VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 20, 1913.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 107 (0 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 67 Sinhalese, 11 Tamils, 17 Moors, 1 Malay, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1913, viz., 235,829) was 23.7, as against 30.1 in the preceding week, 20.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23.0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 166 (1 European, 12 Burghers, 81 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 30 Moors, 4 Malays, and 8 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 36.7, as against 32.5 in the previous week, 31.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 166 total deaths, 39 were of infants under one year of age, as against 47 in the preceding week, 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.-The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—Sixteen deaths were registered from Phthisis (against 15 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 4 in Maradana hospitals, 2 each in San Sebastian, St. Paul's, and Kollupitiya, and 1 in Kotahena.

2. Fifteen deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 16 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year), of which 6 were in New Bazaar, 4 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, Maradana hospitals, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya. Five deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

3. Three deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever*, as in the previous week (against 5 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 were in St. Paul's and the other in Pettah.

4. Sixteen deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 14 from Debility, 10 from Enteritis, 10 from Senility, 9 from Dysentery, 3 from Diarrhoa, 2 from Worms, 2 from Accidents (due to fall and drowning respectively), 1 from Tetanus, and 56 from Other Causes.

5. Four deaths were registered from *Cholera* (against 3 in the previous week), of which 3 were in Kollupitiya and the other in Wellawatta. One case of *Cholera* was reported during the week, against 12 in the previous week.

6. No cases of *Measles* was reported. There was 1 in the previous week. Five cases of *Chickenpox* were reported, against 13 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was $77 \cdot 7^{\circ}$, against $78 \cdot 5^{\circ}$ in the preceding week and $78 \cdot 1^{\circ}$ in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was $29 \cdot 823$ in., against $29 \cdot 549$ in. in the preceding week and $29 \cdot 820$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was $5 \cdot 22$ in., against $2 \cdot 33$ in. in the preceding week and $2 \cdot 85$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1913, viz., 235,829) was 13.5, the lowest recorded during the year, as against 23.7 in the preceding week, 18.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 23.0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 149 (0 Europeans, 12 Burghers, 69 Sinhalese, 34 Tamils, 27 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 32.9, as against 36.7 in the previous week, 30.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 149 total deaths, 30 were of infants under one year of age, as against 39 in the preceding week, 35 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average of last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—Nineteen deaths were registered from Phthisis (against 16 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in New Bazaar, 3 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena, and Maradana hospitals, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Pettah, Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta.

2. Fourteen deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 15 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Kotahena, 3 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 each in New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals, and Slave Island, and 1 in St. Paul's. Eight deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

3. Five deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 3 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year), of which 1 each was in San Sebastian, Kotahena, Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), Slave Island, and Wellawatta.

4. Seventeen deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 12 from Enteritis, 10 from Debility, 5 from Dysentery, 4 from Diarrhea, 3 from Worms, 3 from Senility, 1 from Tetanus, 1 from an Accidental Burn, and 45 from Other Causes.

5. I wo deaths were registered from *Cholera* (against 4 in the previous week). of which 1 was in Kollupitiya and the other in Wellawatta. No cases of *Cholera* were reported during the week. There was one in the previous week.

6. Five cases of Chickenpox were reported as in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was $86\cdot5^{\circ}$, against $77\cdot7^{\circ}$ in the preceding week and $78\cdot6^{\circ}$ in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was $29\cdot970$ in., against $29\cdot823$ in. in the preceding week and $29\cdot863$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was $0\cdot81$ in., against $5\cdot22$ in. in the preceding week and $0\cdot14$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
