"THE MEDICAL WANTS ORDINANCE, NO. 9 OF 1912."

IT is hereby notified that the Legislative Council, acting under the provisions of section 28 of "The Medical Wants Ordinance, No. 9 of 1912," has passed the following resolution at a public session thereof held on November 28, 1913, imposing duties on the exportation of certain products, which duties shall be levied at the Customs on the entry for exportation of such of the products as set forth in the said resolution, and shall be payable to, and shall be collected and received by, the proper officers of the Customs Department, and the payment thereof shall be enforced under the provisions of "The Customs Ordinances, 1869 to 1910":—

(a) That from and after January 1, 1914, the present export duties of 10 cents per cwt. on coffee and 5 cents per cwt. on cinchona, levied under section 4 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1882, be abolished; and (b) that from the same date the following duties on the exportation of cacao, tea, rubber, and cardamoms, being the produce of Ceylon, be imposed under the provisions of section 28 of "The Medical Wants Ordinance, No. 9 of 1912":—

Cacao, 15 cents per 100 lb.
Tea, 15 cents per 100 lb.
Rubber, 75 cents per 100 lb.
Cardamoms, 75 cents per 100 lb.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. No person shall keep a bakery without a license from the Chairman of the Local Board.
2. Every room in a bakery used (a) for kneading of dough or preparation of bread and (b) for baking of bread, or for either of those purposes, shall be well ventilated and well lighted, and the walls thereof plastered with cement, and the floor cemented throughout, and the proper drainage provided; a ceiling shall also be provided when so ordered by the Chairman.
3. No bakery or place used for the sale of bread shall be within 30 feet of any cesspit, latrine, or open sewer.
4. No room in a bakery used (a) for kneading of dough or preparation of bread and (b) for baking of bread, or for either of these purposes, shall be used as a dwelling place or for any purposes other than the preparation and baking of bread.
5. All utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to a bakery or place used for the sale of bread shall be kept scrupulously clean, and the tops of all tables are to be made of closely fitting planks free from holes and crevices.
6. All refuse and dirt in and about the premises of a bakery or place used for the sale of bread shall be removed without delay, and the drains kept well flushed.
7. All bread, cakes, or sweetmeats kept or exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed glass cases free from flies. The glass cases shall be kept scrupulously clean.
8. No person suffering from any cutaneous, contagious, or infectious disease, or who has recently been in attendance on any such person, or who is otherwise unclean, shall be employed in or about any place used as a bakery or for selling bread.
9. All persons employed in the preparation and baking of bread shall wear clean white aprons covering the chest and the body.
10. It shall be lawful for the Local Board Inspectors, supervisors, or other persons authorized in writing by the Chairman at any time to enter and inspect any bakery or place used for the sale of bread, provided that there is some one on the premises.
11. Copies of the above by-laws in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil must be hung up in a conspicuous place in every bakery.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. Every dairyman supplying milk within Local Board limits shall register his name and address at the office of the Local Board. Every person selling or exposing for sale milk without such registration shall be guilty of an offence.
2. No dairy shall be allowed within 50 feet of any cesspit or latrine, nor in a position where bad odours wafted from any cesspit or latrine shall reach it.
3. Every dairy compound shall be provided with drainage to the satisfaction of the Chairman, and the drains shall be regularly flushed and kept clean; no foul water shall be allowed in a dairy compound.
4. All refuse and dirt in and about the premises of a dairy shall be removed without delay. Cowdung shall be removed daily from the cow shed and dairy compound.
5. There must be a pure water supply at a convenient distance. No bathing or washing of clothes at a well in the dairy compound shall be allowed.
6. No building used as a dairy shall be used as a dwelling place or for any other purpose whatsoever; such building shall be kept clean at all times.
7. The milk cows must be free from any disease, and all dairymen must be free from any cutaneous, contagious, or infectious disease.
8. All utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to a dairy shall be kept clean.
9. All vessels sent out containing milk shall be properly stoppered or covered with non-absorbing material, and shall not be carried under the armpit.
10. It shall not be lawful for any person to sell, hawk about, or expose for sale any milk which has been adulterated with water or any foreign substance whatever.
11. No person shall sell or offer for sale any milk from which the cream has been removed, unless he previously informs the person to whom he sells or offers it that the cream has been removed.
12. The Government Medical Officer of the station or his Assistant or any Local Board Inspector may at any time demand and take for the purpose of analysis samples of any milk which is in possession of any person who is found selling, hawking, or exposing milk for sale or from any premises registered as a dairy, and any person who refuses to permit samples to be taken shall be guilty of an offence.
13. Should any samples of milk taken for analysis prove to be adulterated, any dairyman from whose possession or from possession of whose servant such sample was taken shall be deemed guilty of an offence.
14. The Chairman of the Local Board shall be at liberty to cancel the registration of any dairy in case of breach of any provision of these by-laws.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 13, 1913.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 136 (4 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 72 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 19 Moors, 6 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1913, viz., 235,829) was 30·1, as against 27·0 in the preceding week, 22·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23·0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 149 (0 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 69 Sinhalese, 38 Tamils, 22 Moors, 4 Malays, and 8 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 32·5, as against 37·6 in the previous week, 30·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·5 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 149 total deaths, 47 were of infants under one year of age, as against 53 in the preceding week, 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average of last year:

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—Sixteen deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 18 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 each in Kotahena and New Bazaar, 2 each in St. Paul's and Wellawatta, and 1 each in Maradana hospitals and Slave Island. Seven deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

2. Fifteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 20 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 each were in New Bazaar and Maradana hospitals, 2 each in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals) and Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena, and Wellawatta.

3. Three deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 2 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year), of which 1 each was in San Sebastian, Slave Island, and Wellawatta.

4. Sixteen deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 11 from *Debility*, 9 from *Enteritis*, 7 from *Senility*, 6 from *Prematurity*, 5 from *Diarrhoea*, 5 from *Dysentery*, 1 from *Worms*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 1 from an *Accident* due to a thorn prick, and 43 from *Other Causes*.

5. Three deaths were registered from *Cholera* (against 6 in the previous week), of which 2 were in Kotahena and 1 in St. Paul's. Twelve cases of *Cholera* were reported during the week, against 11 in the previous week.

6. One case of *Measles* was reported against nil in the previous week. There were 13 cases of *Chickenpox*, against 6 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 78·5° against 80·2° in the preceding week, and 79·9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·549 in., against 29·858 in. in the preceding week and 29·838 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2·33 in., against 4·17 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
