, situated in Maskeliya, Ceylon, and containing in extent 252 acres or thereabouts; and (2) Bloomfield, also situated in Maskeliya aforesaid, and containing in extent 255 acres or thereabouts, for the sum of two hundred and sixty-eight thousand one hundred and ninety-seven rupees (Rs. 268,197), upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon between the Company and the proprietor or proprietors of the said estates.

SHARES.

3. Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing under his hand in such form as the Company from time to time directs.

4. The full amount of Rs. 500 per share shall be paid on allotment of each share.

5. If before or on the day appointed for payment any Shareholder does not pay the amount for which he is liable, then such Shareholder shall be liable to pay interest for the same at the rate of nine per cent. per annum from the day appointed for the payment thereof to the time of the actual payment.

6. The shares, except where otherwise provided, shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors who may from time to time issue any unissued shares, and may add to such shares such an amount of premium as they may consider proper. Provided that such unissued shares shall first be offered by the Directors to the registered Shareholders for the time being of the Company as nearly as possible in proportion to the shares already held by them, and such shares as shall not be accepted by the Shareholder or Shareholders to whom the shares shall have been offered, within the time specified in that behalf by the Directors, may be disposed of by the Directors in such manner as they think most beneficial to the Company.

7. If several persons are joint-holders of any share, any one of such persons may give effectual receipt for the dividend payable in respect of such share.

8. Every Shareholder shall, on payment of 50 cents per share, be entitled to a certificate under the common seal of the Company specifying the share or shares held by him and the amount paid thereon.

9. If such certificate is worn out or lost, it may be renewed on payment of 50 cents per share.

TRANSFER OF SHARES.

10. The Company may decline to register any transfer of shares made by a Shareholder who is indebted to them.

11. The fee payable to the Company for the registration of a transfer shall be five rupees.

12. The transfer books shall be closed during the fourteen days immediately preceding the Ordinary General Meeting in each year.

13. Subject to the restriction of these Articles, any Shareholder may transfer all or any of his shares by instrument in writing. The Directors may decline to register any transfer whatever, and shall not be required to assign any reason for so declining. In the event of the Directors declining to register a transfer, they shall, upon the request of the Shareholder desirous of executing the same, convene an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company to resolve whether the said transfer shall be registered or not; and the resolution of such General Meeting shall be absolute.

TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

14. The executors or administrators or heirs of a deceased Shareholder shall be the only persons recognised by the Company as having any title to his share.

15. Any person becoming entitled to a share in consequence of the death, bankruptcy, or insolvency of any Shareholder, or in consequence of the marriage of any female Shareholder, or in any way other than by transfer, may be registered as a Shareholder upon such evidence being produced as may from time to time be required by the Directors.

16. Any person who has become entitled to a share in any way other than by transfer may, instead of being registered himself, elect to have some person to be named by him registered as a holder of such share.

17. The person so becoming entitled shall testify such election by executing to his nominee a transfer of such share.

18. The instrument of transfer shall be presented to the Company, accompanied with such evidence as the Directors may require to prove the title of the transferor, and thereupon the Company shall register the transferee as a Shareholder.

Provided always that the Directors shall have the right at all times to decline to register such person as aforesaid, and shall not be required to assign any reason for so declining. In the event of the Directors declining to register such person as a holder of such share, they shall, upon the request of such person, convene an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company to resolve whether such transfer shall be registered or not, and the resolution of such meeting shall be absolute.

FORFEITURE OF SHARES.

19. If any Shareholder fails to pay any allotment money or call on the appointed day, the Company may at any time thereafter, during such time as the call remains unpaid, serve a notice on him requiring him to pay such call together with any interest that may have accrued by reason of such non-payment.

20. The notice shall name a further day and a place or places, being a place or places at which calls of the Company are usually made payable, on and at which such call is to be paid. It shall also state that in the event of non-payment at the time and place appointed, the shares in respect of which such call was made will be liable to be forfeited.

21. If the requisitions of any such notice as aforesaid are not complied with, any share in respect of which such notice has been given may be forfeited by a resolution of the Directors to that effect.

22. Any share so forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be disposed of in such manner as the Directors think fit.

23. Any Shareholder whose shares have been forfeited shall, notwithstanding, be liable to pay the Company all calls owing upon such shares at the time of the forfeiture.

INCREASE OF CAPITAL.

24. The Directors may, with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, increase its capital by the creation of new shares, of such amounts per share and in the aggregate as such resolution shall direct. All new shares shall be offered by the Directors to the registered Shareholders for the time being of the Company as nearly as possible in proportion to the existing shares held by them, and such shares as shall not be accepted by the Shareholder or Shareholders to whom the same shall have been offered within the time specified in that behalf by the Directors may be disposed of by the Directors in such manner as they think most beneficial to the Company.

The Directors shall have power to add to such new shares such an amount of premium as they may consider proper.

25. Any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered as part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the same provisions in all respects, whether with reference to the payment of allotment money, calls, or the forfeiture of shares on non-payment of calls or otherwise, as if it had been part of the original capital.

BORROWING.

26. The Directors shall have power to borrow money for the purposes of the Company, and for this purpose to grant bonds, promissory notes, bills, debentures, interest warrants, bonds for cash credit, trust deed, or other documents, to issue letters of credit, and to grant mortgages or other deed or deeds of security over all or any of the Company's lands, property, estate and assets, but so that the sum so to be borrowed shall not at any one time exceed the sum of Rs. 20,000. Provided that nothing herein contained shall be held to prevent the Directors procuring from time to time, in the usual course of business, such temporary advances on the produce of the estate as they may find it to be necessary or expedient for the purpose of defraying the expenses of working the said estate.

Provided also that before the Directors execute any mortgage or issue any debentures, they shall obtain the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary. A declaration under the Company's seal contained in or endorsed upon any of the documents mentioned in this Article, and subscribed by two or more of the Directors or by one Director and the Secretary, to the effect that the Directors have power to borrow the amount which such document may represent, shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions between the Company and its creditors; and no such document containing such declaration shall, as regards the creditor, be void on the ground of its being granted in excess of the aforesaid borrowing power, unless it be proved that such creditor was aware that it was so granted.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

27. The first General Meeting shall be held at such time, not being more than twelve months after the incorporation of the Company, and at such place as the Directors may determine.

28. Subsequent General Meetings may be held at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if not so prescribed then at such place and at such time as soon after the First day of January in each year as the Directors shall determine.

29. The above-named General Meetings shall be called Ordinary Meetings; all other General Meetings shall be called Extraordinary.

30. The Directors may, whenever they think fit—and they shall, upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one-fifth in number of the Shareholders of the Company for the time being, or by any Shareholder or Shareholders holding not less than one-fifth part of the shares of the Company for the time being subscribed for—convene an Extraordinary General Meeting.

31. Any requisition so made by the Shareholder or Shareholders shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, and shall be left at the registered office of the Company.

32. Upon the receipt of such requisition, the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such time and place as they shall think fit, not being more than twenty-one days after the leaving of the requisition; and if they do not proceed to convene the said meeting within twenty-one days after the leaving of the requisition, the requisitionist or requisitionists or any other Shareholders amounting to the required number may, himself or themselves, convene an Extraordinary General Meeting to be held at such time or place as he or they shall think fit.

33. Fourteen days' notice at least, specifying the place and the hour of meeting, and the purpose for which any meeting is to be held, shall be given by advertisement in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, or in such other manner, if any, as may be prescribed by the Company.

34. Any Shareholder may, on giving not less than ten days' previous notice of any resolution, submit the same to a meeting.

35. Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the registered office of the Company.

36. In order to constitute a meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, there shall be present, either personally or by proxy, three or more Shareholders holding in the aggregate not less than one-tenth of the capital for the time being subscribed for.

37. If within one hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of Shareholders is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of a Shareholder or Shareholders, shall be dissolved. In any other case it shall stand adjourned to the following day at the same time and place; and if at such adjourned meeting the required number of Shareholders is not present, it shall be adjourned *sine die*.

38. The Chairman (if any) of the Board of Directors shall preside as Chairman at every meeting of the Company.

39. If there be no such Chairman, or if at any meeting he is not present at the time of holding the same, the Shareholders present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

40. The Chairman may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place.

41. At any General Meeting, unless a poll is demanded by at least two Shareholders, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the book of proceedings of the Company,

shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution.

42. If a poll is demanded in manner aforesaid, the same shall be taken in such manner as the Chairman directs, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

43. In the event of a resolution being brought before a General Meeting involving the sale of the Company's estates or any portion thereof, or the winding up of the Company, a majority of three-fourths of the Shareholders present and (or) represented by proxy shall be necessary to carry such resolution.

VOTES OF SHAREHOLDERS.

44. Every Shareholder shall (except as provided for in the Article immediately following) have one vote for every one share held by him up to three. He shall have an additional vote for every two shares beyond the first three up to seven, and an additional vote for three shares held by him beyond the first seven up to ten, and an additional vote for every five shares beyond the first ten.

45. When voting on a resolution involving the sale of the Company's estates or any portion thereof, or the winding up of the Company, every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him.

46. If any Shareholder is a lunatic or idiot or prodigal, he may vote by his *curator*; and if any Shareholder is a minor, he may vote by his guardian, or any one of his guardians if more than one.

47. If one or more persons are jointly entitled to a share or shares, the person whose name stands first in the register of Shareholders as one of the holders of such share or shares, and no other, shall be entitled to vote in respect of the same.

48. No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote at any meeting unless all calls due from him have been paid, and no Shareholder other than the trustee or assignee of a bankrupt or representative of a deceased Shareholder, or person acquiring by marriage, shall be entitled to vote at any meeting held after the expiration of three months from the registration of the Company in respect of any share which he has acquired by transfer, unless he has been possessed of the share in respect of which he claims to vote at least three months previously to the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote.

49. Votes may be given either personally or by proxy. A proxy shall be appointed in writing under the hand of the appointor, or, if such appointor is a corporation, under their common seal.

50. No person shall be appointed a proxy who is not a Shareholder, and the instrument or mandate appointing him shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than forty-eight hours before the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote, but no instrument or mandate appointing a proxy shall be valid after the expiration of three months from the date of its execution.

DIRECTORS.

51. The qualification of a Director shall be holding not less than ten shares of the Company upon which all calls for the time being shall have been paid.

52. The number of Directors shall not be less than three nor more than five; but this clause shall be construed as being directory only, and the continuing Directors may act notwithstanding any number of vacancies.

53. The first Directors shall be William Duff Gibbon, William Hamilton Greville Duncan, and Alexander Thomson, who shall have power to nominate and appoint a third Director, and they shall hold office, except in the event of their becoming respectively disqualified, until the first Ordinary General Meeting of the Company to be held in the year 1893.

54. As a remuneration for their services, the Directors shall be entitled to appropriate annually a sum not exceeding Rs. 1,500, to be divided between them in such manner as they may determine, but the Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration for the future.

55. One of the Directors may be appointed by the Board to act as Managing Director and (or) Visiting Agent of the Company, for such time and on such terms as the Board may determine or fix by agreement with the person appointed to the office.

POWERS OF DIRECTORS.

56. The Directors shall have power to carry into effect the purchase of the said Brunswick and Bloomfield estates hereinbefore referred to, and the lease and (or) purchase of any other lands, estates, or property.

57. The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors either by themselves or with the assistance of a Secretary or Secretaries, Agent or Agents, to be appointed by them for such a period and on such terms as the Directors shall think fit; and the Directors shall pay out of the funds of the Company all costs and expenses, as well preliminary as otherwise, paid or incurred in and about the formation and registration of the Company, the purchase of the said estates and the cultivation thereof, and otherwise in or about the working and business of the Company.

58. The Directors shall have power to make, and may make rules or regulations for the management of the property of the Company, and for that purpose may appoint managers, agents, superintendents, officers, clerks, and servants, with such remuneration and at such salaries as they may consider advisable, and may pay the expenses occasioned thereby out of the funds of the Company, and may from time to time remove or suspend all or any of the managers, agents, superintendents, officers, clerks, or servants, for such reasons as they may think proper and advisable, and without assigning any cause.

59. The Directors shall also have power to open from time to time, on behalf of the Company, any account or accounts with such bank or banks as they may select or appoint, and also by such signatures as they shall appoint to draw, accept, make, endorse, sign, and enter into cheques, bills of exchange, promissory notes, bonds, mortgages, proxies to any proctor or proctors, contracts or agreements on behalf and for the purposes of the Company.

60. The seal of the Company shall not be affixed to any instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors, or of one Director and Secretary, who shall attest the sealing thereof.

61. The Directors shall exercise, in the name and on behalf of the Company, all such powers of the Company as are not expressly required to be exercised by the Company in General Meeting.

DISQUALIFICATION OF DIRECTORS.

62. The office of a Director shall be vacated—

- (1) If he ceases to hold the due qualification in shares;
- (2) If he becomes of unsound mind or bankrupt, or take proceedings under the Bankruptcy Law for liquidation of his affairs by arrangement of, or composition with, his creditors.

63. No contract, arrangement, or transaction entered into by or on behalf of the Company with any Director, or with any Company or co-partnership of which a Director is a partner, or of which he is a Director, Managing Director, or Manager, shall be void or voidable; nor shall such Director be liable to account to the Company for any profit realised by such contract, arrangement, or transaction by reason only of such Director holding that office, or of the fiduciary relation thereto established, provided that the fact of his interest or connection therewith be fully disclosed to the Company or its Directors; but no Director shall vote in respect of any contract, arrangement, or transaction in which he is directly or indirectly interested.

ROTATION OF DIRECTORS.

64. At the first Ordinary Meeting of the Company to be held in the year 1893, all the Directors shall retire, and at the first Ordinary Meeting in every subsequent year one-third of the Directors for the time being of the number next below one-third shall retire from office.

65. The Directors to retire in any year shall always be those who have been longest in office, and in case of Directors equal in length of office shall, unless such Directors agree among themselves, be determined by ballot.

66. A retiring Director, if qualified, shall be re-eligible. The Company at the Ordinary General Meeting shall fill up the offices vacated by the retiring Directors by electing a like number of persons.

67. If at any meeting at which an election of Directors ought to take place no such election is made, the meeting shall stand adjourned till the next day, at the same time and place; and if at such adjourned meeting no election takes place, the former Directors shall continue to act until new Directors are appointed at the first Ordinary Meeting of the following year.

68. The Company may from time to time, by special resolution in General Meeting, increase or reduce the number of Directors, and may also determine in what rotation they are to go out of office.

69. Any casual vacancy in the Board of Directors may be filled up by the Directors, but any person so chosen shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

70. The Directors may meet together for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they think fit, and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes. In case of an equality of votes, the Chairman, in addition to his original vote, shall have a casting vote. A Director may at any time summon a meeting of the Directors.

71. The Directors may elect a Chairman of their meetings, and determine the period for which he is to hold office; but if no such Chairman is elected, or if at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the Directors present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

72. All acts done by any meeting of the Directors, or by any person acting as a Director, shall, notwithstanding that it be afterwards discovered that there was some defect in the appointment of any such Directors or persons acting as aforesaid on that day, or that they or any of them were disqualified, be as valid as if every such person had been duly appointed and was qualified to be a Director.

73. The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in a book or books provided for and used solely for that purpose—

- (1) Of all appointments of officers made by the Directors;
- (2) Of the names of Directors present at each meeting of Directors;
- (3) Of all orders made by the Directors; and
- (4) Of all resolutions and proceedings of meetings of the Company and of the Directors.

74. And any such minute as aforesaid, if signed by any person purporting to be the Chairman of any meeting of Directors, shall be receivable in evidence without any further proof.

75. The Company in General Meeting may, by a special resolution, remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office, and appoint another qualified person in his stead. The person so appointed shall hold office during such time only as the Director in whose place he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

DIVIDENDS.

76. The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, declare a dividend to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to their shares.

77. No dividends shall be payable except out of the profits arising from the business of the Company and with the sanction of the Directors.

78. The Directors may, before recommending any dividend, set aside out of the profits of the Company such sum as they think proper as a reserve fund to meet contingencies, or for equalising dividends, or for repairing or maintaining the works connected with the business of the Company or any part thereof, and the Directors may invest the sum so set apart as a reserve fund upon such securities as they, with the sanction of the Company, may select.

79. The Directors may deduct from the dividends payable to any Shareholder all such sums of money as may be due from him to the Company on account of calls or otherwise.

80. Notice of any dividend that may have been declared shall be given to each Shareholder, or sent by post or otherwise to his registered place of abode; and all dividends unclaimed for three years after having been declared may be forfeited by the Directors for the benefit of the Company.

81. No dividend shall bear interest as against the Company.

ACCOUNTS.

82. Once at the least in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company in General Meeting a statement of the income and expenditure for the past year, made up to a date not more than three months before such meeting.

83. The statement so made shall show, arranged under the most convenient heads, the amount of gross income distinguishing the several sources from which it has been derived, and the amount of gross expenditure, distinguishing the expense of the establishment, salaries, and other like matters. Every item of expenditure fairly chargeable against the year's income shall be brought into account, so that a just balance of profit and loss may be laid before the meeting; and in cases where any item of expenditure which may in fairness be distributed over several years has been incurred in any one year, the whole amount of such items shall be stated, with the addition of the reasons why only a portion of such expenditure is charged against the income of the year.

84. A balance sheet shall be made out in every year and laid before the General Meeting of the Company, and such balance sheet shall contain a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company, arranged under the heads appearing in the form annexed to the table referred to in schedule C to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," or as near thereto as circumstances admit.

85. A written or printed copy of such balance sheet shall, seven days previously to such meeting, be delivered at or sent by post to the registered address of every Shareholder.

AUDIT.

86. The accounts of the Company shall be examined, and the correctness of the balance sheet ascertained, by one or more auditors to be elected by the Company in General Meeting.

87. If not more than one auditor is appointed, all the provisions herein contained relating to auditors shall apply to him.

88. The auditors need not be Shareholders in the Company. No person is eligible as an auditor who is interested otherwise than as a Shareholder in any transaction of the Company, and no Director or other officer of the Company is eligible during his continuance in office.

89. The first auditor or auditors of the Company shall be appointed by the Directors, and shall hold office until the second General Meeting, and afterwards the auditor or auditors shall be from time to time appointed by the Company in General Meeting.

90. The remuneration of the auditor or auditors shall be fixed by the Company at the time of their election, save that in case of the first auditor or auditors it shall be fixed by the Directors.

91. Any auditor shall be re-eligible on his quitting office.

92. If any casual vacancy occurs in the office of auditor, the Directors may appoint another auditor, who shall hold office until the next Ordinary General Meeting.

93. If no election of auditor is made in manner aforesaid, the Directors may appoint an auditor or auditors for the year then current, and fix the remuneration to be paid to him or them by the Company for his or their services.

94. Every auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto.

95. Every auditor shall have a list delivered to him of all books kept by the Company, and he shall at all reasonable times have access to the books and accounts of the Company. He may, at the expense of the Company, employ accountants or other persons to assist him in investigating such accounts, and he may, in relation to such accounts, examine the Directors or any other officer of the Company.

96. The auditors shall make a report to the Shareholders upon the balance sheet and accounts, and in every such report they shall state whether in their opinion the balance sheet is a full and fair balance sheet containing the particulars required by these regulations, and properly drawn up so as to exhibit a true and correct view of the state of the Company's affairs, and in case they have called for explanations or information from the Directors, whether such explanations or informations have been given by the Directors, and whether they have been satisfactory; and such report shall be read, together with the report of the Directors, at the Ordinary Meeting.

NOTICES.

97. Notices by the Company may be authenticated by the signature (printed or written) of the Secretary or other person appointed by the Directors to do so.

98. Every Shareholder shall give an address in Ceylon which shall be deemed to be his place of abode, and shall be registered as such in the books of the Company.

99. Notices requiring to be served by the Company upon the Shareholders may be served either personally, or by leaving the same or sending them through the post, in a letter addressed to the Shareholders at their registered places of abode, and any notice so served shall be deemed to be well served for all purposes, notwithstanding that the Shareholder to whom such notice is addressed may be dead, unless and until his executors or administrators shall have given notice to the Managing Director or Secretary of the Company of some address in Ceylon.

100. All notices directed to be given to the Shareholders shall, with respect to any share to which persons are jointly entitled, be given to whichever of the said persons is named first in the register of Shareholders, and notice so given shall be sufficient notice to all the holders of such share.

101. All notices required to be given by advertisement shall be published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*.

102. Every Shareholder residing out of Ceylon shall name an address in Ceylon at which all notices shall be served upon him, and all notices served at such address shall be deemed to be well served. If he shall not have named such an address, he shall not be entitled to any notices.

China Sea—Philippine Islands—Luzon.—Intended flashing Light on Cape Bojeador.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 99 of 1892) that on March 30, 1892, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the summit of a hill, situated about 1,750 yards eastward of the extremity of Cape Bojeador, north-west coast of Luzon island.

Cape Bojeador light will be a flashing white light showing a flash every minute, and visible through an arc of 222°, or from the bearing of N. 14° E., through east to S. 56° W. It will be elevated 360 ft. above the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 26 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catadioptric of the first order.

The lighthouse, 65 ft. high and constructed of brick, is a truncated pyramid with white cupola.

China Sea—Philippine Islands.—Relative to Ports Iloilo and Sebu.

Notice to Mariners No. 106 of 1892, issued by the British Admiralty, is republished:—

The following information relative to Ports Iloilo and Sebu has been received from Mr. R. Campbell, commanding the British steamvessel Elton:—

Panay Island—(1) Port Iloilo—Buoyage, Lights, &c.

Oton bank, at the southern entrance to the strait of Iloilo, has shoaled, and extended in a southerly direction. The south and west extremes of this bank are each marked by a can buoy, painted red and white.

A narrow bank, extending about 7½ cables in a N.E. by N. and S.W. by S. direction, with three fathoms water on it, has formed on the eastern side of the strait of Iloilo. The south-west extreme of this bank is marked by a conical buoy, painted red and white in vertical stripes, and moored with point Kabalik bearing about S.S.E., distant 2 cables.

The wreck, charted as lying off the ruined fort at Iloilo, has been removed.

Sebu Island—(2) Port Sebu—Buoyage and Lights.

The three buoys charted as marking Tambon and Lagundi shoals, at the southern entrance to port Sebu, were not in position, and should not be relied on. The other buoys in the approaches to Sebu were in place, and a conical buoy, painted red, has been moored near the outer extreme of the extensive spit off fort Sebu.

The light (fixed green) on point Lanis may be depended upon in all weathers. Lipata bank light (fixed red) is not to be relied on in bad weather with southerly winds.

At fixed white light is exhibited from near the top of St. Nicholas' church at Sebu, and a fixed red light from Sebu fort.

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VITAL STATISTICS OF CEYLON.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR THE FOURTH QUARTER OF 1891.

I.—POPULATION.

The estimated population of the Island on the last day of the quarter was 3,057,693, an increase of 19,052 on the previous quarter. The increase was due to an excess of births over deaths of 2,542, and to a still larger excess (16,510) of arrivals over departures of Indian coolies.

Table I. in the appendix gives the area and estimated population of each province and district of the Island in the quarter.

2. *Arrivals and Departures of Indian Coolies.*—The total number of arrivals in the quarter was 27,289, an increase of 10,280, or 60 per cent. on the mean annual number (17,009) in the corresponding quarter of the last four years (the period in the past decade during which the tide of immigration was in favour of the Island), while the departures were 10,779, which is a decrease of 164 on the average of the corresponding period under comparison (10,943).

The arrivals up to the end of the year amounted to 103,149, and the departures to 60,042. Thus the net increase to the cooly population of the Island this year was 43,107, an increase even greater than in last year (38,350), when the increase of arrivals recorded was in excess of any previous year since 1871, except 1876 and 1877.

II.—MARRIAGES.

The number of general marriages, i.e., marriages other than Kandyan or Mohammedan, registered in the quarter was 3,027, and of Kandyan marriages 1,112, showing a decrease of 3 and 20 per cent. respectively on the number in the corresponding quarter of 1890.

3. Table III. shows the marriages solemnised among the general community in every province and district of the Island, the civil condition, nationality, the highest, lowest, and mean ages of the parties, the mode of solemnisation, the number of bridegrooms and brides who were unable to sign their names in the registers, &c.

Table IV. gives similar information in respect of the Kandyans.

4. *First Marriages: Re-marriages.*—Of the 3,027 general marriages, 2,671 (equal to 88 per cent.) were between bachelors and spinsters, 73 between bachelors and widows, 228 between widowers and spinsters, 51 between widowers and widows, 1 between a divorced man and a spinster, 2 between divorced women and bachelors, and 1 between a divorced woman and a widower.

Of the 1,112 Kandyan marriages, 885 (equal to 79 per cent.) were between bachelors and spinsters, 46 between bachelors and widows, 98 between widowers and spinsters, 41 between widowers and widows, 17 between divorced men and spinsters, 2 between divorced men and widows, 12 between divorced women and bachelors, 8 between divorced women and widowers, and 3 between divorced men and divorced women.

5. *Age at Marriage.*—The mean age at marriage for the general community was for males 27·3 and for females 19·4; for the Kandyans, 28·1 for males and 20·1 for females.

6. *Minors.*—In the general community 7 per cent. of the males and 73 per cent. of the females, and among the Kandyans 20 per cent. of the males and 71 per cent. of the females, were under 21 years of age at marriage.

7. *Mixed Marriages.*—In the quarter there were registered 20 mixed marriages: 10 between Sihalense and Tamils, 6 between Burghers and Sihalense, 2 between Burghers and Tamils, 1 between a European and a Burgher, and 1 between a European and a Sihalense.

8. *Signatures in the Marriage Register.*—Of the 6,054 persons married among the general community this quarter, 700 men and 2,328 women signed the register with marks, that is to say, 77 per cent. of the men and 23 per cent. of the women were able to write their names. Of the 2,224 persons married among the Kandyans, 443 men and 1,058 women signed the register with marks, or, in other words, 60 per cent. of the men and less than 5 per cent. of the women were able to write their names.

III.—BIRTHS AND DEATHS.

9. *Births.*—The births registered in the quarter numbered 23,546, and were in the proportion of 31·0 to 1,000 persons living, a proportion very nearly the same as the average in the corresponding period of the preceding ten years, 31·1.

10. *Deaths.*—The deaths registered in this quarter amounted to 21,004, including 14 Europeans, 69 Burghers, 13,831 Sihalense, 5,173 Tamils, 1,773 Moors, 92 Malays, and 52 others, and corresponded to an annual rate of 27·8 per 1,000, being 19 per cent. above the mean rate of the corresponding period in the ten years 1881–90 (23·3).

11. *The Births and Deaths and their Rates* in the quarter are compared in the following statement with results obtained in the previous quarters of the year, the fourth quarter of the past year, and the average of the corresponding quarter for the previous ten years:—

12. *Sex.*—Of the total number of births (23,546), 12,373 were males and 11,173 were females, *i.e.*, 111 males to 100 females. Of the total number of deaths (21,004), 11,040 were males and 9,964 were females. Out of equal numbers living of each sex there died 97 males to 100 females.

13. *Health of the Districts.*—The continued unhealthiness of several of the districts comprised in the annexed statement in the first, second, and third quarters of the year was noticed in my last report. This quarter has been another unhealthy period. The district of Hambantota had a death-rate in the first quarter (96.3) nearly treble the mean rate for that period in the previous ten years (33.0); in the second quarter (51.2), a rate more than double that for that period (23.3); in the third (33.5), a rate over 40 per cent. in excess; and in the fourth, the last quarter of the year, the rate recorded was 35.9, which is still more than a third above the normal rate of the quarter (26.7). Matara is another district which has been continuously unhealthy during several quarters. The death-rate of this district in the first quarter was 38.0, an increase of 68 per cent. on the mean rate of the corresponding quarter in 1881–90 (22.6); in the second, 35.2, an increase of 112 per cent. on the mean rate of its corresponding quarter (16.6); in the third, 31.5, an increase of 61 per cent. on its corresponding quarter (19.5); and in the fourth, 26.5, an increase of 28 per cent., or more than a fourth in excess of the rate for that period. Negombo district is another which experienced abnormal mortality throughout each succeeding quarter in the year. The death-rate recorded in this district in the first quarter was 25.6, in the second 35.3, in the third 22.1, and in the fourth 20.6; whereas the rates recorded in these different periods during the preceding decade were respectively 18.7, 20.7, 18.8, and 15.8 per 1,000. Similarly, Puttalam, Chilaw, Badulla, Mullaittivu, Vavuniya, Kandy, Colombo, and Nuwara Eliya experienced continued unhealthiness during the four successive quarters of the year. The highest death-rate in the quarter was recorded in Trincomalee—the district noticed in my last report as being the only one which showed a death-rate lower than usual in each of the preceding three quarters of the year, and as an exception to the general unhealthiness of the Island. The sudden rise in the death-rate of this district (96 per cent., or nearly double the mean rate in the corresponding quarter of the previous ten years) is due to the heavy mortality from cholera, which caused as many as 233 deaths out of a total of 379 cases. Badulla, though showing the next highest death-rate (53.1), increased very considerably (136 per cent.) from the mean rate of the quarters in the preceding ten years (22.5) and, unlike Trincomalee, was also unhealthy during the previous quarters of the year. Batticaloa, Jaffna, and Mannár were healthier in the first two quarters and unhealthier in the two succeeding quarters. Kégalla and Kalutara were healthier in the first and third and unhealthier in the second and fourth. Galle and Ratnapura were, in point of health, worse throughout the year, save in the last quarter. In this quarter all districts without any exception show an increase on their death-rate.

The percentage of increase or decrease in the death-rate of each district in the quarter is shown in the following statement, as compared with the average for ten fourth quarters from 1881 to 1890:—

14. *Age at Death.*—Table IX. shows the number of deaths registered in the quarter at different periods of life for either sex in each province and district. Of the 21,004 deaths registered in the Island this quarter, 3,839, equal to 18 per cent. of the total deaths, occurred under one year; 9,142, or 44 per cent., under five years; 37 persons are reported to have been centenarians, and 1,217 persons to have died at various ages between 75 and 100.

15. *Registered Causes of Death.*—Table VII. in the appendix gives the causes of deaths registered in each district of the Island and of each nationality.

16. *Fever and Diarrhoeal Diseases.*—Of the 21,004 deaths registered in the quarter, 4,226 were reported due to various forms of fever and 4,524 to diarrhoeal diseases. The deaths ascribed to these two causes amount to 8,750, or 42 per cent. of the total number of deaths from all causes. Under this head* cholera accounts for 1,584 deaths, of which 447 occurred in Badulla, 233 in Trincomalee, 205 in Anurádhapura, 104 in Hambantota, and 99 in Matale.

* This is according to the statements of the registrars, wherein what is stated as cholera probably includes many cases of fever and dysentery.

17. Smallpox accounts for 28 deaths, of which 13 were in Kandy, 8 in Colombo, 6 in Batticaloa, and 1 in Badulla. To chickenpox 2 deaths are attributed and to measles 89 deaths, of which 16 were in Colombo, 15 in Ratnapura, and 12 in Galle.

18. The other chief causes of deaths were infantile convulsions 1,612, rickets 1,510, convulsions 792, anæmia 691, phthisis 612, collapse 559, worms 539, debility 518, dropsy 424, old age 336, puerperal convulsions 316, inflammation 215, childbirth 186, fractures and contusions 165, pneumonia 157, thrush 136, rheumatism 133, ulcer and bedsores 122, pleurisy 107, bronchitis 95, parangi 92 (of which 48 were in Kurunégala), want of breast milk 87 (of which 38 were in Badulla, 12 in Kandy, 11 in Matale, 6 in Nuwara Eliya, 4 in Kurunégala, and 4 in Kéggalla), scrofula 83, premature birth 82 (of which 68 were in Badulla), paralysis 73, asthma 69, diabetes 39, hydrophobia 10 (of which 4 in Colombo, 2 in Negombo, and 2 in Jaffna).

19. *Accidental Deaths and Suicides.*—Of the 415 deaths attributed to these causes, 103 are attributed to drowning, 93 to falling from trees, 63 to snake-bites, 20 to fall of heavy substances, 17 to burns and scalds, 13 to gun-shot wounds, 7 to fall from heights other than trees, 5 to poison, 1 to injury by elephant, 1 by buffalo, 2 by crocodile, 2 to sunstroke, 1 to wasp sting, 1 to hornets. There were 21 cases of suicide, of which 13 were by hanging, 1 by drowning, 1 by gunshot wound, 1 by poison and 5 by other means. Three persons were run over by carts.

20. *Murders and Executions.*—Six deaths (all Sihalasee) registered this quarter are attributed to murder and other forms of homicide, of which 2 were in Hambantota, 1 in Matara, 1 in Colombo, 1 in Kéggalla, and 1 in Kurunégala. Four persons (all Sihalasee) were judicially executed in the quarter.

IV.—HEALTH OF THE TOWN OF COLOMBO.

21. The health of the town of Colombo during the quarter (24.5) has been worse than in the corresponding quarter of 1888, 1889, or 1890 (when the rates recorded were 21.7, 21.8, and 20.8 per 1,000 respectively) and than in the preceding quarters of this year (second quarter 22.4; third 24.1), save in the first when the prevalence of smallpox in the town raised the rate to as high as 30.8 per 1,000. The causes of deaths may be summarised as follows:—

23. *European Births and Deaths.*—The European deaths were 6 in number (1 from simple continued fever, 1 from chronic alcoholism, 1 from phthisis, 1 from infantile convulsion, 1 from enteritis, and 1 from cinchosis of liver), and corresponded to an annual rate of 9.4 per 1,000. The birth-rate in the quarter was equal to 20.3.

24. *Births and Deaths of other Races.*—The death-rates of the different nationalities living in the town are not strictly comparable with each other. The European population of the town is small and fluctuating, and the rate calculated on such a population is not likely to be trustworthy for purposes of comparison. Similarly the Tamil death-rate is not a standard of their healthiness in relation to other nationalities. The circumstances which account for the low rate of mortality prevailing in this community are due to the migratory character of the Tamils living in the town and to a difference in the age composition of their population, there being among the Tamils a very small proportion of people at early or advanced periods of life and an unduly large proportion at the middle period, as compared with the other races.

The Burgher death-rate (9.2) in the quarter was slightly less than the mean rate for the corresponding period in the previous four years (10.7), while the other races show an increase on their death-rates. The Sihalasee death-rate was 21.2, an increase of 12 per cent. on the mean rate (19.0). The Moorish death-rate was 41.1, an increase of 17 per cent. on the mean rate (35.2), and the Malay death-rate was 35.6, an increase of 34 per cent. on the mean rate (25.7).
